All athletes who meet the more stringent qualifying mark will automatically compete at the NCAA meet. The remaining spots in the championship field will be filled by those athletes who meet the provisional requirements, but in descending order so that the best performances fill the field first.

1992 USC MEN'S OUTLOOK

Life in the fast lane -- that's the way Jim Bush, USC's second year track coach and a 40-year veteran of college track and field, is going to live the 1992 season. And contrary to popular belief, it's not necessarily a bad way for a 65-year old man to live.

As Bush views the men's roster of his 1992 team, he can't help but smile as his eyes glance upon his set of sprinters. Within the Trojan fold this year are **Quincy Watts**, perhaps the top collegiate 400m sprinter in the nation, **Travis Hannah**, the defending Pac-10 400m champion, **Mark Crear**, a 1990 All-American high hurdler, **Jeff Laynes**, the top junior college sprinter in the nation last year, **Curtis Conway**, a 1991 Pac-10 finalist in both the 100m and 200m as a freshman, **Martin Cannady**, a fifth-year senior whose speed and strength allow him to be a factor in both the intermediate hurdles and the open 400m, and **John Herpin**, a promising high hurdler who gives Troy quality depth in both relays.

"I'm so darned excited about our sprinters," said Bush. "We have 7 guys who can challenge for the national championship. Our goal is to break 3 minutes in the 4x400m and to break 39 seconds in the 4x100m. We've got the people."

So just how far can Bush go with 7 sprinters?

"All the way," he says without a smile to make sure you get his point. "A national championship doesn't happen unless you think about it and plan for it. I try to be realistic and I've showed the team that on paper it can happen. That's the beginning of the quest-- making the athletes truly believe."

USC has more than just sprinters, though. It has some jumpers, a vaulter, some throwers and a few quality multi-purpose athletes.

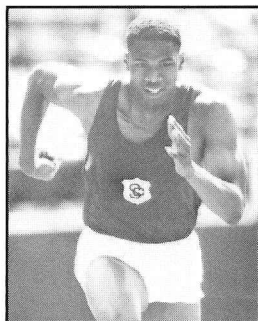
"This is a well-rounded team," added Bush. "The hammer is the only event in which we're lacking. I have great expectations for this team."

Here's an event-by-event breakdown of the 1992 Trojans.

SPRINTS--When it comes to its corps of sprinters, USC ranks among the elite in the nation. USC has 3 former California state prep sprint champions, including seniors **Quincy Watts** (20.50, 44.98) and **Travis Hannah** (21.32, 45.54), who give Troy the best 400m duo in the nation. Watts, currently ranked 10th in the world in the 400m and last year's NCAA runner-up, qualified for the U.S. team at the World Championships in Tokyo with an impressive 44.98, the second fastest 400m in USC history. Hannah won the Pac-10 title last year but was slowed at the NCAAs with a foot injury.

"Quincy should be the premier college sprinter this year and he has the potential to be the best in the world," added Bush. "Travis has as much talent in the 400m as anyone I've coached. He can run in the 44s and can team with Watts to give us a 1-2 finish in the NCAA 400m."

Sophomore **Curtis Conway** (10.32, 20.86), another former state prep champ, clocked lifetime bests last year despite missing half the season because of spring football drills. He joins sophomore **Jeff Laynes** (10.20, 20.69), who finished second to Conway in the 100m at



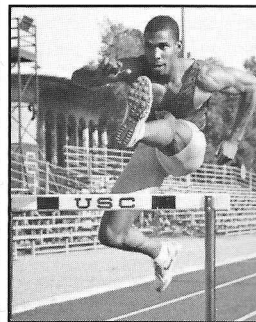

the 1989 state high school meet, to give USC an excellent 1-2 combination in the short sprints and another pair of outstanding legs on the 4x100m relay. Laynes, a junior college transfer from Merritt College in Oakland, Calif., was the top juco sprinter in the nation last year, recording the 25th best time in the world with a 10.20 that won the state juco title.

"We're not sure just how good Curtis can be," said Bush. "But we do know he is invaluable to our success in the relays. Laynes has the ability to go after the school records in the 100m (set by James Sanford in 1980 at 10.02) and the 200m (set by Clancy Edwards in 1978 at 20.03)."

Freshman **Michael Bradley** (10.56, 21.91), the Montana state high school champion in both the 100m and 200m last year, gives the Trojans depth in the sprints and security in the relay if injuries hamper the team.

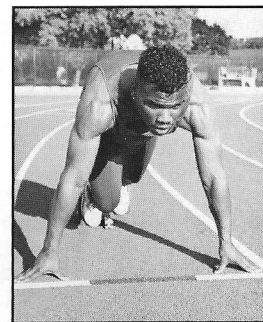
HURDLES--With fifth-year senior **Mark Crear** (13.51) back from a redshirt year and sophomore **John Herpin** (14.14) returning with a year's worth of experience, the Trojans can't help but be stronger in the high hurdles. Crear was the Pac-10 runner-up in 1990, while Herpin took fourth in last year's conference championships. Crear should contend for the conference crown and push for the national title.

Senior **Martin Cannady**, who ran the open 400m (46.83) as a junior in 1990, is returning to the intermediate hurdles after redshirting last year with a foot injury. Cannady excelled in the 300m hurdles in high school, posting a best of 37.3.

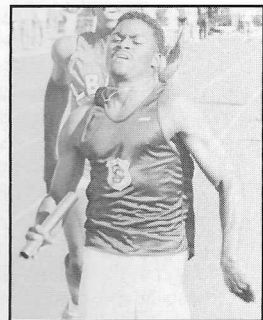
Freshmen **Eric Bell** and **Ryan Forvilly** are promising hurdlers who likely need a year of collegiate competition for seasoning but who give USC quality depth.

Bell had a best of 13.7 in the highs in high school and was undefeated for 4 years of dual meet competition at Castle Park High in San Diego, Calif. Forvilly recorded Nevada state prep records of 14.15 in the highs and 39.0 in the 300m intermediates at Whittell High in Zephyr Cove, Nev.

"We have a very good set of hurdlers," said Bush. "They push each other and in turn make everyone else a better performer. They may not be as star-studded as the sprinters, but the quality is just the same."

DISTANCES--Distances are not a strong area for USC. Seniors **Dave Beaudet** (4:09.65, 14:36.01) and **Dreux Valenti** (3:37.71, 15:27.9, 9:04.1 steeple) along with junior **Todd Overstreet** (1:50.76, 3:59.44), have to step forward as Troy's leaders. Overstreet is USC's key in the halfmile, and Beaudet and Valenti are keys in the 1500m and 5000m.

"Overstreet can be an excellent half-miler," Bush said. "He just has to be consistent."

A host of competitors from the cross country team will lend support in the distances, most notably junior **Dan Vigil** (3:59.0, 16:33.44) and sophomores **Frank Olivar** (1:57.81), **Shinsuke Nishihara** (4:08.60, 10:25.3, 15:57.9), and **George Delao** (4:14.67, 16:31.7).

