

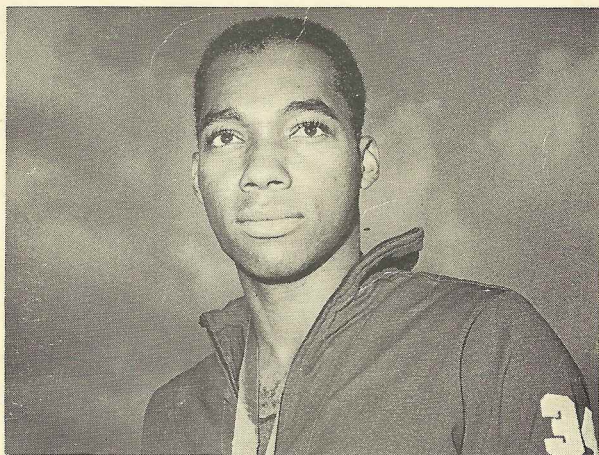

## JESS HILL

### Director of Athletics



Jess Hill, former track and football coach at Troy, begins his 12th year as Director of Intercollegiate Athletics at the University of Southern California.

Born Jesse Terrill Hill in Yates, Missouri, on January 20, 1907, Jess came west with his family ten years later and became one of the top athletes in Southern California while at Corona High School. From the fall of 1923 to the spring of 1925, he was award-

ed ten letters in five sports—football, basketball, baseball, track and tennis.

Following his graduation from Corona in 1925, Hill attended Riverside Junior College for one year, earning letters in football, basketball, baseball and track as Riverside fielded championship teams in all four sports.

Jess entered USC in February, 1927 and continued to exhibit his all-around athletic prowess, playing football and baseball and compiling an outstanding track and field record. He became the first Trojan in history to surpass 25 feet in the broad jump, leaping 25'  $\frac{7}{8}$ " to win the 1929 IC4A title.

Also outstanding in his studies, Jess graduated cum laude following the 1930 collegiate baseball season.

Hill signed immediately to play professional baseball with the old Hollywood Stars. In his first plate appearance, he hit one out of the park at Wrigley Field to start a ten-year career in Triple-A and Major League baseball.

In the off-season during his professional baseball years, Jess launched his coaching career at Corona High. Just as in his playing days, he moved from Corona to Riverside JC. His next position was at Long Beach JC where he was on the physical education and coaching staff when World War II came.

Hill enlisted in the Navy in March of 1942 and served until February of 1946 when he was separated from active duty with the rank of Lieutenant Commander.

Jess returned to USC in the fall of 1946 to begin a period of ten years of advancement within the athletic department. In 1948 he was selected as assistant track coach, being groomed to succeed Dean Cromwell as head track coach after the latter's retirement at the end of the '48 season.

Hill had two undefeated years, 1949 and 1950, as head track coach at USC, continuing the great Trojan track heritage and winning two National Championships. He also held that post in 1962 following the sudden death of his close friend, Jess Mortensen.

Early in 1951 he was named head football coach, following the resignation of Jeff Cravath.

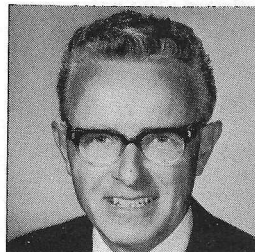
In his second season Hill steered the Trojan varsity through an undefeated conference season and a 7-0 win over Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl game.

Hill's six-year record as head football coach at USC was 45 wins, 17 losses, and 1 tie for a .722 winning percentage.

Jess is married to the former Elizabeth Helen Glass. They have two children, Mrs. Mary Bett Carter, a USC graduate, and Jess Jr., also a USC graduate.

## VERN WOLFE

### Head Track Coach



Now entering his seventh year as head track and field coach at the University of Southern California, Vern Wolfe has already piloted the Trojans to five NCAA track and field championships in the short span of six years.

