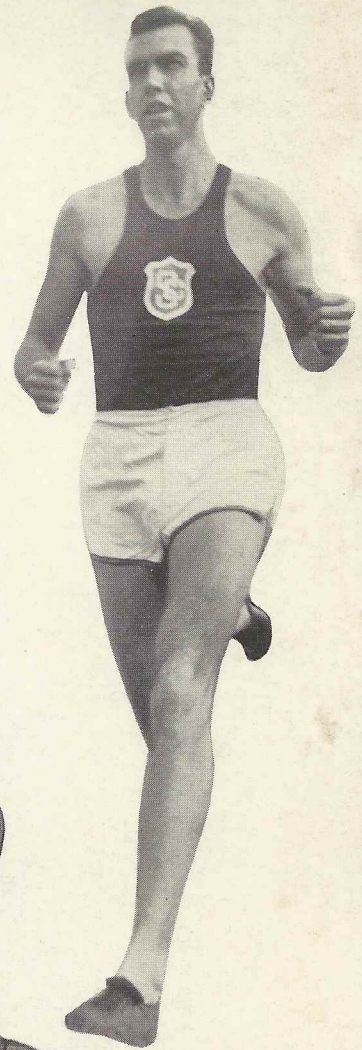

COACH JESS HILL

As Jess Hill moves into his second year as head track and field coach at the University of Southern California, his biggest worry is how he can ever improve over his freshman year of 1949 when the Trojans marched through an undefeated season, capping their efforts with a smashing 55 2/5-point victory in the N.C.A.A. championships.

In his first season as spike mentor at Troy, Hill guided his charges to the Pacific Coast Conference dual meet title, team championships in the Long Beach, Fresno and Modesto Relays, the P.C.C. meet crown and the aforementioned national collegiate title.

The popular Trojan coach also saw Troy get its name on the record books when Pell-Mel Patton ripped off a 20.2s. furlong to erase Jesse Owens' old standard by one-tenth second. SC got another world record when Patton anchored Troy's 880-yard relay team to a sensational 1m. 24s. clocking in the Coliseum Relays to shatter the old mark by a full second.

Hill was a member of three successive track teams at S.C., 1927-29, and lettered all three years in the broad jump. He climaxed his track career at Troy when he won the I.C.4-A. broad jump title in 1929 with a meet record leap of 25ft. 7/8in. He was the first Trojan ever to better 25 feet in the event, and only two other S.C. jumpers--Dick Barber and Al Olson--have since surpassed Hill's supreme effort.

Jess played two years for Howard Jones' football team (1928-29) and was a whiz as a fullback. Although never a starter (he played behind "Sheriff" Jim Musick in his senior year) Hill topped the Pacific Coast Conference statistics in '29 for the highest average yards gained per play of all backs. Jess, in seven conference games, handled the ball 54 times for 441 yards, an average of 8.2 per play. He was the star of the 48-0 win over Washington at Seattle, even though he received belated credit as a befuddled radio announcer misnamed him "Cliff Thiede" all afternoon as Jess ran wild.

Hill didn't report to Sam Barry for baseball until his final year, 1930, but neither Sam nor Jess ever regretted the ultimate decision. First playing third base and later shifting to the outfield, Hill was the leading batter of the California Intercollegiate Baseball Association with a .389 average (21 hits for 54 at-bats) as the Trojans won their first CIBA title.

Orv. Mohler and Garrett Arbelbide were Hill's teammates on that nine.

Jess promptly signed with the old Hollywood Stars at the end of the college schedule and on his first official time at the plate in Wrigley Field on June 5, 1930, with Beryl "Trader" Horne of the Angels pitching, Hill powdered the ball over the fence for a home run. Jess went on that year to bat .356 in 115 games of double-A ball, and next year hit at a .318 clip.

Purchased by the New York Yankees, Hill played for Newark in 1932, St. Paul in 1933 and came back to Newark in '34 (batting .349) before stepping up to the Yanks in '35. He saw action in 107 games as he batted .293 for Joe McCarthy that season, hit for .305 for Washington in 1936, and then played both for the Senators and Connie Mack's Philadelphia A's in '37. In 1938 and 1939 he played for Oakland and then retired with a 10-year professional batting average of .306 with play only in Major League and AAA ranks.