JUMPS--Juniors **Deny Sepaher** and **Jamal Elmidge** and seniors **Griff Joyce** and **Jim Campbell** are a strong foursome of Troy in the jumps. Sepaher (6-10 ³/₄) came on strong at the end of last year to finish third at the Pac-10s. He'll go after the 7-foot barrier this year and perhaps a berth into the NCAAs. Elmidge, a transfer from San Jose City College, is not only a 6-10 high jumper, but he is also a 24-foot long jumper and a 49-foot triple jumper. Joyce (6-8) and Campbell (6-8) have been steady performers in the high jump the past 2 years.

"Sepaher surprised us last year, but he won't this year," said Bush. "There's no reason to think that he can't jump over 7 feet this year."

POLE VAULT--Senior **Todd Lehman** (16-7) is USC's lone competitor in the pole vault, but the lack of individuals should not cost the Trojans. Lehman has been plagued by various injuries the past 18 months, but if he remains healthy in his final year of competition, he should push for Pac-10 recognition.

"I realize that potential can be a bad word in athletics," said Bush, "but Lehman really has the potential to reach the mid-17s in his vaults. Consistency and health are important to his success."

THROWS--Juco transfer **Gary Kirchhoff** (169-0, 58-2 ¹/₂) is a 26-year old thrower who spent 4 years in the Navy and is just learning the discus and the shot put. He has the size (6-4, 260) and the speed to be a quality thrower. Now it's just a matter of refining the techniques. Kirchhoff is USC's lone true thrower, though a couple of decathletes will compete as well in the throws.

"Kirchhoff is the start to the building of our weight events," said Bush. "I see a lot of promise in him. It's just a matter of time."

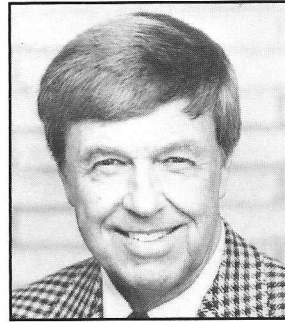
DECATHLON--Freshman **Alexis Sharp** (6,353) was England's national high school champion last year and will have an immediate impact on Troy's program. He's thrown over 200 feet in the javelin, run a 10.84 100m, a 49.50 400m, long jumped over 24 feet and tossed the discus over 150 feet. He'll back up Kirchhoff in the open throws and participate in the long jump when he's not competing in the decathlon.

Redshirt sophomore **Eric Klassen** (6,468), the 1989 Golden West Invitational decathlon champion, returns to the 10-eventer after spending a year concentrating on the pole vault. Klassen has a career best of 16-1 ³/₄ in the pole vault. A 1989 Colorado state high school champ in the high hurdles (13.86), he may compete occasionally in the highs.

Sophomore **James Prestridge** (6,211) finished fifth in last year's Pac-10 championships while showing some promise for the future. Like Sharp and Klassen, Prestridge adds to USC's depth in the javelin (154-1) and the long jump (22-6 ¹/₂).

"Sharp is England's best young prospect," said Bush. "I'm hoping he can place high in the decathlon at the NCAAs. Together, this is a young group of decathletes, but they're good athletes who can make names for each one of themselves in the decathlon."

JIM BUSH Head Coach



It's one of the most unusual pairings in the history of college athletics, but logically it's a natural fit. Longtime UCLA coach Jim Bush is a Trojan, serving his second year as head coach of USC's consolidated men's and women's track and field programs. Bush, a 1987 inductee in the National Track and Field Hall of Fame as one of the collegiate ranks' most successful coaches ever, is now the head coach of the winningest collegiate track and field program,

and in the process becomes the first person ever to coach both the UCLA and USC track programs.

"I never planned on this happening," said Bush. "You save the very best for last. This is definitely my last coaching assignment, but I think it's the best."

Bush, who served the 2 years (1989-90) as a volunteer assistant coach at USC, spent 20 years (1965-84) as the head coach at UCLA, guiding the Bruins to 5 NCAA titles (1966-71-72-73-78) and 3 second place finishes (1974-75-80). All told, 15 of his 20-UCLA teams finished among the NCAA's top 5. His teams won 87.9% of their dual meets (152-21), 7 national dual meet championships awarded by *Track & Field News*, and 7 conference championships. In addition, UCLA posted 10 undefeated seasons under Bush, putting together winning streaks of 17, 20, 34 and 42.

The 1971 and 1973 U.S. Track Coaches Association National Coach of the Year (the first 2-time recipient), Bush has coached 33 NCAA outdoor individual champions (including USC's Robert Reading, winner of the 1989 high hurdles and USC's first NCAA champ since 1982) and 19 Olympians, including former Bruins Wayne Collett, John Smith, Willie Banks, Greg Foster and Andre Phillips.

Prior to Bush's arrival on the Westwood campus, UCLA had never beaten USC in 32 tries. However, under Bush, the Bruins not only defeated USC, they collected 13 wins in 19 dual meets with the Trojans.

In 1984, Bush retired from UCLA at the age of 58 and spent the following 5 years as the conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers, the Los Angeles Raiders and the Los Angeles Clippers. While still at UCLA in the early 1970s, Bush served 3 years as the conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Lakers and Los Angeles Kings. He returned to track in 1989 when longtime friend Ernie Bullard invited Bush to take part in the USC track program as a volunteer assistant for the men's hurdles.

A noted author, lecturer and clinician, Bush has served as a consultant to the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports and the U.S. National Fitness Foundation. He was president of the U.S. Track Coaches Association (1972-73), chairman of the Western United States Olympic Development Committee, on the NCAA Track Coaches Association executive committee for 10 years, and on the Athletic Congress executive board for 7 years. He was head coach of the U.S. team at the 1979 Pan American Games. He also acted as technical director for the track scenes in NBC's movie "The Golden Moment." He

served as a writer for UPI at the 1968 and 1972 Olympics.

Bush, a 1951 graduate of California, began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for Golden Bear football coach Pappy Waldorf. He served as an assistant track coach at Berkeley (Calif.) High in the 1952 season and then move to Southern California, spending 7 seasons (1953-59) at Fullerton (Calif.) High. After 2 seasons (1960-61) at Fullerton College and 3 years (1962-64) at Occidental College, Bush succeeded the late Ducky Drake as UCLA's head coach in 1965.

Born Sept. 15, 1926, in Cleveland, Ohio, Bush moved with his family to California when he was 3 years old. He prepped at Bakersfield (Calif.) High and lettered in both track and football. His athletic accomplishments merited him as an inductee into the Kern County Hall of Fame. Upon graduation in 1944, Bush joined the Naval Air Corps.

Jim has 2 children, Jean and Don. He and his wife, Francoise, live in Culver City.

MIKE BAILEY
Assistant Coach

In his sixth season at USC, Mike Bailey has been instrumental in USC's recent success in the throws and multi-events. Bailey was the head coach of the USC women's program for 2 seasons (1989-90) before it was consolidated under one umbrella with the men's program. As a result, Bailey returned his focus to his first love -- the field events, where he has already coached 3 of USC's 4 all-time NCAA women champions. Bailey guided Wendy Brown (heptathlon), Yvette Bates (triple jump) and Ashley Selman (javelin) to their respective NCAA crowns. Indeed, he's made quite an impact on USC track and field in a short span.

