Events over one lap are officially recorded in tenths and no auto timing factors are therefore presented.

100 yard, 100 meter, 200 meter, 220 yard hand times are converted to automatic "equivalents" by adding a factor of 0.24; 400 meter flat and hurdles, add 0.14; 400 relay, add 0.14 hand-timed yards to automatic metric equivalent; 440 yards flat and hurdles, subtract 0.16; 440 relay, subtract 0.06; hand-timed decathlons are worth about an extra 75 points compared to an automatically timed ten-eventer.







1991 USC MEN'S OUTLOOK

If nothing else, 40 years of coaching track and field has given Jim Bush -- the longtime UCLA head coach who takes over this year as head coach of USC's combined men's and women's programs -- a true picture of reality. In his long tenure in the sport, Bush has experienced both the highs and lows. He knows what it takes to win, because after all he's coached 5 NCAA championship teams. So when he says **"We've got a lot of work ahead of us,"** as he views the 1991 USC men's roster, he knows what he's talking about. **"Track is going to make a comeback at USC,"** says Bush, **"but it's going to take time and those involved with the resurgence of the sport can't be afraid of work."**

USC returns 20 athletes from last year's team and adds 10 freshmen to the arsenal this year. Nonetheless, Bush realizes the team is a year away from pushing around the higher echelon of the Pac-10.

"We have some excellent talent in the sprints, perhaps as fine as any in the nation," said Bush. **"And though we have some fine ability in the hurdles, we're not deep. The same can be said of our distances, jumps and pole vault. Our greatest weakness lies in the throws where we have just 3 competitors. The entire throwing program has to be rebuilt."**

"I'd like to think this team can move into the top 5 of the conference this year. But a lot depends on the athletes' transition to a new system and their physical progress."

Here's an event breakdown of the 1991 Trojans.

SPRINTS--USC's sprinters feature 3 state prep champions, 2 who owned the nation's top mark during their senior year. **"If I had to pick the top sprint corps in the nation, I'd be partial and pick this group,"** said Bush. **"At the very least, you'd have to rate them among the top 3 in the nation."** Junior **Quincy Watts** (10.46, 20.67), a 3-time California prep champion in the 100m and 200m, spearheads Troy's talented sprinters. Though he has spent much of his first 2 college seasons sidelined with injuries, Watts has endured the 1990 Trojan football season without physical damage and hopes that will translate into a successful track campaign. Watts advanced to the semis of last year's NCAA meet but was unable to finish because of a hamstring pull. **"I expect this to be Quincy's best year ever,"** Bush said. **"This season of football has made him stronger and more competitive when he gets injured."** Junior **Travis Hannah** (21.32, 45.54) is among the nation's best in the 400m after finishing sixth at the NCAAs last year and second at the Pac-10s. Hannah is a key figure in Troy's relays, particularly the 4x400m. **"Travis runs the curve as well as anyone I've seen,"** said Bush. **"He has outstanding talent that hasn't been fully utilized."** Senior **Martin Cannady** (21.04, 46.83) surprised many with a steady and fine 1990 campaign. More, however, is expected from Cannady this year. Freshman **Curtis Conway** (10.42, 20.89) has the ability to make an impact on the Pac-10 this season. Like Watts and Hannah, Conway was a California high school sprint champion. Conway did not compete last year, sitting out the season before enrolling at USC. Bush doesn't expect the year layoff to have much of an effect on Conway. Trojan footballer **Scott Lockwood** (10.54), who in the terms of Bush is "one of the finest sprinters ever to come out of Colorado," will run the 100m when he's not splitting time with football's spring drills. Sophomores **John Kaisersatt** and **Tony Borquez** round out the Trojan sprint roster.

HURDLES--A year ago USC had perhaps the 2 top hurdlers in the conference in intermediate performer George Porter, a 2-time Pac-10 champion, and high hurdler Mark Crear, who took third at the NCAA's last year. However, neither one is back (Porter graduated and Crear is redshirting because of a hip injury) and Bush has to lean on youth and inexperience in the hurdles. USC is not without talent. Freshman **John Herpin** comes in after posting the nation's top prep mark in the high hurdles as a junior in 1989 (13.52). Last year, Herpin, who redshirted the 1990 USC football season as a flanker, was slowed by a broken arm that he sustained during his senior prep football season, but he did manage the fourth best mark in the nation (13.65). "**Herpin is fast and tough,**" says Bush. "**It usually takes a year for a freshman to adjust to the 42-inch hurdle, but John is the type of athlete who can make that adjustment this season.**" Freshman **Eric Klassen** (13.80 in high school) is a quality high hurdler who will team well with Herpin. Martin Cannady, whose strong suit is the 400m, will try his hand at the intermediates for the first time on the college level. USC's need for an intermediate hurdler necessitated Cannady's attempt to retry the hurdles. He enjoyed success in the 300m intermediates in high school, but dropped the event on the college circuit. First-year hurdler **Kristian Lewis** gives USC some depth.

DISTANCES--Senior **Mitch Sloan** (3:54.49, 14:51.0, 30:15.1) plans to build on an outstanding 1990 junior season which saw him post career-bests in the 1500m and 10,000m. USC's greatest threat in the distances, Sloan is hoping that a strong cross country season last fall, in which he advanced to the NCAA championships, will translate into an even better 1991 track campaign. "**What Mitch lacks in speed he makes up in competitiveness,**" said Bush. "**He's our best chance for scoring at the Pac-10 meet.**" Senior **Dreux Valenti** (3:57.71, 9:04.1, 14:48.0) pairs well with Sloan to give Troy a solid scoring punch at small meets. Junior **Dave Beaudet** (14:47.47) clocked a season-best last year to record USC's top mark in the 5000m. Similar steps in improvement by Beaudet would be greatly welcomed in 1991. Sophomores **Don Higgins** and **Todd Overstreet** competed on a limited basis last year and will need to make great strides this year if Troy is to be a threat in the distances. "**Todd has great potential,**" said Bush. "**He has all the tools to do the 800m under 1:50, but he has to want it.**" Freshmen **Frank Olivar** and **Shinsuke Nishihara** join sophomore **Dan Vigil** and juniors **Tom Piazza** and **Robert Dennis** from USC's cross country program.