At Corona High School before he came to S.C., Hill was a one-man riot. Over a two-year span he won ten letters in football, basketball, baseball, track and tennis. Then he moved on to Riverside Junior College for a year and there earned awards in all the above mentioned sports but tennis. Riverside had championship teams in all four sports that year (1925-26).

Jess entered SC in February, 1927. He graduated in June, 1930, cum laude.

After his retirement from baseball, he coached at Corona High, Riverside Junior College and Long Beach City College.

In March, 1942, Hill enlisted in the Navy and was discharged in February, 1946, as a lieutenant-commander. In the Navy he coached and played baseball at St. Mary's and Del Monte Pre-Flights and later was athletic director at Clinton, Camp Kearney and Memphis Naval Air Stations.

After his discharge, Jess went back to Long Beach City College and coached an unbeaten baseball team in the Metropolitan Conference.

Hill finally returned to SC in July, 1946, and immediately got off to a flying start by mentoring one of Troy's greatest frosh football teams that season. The mighty '46 Trobables were unbeaten and untied in five games, rolling up 238 points to 26 for the opposition. In their two games with UCLA the Trojan yearlings triumphed by scores of 66-13 and 40-7.

Jess coached frosh football from 1946 to 1948 and assisted Dean Cromwell with the 1947 and 1948 track and field teams. In 1948 he also held the job as freshman track coach.

Hill is married to the former Elizabeth Helen Glass, who was his high school sweetheart at Corona High. He has two children--Mary Elizabeth, 17, and Jesse T. Hill, Jr., 8.

ASSISTANT COACH JIM MCGREGOR

Jim McGregor, former distance runner at Troy, piloted one of the strongest frosh spike teams in Trojan history through an undefeated season last year to successfully inaugurate his coaching career at SC.

Among the Trobables' victims was Los Angeles City College, defending National Junior College champions. McGregor's boys came through with two school records: Bob Van Doren, 50ft. 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ in., in the shot, and the mile relay team, 3m. 21.2s.

McGregor was born in Portland, Ore., on Dec. 30, 1921. He attended Grant High School in Portland where he won the city mile in 1940. He came to SC the following year and was top man in the mile and two mile.

The frosh mentor ran the two mile for the varsity in 1942 and then enlisted in the Marine Corps. As a member of the reserves, he attended the University of Minnesota where he received his bachelor of arts degree in 1946.

McGregor coached track and basketball at Benson Tech in Portland from 1946 to 1948. Both his 1946 and '47 cross-country teams won Pacific Northwest titles. His big ace was Jim Newcomb, who will perform for the varsity this year in the mile and two mile.

GEORGE PASQUALI: 23, 5:11, 145, Senior, Glendale Hoover--Lettered in 1949. Best of 9.7s. in 100 and 21.2s. in 220. Ran first on Trojan 880-yard relay team which set world record of 1m. 24s. in Coliseum Relays. Placed third in 100 and second in 220 in PCC championships. Qualified for both sprints in NCAA but went unplaced in finals. Majoring in physical education.

JOHN BRADLEY: 20, 5:11, 150, Sophomore, Glendale Hoover--Won frosh numerals in 1949. Best of 9.7s. in 100 and 20.8s. in 220, both made in high school. Won state prep 100 title in 1947 and 220 in 1947 and 1948. Was All-American both years. Undefeated in dual competition last year and had bests of 9.8s. in 100 21.2s. in 220. Also ran on mile relay team which set school frosh record of 3m. 21.2s. Majoring in foreign trade.

AL MEJIA: 21, 5:7, 148, Sophomore, Fremont--Transfer from Compton College. Best of 9.8s. in 100 and 21.4s. in 220. Made latter in winning National Junior College championships. Took second in 100 in same meet. Ran 100 meters in 10.5s. in Mexico. Majoring in physical education.

DEWEY VROOM: 23, 5:9, 160, Junior, Fremont--Transferred from Compton College in 1948. Has been out past two years with injuries. Best of 9.8s. in winning 1947 Santa Barbara Relays open 100. Majoring in business education.

QUARTER-MILE

NORM STOCKS: 22, 6:0, 160, Junior, San Diego--Lettered in 1949. Best of 48.4s. in taking second in UCLA dual. Won state prep title in 1946 in 49.3s. Placed second last year in PCC championships and was second to Mal Whitfield in PCC-Big Ten dual. Ran third man on Trojan world record 880-yard relay team. Best of 21.6s. in 220. Majoring in business.