Friendly and buoyant in nature, the 46-year-old Wolfe has been coaching track since 1950. He arrived at USC in

the summer of 1962 to succeed Jess Hill, the current Trojan athletic director. Hill had served as interim coach that season following the sudden death of Jess Mortensen just as the season was beginning.

In six years at USC, 12 men have tied or broken 19 indoor and outdoor world records. The Trojans have won five NCAA team championships and have won thirteen individual events. All individual track and field event school records have been broken by Wolfe-coached athletes.

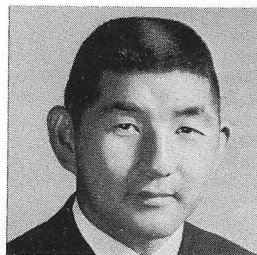
Since arriving at USC, Wolfe has captured three Pacific-8 conference championships and has had three undefeated dual meet seasons. His dual meet record now stands at 49 wins against just four losses.

Eleven athletes who were coached by Wolfe have competed in the Olympics, with three winning gold medals. Rex Cawley captured a gold medal in the 1964 games in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles; Dallas Long won the shot put in the 1964 games, and Bob Seagren took the pole vault in the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City.

Wolfe resides in Rolling Hills with his wife, Marilyn, and two boys, Corey, 15, and Dean, 13. The latter is named after Dean Cromwell.

## KEN MATSUDA

### Athletic Advisor Assistant Track Coach



Ken Matsuda is now in his third year as assistant track coach at USC. He came here in the summer of 1966 following a successful coaching job at Foothill College.

Matsuda had worked with Wolfe for one season (1961) at San Jose State when the Trojan headman trained the Spartan freshmen. Besides his coaching duties, the 33-year-

old coach serves as Athletic Advisor for academic affairs in the athletic department.

The Trojan track assistant had an outstanding athletic career of his own, lettering four years in football, track and baseball at Westchester High. From Westchester Matsuda went to Santa Monica City College for a year and a half making the All-Metropolitan Conference team in football. He then transferred to San Jose State where he earned two letters as a Spartan halfback and competed in track as a sprinter and long jumper.

Born Feb. 11, 1935 in Fresno, Ken and his wife, Janet, have a girl, Jo Ann, 8, and a boy, Michale, 6. They live in Torrance.

### JOE ANTUNOVICH—6-3½, 227, 20, So. (Discus)

New Zealand National Junior Champion in both the shot put and discus in 1966-67 . . . National junior record holder in the shot put (56'4") and discus (188'11") . . . Student Body President in high school . . . Established new USC freshman discus mark last season with throw of 178'7" . . . Mark places him 9th on all-time USC list.

### HOWARD BECKER — 5-9, 155, 21, Jr. (880)

Competed in the 440 for the Trojans last season with times of 48.1 in the open quarter and 46.5 relay leg . . . Will be used in the half mile this year . . . Clocked 1:51.5 in 880 last season . . . Attended Pierce Junior College after graduation from Palos Verdes High School.

### JOHN BUEHLER — 6-0, 240, 19, So. (Shot Put)

Former CIF Southern Section shot put champion . . . Outstanding prep mark of 65'9¾" . . . Had best of 56'2¼" as a frosh last season . . . Very strong youngster who should approach 60 feet this year . . . Younger brother of Stanford football star George Buehler . . . Attended Whittier High School.

### TOM COLICH — 6-4, 255, 20, Jr. (Shot Put)

Placed third in the state high school shot put championships in 1966 . . . Had prep marks of 62'¾" in the shot and 177'7" in the discus . . . Turned in season's best mark last season early in the year with toss of 58'6" . . . Eighth best in USC history . . . Attended Inglewood High School.

### RICH COULTER — 5-9, 145, 19, So. (Sprints)

One of the premier sprinters in the state two years ago . . . Had prep marks of 9.5 and 20.9 (straightaway) . . . Clocked wind aided 9.4 last season . . . Gives added depth to Trojan sprint corps . . . Voted Outstanding Senior Boy at Santa Ana Valley High School.