JUMPS--The arrival of assistant coach **Milan Tiff** may prove to be just as significant as any mark achieved by a Trojan jumper this year. Tiff inherits 3 long jumpers who have shown considerable improvement during Troy's fall workouts. Senior **Mark Michaelian** (23-0 1/2) has displayed the greatest improvement and could be a participant at the Pac-10 Championships. A sprinter his first 2 years at USC, junior **Dayn Kirksey** is one of Tiff's most promising projects this year. Freshman **Chris Hawley** is a developing jumper who should benefit greatly from Tiff's coaching. There are no Trojan triple jumpers but Michaelian has toyed with the event in past years and on a rare occasion may try the event this year. USC returns all 3 of its high jumpers from last year, junior **Jim Campbell** (6-8) and sophomores **Griff Joyce** (6-8) and **Deny Sepaher**(6-8). Each jumper recorded career-bests last year. "**We could surprise some people in jumps this year,**" said Bush. "**Milan will have a huge impact on our long jumpers. In addition, we return 3 solid high jumpers who exhibited outstanding improvement last year and are capable of doing so again this year.**"


POLE VAULT--Senior **Brooks Morris** (16-4 3/4), junior **Todd Lehman**(16-7) and redshirt freshman **Eric Klassen** (15-8) comprise Troy's pole vaulting unit. If the 2 returnees can maintain consistency throughout the season they could be a valuable asset at scoring meets. Morris vaulted a career-high 16-4 3/4 during last year's indoor season but was felled by an injury that kept him out of the outdoor season. Lehman, a former Arizona state high school champion, has demonstrated great potential but hasn't been consistent in his performances. He vaulted a season-best 16-6 in the third meet last year but finished the season with a 15-11 at the Occidental Invitational and 15-9 at the Pac-10 championships. Klassen, an outstanding athlete, could be a double threat for USC in both the high hurdles and vault. "**Some people may chuckle at me, but I think all 3 of these vaulters can be over 17 feet by the season's end,**" Bush said.

THROWS--Though quantity is shallow, the quality is outstanding. With just 2 throwers on the entire roster, Bush leans heavily on junior javelin thrower **Matt Gee** (213-5) and freshman discus thrower **Joe Cajic** (185-0 in high school) for some point production. Gee, once the top prep thrower in the nation, has been slowed by injuries the past 2 years. However, if he can preserve his health for the entire season then perhaps he'll push for the Pac-10 crown. Bush admits that Cajic is young and needs time to get used to the college implements. Nevertheless, USC can use some choice performances from Cajic. "**Obviously, this is our weakest event, but not because of the performers but because of the lack of performers,**" said Bush. "**We have no shot putter or hammer thrower and we certainly have no depth. We'll take a beating in scoring meets when it comes to the throws.**"

DECATHLON--USC's lone decathlete is freshman **James Prestridge** who has provided multi-event coach Mike Bailey with early optimism about the future. Prestridge has competed in just 1 decathlon prior to this season, logging 5,621 points to finish second in the high school division of the 1990 Mt. SAC Relays. A full year of concentration and training should advance Prestridge's stock in the Pac-10.

JIM BUSH Head Coach



It's one of the most unusual pairings in the history of college athletics, but logically it's a natural fit. Longtime UCLA coach Jim Bush is now a Trojan, beginning his first year as head coach of USC's newly consolidated men's and women's track and field programs. Bush, a 1987 inductee in the National Track and Field Hall of Fame as one of the collegiate ranks' most successful coaches ever, is now the head coach of the winningest collegiate

track and field program, and in the process becomes the first person ever to coach both the UCLA and USC track programs.

"I never planned on this happening," said Bush. "You save the very best for last. This is definitely my last coaching assignment, but I think it's the best. I'm very excited about being a Trojan."

Bush, who served the past 2 years (1989-90) as a volunteer assistant coach at USC, spent 20 years (1965-84) as the head coach at UCLA, guiding the Bruins to 5 NCAA titles (1966-71-72-73-78) and 3 second place finishes (1974-75-80). All told, 15 of his 20 UCLA teams finished among the NCAA's top 5. His teams won 87.9% of their dual meets (152-21), 7 national dual meet championships awarded by Track & Field News, and 7 conference championships. In addition, UCLA posted 10 undefeated seasons under Bush, putting together winning streaks of 17, 20, 34 and 42.

The 1971 and 1973 U.S. Track Coaches Association National Coach of the Year (the first 2-time recipient), Bush has coached 33 NCAA outdoor individual champions (including USC's Robert Reading, winner of the 1989 high hurdles and USC's first NCAA champ since 1982) and 19 Olympians, including former Bruins Wayne Collett, John Smith, Willie Banks, Greg Foster and Andre Phillips.

Prior to Bush's arrival on the Westwood campus, UCLA had never beaten USC in 32 tries. However, under Bush, the Bruins not only defeated USC, they collected 13 wins in 19 dual meets with the Trojans.

In 1984, Bush retired from UCLA at the age of 58 and spent the following 5 years as the conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers, the Los Angeles Raiders and the Los Angeles Clippers. While still at UCLA in the early 1970s, Bush served 3 years as the conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Lakers and Los Angeles Kings. He returned to track in 1989 when longtime friend Ernie Bullard invited Bush to take part in the USC track program as a volunteer assistant for the men's hurdles.

A noted author, lecturer and clinician, Bush has served as a consultant to the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports and the U.S. National Fitness Foundation. He was president of the U.S. Track Coaches Association (1972-73), chairman of the Western United States Olympic Development Committee, on the NCAA Track Coaches Association executive committee for 10 years, and on the Athletic Congress executive board for 7 years. He was head coach of the U.S. team at the 1979 Pan American Games. He also acted as

technical director for the track scenes in NBC's movie "The Golden Moment." He served as a writer for UPI at the 1968 and 1972 Olympics.

Bush, a 1951 graduate of California, began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for Golden Bear football coach Pappy Waldorf. He served as an assistant track coach at Berkeley (Calif.) High in the 1952 season and then move to Southern California, spending 7 seasons (1953-59) at Fullerton (Calif.) High. After 2 seasons (1960-61) at Fullerton College and 3 years (1962-64) at Occidental College, Bush succeeded the late Ducky Drake as UCLA's head coach in 1965.

Born Sept. 15, 1926 in Cleveland, Ohio, Bush moved with his family to California when he was 3 years old. He prepped at Bakersfield (Calif.) High and lettered in both track and football. His athletic accomplishments merited him as an inductee into the Kern County Hall of Fame. Upon graduation in 1944, Bush joined the Naval Air Corps.

Jim has 2 children, Jean and Don. He and his wife, Francoise, live in Culver City.

MIKE BAILEY
Assistant Coach

In his fifth season at USC, Mike Bailey has been instrumental in USC's recent success in the throws and multi-events. Bailey was the head coach of the USC women's program that past 2 seasons (1989-90) before it was consolidated under one umbrella with the men's program. As a result, Bailey returns his focus to his first love -- the field events, where he has already coached 3 of USC's 4 all-time NCAA women champions. Bailey guided Wendy Brown (heptathlon), Yvette Bates (triple jump) and Ashley Selman (javelin) to their respective NCAA crowns. Indeed, he's made quite an impact on USC track and field in a short span.

In his 2 years as women's head coach, Bailey led USC to 5 wins in 7 dual meets. He coached 18 All-Americans and 7 USC record holders. Bailey, who spent 2 prior seasons (1987-88) as Fred LaPlante's assistant at USC, guided the Women of Troy to a ninth place finish at the 1989 NAAs, his first season as USC's head coach.

The 34-year-old Bailey came to USC in 1987 after spending 2 years (1985-86) as the head women's coach at Idaho State. For 4 previous years (1981-84), he was the head coach at Judge Memorial High in Salt Lake City, Utah.

