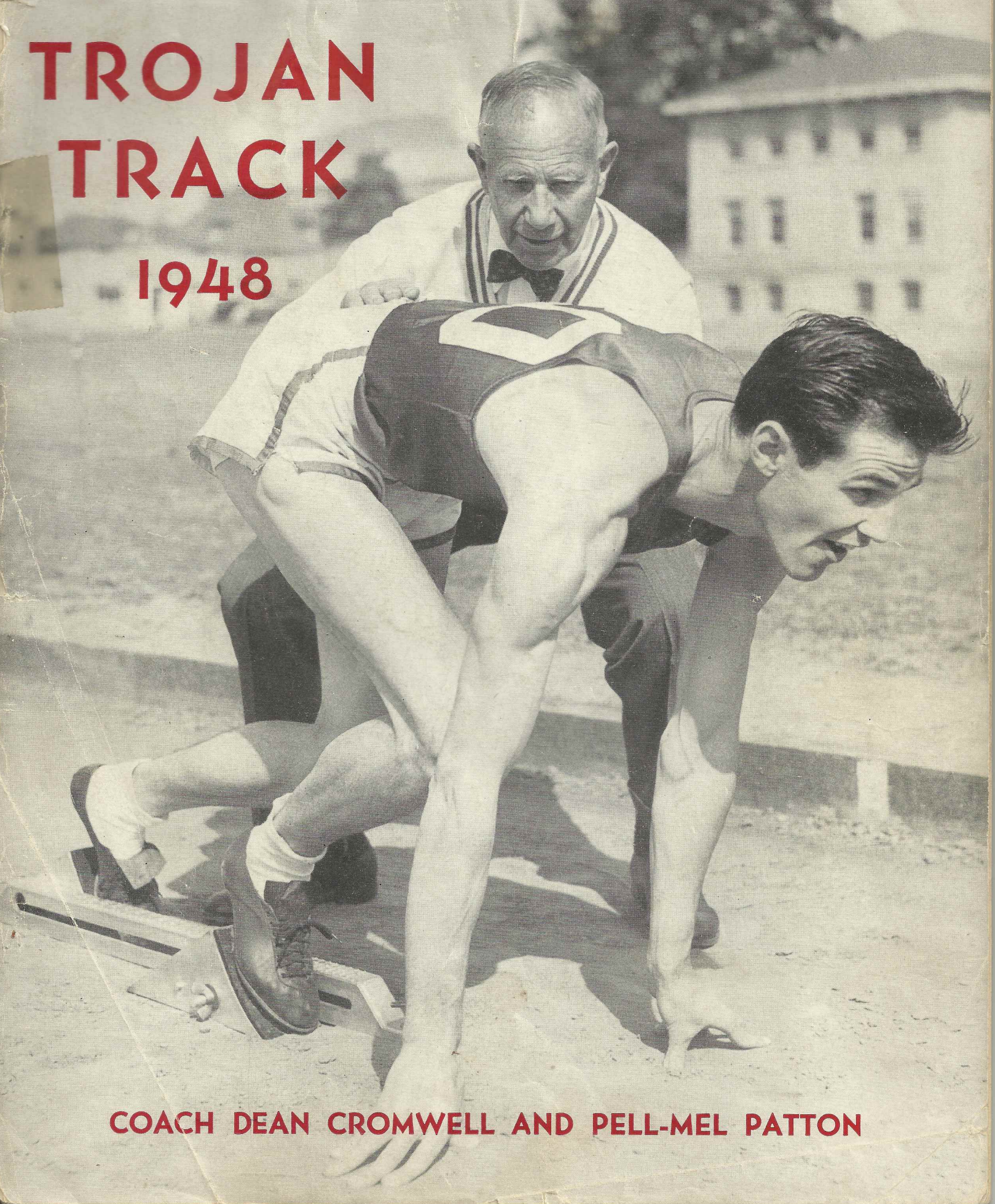

DEAN BARTLETT CROMWELL, Age 68, Born Turner, Oregon, September 20, 1879.
All-around athlete at Occidental College; first employed at S.C., September, 1908.
Coached first Trojan track team in 1909 and has never coached elsewhere.
Unanimously chosen head coach, American Olympic Team, 1948.
