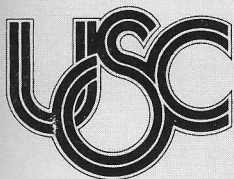

Events over one lap are officially recorded in tenths and no auto timing factors are therefore presented.

100 yard, 100 meter, 200 meter, 220 yard hand times are converted to automatic "equivalents" by adding a factor of 0.24; 400 meter flat and hurdles, add 0.14; 400 relay, add 0.14 hand-timed yards to automatic metric equivalent; 440 yards flat and hurdles, subtract 0.16; 440 relay, subtract 0.06; hand-timed decathlons are worth about an extra 75 points compared to an automatically timed ten-eventer.

## 1990 USC MEN'S TRACK AND FIELD PROSPECTUS

"Let youth be served" may be more of a battle cry than an excuse for USC men's track and field in 1990. Senior performers are rare among the Trojans this year, and though the team is young, the talent is certainly prevalent among the juniors and sophomores. Only 2 seniors figure prominently in sixth-year head coach **Ernie Bullard's** plans. Yet both seniors could make quite an impact on the national scene, while juniors and sophomores are expected to perform at a high plateau on the conference level.

"This is a quality team that will only get better as the season progresses," said Bullard. "We have plenty of experience and talented performers, yet few are seniors. We're not particularly deep in any area, so obviously our health will play a key role. And if our health maintains, we should prove to be a factor in the sprints, relays and hurdles and competitive in the field events." Here's a closer look at USC's 1990 men's track and field squad:

**SPRINTS** — Though lean on experience, the Trojans are deep in talent, returning their top 2 sprinters of a year ago and adding a quality transfer. Sophomore **Quincy Watts** (10.46, 20.67) and junior **Calvin Holmes** (10.46) recorded the team's top marks in the 100 last year, but Watts, one of the nation's premier prep sprinters in 1988, was sidelined much of the season with various ailments and competed in just 3 meets. If he can maintain his health, he is as strong a candidate as anybody for a Pac-10 title and possible All-America recognition. Junior **Martin Cannady** ran a season-best 10.54 at Long Beach City College in 1989 and will bolster what is already a strong sprinting corps. A 1989 NCAA finalist, sophomore **Travis Hannah** won 4 of the 8 400 meters he entered in 1988. His personal-best of 45.54 (against UCLA) gives Bullard good reason to be confident of USC consistently scoring well in the sprints. Hannah, an All-Pac-10 performer, figures to place his name once again among the elite of the Pac-10, a conference noted for its outstanding quality in the 400 meters. As a prep in 1989, **Tony Borquez** (47.50) won the CIF 400 meter title and advanced to the state finals while representing Alemany High of Mission Hills, Calif.

**HURDLES** — Troy loses 2 quality hurdlers from last year, graduating Robert Reading (13.42, USC record), the 1989 NCAA 110m high hurdle champion, while sophomore Ron Copeland (14.42) was not released for competition because of medical reasons. Nonetheless, USC should remain quite competitive in the hurdles. All-American senior **George Porter** (49.19) won the Pac-10 title in the 400m hurdles and finished third at the NCAA championships last year. Heading into the 1990 season, Porter is the frontrunner to capture the individual crown both at the Pac-10 and NCAA levels. Junior **Mark Crear** (14.05, 51.64) finished third in the high hurdles at last year's California State Junior College Meet while competing for Mt. SAC College.

**DISTANCES** — Junior **Mitch Sloan** (3:59.90, 14:51.0, 30:49.30) began to come on toward the end of the 1989 campaign and continued the steady improvement throughout USC's fall cross country season, finishing as Troy's top performer at the Pac-10 Championships (17th) with a 24:19 over an 8K course. Now Sloan, USC's top distance runner, is on the verge of establishing himself for All-Pac-10 recognition. Like Sloan, junior **Dreux Valenti** (3:58.97, 9:04.1, 14:48.0) displayed promising signs in 1989. The pair could combine to give USC high points from the distance events. Freshman **Don Higgins** was the state of Washington's cross country individual runner-up in 1988 and will strongly support the efforts of Sloan and Valenti.