### NEIL DUGGAN — 6-1½, 160, 28, Sr. (Mile)

Still regarded as the finest distance runner in junior college track history . . . Once held five different JC records . . . Transferred to USC last year from Hancock Junior College in Santa Maria . . . Captured sixth in Pac-8 mile championships last spring with time of 4:06.5 . . . Had best marks last season of 4:05.1 and 8:47.6 . . . Originally from Birmingham, England . . . All-time best in mile is 3:56.1.

### TYRONE DUTTON — 5-11, 147, 20, Jr. (Hurdles)

Pleasant addition to Trojan varsity this spring . . . Comes to USC following two years at Los Angeles City College . . . Ran the 120-yard high hurdles in 13.9w and placed third in the California State Junior College Championships in the 330-yard intermediate hurdles in time of 37.7 . . . Attended Salesian High School.

### RICHARD DYER — 5-11, 155, 19, So. (Distances)

Young distance runner from Lakewood High School . . . Former CIF two mile champion with best clocking of 9:05.8 . . . This time was the seventh best on the 1967 high school two mile list . . . As a freshman last year, Dyer ran 1:55.5, 4:14.9 and 9:14.6 . . . Should help considerably in next few years.

### HERMAN FRANKLIN—5-11, 180, 20, Jr. (Hurdles)

Outstanding addition to Trojan varsity this season . . . Enjoyed fabulous success as junior college trackman last season at Harbor Junior College . . . California State junior college champion in both the 120-yard high hurdles and 330-yard intermediate hurdles . . . Had bests last year of 13.8 and 35.8 in the hurdles and 9.6 in the 100 and 10.1 in the 100 meters . . . Also will be available in the triple jump where he has recorded best of 49 feet . . . Extremely versatile athlete. Turned in excellent early season performances on the indoor circuit with times of 14.0 (120HH) and 6.9 (60 HH) . . . Attended Jordan High School.

### ANDY HERRITY — 5-10, 142, 19, So. (Two Mile)

Promising young distance runner from England . . . Had bests of 4:04 and 8:52 as a prep . . . Saw limited service with frosh last year . . . Ran mile in 4:16.6 last season.

### CURTIS JONES — 6-0, 162, 19, So. (Mile)

Competed with Trobabs last year . . . Ran 4:12.0 and 9:18 last season . . . Attended Dominguez High School in Compton . . . Coast League two mile champ in 1966 and 1967.

### PARK KENNEDY—6-3, 190, 20, Jr. (High Jump)

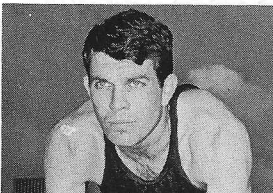
Will have to supply Trojans with some big efforts if USC is to score any points in the conference meet . . . High jumped 6'6" last season, but has lifetime best of 6'8" . . . Senior Class President at Foothill High School in Santa Ana.

### FRED KULLER — 6-2½, 175, 23, Sr. (Sprints)

One of the finest sprinters in recent Trojan history . . . Has best marks of 9.3 and 20.8 . . . Shares national JC 100 mark of 9.3 . . . Finished third in both Pac-8 sprints last spring . . . Ran second leg on USC's world record breaking 440-yard relay team in 1967 . . . Placed in finals of the 100 at the NCAA championships as a sophomore . . . Santiago High School graduate.

### STEVE LEHMER — 6-2, 230, 20, Jr. (Discus)

Known to most Trojan fans as a starting guard on the last two USC Rose Bowl football teams . . . Has potential to develop into fine discus thrower . . . Had throw of 171'0½" last season as sophomore . . . One of the few left handers in this event . . . Attended Loara High School.