In his 2 years as women's head coach, Bailey led USC to 5 wins in 7 dual meets. He coached 18 All-Americans and 7 USC record holders. Bailey, who spent 2 prior seasons (1987-88) as Fred LaPlante's assistant at USC, guided the Women of Troy to a ninth place finish at the 1989 NAAs, his first season as USC's head coach.

The 35-year-old Bailey came to USC in 1987 after spending 2 years (1985-86) as the head women's coach at Idaho State. For 4 previous years (1981-84), he was the head coach at Judge Memorial High in Salt Lake City, Utah.

A strong technician in the multi-events, Bailey draws upon his own experience as a decathlete, though he never competed in college track and field. He was a celebrated high school decathlete and was the 1974 and 1975 Western U.S. decathlon champion. He gave up the decathlon in college and starred for 4 years as a middle linebacker at Utah. He continued playing football for 2 years in the Canadian Football League with Calgary and Saskatchewan. Upon his departure from football, Bailey resumed training in the decathlon in 1982. He logged a personal best of 7,621 points in the 10-eventer. A ruptured Achilles tendon in 1987 ended his competition and signaled the start of his coaching career.

Mike and his wife, Cindy, have a 15-year old son, Michael.



BARBARA EDMONSON
Assistant Coach

One of the finest women sprinters of all-time, Barbara Edmonson is in her first year on the USC track and field coaching staff and in the process become one of the few, if any, coaches to handle both the men's and women's sprinters at a Division I program. Edmonson is a former world record holder in the 50m, 100m and 200m and, competing under her maiden name of Ferrell,

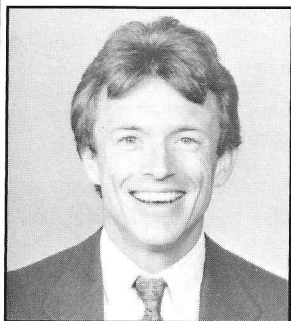
was a member of the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic teams. In fact, she won the 100m gold and the 200m silver at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. Like fellow Trojan assistant Milan Tiff, she was recognized for several years as the United States' top performer in her specialties. And like head coach Jim Bush, Edmonson is a member of the U.S.

National Track and Field Hall of Fame (1988 inductee). She is the 11th track and field Hall of Fame member to be associated with USC.

Edmonson was an elementary teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District for 8 years (1968-76) and continued to compete on an international level for much of her teaching career. In 1976, she moved on to become the United Teachers of Los Angeles union representative. At the same time, she returned to track as a coach for the Beyond Athletics Track Club. In 1980, she stepped up to the college ranks, coaching the sprinters at West Los Angeles Junior College. Edmonson became the head boy's and girl's coach at St. Bernard High in Playa Del Rey, Calif., in 1988 and led both teams to the league title.

She is the wife of past UCLA sprint great Warren Edmonson, the 1972 NCAA 100m champion.



JOHN MEDVED
Assistant Coach

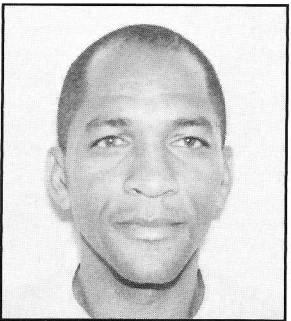
Charged with the instruction of USC's distance program, John Medved comes to USC from Occidental College in Eagle Rock, Calif., from where he graduated in 1984 and held a similar position on the coaching staff for 3 years (1988-90).

A standout on Occidental's cross country team, Medved has begun coaching career at an early age, working with Oxy tracksters while still

an undergraduate. Upon graduation, he served as head coach of both the men's and women's track and field programs at Blair High School in Pasadena, Calif.

As a prep, Medved was an honored distance runner at Vista High in San Diego.

The 29-year old Medved also coordinates the USC men's and women's cross country programs under Bush's direction. John is single and is a math teacher at Manual Arts High in Los Angeles.



MILAN TIFF
Assistant Coach

One of the greatest triple jumpers ever, Milan Tiff is reunited with his college coach Jim Bush, serving as a Trojan assistant of the horizontal jumps.

A 5-time U.S. champ in the triple jump (1969-70-71-72-73), Tiff won 3 NCAA individual titles, set the NCAA triple jump record, and was a member of the 1973 NCAA Championship team at UCLA. Many regard Tiff as

the man who revolutionized the sport in the United States. After touring Europe during the summer months of his collegiate competition, Tiff brought back to the States a technique and style used by the Soviets who were the world leaders in the event at the time. All 5 of his U.S. titles were captured during his college days. Though a spot on the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic teams seemed certain, Tiff, for personal

reasons, chose to forego the Olympic Games. His final official competition came as a 22-year senior at UCLA in the 1973 NCAA Championships.

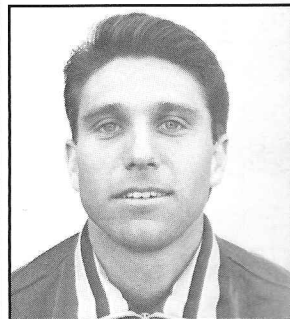
Tiff's collegiate career began at Miami of Ohio where he won the NCAA and the Mid-America Conference triple jump titles during his freshman and sophomore seasons. Following his 1970 sophomore year, Tiff transferred to UCLA in hopes of collecting a team crown to go along with his individual championships. He sat out the 1971 season (but still won the U.S. title) and came back in 1972 to collect his first of 2 team titles as a Bruin, yet he finished fourth in the triple jump. The following year, Tiff collected the triple jump crown with a then NCAA record (54-1 3/4) as UCLA won the championship. Tiff was a Bruin captain his senior year.

As a prep at Shaker Heights (Ohio) High School, Milan set the national scholastic record with a jump of 50-5.

In 1989 Tiff returned to active competition on the master's circuit and is the current world record holder on the master's level with a jump of 53-11.

Tiff, who has coached world record holder Willie Banks, 1984 Olympic gold medalist Al Joyner and 1988 Olympic silver medalist Mike Powell, is also a painter of abstract realism and has artwork in exhibits throughout the nation.

Milan and his wife, Aleita, live in Brentwood, Calif., with their 2 daughters, Synue (12) and Zaade (10).



DAN LANGE
Assistant Coach

Dan Lange is in his second year working with USC's throwers. The 26-year old Lange came to USC from the Advantage Athletics club for which he continues to coach during the summers.

Lange was a 4-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and was a 3-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier in the hammer. He won

All-American recognition in his 1988 senior season, finishing third in the hammer at the national meet. A 2-year captain at CSUN, Lange went on to coach 2 years (1989-90) for the Matadors before coming to USC in the fall of 1990.

Lange prepped at Hart High in Valencia, Calif., where he lettered for the track team in the discus throw. The 26-year Lange, who studied exercise physiology at CSUN, is single and still resides in Valencia.

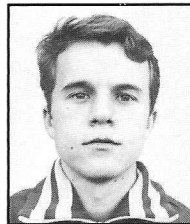

HIGH SCHOOL: Beaudet prepped at St. Francis High in La Canada, Calif...won All Del-Rey League honors for cross country (1986) and track (1988)...won All-Foothill League cross country recognition in 1987...had a prep best of 15:11 in the 3-mile...received academic honors for carrying a 4.0 GPA in high school.