**JUMPS** — The arrival of senior **Dietmar Haaf** (27-0¾), a transfer from the University of Stuttgart in West Germany, has already caused many to wander back in time to the days of Larry Doubly, USC's last NCAA long jump champion in 1988. Haaf competed at the NCAA

Indoor Championships in early March, prepping himself as perhaps a favorite for the outdoor long jump title in June. Sophomore **Jim Campbell** high jumped 6-4 as a rookie in 1989 and is Troy's top threat this year. The pole vault, an Ernie Bullard favorite, returns a pair of 16-footers, sophomore **Todd Lehman** (16-7), and junior **Brooks Morris** (16-1).

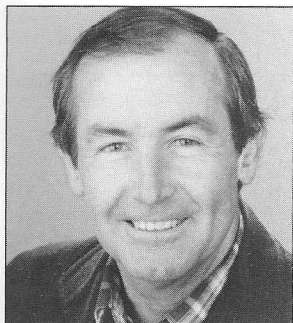
**THROWS** — Though it has not figured prominently in USC scoring in recent years, the throws are making a comeback in the Trojan arsenal. Sophomore **Matt Gee** (213-5), an inside linebacker on the USC football team, set a school-record in the javelin (new implement) in his rookie season last year. Gee, who was the nation's No. 2 high school javelin thrower in 1988 at Arkansas City (Ks.) High, will receive support this year from freshman **John Gallagher**. Gallagher was the Golden West discus champion (192-4) in 1989.

**ERNIE BULLARD**  
**Head Coach**



Former Trojan trackster Ernie Bullard is in his sixth year as USC's head track and field coach.

Bullard, 53, was selected the Trojan coach after Verne Wolfe, who guided USC to 5 NCAA national championships in 22 years, retired following the conclusion of the 1984 season. Coincidentally, Wolfe coached Bullard as a prep at North Phoenix (Ariz.) in 1954.

"This is the successful culmination of my career," says Bullard. "Ever since I was an athlete at

USC, my primary professional goal was to return to my alma mater as its track coach. My experience at San Jose State certainly prepared me well for that."

Upon his arrival at USC, Bullard met with immediate success. His initial Trojan team was ranked 12th in the nation in 1985 dual meet performances by *Track & Field News*. His following team of 1986 was ranked eighth after winning 6 of 7 dual meets.

In the 5 seasons that have followed since Bullard took over, seven school records have fallen. A pole vaulter himself while at USC (his best was 14-4½), Bullard has coached seven 18-foot pole vaulters, the most by any college coach. Three such vaulters include former Trojans Steve Klassen, Doug Wicks and Eric White.

Bullard came to USC after spending 14 seasons as the head coach at San Jose State. He posted a stellar 84-22 (.792) dual meet record at San Jose State, and 6 of his teams finished in the Top 10 in *Track & Field News'* national dual meet rankings.

When he took over at San Jose State in 1971, Bullard maintained the national prominence that the Spartans had enjoyed under the late Bud Winter. Ernie's 1973 team was 9-0 and ranked sixth by *Track & Field News*, and 3 of his later teams also went undefeated (11-0 in 1975, 10-0 in 1977, 6-0 in 1979). The 1975 squad placed fourth in the NCAA meet. His teams won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (now Big West) championship 7 times and were runners-up 5 times.

Four of Bullard's athletes at San Jose State won 7 NCAA titles between them — triple jumper Ron Livers (1975-77-78), high hurdler Dedy Cooper (1976), javelin thrower Curt Ransford (1980) and pole vaulter Felix Bohni (1983 indoor and outdoor). Two others, John Powell in the discus and Dan Ripley in the pole vault, have held world records.

The Spartans won the NCAA title in 1969 while Bullard was an assistant (1969-70) under Winter.

Internationally respected, he has been a member of the U.S. Olympic Development Committee since 1978, is the NCAA District VIII track representative and coached the U.S. junior team against the USSR in 1975.

Bullard was also a successful junior college head coach, serving 2 years (1967-68) at Mesa (Ariz.) Community College and 3 years (1964-66) at Orange Coast College in Costa Mesa (Calif.). His 1968 Mesa team won the national JC meet (which earned him the national JC Coach of the Year honor) after placing second in 1967. His Mesa pupils included several national JC individual champions, JC record

holders and Olympic competitors, including Mark Murro, the first American to throw the javelin 300 feet.