A strong technician in the multi-events, Bailey draws upon his own experience as a decathlete, though he never competed in college track and field. He was a celebrated high school decathlete and was the 1974 and 1975 Western U.S. decathlon champion. He gave up the decathlon in college and starred for 4 years as a middle linebacker at Utah. He continued playing football for 2 years in the Canadian Football League with Calgary and Saskatchewan. Upon his departure from football, Bailey resumed training in the decathlon in 1982. He logged a personal best of 7,621 points in the 10-eventer. A ruptured Achilles tendon in 1987 ended his competition and signaled the start of his coaching career.

Mike and his wife, Cindy, have a 14-year old son, Michael.



BARBARA EDMONSON
Assistant Coach


One of the finest women sprinters of all-time, Barbara Edmonson is in her first year on the USC track and field coaching staff and in the process become one of the few, if any, coaches to handle both the men's and women's sprinters at a Division I program. Edmonson is a former world record holder in the 50m, 100m and 200m and, competing under her maiden name of Ferrell,

was a member of the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic teams. In fact, she won the 100m gold and the 200m silver at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. Like fellow Trojan assistant Milan Tiff, she was recognized for several years as the United States' top performer in her specialties. And like head coach Jim Bush, Edmonson is a member

of the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame (1988 inductee). She is the 11th track and field Hall of Fame member to be associated with USC.

Edmonson was an elementary teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District for 8 years (1968-76) and continued to compete on an international level for much of her teaching career. In 1976, she moved on to become the United Teachers of Los Angeles union representative. At the same time, she returned to track as a coach for the Beyond Athletics Track Club. In 1980, she stepped up to the college ranks, coaching the sprinters at West Los Angeles Junior College. Edmonson became the head boy's and girl's coach at St. Bernard High in Playa Del Rey, Calif., in 1988 and led both teams to the league title.

She is the wife of past UCLA sprint great Warren Edmonson, the 1972 NCAA 100m champion.




JOHN MEDVED
Assistant Coach

Charged with the instruction of USC's distance program, John Medved comes to USC from Occidental College in Eagle Rock, Calif., from where he graduated in 1984 and held a similar position on the coaching staff the past 3 years (1988-90).

A standout on Occidental's cross country team, Medved his began coaching career at an early age, working with Oxy tracksters while still an undergraduate. Upon graduation, he served as head coach of both the men's and women's track and field programs at Blair High School in Pasadena, Calif.

As a prep, Medved was an honored distance runner at Vista High in San Diego.

The 28-year old Medved also coordinates the USC men's and women's cross country programs under Bush's direction. John is single and is a math teacher at Manual Arts High in Los Angeles.



MILAN TIFF
Assistant Coach

One of the greatest triple jumpers ever, Milan Tiff is reunited with his college coach Jim Bush, serving as a first-year Trojan assistant of the horizontal jumps.

A 5-time U.S. champ in the triple jump (1969-70-71-72-73), Tiff won 3 NCAA individual titles, set the NCAA triple jump record, and was a member of the 1973 NCAA Championship team at UCLA. Many regard Tiff

as the man who revolutionized the sport in the United States. After touring Europe during the summer months of his collegiate competition, Tiff brought back to the States a technique and style used by the Soviets who were the world leaders in the event at the time. All 5 of his U.S. titles were captured during his college days. Though a spot on the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic teams seemed certain, Tiff, for

personal reasons, chose to forego the Olympic Games. His final official competition came as a 22-year senior at UCLA in the 1973 NCAA Championships.


Tiff's collegiate career began at Miami of Ohio where he won the NCAA and the Mid-America Conference triple jump titles during his freshman and sophomore seasons. Following his 1970 sophomore year, Tiff transferred to UCLA in hopes of collecting a team crown to go along with his individual championships. He sat out the 1971 season (but still won the U.S. title) and came back in 1972 to collect his first of 2 team titles as a Bruin, yet he finished fourth in the triple jump. The following year, Tiff collected the triple jump crown with a then NCAA record (54-1 $\frac{3}{4}$) as UCLA won the championship. Tiff was a Bruin captain his senior year.

As a prep at Shaker Heights (Ohio) High School, Milan set the national scholastic record with a jump of 50-5.

In 1989 Tiff returned to active competition on the master's circuit and is the current world record holder on the master's level with a jump of 53-11.

Tiff, who has coached world record holder Willie Banks, 1984 Olympic gold medalist Al Joyner and 1988 Olympic silver medalist Mike Powell, is also a painter of abstract realism and has artwork in exhibits throughout the nation.

Milan and his wife, Aleita, live in Brentwood, Calif., with their 2 daughters, Synue (11) and Zaade (9).

Assistant Coach


Robert Reading, who put his name alongside the many great high hurdlers in USC history, returns to his alma mater as a volunteer hurdles coach for Bush.

As a senior in 1989, Reading captured the NCAA high hurdles title with a wind-aided 13.19. In the semis he clocked a legal 13.42, a USC record and the third fastest time in Pac-10 history. With the title he

became the 97th Trojan to win an NCAA crown (the seventh in the high hurdles) and the first since 1982. A 2-time Pac-10 champion, Reading won 8 of 9 races run his senior year.

In high school, he won the state high hurdles title at St. Mary's College High in Berkeley, Calif.

Reading, who studied communications at USC, is a sales representative for All-Sport Photography in Los Angeles.



BYRON HANSEN
Trainer

In his 12th year at USC, Byron Hansen handles the duties as trainer for the men's track and field team, as well as other intercollegiate sports at Troy.

The 35-year-old Hansen came to USC in 1980 after serving as an assistant trainer at Colorado from 1978 to 1980. He received his master's degree in physical education from Colorado in 1981.

Byron also served as a trainer for basketball at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles.

A native of Albany, Oregon, Hansen received his bachelor's degree from Oregon in 1978 in Health Education. At South Albany High, Hansen lettered in football as a running back.

Byron and his wife, Laurie, have two daughters, Kelly, 5, and Kristin, 2.



6-1, 175, Sophomore, Sprints

THIS YEAR: Tony Borquez joins the likes of Curtis Conway, Travis Hannah and Martin Cannady to give USC unusual strength in the quarter-mile and flexibility in the 1600m relay.

COLLEGE -- 1990: Tony competed in just 1 meet, recording a 50.94 in the 400m at the Aztec Invitational (March 3).

HIGH SCHOOL: Borquez showcased his talent in prime time when he won the high school 500m at the 1989 Sunkist indoor meet...a 3-time Del Rey League champion in the 400m while at Alemany High in Mission Hills, Calif...advanced to the state 400m finals in his junior and senior years...finished third in the 1989 Arcadia Invitational 400m.

PERSONAL: Tony was born on April 14, 1971, in Van Nuys, Calif...majoring in business at USC...is a computer whiz.

CAREER BESTS: 200m - 21.58, 400m - 47.50.



JOE CAJIC

6-4, 285, Freshman, Throws

THIS YEAR: USC's most promising newcomer in the throws, Joe Cajic is 1 of 7 Trojan footballers on the track team (Cajic redshirted the 1990 football season as an offensive guard). He and fellow footballer Matt Gee comprise the strength of USC's throwing events.