BUD CURRY: 20, 5:11, 155, Junior, South Gate--Transfer from Compton College. Best of 49s. flat. Ran second on Compton College mile relay team which set national jaysee record of 3m. 17.4s. last year. Was All-City 440 champ in high school in 50.1s. Majoring in zoology.

LEN LAUDENBACK: 20, 5:9, 150, Sophomore, Los Angeles--Won frosh numerals last year. Best of 50.2s. in high school. Bothered by injuries last year. Member of frosh mile relay team which set school record of 3m. 21.2s. Majoring in dentistry.

BOB CHAMBERS: best time of 48.2s. (see half-mile.)

HALF-MILE

BOB CHAMBERS: 22, 6:3, 175, Senior, Los Gatos--Lettered in 1947, '48 and '49. Best of 1m. 52.4s. in winning PCC-Big Ten dual in 1948. Placed sixth in 800 meters in 1948 Olympic Games at London. Won PCC half-mile in 1948 and '49. Tied national interscholastic record of 1m. 54.4s. in 1944. Set Trojan frosh records of 48.2s. and 1m. 54.5s. for quarter and half respectively in 1947. Qualified for NCAA finals last year but broke leg in prelims and couldn't compete in finals. Anchored two-mile relay team which set school record of 7m. 39.7s. in Fresno Relays. Married and has a 3-year old girl. Majoring in physical education.

BOB PRUITT: 26, 5:11, 170, Senior, Rocky Ford, Colo.--Lettered in 1948 and '49. Best time of 1m. 50.8s. in taking third in NCAA behind Mal Whitfield and Herb Barten. Also placed third in national AAU championships and made European tour. Placed second in PCC in 1948 and was third last year. Ran third on two-mile relay team which set record of 7m. 39.7s. Has time of 49s. for lap on mile relay team. Best mile time of 4m. 18.1s. Majoring in physical education.

WALLY WILSON: 25, 6:0, 157, Senior, Washington--Lettered in 1946 and '49. Best of 1m. 53.9s. in taking fourth in the PCC-Big Ten dual. Placed fourth in PCC championships. Won Stanford dual. Ran second on record two-mile relay team. Has lap time of 49s. in mile relay. Married and has 3-year old boy. Majoring in dentistry.

STAN MATTOON: 22, 6:1, 155, Senior, Garden Grove--Lettered in 1949. Best of 1m. 57.7s. in taking crucial third against Stanford. Won national jaysee mile title in 1947 while at Fullerton Junior College. Majoring in business.

MILE AND TWO-MILE

JIM NEWCOMB: 21, 6:0, 150, Sophomore, Benson Tech, Portland, Ore.--Transfer from Santa Ana College. Best of 4m. 22.9s. in mile and 9m. 36.1s. in two-mile. Won national jaysee mile and two-mile titles last year. Was city and state prep champ at Benson in 1948 and set city record of 4m. 23.4s. Won national junior AAU 5000 meter title the same year. First man on SC cross-country team last winter and set UCLA course record of 22m. 12s. for four miles. Never defeated in high school and junior college competition. Majoring in physical education.

BOB MITCHELL: 22, 5:9, 135, Junior, Huntington Park--Lettered in 1949. Best of 4m. 21.7s. in mile and 9m. 47s. in two-mile. All-City champ in half-mile in 1945. Ran first on record two-mile relay team last year. Only man to defeat Newcomb in cross-country last winter. Majoring in business.

JOHN CHERRY: 22, 6:0, 165, Senior, Colton--Lettered in 1947, '48 and '49. Best of 4m. 23.4s. in mile and 9m. 44.6s. in two mile. Won CIF mile in 1944. Won two mile in Stanford and UCLA duals last year. Majoring in zoology.

WILFIRD BAILLIE: 21, 6:1, 154, Senior, Garden Grove--Lettered in 1949. Best of 4m. 21.7s. in taking third in Stanford dual. Placed second in national jaysee mile in 1948 while competing for Santa Ana College. Majoring in dramatics and public speaking.

BOB PRUITT: best time of 4m. 18.1s. (see half-mile.)