He also coached in the high school ranks. He was the head coach at Tolleson (Ariz.) High in 1961, then served as an assistant at Arcadia High in Phoenix in 1962 and 1963. In 1960, he was a student teacher under Vern Wolfe at North Phoenix High.

Before Bullard came to USC as a student-athlete, he was the national JC pole vault champion in 1956 at Phoenix College and was the Arizona State champ in 1954 at North Phoenix High as a senior under Wolfe.

Bullard received a bachelor's degree in education from USC in 1959 and a master's degree in physical education from Arizona State in 1961. He is the author of 5 books on track and is in demand as a guest at track clinics and camps.

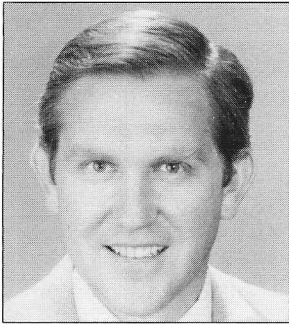
Born on July 30, 1937, he has a son, Denton, 31, and a daughter, Kari, 24, a former USC student.

**LARRY KNUTH — Assistant Coach**



When Ernie Bullard was named head track coach at USC, he called on his old friend and book collaborator, Larry Knuth, to rebuild the USC distance program. The 48-year-old Knuth worked quickly and has impressively rebuilt Troy's distance program. Along with reviving USC's men's and women's cross country programs in 1985, Knuth has coached 3 Trojans who qualified for the NCAA cross country championships, one, Amy Goodwin, also earned All-America recognition, USC's first in cross country.

Bullard found Knuth at Saddleback College (Mission Viejo, Calif.), where he worked as a journalism advisor from 1977 to 1984. During a 3-year stint as cross country coach at UC Irvine, Knuth took a team that finished in last place in the conference during his first year (1979) and won the PCAA title the following year (1980). He was named PCAA Coach of the Year for the turnaround.

In his 15 years as a cross country coach, Knuth's teams have won more than 80 percent of their meets. In 1967 his team at Pasadena (Calif.) City College won the California state JC championship.

Among the other California community colleges where Knuth has coached are Palomar, Glendale and Fullerton. In the first 4 years of his JC coaching career, he had 8 runners who clocked 4:12 or better in the mile, 2 of which were Southern California champions.

At UCI in 1981, one of his runners, John Gerhardt, won the PCAA cross country individual title and another, Joe Young, was the conference 1500M champion. Gerhardt also finished eighth at the 1981 TAC cross country championships.

A fine instructor in the classroom, Knuth teaches courses in USC's sports information academic program.

A 3-sport letterman at California High in Whittier, Calif., Knuth competed for Jim Bush at Fullerton College and Cornelius Warmerdam at Fresno State. Bush went on to build one of collegiate track's finest programs at UCLA, and Warmerdam was the first man to clear 15 feet in the pole vault.

Knuth and his wife June have two daughters, Lindsay, 13, and Cameron, 7.

**JIM BUSH — Assistant Coach**



One of the great coaches in college track, Jim Bush is in his second year coaching USC's hurdlers. Perhaps the only person in history to coach both USC and UCLA teams, Bush guided UCLA to 5 NCAA titles during his 20 years in Westwood. As a result of his outstanding coaching achievement, Bush was voted into the National Track and Field Hall of Fame in 1987.

Bush's expertise in track was immediately evident in his first year at

USC. He coached Trojan senior Robert Reading to the 1989 NCAA individual title in the 110M high hurdles. In the process he became USC's first national champ since 1982.

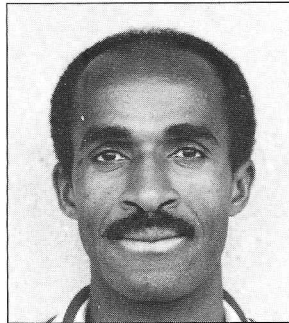
Since retiring from UCLA in 1984, Bush has served as conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers and Los Angeles Raiders.

While at UCLA, Bush's teams won 88.1% of their dual meets and seven conference championships. The Bruins were named National Dual Meet champions 10 times by *Track and Field News* under Bush, posting undefeated seasons in each of those years. He was honored as National Coach of the Year in 1971 and 1973.