HIGH SCHOOL: Cajic was the 1989 and 1990 Arizona state champion in the discus while at Shadow Mountain High in Phoenix...was also crowned the 1990 state champion in the shot put...won the Great Southwestern discus championship as a junior in 1989...was a 2-sport standout at Shadow Mountain...was a 3-year starting offensive guard in football, winning all-state honors his senior year.

PERSONAL: Joe was born on Sept. 30, 1971, in Cleveland, Ohio...majoring in education...gave up football after his junior year in high school to concentrate on a blossoming track future, but returned to football early his senior year because he missed the game.

CAREER BEST: Discus - 185-0, Shot Put - 56-10 (high school implements)



MARTIN CANNADY
5-11, 175, Senior, Sprints

THIS YEAR: One of the Pac-10's top quarter-milers, Cannady is a key figure for USC in both the 400m and the 1600m relays. He joins Travis Hannah and Curtis Conway as the backbone of one of the strongest 1600m relay teams in the nation. A potential NCAA qualifier in the open 400m, Cannady may add the intermediate hurdles to his repertoire this year. He serves as team co-captain junior Todd Lehman.


COLLEGE -- 1990: As a junior in 1990, Cannady enjoyed a fine season, posting a pair of sub-47s, including a season-best 46.85 in the preliminaries of the Pac-10 Championships in Seattle, Wash...was disqualified in the Pac-10 finals after running out of his lane on the final turn...ran a 46.91 to finish second in the open division at the Mt. SAC Relays...recorded a 47.23 to finish second at the Occidental Invitational behind teammate Travis Hannah's 46.32...ran seven 400m races during the season and finished no lower than third in any of them...also ran a 200m, posting a winning 21.75 at the Long Beach Twilight Invitational.

JUNIOR COLLEGE: Cannady ran at Long Beach (Calif.) City College for 2 years (1988-89)...finished second in the 400m (47.0) at the 1989 California junior college championships held in Fresno.

HIGH SCHOOL: Cannady lettered in football (defensive back and tailback) and track at Duarte (Calif.) High...was the 1986 CIF Masters champion in the 100m (10.59) and 200m (21.31)...was a 3-time CIF 3-A champ in the 100m (1985-87) and 2-time winner (1986-87) in the 200m...posted a 37.3 in the 300m intermediate hurdles, which was the nation's top prep mark to that point of the 1987 season...led Duarte to the Mission Valley League title in 1986 and again in 1987...was a 3-time league champ in the 100m and 200m (1985-87) and ran the anchor leg for the 400m and 1600m relay teams that won the 1986 and 1987 league titles...was a high school and junior college teammate of Maurice Horton, current member of NCAA defending national champion LSU...favorite event is the 200m.

PERSONAL: Martin was born in Los Angeles on Dec. 16, 1968...majoring in communications...an excellent student, he maintained a 3.50 GPA in high school...full name is Theodore Martin Cannady

CAREER BESTS: 100m - 10.54, 200m - 21.04, 400m - 46.71



CURTIS CONWAY
6-1, 180, Freshman, Sprints

THIS YEAR: One of the most anticipated arrivals in Pac-10 track and field this year is that of USC sprinter Curtis Conway. Conway originally signed with USC in 1989, but did not qualify academically, so he chose to attend El Camino College in Torrance, Calif., as a part-time student. Conway will be a factor in the conference in the sprints and both relays. He teams with Quincy Watts and Travis Hannah to give Troy one of the finest sets of sprinting trios in the nation.


COLLEGE FOOTBALL: Curtis was a flanker and a returner for the USC football team, appearing in all 13 games last fall...led the team in both punt and kickoff returns, returning 12 punts for 161 yards (13.4 avg.) and 1 TD (at Oregon State) and 26 kickoffs for 555 yards (21.4 avg., seventh best in the Pac-10)...rushed the ball 4 times for 21 yards (5.5 avg.)...caught 1 pass for no yards.

HIGH SCHOOL: Conway was the focal point in leading Hawthorne (Calif.) High to 3 consecutive state titles...as a senior in 1989, Conway won the state title in the 100m (10.42, second fastest prep time in the nation in 1989) and finished second in the 200m (20.89, third fastest prep time in the nation)...ran a 45.7 anchor in Hawthorne's second place finish in the 1600m relay at the state meet...was a double sprint winner at the 1989 CIF masters (10.66, 21.04)...anchored the Hawthorne 400m relay team in 1989 which set a state record (40.25)...placed second in the 100m (10.85) and third in the 200m (21.30) as a junior at the 1988 state meet...teamed with current Trojan Travis Hannah in both football and track at Hawthorne...was a prep All-American as a senior quarterback for Hawthorne's football team...scored 62 of his team's 82 touchdowns during his junior and senior seasons...passed for 1,257 yards and 11 touchdowns and rushed for 758 yards and 10 TDs on 80 carries (9.5 avg.) his senior year.

PERSONAL: Curtis was born Nov. 13, 1971, in Los Angeles...majoring in criminal law.

CAREER BESTS: 100m - 10.42, 200m - 20.89



MATT GEE
6-3, 235, Junior, Javelin

THIS YEAR: Though injuries have curtailed much of his collegiate track career, Matt Gee remains a top figure in USC track and field. He is USC's record holder with the new javelin implement (213-5). National recognition during the 1991 season is not out of Gee's reach, but his health is the key.

COLLEGE TRACK--1990: Gee missed nearly his entire 1990 sophomore season with a knee injury suffered during football spring drills...in his lone competition of the season, Gee threw the javelin 209-6 to finish third at the Aztec Invitational...qualified for the Pac-10 Championships but did not compete...**1989:** In his first college meet, Gee established the USC record, placing second at the Aztec Invitational with a 213-5...also finished second in the USC Triangular (203-4) and in the UCLA dual (195-6)...had the Pac-10's sixth best throw during the season...missed a month of his freshman season to participate in spring football.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL--Gee appeared in 10 games during the 1990 Trojan football season, starting 3 games at inside linebacker...recorded 46 tackles, including 29 solo tackles...missed a game with torn ligaments in his right thumb and missed 2 others (including the John Hancock Bowl) with a right knee injury that required arthroscopic surgery this past January...as a reserve, Gee registered 51 tackles during his sophomore season of 1989...was named **Pac-10 Special Teams Player of the Week** on Nov. 5, 1989...was among 4 first-year freshmen to play for the Trojans in 1988.

HIGH SCHOOL: One of the nation's top prep javelin throwers his final 2 years at Arkansas City (Kan.) High...threw a personal-best 243-9 as a senior in 1988 (second to Oregon's Art Skipper as best prep throw in the nation...had the best prep throw (243-1) as a junior in 1987...won state titles in the javelin and shot put in 1987, and took second in the discus...other bests include 61-2 3/4 in the shot and 175-0 in the discus.

PERSONAL: Matt was born in Arkansas City, Kan., on Nov. 22, 1969...majoring in public administration.