PERSONAL: Dave was born Aug. 23, 1970, in Arcadia, Calif...majoring in political science...His father, Robert, is a chemistry professor at USC.

CAREER BESTS: 5000m - 14:36.01; 1500m - 4:09.65.



MARTIN CANNADY 5-11, 175, Senior, Intermediate Hurdles

THIS YEAR: After a year off recovering from a foot injury, Martin Cannady returns to the track healthy and in a different event...Cannady is returning to the intermediate hurdles after 3 years of college competition at 400m...He is

USC's top intermediate hurdler and is a vital reserve in USC's battle to be among the nation's best in both relays...Cannady is a team co-captain along with Quincy Watts.

COLLEGE -- 1991: What was supposed to be a banner year for Cannady turned into a season of frustration...a nagging foot bruise that he sustained over the course of several practices knocked him out a week into the season and forced him to redshirt the year...in his lone

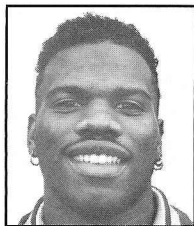
appearance of the season, he clocked a 48.9 in the 400m of a 4-way meet at Cal State Northridge...**1990:** As a junior in 1990, Cannady enjoyed a good season, posting a pair of sub-47s, including a season-best 46.85 in the preliminaries of the Pac-10 Championships in Seattle, Wash...was disqualified in the Pac-10 finals after running out of his lane on the final turn...ran a 46.91 to finish second in the open division at the Mt. SAC Relays...recorded a 47.23 to finish second at the Occidental Invitational behind teammate Travis Hannah's 46.32...ran seven 400m races during the season and finished no lower than third in any of them...also ran a 200m, posting a winning 21.75 at the Long Beach Twilight Invitational.

High...was the 1986 CIF Masters champion in the 100m (10.59) and 200m (21.31)...was a 3-time CIF 3-A champ in the 100m (1985-87) and 2-time winner (1986-87) in the 200m...posted a 37.3 in the 300m intermediate hurdles, which was the nation's top prep mark to that point of the 1987 season...led Duarte to the Mission Valley League title in 1986 and again in 1987...was a 3-time league champ in the 100m and 200m (1985-87) and ran the anchor leg for the 4x100m and 4x400m relay teams that won the 1986 and 1987 league titles.

PERSONAL: Martin was born in Los Angeles on Dec. 16, 1968...majoring in communications... an excellent student, Martin maintained a 3.50 GPA in high school...full name is Theodore Martin Cannady

CAREER BESTS: 100m - 10.54, 200m - 21.04, 400m - 46.71



CURTIS CONWAY **6-1, 180, Sophomore, Sprints**

THIS YEAR: One of Jim Bush's "seven" who figure prominently is USC's national plans, Conway teams with newcomer Jeff Laynes to give Troy an outstanding 1-2 threat in both the 100m and 200m...Curtis, who consistently ran the second leg on both of USC's relays last year, should assume the same role this year.

COLLEGE -- 1991: Despite spending 3 weeks of the season in spring football, Conway appeared in 6 meets as a freshman last year, running in 10 individual sprints and 8 relays...finished fifth in both the 100m (10.47) and 200m (20.94) in the Pac-10 Championships at Tempe, Ariz. ...in the Pac-10 preliminaries, clocked a 10.39 to finish third in the 100m and clocked a career-best 20.86 to finish second in the 200m...won the first 3 races of his college career: the 100m of the USC Homecoming meet where he posted a season-best wind-aided 10.32 and then the following week won the 100m (10.43) and 200m (20.91) in a 5-way meet at Arizona State...ran the second leg of USC's 4x100m and 4x400m relays that registered season-bests of 39.71 and 3:07.80...was one-fourth of what some termed the nation's fastest football 4x100m relay team that also included flankers Travis Hannah and Quincy Watts and cornerback Calvin Holmes (and occasionally cornerback John Herpin).

HIGH SCHOOL: Conway was the focal point in leading Hawthorne (Calif.) High to 3 consecutive state titles...as a senior in 1989, Conway won the state title in the 100m (10.42, second fastest prep time in the nation in 1989) and finished second in the 200m (20.89, third fastest prep time in the nation)...ran a 45.7 anchor in Hawthorne's second place finish in the 4x400m relay at the state meet...was a double sprint winner at the 1989 CIF masters (10.66, 21.04)...anchored the Hawthorne 4x100m relay team in 1989 which set a state record (40.25)...placed second in the 100m (10.85) and third in the 200m (21.30) as a junior at the 1988 state meet...teamed with current Trojan Travis Hannah in both football and track at Hawthorne...was a prep All-American as a senior quarterback for Hawthorne's football team...scored 62 of his team's 82 touchdowns during his junior and senior seasons...passed for 1,257 yards and 11 touchdowns and rushed for 758 yards and 10 TDs on 80 carries (9.5 avg.) his senior year.

PERSONAL: Curtis was born Nov. 13, 1971, in Los Angeles...majoring in criminal law...originally signed with USC in 1989, but did not qualify academically, and therefore attended El Camino College in Torrance, Calif., as a part-time student.

MARK CREAR **6-1, 175, Senior, Hurdles**

THIS YEAR: Mark Crear, who came out of nowhere in 1990 to become one of the nation's top collegiate high hurdlers of the season, hopes to regain similar form after sitting out last year...If Crear can recapture the success of 1990, he'll vie for both Pac-10 and NCAA titles.

COLLEGE -- 1991: An abdominal ligament strain suffered toward the end of the 1990 season and aggravated in the following fall forced Crear to sit out 1991 and redshirt the year...**1990:** Crear enjoyed a fantastic junior season at USC, winning All-American honors after finishing third in the 110m hurdles with a 13.65 at the NCAA Championships in Durham, N.C...At the Pac-10 Championships in Seattle, Wash., Mark took second to Washington State's Tony Li (13.93 to 13.94) after leading nearly the entire race (he clipped the ninth hurdle and momentarily lost his balance)...Crear sliced more than half a second off his previous personal best with a windy 13.51 at the S&W Modesto Relays on May 5 (it stood as the season's top collegiate mark for 3 weeks)...collected a victory (13.87 in UCLA dual) and 9 second place finishes in 14 races during the 1990 season...registered 9 sub-14.00 performances...ran the lead leg on USC's 4x400m relay team at the USC quadrangular (3:11.01) and at the UCLA dual (3:11.22).

JUNIOR COLLEGE: As a sophomore at Mt. San Antonio College (Walnut, Calif.), Mark finished third at the 1989 California state junior college meet with a then personal-best 14.07...as a freshman in 1988, Crear placed sixth in the high hurdles at the state meet.

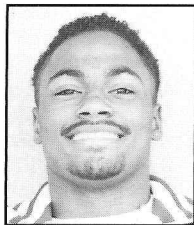

TRAVIS HANNAH 5-9, 165, Senior, Sprints

THIS YEAR: The biggest obstacle in Travis Hannah's quest for another Pac-10 title and a first ever NCAA Championship in the 400m stands in the form of Quincy Watts -- his teammate and roommate. Hannah will push Watts to the limit and vice versa thus creating perhaps

the best pair of quartermilers at any school this year.