**JEFF MARSEE — 5-10, 140, 19, So. (Two Mile)**

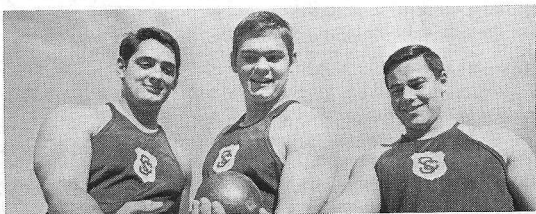
Placed second in the state meet two years ago as prep . . . Recorded eighth best two mile time in the country as a prep with mark of 9:06.0 . . . Developed into outstanding prospect last year with new USC freshman school record of 8:47.4 . . . A sure Trojan star of the future . . . Graduate of South Torrance High School.

**LENNOX MILLER — 6-0, 175, 22, Sr. (Sprints)**

Considered by experts to be one of the finest sprinters in the world today . . . Certainly rates as the No. 1 sprinter in college at the moment . . . Has tremendous poise in the starting blocks . . . Holder of both sprints records as USC . . . Has run the 100 in 9.2 and the 220 in 20.4 . . . Climaxed great junior year last season with second place finish and Silver Medal in the 100 meters at the Olympics in Mexico City . . . Has won the 100 and 220 in the Pac-8 championships in both 1967 and 1968 . . . Clocked 9.3 and 20.6 as a sophomore and 9.4 and 20.8 last season . . . Won the 100 meters at the NCAA championships last season with time of 10.1 . . . Placed second in the 200 meters in time of 20.8 . . . Came to USC from Kingston, Jamaica with outstanding prep credentials . . . Outstanding competitor . . . New world record holder in the indoor 100-yard dash . . . Ran 9.4 in Houston on the indoor track circuit.

**DAVE MURPHY — 6-4, 250, 20, Jr. (Shot Put)**

Another talented newcomer to the Trojan ranks this year . . . Dazzled the prep sports world two years ago with tremendous shot put performances . . . Had toss of 67'2" while a prep at Sunny Hills High School . . . Moved onto Fullerton Junior College for two years . . . Went over 60 feet last year with toss of 60'1" . . . Also threw discus 169'3 1/2" . . . Has already reached 60 feet in early practices.

**MIKE NEWTON — 5-11, 165, 19, So. (440)**

Captured the state 440 title while at Whittier High School two years ago with time of 47.2 . . . Had seasonal best of 46.9 which was the second best mark recorded by a high school performer that season . . . Had best of 47.2 in the quarter and 21.3 in the 220 for Trojan frosh last season . . . Outstanding potential . . . Strong addition to Trojan quarter mile hopes this year.

**OLE OLESON — 5-9, 150, 19, Jr. (Two Mile)**

Contributed greatly to Trojan cause last year . . . Transferred to USC last spring from Santa Monica City College . . . Appeared to get better with each meet last season . . . Became USC's greatest two miler ever with excellent time of 8:44.6 . . . Placed second to Gerry Lindgren in Pac-8 three mile in 13:35.4 . . . Counted on heavily by Trojan coaches . . . Has already blistered 8:36.1 on indoor circuit.

**RON PHARRIS — 6-0, 180, 19, So. (Sprints)**

Tabbed as one of the finest sprinters in the state two years ago while at Anaheim High School . . . Clocked 9.6 and 21.3 around a curve as a prep . . . Competed with Trobables last spring with clockings of 9.6 and 21.2 . . . Also ran the 440 in 48.5 . . . Will also get shot at tailback when Trojan footballers begin spring practice . . . Gained 109-yards rushing vs. UCLA frosh two years ago.

**HOWARD PRATT—6-1, 170, 20, Jr. (Triple Jump)**

Comes to USC from Phoenix College in Arizona . . . Will compete in both the long jump and triple jump . . . Has been over 24 feet in the long jump . . . National Junior College triple jump champion with leap of 49'11 3/4".