CAREER BEST: Javelin - 213-5



TRAVIS HANNAH
5-9, 165, Junior, Sprints

THIS YEAR: A 2-time NCAA qualifier, Travis Hannah figures to emerge as one of the nation's top collegiate quartermilers. He is a key figure for USC in both the 400m and the 1600 relays, a pair of events in which USC will vie for national championships. With the arrival of

Curtis Conway, Hannah once again is teamed with his long-time friend and high school teammate. The 2 combined to bring Hawthorne (Calif.) High the 1987 and 1988 California state boy's track and field team championships which also included the 1600m relay titles.

COLLEGE TRACK--1990: Though he suffered a strained groin muscle in the 1990 USC football spring drills (March 12-30), Hannah nevertheless came on strong at the end of his sophomore season and won All-America recognition after finishing sixth at the NCAA Championships with a 45.90...matched his career best (45.54) in the semis of the same meet...posted a pair of second place finishes in the prelims and finals of the Pac-10 Championships, finishing second in both races to UCLA's Olympian Steve Lewis...won the Occidental Invitational 400m (46.32)...ran his first and only collegiate 200m and registered a winning time of 21.32 in the UCLA dual meet...ran legs on USC's 400m and 1600m relay teams...in fact, ran the opening leg of the 1600m relay team that finished first at the Pac-10 Championships with a 3:05.06 (it was later disqualified for running out of the lane)...

1989: As a freshman in 1989, Travis finished third (46.48) at the conference meet...appeared in 7 meets, winning the 400m 3 times...Ran a career-best 45.54 to finish second in the UCLA dual...qualified for the NCAA meet in Provo, Utah, recording a 46.25 in prelims.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL--1990: Travis appeared in all 13 games as a reserve flanker during USC's 1990 football season...was fifth on the team with 15 receptions which included 2 touchdowns (both against Oregon State)...returned 9 kickoffs for a 19.8 avg...**1989:** Hannah sat out the 1988 football season, but did appear in 7 games in 1989 as a flanker for the Rose Bowl champion Trojans, collecting 46 yards rushing on just 2 carries (had a 37-yard run against Utah State) and catching 1 pass for 7 yards.

HIGH SCHOOL: As a senior, Hannah was the 1988 California State champ in the 400m (47.20) while running for perennial prep track power Hawthorne High...his high school best of 46.84 in 1988 (clocked while winning the Arcadia Invitational 400m) was second best in the state (current teammate Quincy Watts ran a 46.67 at Taft High) and eighth best in the nation...won CIF Southern Section 400m title (47.06)...suffered a pulled hamstring at the Penn Relays...as a junior in 1987, finished second in the state 400m to Steve Lewis (47.2 to 46.7), who later won the Olympic gold medal in the same event...winner at the 1987 CIF Masters meet with a 47.80.

PERSONAL: Travis was born on Jan. 31, 1970...clocked a 4.21 in the 40, making him the fastest Trojan on the football team, a squad loaded with impressive sprinters...his cousin is NFL receiver Stephen Baker...majoring in education.

CAREER BEST: 200m - 21.32, 400m - 45:54



JOHN HERPIN
5-11, 175, Freshman, Hurdles

THIS YEAR: One of the nation's top prep hurdlers over the past 2 years, John Herpin should join the long line of outstanding hurdlers in USC history. Though a newcomer to the college ranks, Herpin will be Troy's top threat in the high hurdles, and he could make

quite a splash in the Pac-10. A flanker on the Trojan football, Herpin redshirted the 1990 football season.

HIGH SCHOOL: A 2-sport star at LaPorte (Tex.) High, Herpin broke his arm during LaPorte's 1989 football season and was sidelined for much of his 1990 senior track campaign...did post a 13.65 in the 110m highs, the nation's fourth best prep time in 1990...was a 2-time Texas state champ in the high hurdles...was named USA Today pre-season 1990 All-USA Track & Field heading into the 1990 season...had a 1989 junior season best of 13.52, the top high school mark in the nation...won the 1989 state title with a time of 14.03...was 1989 prep All-American in football...played in only 3 games during his senior season after breaking his arm on the first play of the fourth game...rushed for 248 yards on 17 carries (14.6 avg.), which included 120 yards on his first 4 carries, in the 3 games prior to his injury...was 2-time all-state selection in football.

PERSONAL: John was born March 25, 1972 in Liberty, Tex...majoring in business.

CAREER BEST: 100m - 10.52, 110m hurdles - 13.52



ERIC KLASSEN
6-1, 175, Freshman, Hurdles and Pole Vault


THIS YEAR: As just a redshirt freshman, Eric Klassen is expected to have a strong impact on USC's program during the 1990 season. Klassen, a talented athlete, is focusing on the high hurdles and pole vault this year, though he is an excellent decathlete as well.

COLLEGE--1990: Klassen redshirted his freshman season after suffering a stress fracture in his right foot and then later contracting hepatitis.

HIGH SCHOOL: Klassen prepped at Fairview High (which also produced Trojan sprinter Scott Lockwood) in Boulder, Colo...won the state 110m high hurdles title with a then personal-best of 13.86, the fifth best prep time in the U.S. in 1989...captured the 1989 Golden West decathlon title with a personal-best 6,468 points.

PERSONAL: Eric was born in Thousand Oaks, Calif., on June 24, 1970...majoring in business...younger brother of former USC All-American Steve Klassen (1984-87), the third Trojan ever to clear 18-0 in the pole vault.

CAREER-BESTS: 110m Hurdles - 13.80, Pole Vault - 15-8, Decathlon - 6468



TODD LEHMAN
6-0, 175, Junior, Pole Vault

THIS YEAR: Todd Lehman is on the brink of becoming one of USC's top vaulters in recent years. Lehman teams with Brooks Morris to give Troy an outstanding 1-2 combo in the vault. Todd is a team co-captain along with senior Martin Cannady.

CAREER BEST: 800m - 1:53.0, 1500m - 4:03.24




JAMES PRESTRIDGE

6-2, 155, Junior, Distances


THIS YEAR: Dreux Valenti joins Mitch Sloan as USC's top 2 runners in the distance events. Valenti's strong suit is the steeplechase.

QUINCY WATTS
6-2, 195, Junior, Sprints

THIS YEAR: If he can remain healthy, Quincy Watts could emerge not only as one of the Pac-10's best sprinters in 1991, but also as one of the NCAA's premier sprinters. Watts is the leader of this year's outstanding parade of Trojan sprinters.

COLLEGE--1990: Quincy has endured a college career checkered with injuries...pulled up with a strained hamstring in the 200m semis at the NCAA Championships...had advanced to the semis by running a 20.76 in the prelims...sat out 3 weeks of the season because of a hamstring injury suffered at the Twilight Invitational...ran just 7 races last year, five 200m, a 400m and a 300m...finished third at the Pac-10 Championships in the 200m (21.22)...ran a 20.66 at the Occidental Invitational to record his best 200m since arriving at USC and as a result was named **Pac-10 Athlete of the Week**...won his only 400m race of the season with a 47.02...was narrowly edged by Stars & Stripes' Jeff Williams in Azusa Pacific's Meet of Champions 300m race (32.48)...**1989:** Though hampered by nagging injuries, Watts' debut on the college ranks was impressive...opened his college career with a 10.62 and a 20.7 to take second in both events at the USC Centennial...a week later, recorded a season-best 10.46 in the 100m at the USC Twilight...won the UCLA dual 200m with a 20.67...early-season shin splints sidelined him...later a hamstring injury put an end to his freshman season...easily qualified for the NCAA meet in 100m and 200m but a strained hamstring muscle kept him out of the national championships as well as the Pac-10 meet.