COLLEGE -- 1991: A 3-time NCAA qualifier, Travis Hannah won his first ever Pac-10 crown as a junior last year, capturing the 400m title with a 46.16...despite being slowed by an injured left ankle, he advanced to the semis of the NCAA Championships in Eugene, Ore., with a 46.85, but did not move on to the finals though clocking a 46.39 in the semis...ran 7 races, all under 47 seconds...posted a season-best 45.84, the second fastest time in the Pac-10 last year (behind Watts' 45.59)...didn't run his first open 400m until March 30 and then missed the next 3 weeks of the season to tend to his duties in spring football...ran the third leg in all 6 of USC's 4x100m relay races and was part of a team that clocked a season-best 39.71...also ran the opening leg in the only 2 4x400m relays that USC attempted, which recorded a best of 3:07.80...**1990:** Though he suffered a strained groin muscle in football spring drills (March 12-30), Hannah nevertheless came on strong at the end of his sophomore season and won All-America recognition after finishing sixth at the NCAA Championships with a 45.90...matched his career best (45.54) in the semis of the same meet...posted a pair of second place finishes in the prelims and finals of the Pac-10 Championships, finishing behind UCLA's Olympian Steve Lewis...won the Occidental Invitational 400m (46.32)...ran his first and only collegiate 200m and registered a winning time of 21.32 in the UCLA dual meet...ran legs on USC's 4x100m and 4x400m relay teams...in fact, ran the opening leg of the 4x400m relay team that finished first at the Pac-10 Championships with a 3:05.06 (it was later disqualified for running out of the lane)...**1989:** As a freshman in 1989, Travis finished third (46.48) at the conference meet...appeared in 7 meets, winning the 400m 3 times...ran a career-best 45.54 to finish second in the UCLA dual...qualified for the NCAA meet in Provo, Utah, recording a 46.25 in his preliminary heat.

HIGH SCHOOL: As a senior, Hannah was the 1988 California State champ in the 400m (47.20) while running for perennial prep track power Hawthorne High...his high school best of 46.84 in 1988 (clocked while winning the Arcadia Invitational 400m) was second best in the

state (Watts ran a 46.67 at Taft High) and eighth best in the nation...won CIF Southern Section 400m title (47.06)...suffered a pulled hamstring at the Penn Relays...as a junior in 1987, finished second in the state 400m to Steve Lewis (47.2 to 46.7), who later won the Olympic gold medal in the same event...won the 1987 CIF Masters meet with a 47.80.

PERSONAL: Travis was born on Jan. 31, 1970...clocked a 4.21 in the 40, making him the fastest Trojan on the football team, a squad loaded with impressive sprinters...his cousin is NFL receiver Stephen Baker...majoring in education.

CAREER BEST: 200m - 21.32, 400m - 45:54



GARY KIRCHHOFF 6-4, 260, Junior, Throws

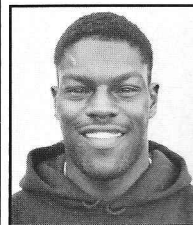
THIS YEAR: A junior college transfer, Gary Kirchoff figures to have an immediate impact as Troy's top threat in the discus and the shot put.

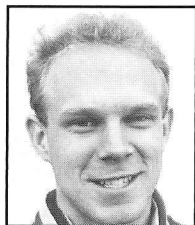

THIS YEAR: Todd Overstreet will team with Dave Beaudet and Dreux Valenti to give USC a solid trio of distance runners. Overstreet displayed tremendous improvement last year and enters his junior season as a runner who can threaten the top performers in the Pac-10.

DENY SEPAHER **6-4, 170, Junior, High Jump**

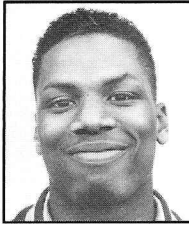
THIS YEAR: A year ago, Deny Sepaher emerged from nowhere as one of the top high jumpers in the Pac-10. If he makes similar progress this year, Sepaher could be a key element in USC's plans at the NCAA Championship meet in Austin, Tex.

COLLEGE -- 1991: Sepaher enjoyed an outstanding 1991 sophomore season...finished third at the Pac-10s in Tempe, Ariz., with a lifetime best jump of 6-10 3/4...jumped over 6-9 in 4 of 7 competitions...won the high jump in a 4-way meet at UCLA (6-9 3/4) and at the Mt. SAC Relays (6-9)...**1990:** As a freshman in 1990, Sepaher competed in 5 meets, posting a season best 6-8 to take fourth place at the UCLA dual.

HIGH SCHOOL: Sepaher prepped at Mills High in Millbrae, Calif., where as a 1989 senior he was Peninsula Athletic League champ in the high jump...also ran a leg on Mills' league championship 4x100m relay team.

PERSONAL: Denny was born Dec. 23, 1970 in San Francisco, Calif...majoring in business at USC...enjoys bungee jumping.

CAREER BEST: High Jump - 6-10 3/4



QUINCY WATTS 6-2, 195, Senior, Sprints

THIS YEAR: Perhaps the nation's top collegiate 400m sprinter, Quincy Watts begins the season ranked 10th in the world and sixth in the United States. Watts, a team co-captain with Martin Cannady, is the leading candidate for the NCAA title and a strong Olympic hopeful.

COLLEGE -- 1991: All the frustrations of his first 2 seasons at USC seemed to be long forgotten after Watts' performance during his 1991 junior season...Watts established himself as one of the nation's best 400m sprinters, winning 9 of 11 races during the collegiate season...was the NCAA runner-up in the championship meet at Eugene, Ore., running a 45.58 in the finals...clocked a 45.49 to win his semi-final heat...went on during the summer to finish third at the TACs in New York with a lifetime best 44.98, making him the second fastest Trojan ever (Billy Mullins ran a 44.84 in 1981)...finished third at the TACs and qualified for the World Championships representing the U.S. in the 4x400m relay...finished second with a 45.84 at the U.S. Olympic Festival held at UCLA in July...was fourth (second among U.S. competitors) at the Pan American Games in Havana, Cuba, with a 46.01...recorded a 45.59 at UCLA (April 13), which stood for 4 weeks as the best collegiate time for the season in the U.S...won the Mt. SAC Relays with a 45.79...A 2-time Pac-10 Athlete of the Week, Watts won his 400m heat at the Pac-10s (46.62), but was dehydrated afterwards and suffered a strained hamstring in the 200m prelims which forced him out of the remainder of the meet...anchored USC's 4x100m (season-best 39.71) relay team to a perfect 6-0 record last year...also anchored the 4x400m relay (3:07.80)...**1990:** Watts endured a college career checkered with injuries his first 2 years...was forced out of 3 meets during his 1990 sophomore season because of a hamstring injury...pulled up with a strained hamstring in the 200m semis at the NCAA Championships...had advanced to the semis by running a 20.76 in the prelims...finished third at the Pac-10 Championships in the 200m (21.22)...ran a 20.66 at the Occidental Invitational to record his best 200m since arriving at USC and as a result was named Pac-10 Athlete of the Week...won his only 400m race of the season with a 47.02...**1989:** Though hampered by nagging injuries, Watts' debut on the college ranks was impressive...opened his college career with a 10.62 and a 20.7 to take second in both events at the USC Centennial...a week later, recorded a season-best 10.46 in the 100m at the USC Twilight...won the UCLA dual 200m with a 20.67...qualified for the NCAA 100m and 200m, but a strained hamstring muscle put him out of the NCAA and Pac-10 meets.