Bush began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Berkeley (Calif.) High in 1951 and then moved south to Fullerton High, where he spent 7 years (1952-59). After 2 seasons at Fullerton College (1960-61) and 3 years at Occidental College (1962-64), Bush succeeded the late Ducky Drake as UCLA's head track and cross country coach in 1964.

Born in Cleveland, Ohio, the 63-year-old Bush was a high hurdler at California and graduated from the Berkeley campus in 1951.

**DON QUARRIE — Assistant Coach**



Don Quarrie, a former Trojan sprint great who won a gold medal in the 200 meters for Jamaica in the 1976 Olympics, was named USC's sprint coach for the men's and women's track teams in the fall of 1989.

Quarrie, 38, was the first male sprinter to make an Olympic team 5 times (1968-72-76-80-84). Besides his gold medal in 1976, he won a silver in the 100 in that Olympics, as well as a bronze in the 200 in the 1980 Olympics and a silver as a member of Jamaica's 400-meter relay team in the 1984 Olympics.

A native of Kingston, Jamaica, Quarrie was ranked in the top 6 in the world in the 100 meters 6 times, including No. 1 in 1976, and in the world's top 10 in the 200 meters 9 times, including No. 1 in 1975 and 1976. His personal best times were 10.07 in the 100 and a then-world record 19.8 in the 200.

He lettered at USC in 1972 and 1973, captaining the 1973 squad. He shares the school record in the 220-yard dash with Willie Deckard at 20.2 and also ran the anchor leg on the school record 880-yard relay team.

Quarrie received both his bachelor's (in business administration in 1974) and master's (in business administration in 1978) degrees from USC.

In 1984, he established Don Quarrie and Associates in which he independently coaches on a consulting basis throughout the world. In addition, he has worked as a consultant for Nike in recent years.

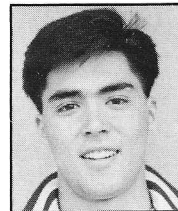

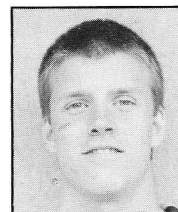
**TONY BORQUEZ — 6-1, 175, Freshman, Sprints**

**CAREER BESTS:** 400M - 47.50, 200M - 21.58.



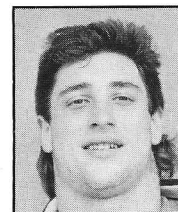
**JOHN GALLAGHER — 6-1, 220, Freshman, Throws**

**MATT GEE — 6-3, 235, Sophomore, Throws**

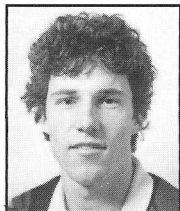

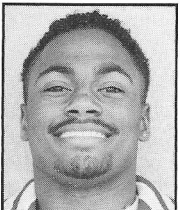


**DIETMAR HAAF — 5-10, 155, Senior, Jumps International:** Dietmar Haaf enters his first year at USC as one of the world's premier long jumpers . . . captured the 1990 German (26-11) and European (26-7) championships in February and March of this season . . . his winning mark in the German Championships (held in Sindelfingen, W.G.) was the fourth best in the world during the 1990 indoor season . . . owns the tenth best indoor mark ever, jumping a career-best 27-0¾ at Sindelfingen, West Germany last year . . . the jump was also the ninth best in the world in 1989 . . . has defeated all the current top-ranked jumpers except Carl Lewis and Larry Myricks . . . at a 1989 meet in Stuttgart, West Germany, Haaf led Lewis through the first 5 jumps, but Lewis, who owns a 62-meet long jump winning streak entering 1990, edged Dietmar on the final jump of the competition . . . for the past 3 years competed with the Salamander Track Club in West Germany.

**COLLEGE:** Dietmar attended University of Stuttgart for 3 years where he studied mechanical engineering . . . did not represent Stuttgart in track and field . . . won the 1986 world junior championship with a jump of 26-2.