HIGH HURDLES

- DICK ATTLESEY: 20, 6:4, 185, Senior, Bell--Lettered in 1947 and '49. Best of 14s. flat in taking third behind Craig Dixon and Harrison Dillard in national AAU. Placed second to Dixon in NCAA and PCC meets. Tied school record of 14.1s. in heat in Modesto Relays. All-City prep champ at 14.3s. (39-inch hurdles) in 1946. Majoring in radio.
- DON HALDERMAN: 26, 6:1, 160, Senior, Ventura--Lettered in 1948 and '49. Best of 14.5s. in taking fourth behind Dixon, Billy Anderson and Attlesey in Compton Invitational. Placed fifth in Fresno Relays. Married and has year old girl. Majoring in physical education.
- ART BARNARD: 20, 5:11½, 175, Junior, La Jolla--Lettered in 1949. Best of 14.6s. All-CIF hurdles champ in high school in 1947. Placed third in last year's national junior AAU high hurdles. Also runs quarter-mile in about 50s. Majoring in art.
- AL LAWRENCE: best time of 14.4s. (see low hurdles)

LOW HURDLES

- RONNIE FRAZIER: 22, 5:9½, 155, Senior, Van Nuys--Lettered in 1947, '48 and '49. Best of 22.7s. National junior and senior AAU low hurdles champ in 1945 while still in high school. Won All-City lows the same year. Placed third in NCAA lows in 1947 as freshman. Set frosh school record of 23.1s. Placed third in NCAA 400-meter hurdles in 1948. Placed third in NCAA lows last year and took third in the national AAU 400-meter hurdles. Ran second man on Trojan 880-yard relay team which set world record of 1m. 24s. Best of 52s. flat in 400-meter hurdles. Runs 100 in 10s. and quarter mile in 49s. Majoring in retailing.
- AL LAWRENCE: 24, 6:1, 175, Senior, Glendale--Lettered in 1944, '46, '47 and '49. Best of 23s. flat. Won national junior AAU lows in 1943 as a prep. Set national interscholastic record of 23.4s. for 220-yard lows. Set Trojan frosh record of 14.4s. for high hurdles in 1944. Scored 13 points in 1946 NCAA by taking thirds in broad jump and low hurdles and sixth in high hurdles. Placed fourth in Olympic Decathlon Tryouts in 1948. Best of 24ft. 11¼in. in broad jump. Also pole vaults 13 feet. Majoring in physical education.
- JOE SCOTT: 22, 5:9½, 165, Senior, El Monte--Lettered in 1948 and '49. Best of 23.4s. All-CIF low hurdles champ in 1945. Placed third in national AAU lows the same year. Was fourth in last year's national AAU lows. Played halfback on football team last fall. Married and has baby girl. Majoring in education.

JACK BARNES: 22, 6:2½, 180, Junior, Dorsey--Lettered in 1949. Best of 6ft. 6½in. in setting frosh school record in winning Santa Barbara Relays in 1948. Tied for first in PCC championships. Tied for fourth in NCAA. Majoring in art.

DICK BROMBACH: 20, 6:1, 160, Sophomore, Long Beach Poly--Won frosh numerals last year. Best of 6 ft. 4½in., made in high school. Tied for first in state prep meet in 1948. Tied for first in national junior AAU last year. Majoring in business.

CHARLES LeBOLD: 23, 6:1, 170, Sophomore, Glendale--Won frosh numerals in 1948. Best of 6ft. 4in., as a frosh. Out last year with injuries. Majoring in fine arts.

JERRY KINCHELOE: 19, 6:1½, 160, Sophomore, Benson Tech, Portland, Ore.--Won frosh numerals last year. Best of 6ft. 2in. Majoring in physical education.

BROAD JUMP

HENRY AIHARA: 23, 5:8, 140, Senior, New Trier, Ill.--Lettered in 1948 and '49. Best of 24ft. 9in., in winning PCC championships last year. Won 1945 NCAA while at Illinois. Placed third in last year's NCAA and AAU. Also high jumps 6ft. 2in. Majoring in geology.

FRANK FLORES: 20, 5:8½, 160, Sophomore, Monterey--Transfer from Monterey Peninsula College. Best of 23ft. 7¼in. in winning Fresno Relays jaysee broad jump last year. Majoring in liberal arts.