HIGH SCHOOL: Watts was one of the most sought-after prep track recruits in the nation while at Taft High in Woodland Hills, Calif...a 3-time state champion...won the 200m title as a 1986 sophomore and as a 1987 junior...added the 100m state title to his collection in 1987...a hamstring injury hampered him in his 1988 senior season but was able to record the second fastest 200m in the nation (20.67)...ran a 46.7 400m during his senior season...logged his personal bests of 10.30 and 20.50 as a junior while winning the 100m and 200m at the Junior Olympics meet...ran a windy 10.17 to win the L.A. City 100m.

PERSONAL: Quincy was born in Detroit, Mich., on June 19, 1970...majoring in communications.

CAREER BESTS: 100m-10.30 (10.17w), 200m-20.50, 400m-44.98

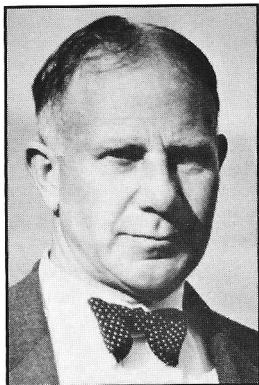

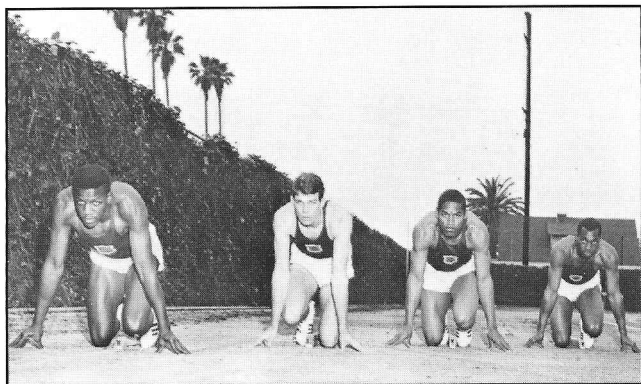

CHAMPIONS AND RECORD HOLDERS

WORLD RECORDS: 61 USC trackmen have equalled or bettered world records since 1912.
OLYMPIC GAMES: USC trackmen have won 23 individual Olympic titles and have shared in seven relay victories. Fifty-seven men have won a total of 86 places on United States Olympic teams.
NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC has won 26 out of the 71 NCAA Outdoor meets since its beginning in 1921. On 10 occasions they have finished second. The Trojans won 9 in a row (1935-1943), and 7 straight (1949-1955). They have also won 2 NCAA Indoor Championships since its beginning in 1965. A total of 97 individual outdoor championships highlight the record.
NATIONAL TAC CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC trackmen have won 86 individual senior TAC (formerly AAU) outdoor championships.

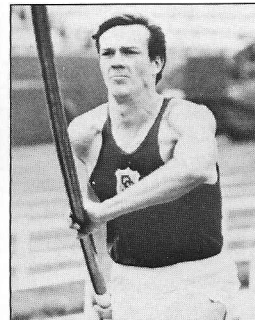

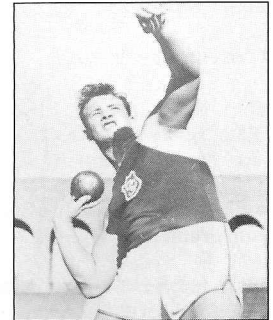

1992 WOMEN OF TROY OUTLOOK

Speed is the essence of track and field. Every athlete wants it and needs it to be successful. It dominates training sessions and competitions. Everything in the sport must be done so quickly.

However, USC must exercise a great deal of patience this year with its women's track and field team despite the fact it is a team loaded with speed.

The Women of Troy return their top 2 sprinters and its top 2 hurdlers of a year ago and have added a pair of speedy freshmen this year to make this one of the quickest USC women's teams in recent years.

"I like what we have in the women's team," said second-year USC coach Jim Bush. "This, however, is a young team full of sophomores who have to get over last year's freshmen-itis and freshmen who have to contribute right away if they can adjust to college competition."

Sophomore sprinters Inger Miller and Melanna Gray team with senior hurdler Michelle DeCoux and sophomore hurdler Felice Lipscomb to give USC a solid nucleus around which Bush can build this year's team. They are versatile and talented enough to compete in a variety of events, including both relays where they should prove to be quite a foursome.

While a foursome runs the sprints, a trio will throw the elements. Freshman Celeste McVey is the centerpiece of USC's throwing events. She and senior Teresa Ortega are Troy's skilled discus throwing duo. When she's not excelling in the discus, though, McVey pairs with Allison Franke to provide USC with a strong 1-2 combo in the javelin.

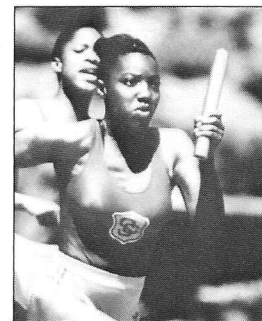
Multi-purpose freshman Tanya Smith ran, jumped and hurdled with the best of the U.S. prepsters last year. Now, she takes her talents to the collegiate level where she hopes to reach similar status -- in due time.

"We're probably a year away from competing among the elite of the Pac-10," added Bush. "Nonetheless, I expect us to make some positive strides this year that will put us in a position to be among the nation's better teams in a short time."

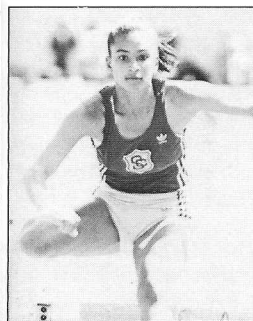
Here's an event-by-event breakdown of the Women of Troy.

SPRINTS--Sophomores Inger Miller (11.48, 23.57), Melanna Gray (11.77, 23.82) and Angela Rolfe (53.55) give Bush reason to smile about the sprints.

Miller was the top prep sprinter in 1990 and appears to have fully recovered from a foot injury that slowed her late last year. Gray showed great promise last year, posting career bests in both short sprints. Rolfe is healthy once again after an injury-plagued 1990 and redshirting last year and could push for national recognition this year if she can quickly develop a training base.



INGER MILLER



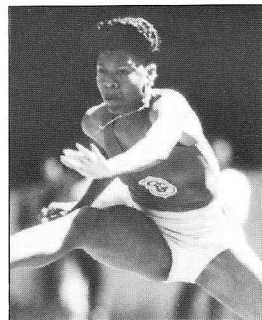

"Miller has the talent to be the top 100m sprinter in the Pac-10 this year," said Bush. "Roife is one of the most talented women I've seen in the 200m and 400m. My goal is to get her into the Olympics."