**PERSONAL:** Dietmar was born March 6, 1967 in Stuttgart, West Germany . . . attended Max Eyth High School . . . majoring in mechanical engineering at USC . . . first started taking classes in English 9 years ago, but admits, "I've learned more English in the past 6 months than I did in 9 years of classwork." . . . was at USC when the Berlin Wall fell, but of the event Dietmar said "Two weeks prior, I was talking to people back home and we thought everything was normal. It came to me as a total surprise. I would have never predicted it to fall."

**CAREER BESTS:** Long Jump - 27-0¾.



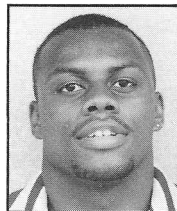
**TRAVIS HANNAH — 5-9, 165, Sophomore, Sprints**

**CALVIN HOLMES — 5-10, 180, Junior, Sprints**

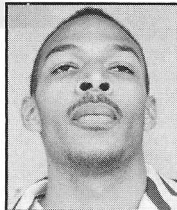

**CAREER BESTS:** 100M - 10.46 (10.36w), 200M - 21.43.



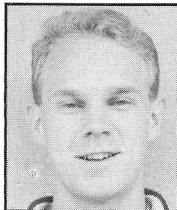
**DAYN KIRKSEY — 6-2, 175, Sophomore, Sprints**

meets entered.

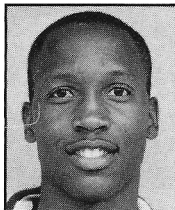

last year's NCAA championships in Provo, Utah . . . won the 400M hurdles at the USC triangular (50.14), Fresno Relays (51.29), USC Centennial (50.0) and UCLA dual (50.45) . . . **1988:** Finished third at the TAC Championships with a 49.49 in the 400M hurdles . . . took fifth at the NCAA Championships with a 50.37 . . . competed in the U.S. Olympic Trials . . . finished seventh in the Pac-10 finals . . . **1987:** Qualified for the NCAA Championships in Baton Rouge, La., but did not advance to the finals . . . at Pac-10 meet in Corvallis, Ore., Porter was leading his heat when he tripped over the last hurdle and did not finish . . . experienced similar misfortune at the Jenner Classic when he fell over the eighth hurdle . . . ran a 51.06 in his first collegiate 400M hurdles to win the USC Invitational . . . anchored the second-place Trojans in the 1600M relay at the 1987 Pac-10 meet . . . **1986:** Redshirted the season because of a chronic hamstring injury.

**HIGH SCHOOL:** The national high school record holder at Cabrillo High in Lompoc, Calif., in the 300M hurdles with a mark of 35.32, breaking Danny Harris' (1984 Olympic silver medalist) 1983 mark of 35.52 . . . was undefeated during his senior year in 1985, including the league, CIF 1-A, state and International Prep Invitational titles . . . was *Track & Field News'* top-ranked intermediate hurdler among the nation's preps in 1985 and was No. 3 in 1984 . . . won the California state 400M hurdle title in 1984 . . . a fine high hurdler, he won the CIF 1-A 110M highs at the 1985 CIF meet (14.29, the race was rerun a week later because it was originally run over a short course) . . . was named the state's Athlete of the Year in 1985 by Cal-Hi Sports . . . a star basketball player, Porter averaged 21 points a game for Cabrillo's cagers in 1985.

**PERSONAL:** George was born in Topeka, Ks., on Dec. 19, 1966 . . . majoring in urban planning.

**CAREER BEST:** 49.19 - 400M hurdles.

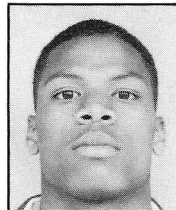

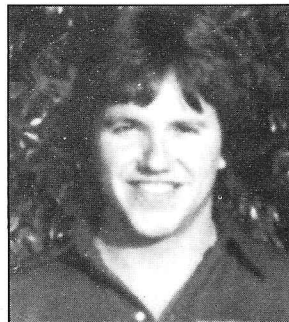

**Trainer**



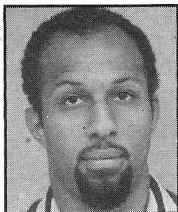
In his 11th year at USC, Byron Hansen handles the duties as trainer for the men's track and field team, as well as other intercollegiate sports at Troy.

Byron and his wife, Laurie, have two daughters, Kelly, 4, and Kristin, 1.