HERITAGE

CHAMPIONS AND RECORD HOLDERS

WORLD RECORDS: 61 USC trackmen have equalled or bettered world records since 1912.

OLYMPIC GAMES: USC trackmen have won 23 individual Olympic titles and have shared in seven relay victories. Fifty-seven men have won a total of 86 places on United States Olympic teams.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC has won 26 out of the 70 NCAA Outdoor meets since its beginning in 1921. On 10 occasions they have finished second. The Trojans won 9 in a row (1935-1943), and 7 straight (1949-1955). They have also won 2 NCAA Indoor Championships since its beginning in 1965. A total of 97 individual outdoor championships highlight the record.

CROMWELL TRACK AND FIELD

Used as a training and warm-up facility during the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles, Cromwell Track and Field underwent a complete refurbishing in fall of 1983. Not only was the track resurfaced, but a new drainage system was also added.

A new Rekortan surface, the same as the Olympic track in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, has eight, 42-inch lanes. The high jump area is larger than before and there are two new sand pits for the horizontal jumps.

Cromwell Field had been renovated in 1979, but all that remains from the first facelift is the equipment storeroom and weightroom on the track's southwest perimeter. Although there are no permanent grandstands yet, a \$1.8 million fundraising drive is on, and when that financial goal is reached, a doubledeck stadium capable of holding 5,000 people will be constructed.









1991 WOMEN'S OUTLOOK

USC's track and field coach Jim Bush is a rookie at this coaching bit. Yes, he's coached for over 40 years but this women's act is all new to him. And he's excited about it. **"It's like no other challenge I've ever had in coaching,"** said Bush, who coached UCLA's men for 20 years and now begins his first year guiding USC's combined men's and women's program. **"Fortunately for me, I'm inheriting a talented group of women that should make this first season an enjoyable endeavor."**

The Women of Troy return 9 athletes from last year's team, add an excellent transfer and take on what is perhaps the finest recruiting class in the Pac-10. It's easy to understand Bush's enthusiasm for the season.

USC features a 16-woman roster with just 3 seniors and 8 underclassmen. Five freshman of exceptional caliber are expected to perform at a high level despite their youthfulness. The youngsters will carry USC's torch in the sprints and hurdles, while veterans sustain USC's attack in the field events.

"This team will be a force in the Pac-10," said Bush, **"but it's a year away from pushing for a national championship."**

Here's an event-by-event look at the Women of Troy.

SPRINTS--As a collective group, the sprints are conceivably USC's strongest asset, yet also its most inexperienced. Senior **Louan Guialdo** (11.91, 24.10), who drops the 100m and adds the 400m to her duties, is the veteran on a 4-woman sprint group that headlines 3 freshmen. Guialdo is a high level performer who figures to make a name for herself in both the sprints and long jump. Newcomer **Inger Miller** (11.48, 23.57) heads a list of Trojan freshmen sprinters that would be hard to equal at any other school in the nation. Miller was the nation's top prep sprinter last year in both the 100m and 200m. Indeed, she's the focal point of USC's success in the future but she is also the key ingredient for the Trojan's success this year. Miller will be pushed by fellow freshman **Melanna Gray** (11.77, 24.20), who went undefeated her final 2 seasons in high school while winning the Missouri state titles in the 100m and 200m. Not to be overshadowed is freshman **La Tima Jones** (24.11, 55.19) who not only gives USC great depth in the sprints but also rounds out what should be one of the best relay teams in the conference. Sophomore **Angela Rolfe**, a sprinter of equal quality with the aforementioned group, is redshirting the year. Hurdlers **Michelle DeCoux** and **Felice Lipscomb** lend some reserve strength in the relays. **"Both relays have the capability to be outstanding this year,"** says Bush. **"We won't be deep and we won't be experienced, but there's no questioning the talent factor of this group of sprinters. They'll truly be exciting."**

HURDLES--It would seem USC's women hurdlers aren't to be outdone by their sprinting teammates. The Women of Troy feature 3 outstanding hurdlers, all of whom could push for a Pac-10 title in either the highs or intermediates. Senior **Effie Daetz** (13.89, 59.35) is hoping to regain her form of 2 years ago when she qualified for the NCAA indoor championships and finished fifth at the Pac-10 championships. Injuries sidelined her much of last year. Junior **Michelle DeCoux** (14.31, 59.60), last year's Pac-10 runner-up in the intermediates and a former state high school champion in both hurdle races, is not only among the Pac-10's best in the intermediates but could prove

to be among the nation's top 5 this year. As he did in collecting the nation's top high school sprinter (Inger Miller), so too has Bush done in the hurdles by gathering the nation's top high school performer of a year ago, freshman **Felice Lipscomb** (13.92, 41.69 -- high school hurdles). **"Obviously we're very talented in the hurdles, but I also like the versatility we have,"** said Bush. **"We're very thin, but versatility makes us a little deeper. All 3 are threats to win their races in either hurdle events. We can put them all in the same event or mix them into either hurdle race. They'll improve during the season just because of the competition from each other."**

DISTANCES--USC has just 3 distance runners in an area that could cause problems for the Trojans in small scoring meets. Junior **Tracy Boudreau** (2:12.12) was Troy's top runner during the 1990 cross country season. Sophomore **Amy Goodwin** (4:27.70, 16:56.0) redshirted last year and is hoping to regain the form that made her an All-Texas performer in high school and USC's first All-American in cross country (1989). Walk-on junior **Shannon Selander** begins her first year in the Trojan track and field program after sitting out the past 3 seasons. Selander, who also competed on USC's cross country team in the 1990 fall, last ran track in her 1987 senior year at Curtis High in Tacoma, Wash.

JUMPS--Senior **Louan Guialdo** (20-7 ³/₄) is Troy's lone representative in the long jump. Guialdo qualified for the Pac-10s a year ago and could advance farther this year if she can make the progress Bush anticipates. **"I think Milan Tiff will have a great impact on Louan's jumping this season,"** said Bush. **"Not only are the NCAAs a real possibility for her, but so too is the school-record of 21-11."** Much like Guialdo, senior **Yleana Carrasco** (6-0) is USC's only competitor in the high jump. Carrasco enjoyed a fantastic high school career, but constant injuries have slowed her down in college. A former starter on USC's volleyball team, Carrasco has had a year to concentrate solely on the high jump with the anticipation that she will be among the Pac-10s best by season's end.