Freshman **Kerrie Pegues**, a fiery competitor out of St. Bernard High in Playa del Rey, Calif., is looking to push her name among USC's top sprinters and onto the Trojan relay teams, which will have not only quality but depth this year.

"Last year we sweated to keep 4 athletes going on our relay teams," said Bush, "but this year we have 7 different people from whom to choose for our relays."

HURDLES--Senior **Michelle DeCoux** (14.31, 58.23), a 3-time Pac-10 finalist in the intermediate hurdles, paces a heady list of hurdlers that includes sophomore **Felice Lipscomb** (13.96), the 1990 California state prep high hurdles champ, and **Tanya Smith**, who posted best prep high hurdle mark in the nation last year.

"I'm going to work DeCoux harder this year," said Bush. "Last year was my first year of coaching women, and I wasn't sure what I could demand of Michelle. Now I know, and I think she can be among the nation's best this year in the intermediates."

After a year off, DeCoux is running the high hurdles once again, using the event as a training device for the intermediates.

"Lipscomb now understands the college level of competition and should improve because of the experience," said Bush. "Smith is loaded with talent but I'm not sure how she'll do this year because she's so young."

DISTANCES--Sophomore **LaTima Jones**, who made a name for herself last year in the 200m (24.11) and 400m (55.19), is switching to the 800m this year because of Troy's great need in that event.

Junior **Amy Goodwin** (4:27.70, 11:00.8) provides quality representation for Troy in the 1500m and 3000m.

Freshman **Margarita Fernandez** is hoping to parlay a successful cross country season into a solid year in the 1500m and 3000m. Fellow freshmen **Carrie Cota**, **Julie Jackle** and **Katie Page** join Fernandez in the move from cross country to the distance events in track.

JUMPS--**Smith** (5-11), who is a quality high hurdler, will have to carry Troy's torch in the high jump by herself. In fact, the Women of Troy have no triple jumper and no proven long jumper.

THROWS--Freshman **Celeste McVey**, last year's California state prep champion in the discus, leads a trio of quality throwers for USC. McVey has the talent to push for Pac-10 recognition in the discus (160-11). In addition, she has a strong arm for the javelin (145-0). Senior **Teresa Ortega** (158-2) gives McVey an outstanding training partner in the discus. The pair should prove to be quite a combination for Troy. Junior **Allison Franke** (159-0) pairs with McVey in the javelin.

MICHELLE DeCOUX 5-7, Senior, Hurdles

THIS YEAR: A USC team co-captain along with Teresa Ortega, Michelle DeCoux enters her final year at USC looking for a Pac-10 title and NCAA All-American recognition. DeCoux, who finished second in the 400m hurdles at the past 2 Pac-10 Championships, is not only one of the

conference's top intermediate hurdlers, but she ranks among the best collegians in the nation as well.

COLLEGE--1991: A steady performer, DeCoux displayed uncommon durability that made her one of the top athletes in the Pac-10 during her 1991 junior season...finished no lower than second in 8 of her 10 intermediate hurdle races...was third at the Mt. SAC Relays (60.82)...recorded a personal-best 58.23 (third fastest time in USC history) in a meet against UCLA and BYU...at the Pac-10 Championships in Tempe, Ariz., she clocked a 59.57 in the prelims and a 59.20 in the finals, finishing second in both races...qualified for the NCAAs in Eugene, Ore., but did not advance past the prelims...**1990:** Michelle appeared in 11 meets during her sophomore season and ran 20 races in 15 weeks of competition...ran a season-best 59.60 in the 400m at the USC Twilight meet, the third fastest time ever by a USC athlete...finished no lower than second in all 10 intermediate hurdle races she ran...finished second in the intermediate hurdles at the Mt. SAC Relays (60.20), the Sun Angel Invitational (61.11), the Pac-10 Championships (60.23) and the UCLA dual (60.49)...registered a season-best 14.34 out of 8 high hurdles races...ran a season-best 8.20 in the 55m hurdles at the Idaho State Indoor Invitational...**1989:** Competed in 8 meets as a 1989 freshman, running 16 events and finishing no lower than fourth in any race...recorded a PR 14.31 in the 100m hurdles (at UCLA dual)...had a season-best 59.66 in the 400m hurdles at the Pac-10 meet...also ran a 25.90 in the only 200m race she ran all season.

HIGH SCHOOL: A double winner in 1988 California state meet (100m hurdles and 300m hurdles) while running for Bishop O'Dowd High in Oakland, Calif...ran nation's top prep time in 300m hurdles (42.16) while winning state title...also ran a season-best 13.86 in the 100m hurdles (No. 2 in the U.S.)...won the 1988 Keebler International 300m hurdles (42.59) in Elmhurst, Illinois...was the 300m hurdles North Coast Section champion as a junior and senior...was also 100m hurdles North Coast Section champion her senior season.

PERSONAL: DeCoux (pronounced "de-COO") was born in Oakland, Calif., on Dec. 30, 1969...a fine student, she won the CIF Scholar-Athlete Award in 1988...majoring in psychology at USC.

CAREER BESTS: 100m hurdles - 14.31, 400m hurdles - 58.23



LA TIMA JONES 5-8, Sophomore, Sprints

THIS YEAR: After performing well last year in the 200m and 400m, LaTima Jones moves to the 800m this year.

COLLEGE--1991: One of USC's 3 freshmen sprinters last year, Jones proved to be a pleasant addition to the team...finished seventh in the 400m (57.91) and fourth in the 200m (24.25)

at the Pac-10 Championships...ran 14 races last year, winning 3...swept the 200m (24.26w) and 400m (season-best 56.20) college titles at the Mt. SAC Relays.

HIGH SCHOOL: A 2-sport star at St. Anthony High in Long Beach, Calif., La Tima finished fourth at the state championships in the 200m (24.45) and fifth in the 400m (55.64)...was 3-time all-city...as a junior in 1989 she recorded season-best in 100m (12.22) while winning the CIF title...an outstanding forward on the St. Anthony girl's basketball team as well, winning 1990 CIF 2-A honors.

PERSONAL: La Tima was born June 22, 1972 in Harbor City, Calif...majoring in psychology.

CAREER BESTS: 200m - 24.11, 400m - 55.19



FELICE LIPSCOMB 5-4, Sophomore, Hurdles

THIS YEAR: This is the year in which Felice Lipscomb may step forward to emerge as a top flight hurdler in the Pac-10. Lipscomb's speed will not only make her a strong contender for Pac-10 recognition but it will also make her a key figure in Troy's relays.