**BOB SEAGREN — 5-11, 175, 22, Sr. (Pole Vault)**

Acclaimed to be the greatest pole vaulter in history . . . Certainly his marks speak for themselves . . . Has been named U.S. Athlete of the Year by the U.S.T.F.F. . . . Is without doubt the most active vaulter in history . . . Concluded great 1968 campaign by capturing Gold Medal in summer Olympics at Mexico City . . . Recently set new indoor world record of 17'5 3/4" at Albuquerque and then broke it with leap of 17'6" in Los Angeles . . . set outdoor world record of 17'9" at Final Olympic Trials at So. Lake Tahoe in 1968 . . . The outdoor mark came following a serious back injury that practically kept him out of the trials . . . Also doubles as intermediate hurdler . . . Clocked 53.4 in first-ever attempt in this difficult race . . . Took a second place vs. UCLA in dual meet last spring . . . Tremendous competitor with great influence on his teammates . . . Does considerable amount of running during track season.

**MIKE SELLERS — 5-10, 145, 19, So. (Distances)**

CIF two mile champion in 1966 . . . Ran 9:12 as a prep at West High School in Torrance . . . Named to National Honor Society in high school . . . Competed with Trobables last spring and clocked fine 9:01.2 . . . Will give Trojans good depth in distances this year.

**CARL TRENTADUE — 6-1, 185, 21, Sr. (880)**

Outstanding prep in both the mile and two mile at Westminster High School . . . Clocked 4:08.5 as prep . . . Ran 4:04 in the mile as a soph but was injured the rest of the season . . . Worked hard in comeback last season and placed 4th in Pac-8 880 in time of 1:49.9 . . . Had one of the fastest 880 times in the world last season of 1:47.9 . . . Suffers from arthritis in his ankle . . . Should be among the top 880 men in the country this year.

**TERRY TUBB — 5-11, 175, 21, Sr. (880)**

Joined Trojan varsity last spring after attending Pierce Junior College . . . Had best time last season of 1:50.3 in the half mile . . . With hard work could dip under 1:50 this season.

**MONTGOMERY TURNER—5-10, 167, 20, Jr. (440)**

Outstanding newcomer joining Trojan ranks following two brilliant years at East Los Angeles Junior College . . . Captured state junior college 440 title last year in 46.9 . . . All-around athlete who has also clocked 9.8 in the 100 and 21.2 in the 220 . . . All-Metropolitan defensive halfback in football two seasons ago . . . Will give USC excellent quarter mile help for next two seasons.

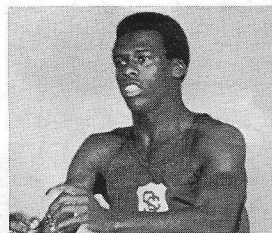

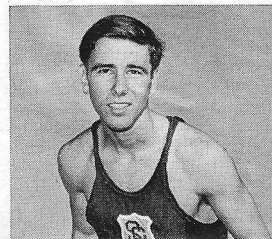

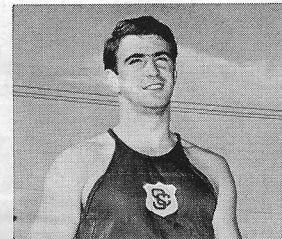

OLYMPIC GAMES: USC trackmen have won 17 individual Olympic titles and have shared in ten relay victories. ~~Forty-nine~~ 48 men have won a total of 74 places on United States Olympic teams.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC has won 26 out of 39 NCAA meets competed in since its beginning in 1921. On eight occasions they have finished second. The Trojans won nine in a row (1935-1943), and seven straight (1949-1955). A total of 77 individual championships highlight the record.

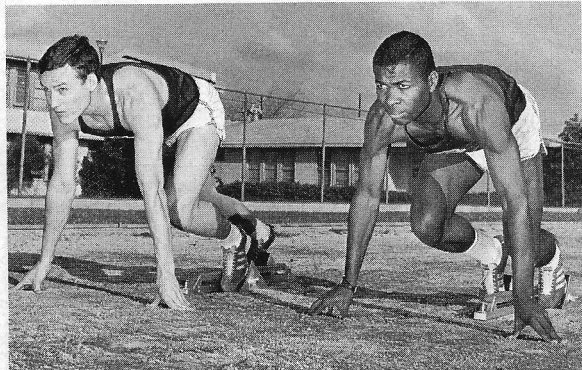