THROWS--In junior **Ashley Selman**, USC possesses the nation's most promising Olympic hope in the javelin. A Pac-10 champion her freshman year and an NCAA titlist as a sophomore last year, Selman is looking to capture both crowns in one season this year. Selman, who won the NCAA crown with a toss of 186-3, is the USC record holder at 187-9 and admits she has her eyes on Karin Smith's 10-year old collegiate record of 211-5. Junior **Allison Franke** (169-8 discus, 159-0 javelin), a transfer from Southern Methodist, was a double winner as a freshman last year at the Southwest Conference championships. Her addition to the Women of Troy gives USC an exceptional duo in the javelin and a potential NCAA scorer in the discus. Redshirt junior **Teresa Ortega** (147-8) was a Pac-10 scorer last year. She is expected to immensely benefit from the arrival of Franke. **"I don't see any reason why Ashley should not repeat her NCAA title,"** Bush said. **"The addition of Allison can make us 1-2 in the javelin at NCAAs if all were to fall just right."**

HEPTATHLON--A healthy redshirt freshman **Karen Kelly** would be a welcomed plus for USC. Kelly, who has been injured much of her time at Troy, is an unknown quantity in the 7-eventer. However, multi-event coach Mike Bailey, who coached Olympian Wendy Brown, believes she could develop into a fine heptathlete.

A possible NCAA qualifier, Daetz is the veteran of USC's talented hurdlers which include Michelle DeCoux and Felice Lipscomb.

THIS YEAR: A steady performer, Michelle DeCoux has displayed uncommon durability that has made her one of the top athletes on the team. DeCoux is USC's strongest entrant in the 400m hurdles and teams with Effie Daetz and newcomer Felice Lipscomb to give the Women of Troy an outstanding trio in the high hurdles.

HIGH SCHOOL: A double winner in 1988 California State meet (100m hurdles and 300m hurdles) while running for Bishop O'Dowd High in Oakland, Calif...ran nation's top prep time in 300m hurdles (42.16) while winning state title...also ran a season-best 13.86 in the 100m hurdles (No. 2 in the U.S.)...won the 1988 Keebler International 300m hurdles (42.59) in Elmhurst, Illinois...was the 300m hurdles North Coast Section champion as a junior and senior...was also 100m hurdles North Coast Section champion her senior season.

PERSONAL: DeCoux (pronounced "de-COO") was born in Oakland, Calif., on Dec. 30, 1969...a fine student in high school, Michelle won the CIF Scholar-Athlete Award in 1988...is a psychology major at USC.

CAREER BESTS: 100m hurdles - 14.31, 400m hurdles - 59.60



ALLISON FRANKE
5-10, Sophomore, Throws

THIS YEAR: A transfer from Southern Methodist, Allison Franke is a quality performer in both the javelin and discus. Franke' arrival along with the return of Ashley Selman gives USC perhaps the best 1-2 throwing combination in the nation this year. Because SMU granted her a release, she is eligible to compete this year as a sophomore.

COLLEGE--1990: As a freshman last year, Franke competed at Southern Methodist where she won the Southwest Conference titles in both the javelin (137-4) and discus (169-4, an SMU school record)...finished fifth in the heptathlon (4304) at the SWC meet and accounted for 24 of SMU's 38 points...was the high point performer of the meet and as a result was named the meet's most valuable female athlete...threw the discus 150-3 in the prelims of the NCAA Championships in Durham, N.C. but did not advance.

HIGH SCHOOL: One of the finest female athletes ever to come out of Canyon High in Anaheim, Calif., Allison was a 3-time CIF 4-A champ

HIGH SCHOOL: A prep All-American at North Kansas City High in Kansas City, Mo., Gray finished second at the Golden West Invitational with 11.80 in the 100m, Track & Field News' fourth fastest time by a U.S. prep last year...undefeated in both the 100m and 200m during her 1989 junior and 1990 senior seasons...was a 2-time state champ in the 100m and 200m, clocking career bests of 11.77 and 24.20 her senior year while leading North Kansas City to the state title...as a junior in 1989 won the Kansas University Relays 100m (11.85)...anchored her high school's 4x100m to the state title...was also a 2-time recipient of the Wayne Campbell Award recognizing her as the best female athlete in Kansas City...lettered 2 years in basketball as well.

PERSONAL: Melanna was born July 16, 1972 in Kansas City, Mo...majoring in drama at USC...her father, Mel Gray, was an All-Pro receiver for the NFL's St. Louis Cardinals for 11 years...paints portraits and has had her work shown in exhibits.

AMY GOODWIN 5-6, Sophomore, Distances

THIS YEAR: Though USC's depth in the distances is slim, Amy Goodwin is a quality runner who gives the Women of Troy some firepower to score with in dual competition.

COLLEGE--1990: Amy ran 2 mile races on the indoor circuit and a pair of 1500m races during the 1990 season, clocking bests of 4:55.00 in

the mile and 4:36.39 in the 1500m...redshirted the remainder of the season...ran a 21.07 as the second best Trojan at the 1990 Pac-10 Cross Country Championships...**1989:** Crowned USC's first NCAA cross country All-American after finishing 35th (17:25.74) at the NCAA Championships held at the Naval Academy...came in second

(16:55.3) at the NCAA Region 8 Championships in Fresno, Calif...finished fourth (17:05) at the Pac-10 Championships...enjoyed a fine 1990 freshman track season...competed in 7 meets, including the Pac-10 championships where she placed seventh in the 1500m (4:34.53)...won the USC Centennial 800m (2:10.10)...took second in her first collegiate event, the 1500m (4:29.69) at a USC 3-way meet.

HIGH SCHOOL: A prep All-American while at Bellville (Tex.) High, Goodwin, a 4-time Texas state champion in the 800m, won the state's half mile event in her 1988 senior season with a 2:09.86...was also the state mile champion in 1988...was named 1988 Miss Texas Track...as a junior Goodwin recorded the second best mark in the 800m (2:09.86) by a prep in 1987...won the Texas cross-country title 4 times.

PERSONAL: Goodwin was born in Bellville, Tex., on Sept. 10, 1969...an outstanding student in high school, Amy carried a perfect 4.0 grade point average at Bellville...majoring in history at USC.

LOUAN GUALDO 5-7, Senior, Jumps & Sprints

THIS YEAR: Louan Gualdo, USC's most versatile athlete, is a threat to score big points in any dual meet in any one of the sprinting events as well as in the long jump. USC's long jump record of 21-11 (held by Yvette Bates) is well within Gualdo's reach this season and it's quite possible for her to put her name among USC's all-time top 5 in both the 100m and 200m. Gualdo, along with Ashley Selman, serves as the team's co-captain.