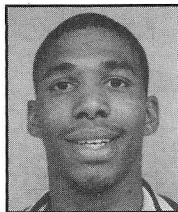
**MARTIN CANNADY — 5-11, 175, Junior, Sprints**

**CAREER BESTS:** 100M - 10.54, 200M - 21.04, 400M - 46.71.



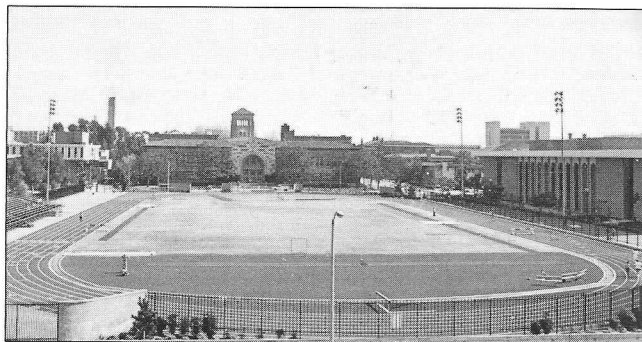
**MARK CREAR — 6-1, 175, Junior, Hurdles**

**JUNIOR COLLEGE:** USC's top performer in the high hurdles (already clocked a 13.77 this year), Mark Crear enjoyed a fine junior college career at Mt. San Antonio College (Walnut, Calif.) . . . as a sophomore last year, Mark finished third in the California state junior college meet with a then personal-best 14.07 . . . as a freshman in 1988, placed sixth in the high hurdles at the state meet.

**CROMWELL TRACK AND FIELD**

Used as a training and warm-up facility during the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles, Cromwell Track and Field underwent a complete refurbishing in fall, 1983. Not only was the track resurfaced, but a new drainage system was also added.

A new Rekortan surface, the same as the Olympic track in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, has eight, 42-inch lanes. The high jump area is larger than before and there are two new sand pits for the horizontal jumps.

Cromwell Field had been renovated in 1979, but all that remains from the first facelift is the equipment storeroom and weightroom on the track's southwest perimeter. Although there are no permanent grandstands yet, a \$1.8 million fundraising drive is on, and when that financial goal is reached, a doubledeck stadium capable of holding 5,000 people will be constructed.

**CHAMPIONS AND RECORD HOLDERS**

**WORLD RECORDS:** 61 USC trackmen have equalled or bettered world records since 1912.

**OLYMPIC GAMES:** USC trackmen have won 23 individual Olympic titles and have shared in seven relay victories. Fifty-seven men have won a total of 86 places on United States Olympic teams.

**NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS:** USC has won 26 out of the 64 NCAA Outdoor meets since its beginning in 1921. On 10 occasions they have finished second. The Trojans won nine in a row (1935-1943), and seven straight (1949-1955). They have also won two NCAA Indoor Championships since its beginning in 1965. A total of 97 individual outdoor championships highlight the record.

**USC: NO. 1 IN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS**

USC has long dominated the world of intercollegiate athletics. Trojan men's teams are tops in the nation in NCAA championships with 64 — far more than any other university. And the football team has been voted national champions eight times.

USC has won the National Collegiate All-Sports Championship — an annual ranking by The Knoxville Journal of the country's top men's athletic programs — six times (1971-72-74-75-77-80) since its inception in 1971.

USC's women are also a force, with 13 national team titles, all since 1976.

From 1959-60 to 1984-85, USC put together an amazing streak. In each of those 26 years, at least one Trojan team won a national championship (including five crowns in both 1962-63 and 1976-77).