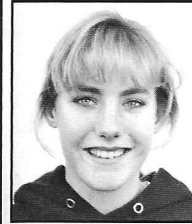

High, Felice was a double winner as a senior at the 1990 state championships, capturing the 100m high (13.58) and 300m intermediate (41.69) titles...finished second at the Golden West Invitational in the 100m highs (14.38)...a week later, she won both the 100m highs (13.92) and the 300m intermediates (42.47) at the International Prep Invitational in Elmhurst, Ill...owned the nation's best high school mark in both the 100m highs (13.92) and the 300m intermediates (41.69), her first year running the intermediates...was named USA Today All-USA...as a junior in 1989, Lipscomb won the state 100m highs (13.65) and recorded the nation's top prep mark in the 30-inch high hurdles (13.69)...as a sophomore in 1988, Felice clocked a 14.00 in the 30-inch 100m hurdles, the fourth best U.S. prep mark...finished third in the 100m highs at the state meet (current teammate Michelle DeCoux won the event)...was the 4-time Ocean League MVP while winning the league title in the 100m hurdles all 4 years...led the team to the league title both her sophomore and senior seasons.

CELESTE McVEY 5-9, Freshman, Throws

THIS YEAR: A multi-purpose thrower, Celeste McVey will team with Allison Franke to give USC a strong 1-2 combination in the javelin, and she'll team with Teresa Ortega to give the Women of Troy a solid duo in the discus.

HIGH SCHOOL: McVey was the top discus selection for *Track & Field News* All-American honors last year...as a senior at Redlands (Calif.) High, McVey tossed the discus a career-best 160-11 to win the state prep title last year...was a 2-time (1990 and 1991) CIF Masters and 4-A champ in the discus...was named field events MVP at the 1991 Mt. SAC Relays and Claremont Invitational...was a 3-time Citrus Belt League titlist in the discus and added the shot put crown last year...won the 1991 Golden West Invitational discus (156-8) and finished second (her only loss of the season) at the Keebler Invitational (148-0)...has also thrown the javelin, finishing third at the 1990 Junior TACs in Fresno.

PERSONAL: Celeste was born Aug. 6, 1973, in West Covina, Calif...in 1985, she set the TAC national record in the discus (99-2) for her age group...majoring in communications at USC.

CAREER BESTS: Discus - 160-11, Shot Put - 38-11 1/2, Javelin - 144-0



INGER MILLER 5-4, Sophomore, Sprints

THIS YEAR: Inger Miller is the centerpiece of USC's sprint corps. A likely participant at the NAAs, Miller should push for national recognition in the 100m, 200m and 1 of USC's relays.

COLLEGE--1991: Despite various ailments which sidelined her for portions of her 1991 freshman season, Miller still put together an outstanding year that made her one of the Pac-10s top underclass sprinters last year...won 4 of the 7 races she ran and finished second in 2 others and third in the other...won the 100m in her first 2 collegiate meets, a 5-way at UCI (11.90) and the USC Homecoming meet (11.77)...suffered a slight pulled groin muscle that kept her out for a month, but upon her return she lowered her season-best to 11.64 after finishing third in a triangular at UCLA...record her season-best and wind-aided 11.52 in winning the Mt. SAC Relays...qualified for the Pac-10s and ran a 24.01 in the 200m to advance to the finals but DQ'd in the 100m prelims...after anchoring USC to a second place finish in the 4x100m with a 44.61 (third fastest time in USC history), Miller was forced out of the meet with a recurring foot injury she originally suffered in high school.

HIGH SCHOOL: Miller was a prep All-American as a 1990 senior at John Muir High in Pasadena, Calif...posted 1990 U.S. prep bests in the 100m (11.48) and the 200m (23.57)...incurred severe tendinitis in her left foot that cut short her season in April...attempted to compete at the state meet but the tendinitis forced her out after the prelims...prior to the injury she captured the 100m (11.71) and 200m (23.57) titles at the Arcadia Invitational...anchored Muir's 1990 U.S. best 4x100m relay (46.07)...led Muir to the state championship as a junior in 1989...finished second at the state meet to Angela Burnham (now of UCLA) in both the 100m (11.46) and 200m (23.86)...had second best prep marks in the nation in both 100m (11.53) and 200m (23.62)...won the Arcadia Invitational 100m (11.64), beating Burnham (11.89) but finished second in the 200m (23.91) to Burnham (23.63)...relatively new to the sport; first started competing in track during her 1988 sophomore season at Muir...finished second at the 1988 state championship meet in the 100m and third in the 200m...had the nation's fourth best prep mark in both the 100m (11.64) and the 200m (23.59)...won the CIF and Pacific League 100m and 200m titles all 3 years at Muir.

PERSONAL: Inger is the daughter of former Trojan great Lennox Miller, who won a silver medal in the 1968 Olympics and a bronze in the 1972 Olympics while running the 100m for Jamaica...was a 1990 Rose Parade princess...was born in Los Angeles on June 12, 1972...majoring in communications while minoring in international relations.

CAREER BESTS: 100m - 11.48, 200m - 23.57



TERESA ORTEGA 6-0, Senior, Throws

THIS YEAR: A fifth-year member of the USC program, Teresa Ortega will team with freshman Celeste McVey to give USC a strong pair of discus throwers. Ortega, who made great strides of improvement last year, could prove to be among the Pac-10's elite throwers this year. She is a co-captain along with Michelle DeCoux.

COLLEGE--1991: Ortega used her 1991 junior season to develop into a consistent and good discus thrower...competed in 12 meets, including the Pac-10 Championships in Tempe, Ariz., where she finished 12th with a throw of 135-8...recorded 1 of 3 victories during the season by registering a PR 158-2 (sixth best throw ever by a Trojan) in a 5-way meet at Arizona State...also posted wins at the Cal State Relays (153-7) and the USC Homecoming meet (147-4)...tossed the discus 156-3 while taking fifth in a quadrangular at UCLA...competed in the shot twice during the season, posting a best of 35-0 1/2...**1990:** As a sophomore in 1990, Teresa recorded a season-best 147-8, which she threw at the L.A. Coliseum while finishing second in the UCLA dual...scored at the Pac-10 Championships in Seattle, Wash., with a 144-7, good for eighth place...threw the discus in 10 meets and collected a pair of second place finishes to go along with a third and 2 fourths...**1989:** Redshirted the season...**1988:** As a freshman, Teresa competed in 4 meets...tossed the javelin a personal-best 131-2 and the discus 121-10.

ANGELA ROLFE 5-9, Sophomore, Sprints

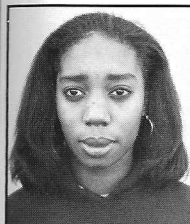

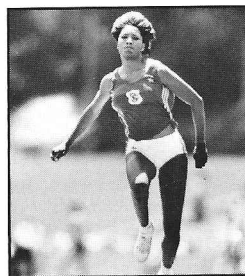

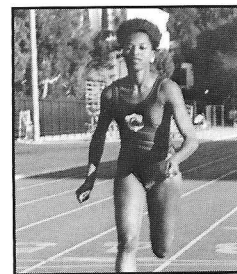

Trojan men's teams are tops in the nation in NCAA championships with 66 -- far more than any other university. And the football team has been voted national champions eight times.

USC has won the National Collegiate All-Sports Championship -- an annual ranking by The Knoxville Journal of the country's top men's athletic programs -- six times (1971-72-74-75-77-80) since its inception in 1971.

USC's women are also a force, with 13 national team titles, all since 1976.

From 1959-60 to 1984-85, USC put together an amazing streak. In each of those 26 years, at least one Trojan team won a national championship (including five crowns in both 1962-63 and 1976-77).