COLLEGE--1990: Gualdo finished no worse than second in 4 different events during her 1990 junior season...her forte, however, is the long jump where she recorded a career-best 20-7 1/4 (fifth best mark in USC history) in only the second outdoor meet of the season...recorded a 7.22 55m at the Bengal Indoor Invitational...ran a season-best 24.83 in the 200m of the USC Twilight Invitational...**1989:** Opened the season in promising fashion with indoor bests of 25.06 (200m), 8.44 (55m hurdles) and 19-9 1/2 (long jump) and went on to record outdoor bests of 19-10 1/2 (long jump) and 25.00 (200m) but an injury ended her competition with 6 weeks left in the season and she was able to redshirt...**1988:** Troy's top sprinter as a 1988 sophomore, she finished fifth in the Pac-10 100m (12.07)...ran a career-best 24.36 (USC's tenth fastest time all-time) to finish third at the Pac-10s...was one of three 20 foot-plus Trojan jumpers with a best of 20-5 3/4 against UCLA...recorded a wind-aided 20-7 1/4 at the UTEP Invitational...jumped 19-9 1/4 in NCAA prelims, but did not advance to finals...ran 11.91 100m (USC's tenth fastest time all-time) at Oxy Invitational...**1987:** Added quality depth to USC's jump corps and posted a season best of 19-2 in the long jump...her speed helped her post season sprint bests of 24.8 (at USC's Heptathlon Plus meet) for 200m and 12.21 (third place at the Stanford Invitational) in the 100m...finished third or better 7 times in 1987 as a freshman.

HIGH SCHOOL: Louan did not compete for Childs High in Bronx, N.Y...had a long jump of 20-5 1/2 (fourth best national prep mark in 1986) while competing for Dynamite Track Club...placed fourth in the long jump (20-5 1/2) and fifth in the 200m (24.52) at the 1986 TAC Junior championships...won Junior Olympics long jump title (19-10) in 1985...set Empire State Games long jump record (19-8) in 1986...first jumped 19 feet at age 15 in 1983.

5-8, Freshman, Sprints

THIS YEAR: La Tima Jones is one of 3 freshmen sprinters. Despite her inexperience on the college level, Jones figures to be a key element in USC's sprint assault.

PERSONAL: La Tima was born June 22, 1972 in Harbor City, Calif...majoring in psychology.

FELICE LIPSCOMB
5-4, Freshman, Hurdles

THIS YEAR: One of 3 state high school champions to join USC this year, Felice Lipscomb will team with Effie Daetz and Michelle DeCoux to give USC a superb trio of hurdlers. Though her strength lies in the highs, Lipscomb will be a force in the intermediates as well.

HIGH SCHOOL: A prep All-American at Santa Monica (Calif) High, Felice was a double winner as a senior last year at the state championships, capturing the 100m high (13.58) and 300m intermediate (41.69) titles...finished second at the Golden West Invitational in the 100m highs (14.38)...a week later, she won both the 100m highs (13.92) and the 300m intermediates (42.47) at the International Prep Invitational in Elmhurst, Ill...owned the nation's best high school mark in both the 100m highs (13.92) and the 300m intermediates (41.69), her first year ever running the intermediates...was named USA Today All-USA...as a junior in 1989, Lipscomb won the state 100m highs (13.65) and recorded the nation's top prep mark in the 30-inch high hurdles (13.69)...as a sophomore in 1988, Felice clocked a 14.00 in the 30-inch 100m hurdles, the fourth best prep mark...finished third in

5-4, Freshman, Sprints

THIS YEAR: One of the most promising newcomers to join the college ranks this year, Inger Miller gives USC immense quality in the sprints. Miller will be the focal point of USC's individual performance in the 100m and 200m and in both relays.

HIGH SCHOOL: Miller was a prep All-American as a senior last year at John Muir High in Pasadena, Calif...posted 1990 U.S. prep bests in the 100m (11.48) and the 200m (23.57)...in fact, her 100m time was the 12th fastest by any U.S. woman last year...incurred severe tendonitis in her left foot that cut short her season in April...attempted to compete at state meet but the tendonitis forced her out after the prelims...prior to the injury she captured the 100m (11.71) and 200m (23.57) titles at the Arcadia Invitational...anchored Muir's 1990 U.S. best 400m relay (46.07)...led Muir to the state championship as a junior in 1989...finished second at the state meet to Angela Burnham (now of UCLA) in both the 100m (11.46) and 200m (23.86)...had second best prep marks in the nation in both 100m (11.53) and 200m (23.62)...won the Arcadia Invitational 100m (11.89), beating Burnham (11.64) but finished second in the 200m (23.91) to Burnham (23.63)...relatively new to the sport; first started competing in track during her 1988 sophomore season at Muir...finished second at the 1988 state championship meet in 100m and third in the 200m...had the nation's fourth best prep mark in both the 100m (11.64) and the 200m (23.59)...won the CIF and Pacific League 100m and 200m titles all 3 years at Muir.

PERSONAL: Inger is the daughter of former Trojan great Lennox Miller, who won a silver medal in the 1968 Olympics and a bronze in the 1972 Olympics while running the 100m for Jamaica...was a 1990 Rose Parade princess...was born in Los Angeles on June 12, 1972...majoring in communications while minoring in international relations.

6-0, Junior, Throws

THIS YEAR: A developing thrower, redshirt junior Teresa Ortega teams with newcomer Allison Franke in the discus.

5-8, Junior, Javelin

THIS YEAR: What can Ashley Selman do for an encore? The defending NCAA champion, Ashley has her sights set on a throw of more than 200 feet for her 1991 junior campaign. This year's team co-captain along with Louan Guialdo, Selman admits that after winning the Pac-10 title as a freshman and the NCAA title as

a sophomore that she'd now like to win both in the same season.

COLLEGE--1990: Selman won the NCAA javelin title as a sophomore with a throw of 186-3...is the fourth Woman of Troy to win an NCAA title...tossed the spear 184-10 against UCLA (April 28) which at the time was the top collegiate throw of 1990...won 7 of 11 javelin competitions...eclipsed the 173 mark in 5 meets...finished second to Oregon's Paula Berry at the Pac-10 Championships...in her first and only collegiate heptathlon she scored 4,469 points to finish third at the Golden Bear Meet of Champions...**1989:** Enjoyed an outstanding freshman season...was the U.S. eighth ranked javelin thrower for the season...won the TAC junior title, earned NCAA All-American recognition and captured the Pac-10 title in the javelin...launched the spear a school record 187-9 (the third farthest throw by an American in 1989) at the junior TACs...earlier in the year she finished sixth at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Provo, Utah, with a throw of 166-4...won the Pac-10 crown with a then-career-best and USC record 176-10...In her first collegiate meet (Aztec Invitational), Ashley's toss of 149-8 put her among USC's all-time top 5...took second in the UCLA dual with a 171-5...a bone displacement in her right foot kept her out of the heptathlon but she was able to compete in 6 events at the USC Centennial.

HIGH SCHOOL: Perhaps Orange County's best female athlete while at Foothill High in 1988, Selman scored 4445 points in the heptathlon and threw the javelin 158-9...also had bests of 18-0 in the long jump, 39-7 in the shot and 14.8 in the 100m hurdles...Selman's javelin best was the No. 5 effort in the nation by a prep in 1988...the Century League Female Athlete of the Year in 1988, Selman was also an All-Century League pick in basketball (point guard)...as a junior in 1987, Selman won a CIF basketball playoff game by hitting 2 free throws with 4 seconds left.

PERSONAL: Selman was born in Orange, Calif., on April 21, 1970...A fine student in high school, Ashley had a 3.83 grade point average in high school...an exercise science major at USC.