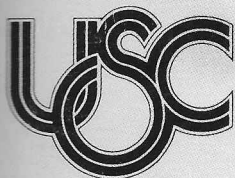

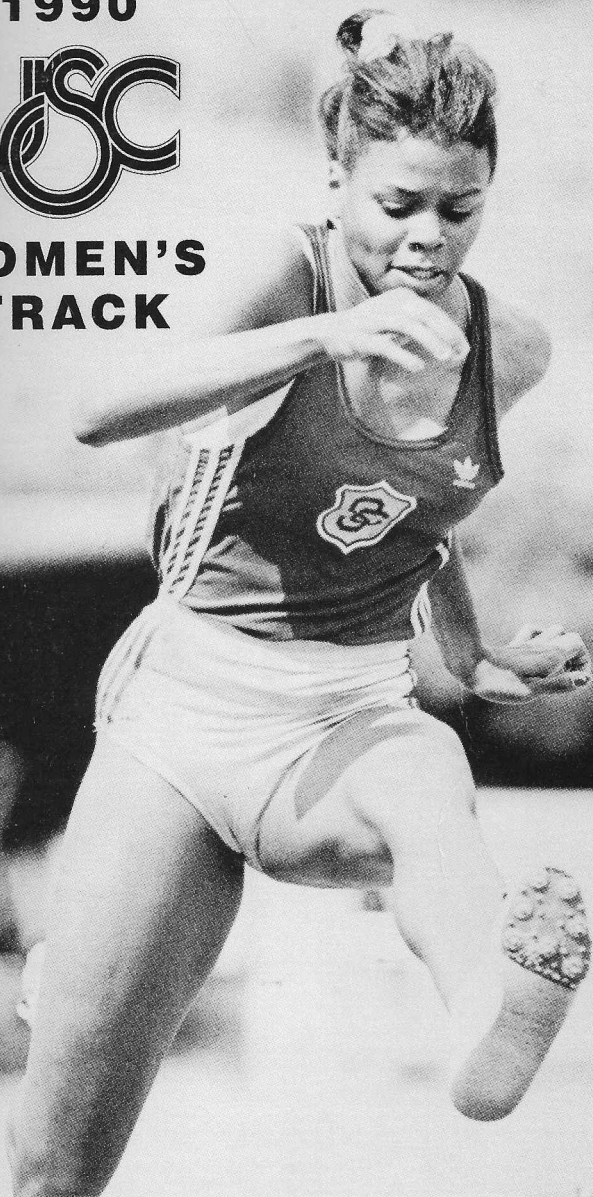

## 1990 USC WOMEN'S TRACK AND FIELD OUTLOOK

No one can ever accuse Mike Bailey, USC's second year head coach, of thinking small. No, Bailey isn't one who easily finds contentment. Rather, he searches for challenges, and the challenge he has set forth for he and his 1990 Women of Troy track team is a top 5 finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championship meet.

USC finished eighth as last year's NCAA Championships, yet only 1 scorer is back. Nonetheless, one glance at the USC roster, and Bailey's eyes seem to light up. "The numbers aren't necessarily in our favor," said Bailey. "We don't have a lot of depth. So just like last year, we can't afford injuries. But we certainly have some fine individual talent."

Olympian **Leslie Maxie** is back, looking to pursue a championship in the 400M hurdles and points in the high hurdles. Like Maxie, sophomore thrower **Ashley Selman** has thoughts of an NCAA individual championship dancing through her mind as well. And though the competition within the Pac-10 is highly keen, even junior hurdler **Effie Daetz** entertains the idea of unparalleled success in the high hurdles.

"We're the type of team that won't score a lot in dual meets or maybe even at the Pac-10 meet," added Bailey. "You need depth to score where few teams are involved in the competition. Our talent lies with one outstanding individual in nearly every event. Therefore, I believe we can score a fair amount of points at the NCAAs.

Here's a breakdown of the 1990 Women of Troy:

**SPRINTS** — Juniors **Ronda Brooks** (11.73, 23.95) and **Louan Guialdo** (11.91, 24.10) are back and are healthy. Troy's depth was sorely depleted last year when both sprinters went down early in the season with hamstring pulls. Senior **Noelle Chapin** (24.97, 54.91), the lone returning sprinter to compete all of last year, supplies USC with experience. Senior **Leslie Maxie** (24.08) will add the sprints to her repertoire, including the 100M which she hasn't run since high school. Nonetheless, the arrival of such speed should strengthen USC's arsenal. Freshman **Angela Rolfe**, one of Bailey's top recruits, gives USC quality depth that should make the Women of Troy a threat to win in each sprint.

**HURDLES** — Maxie, the 1987 NCAA runner-up in the 400M hurdles, combines with junior **Effie Daetz** (13.94, 63.64) and sophomore **Michelle DeCoux** (14.31, 59.66) to give USC one of the strongest corps of hurdlers in the nation. Maxie is a 1988 U.S. Olympian in the 400M hurdles. Daetz was an All-Pac-10 performer as just a sophomore last year and qualified for the 1988 NCAA Indoor Championships as well. DeCoux was a 2-time state champion who now has a year of college experience to draw upon.

**DISTANCES** — Bailey figures the combination of senior **Shannon Clark** (2:07.79, 4:22.06) and sophomore **Amy Goodwin** (2:08.64, 4:27.70) gives USC excellent talent and a tandem that can score points in bunches in dual or multi-team meets. Clark, who enjoyed an outstanding freshman season, was sidetracked last year by the flu. Goodwin is USC's first All-American in cross country. Her fall success will hopefully carry over to the spring.

**JUMPS** — In the words of Bailey, junior **Yleana Carrasco** (6-0) is "ready to take off." Carrasco was a celebrated jumper in high school, yet a broken bone and stretched ligaments have severely hampered her USC career thus far. Junior **Louan Guialdo** (20-7¼, 5-6) qualified last year for the NCAA meet in the long jump. Though a rookie to the college ranks, freshman **Karen Kelly** (5-7) has the ability to perform well for the Trojans.

**THROWS** — Across the board — the discus, shot and javelin — the Trojans are stronger than in years past. And it will be the sophomores who lead the way. Sophomore **Ashley Selman** (187-9) is a leading candidate for the NCAA javelin title. Sophomore **Teresa Ortega** (137-0) redshirted last year in hope that the maturity gained from a year layoff will produce some outstanding marks. Like Ortega, sophomore **Rugina Hendricks** (40-11¾, 135-7) redshirted last year. Yet her 40-11¾ in the shot as a mere freshman gives reason to believe that bigger and better marks for Hendricks are on the horizon . . . **Heptathlon** — Selman (4445) performed well in high school, but bone problems kept her away from the multi-event last year. Carrasco, a 4-year starter on the USC women's volleyball team, will showcase her athletic talent when she takes on the heptathlon for the first time ever this year. Freshman **Karen Kelly** is also a promising newcomer who will begin her first year in the grueling 7-event heptathlon.

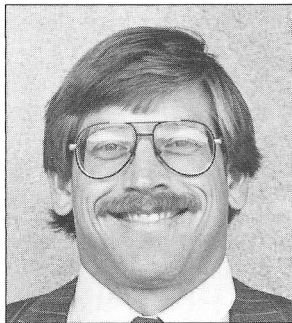

## **MIKE BAILEY**

### **Head Coach**



In light of his success at USC in only 3 years, it's hard to ignore Mike Bailey's imprint on the women's track and field program at Troy.

After serving as Fred LaPlante's assistant for 2 seasons, Bailey took over the reigns of USC track and field last year and promptly guided the Women of Troy to a Top-10 finish (eighth) at the NCAA Outdoor Championship Meet. He coached 3 All-Americans in his initial season and became the overseer of one of track's finest young arms in javelin thrower Ashley Selman.

In his first year at USC, Bailey coached two Pac-10 champs (Wendy Brown and Diana Clemens), and helped Wendy Brown to the 1988 NCAA heptathlon title and a place on the 1988 U.S. Olympic team. He helped Yvette Bates to two NCAA indoor triple jump titles and to the Olympic Trials.

Before coming to USC, Bailey coached at Idaho State for 2 years and at Judge Memorial High in Salt Lake City, Utah for 4 years.

A former decathlete himself, the 33-year-old Bailey has scored 7,621 points in the 10-eventer, even though he never competed in college track. Instead, he started for 4 years at middle linebacker at Utah and continued for 2 years in the Canadian Football League with Calgary and Saskatchewan.

Mike and his wife, Cindy, who also serves as the recruiting coordinator for USC women's track, have a 13-year-old son, Michael.

## **HELAINÉ CLAYMAN**

### **Trainer**



A 1980 graduate of USC, Clayman serves as the trainer for the Women of Troy track squad.

In her tenth year on USC's training staff, the 31-year-old Clayman also works with all other women's sports at Troy, as well as men's volleyball. She earned her bachelor's degree in sports medicine and is currently working on her doctorate in exercise physiology.

Clayman was a swimmer as a prep and graduated from Venice (Calif.) High in 1976.
