

Events over one lap are officially recorded in tenths and no auto timing factors are therefore presented.

100 yard, 100 meter, 200 meter, 220 yard hand times are converted to automatic "equivalents" by adding a factor of 0.24; 400 meter flat and hurdles, add 0.14; 400 relay, add 0.14 hand-timed yards to automatic metric equivalent; 440 yards flat and hurdles, subtract 0.16; 440 relay, subtract 0.06; hand-timed decathlons are worth about an extra 75 points compared to an automatically timed ten-eventer.

All athletes who meet the more stringent qualifying mark will automatically compete at the NCAA meet. The remaining spots in the championship field will be filled by those athletes who meet the provisional requirements, but in descending order so that the best performances fill the field first.

1993 USC Men's Track Outlook

After losing all but 1 NCAA qualifier from last year's USC men's track team that finished third in the NAAs, one would think that head coach Jim Bush would downplay expectations for 1993. Not true.

Quite the opposite, in fact.

"If we can keep everyone healthy and the athletes improve like I think they can, I believe we will be fighting for the national championship," he said.

Lofty goals for a coach whose team isn't picked by many prognosticators to even be in the top 20. But Bush feels he has the formula to score the points needed.

"We are not going to be a great dual meet team, but probably better than we have been in the last 2 years," said Bush. "We finally have every event covered. What we are going to be is a outstanding big meet team."

Among the athletes Bush will have to replace are quartermilers Quincy Watts (43.50), the Olympic and NCAA champion, Travis Hannah (45.17), who finished fourth at the NCAA meet, NCAA high-hurdle titlist Mark Crear (school record 13.33) and sprinter Curtis Conway (10.28 in 100m, 20.77 in 200m), who has entered the upcoming NFL draft.

"I have the best group of freshmen that I've ever recruited in my 42 years," said Bush, now in his third season at the helm of USC, and who won 5 NCAA crowns at UCLA. "I think we have the potential to win 4 individual NCAA championships, including 2 by athletes that are only freshmen. Plus, we have the ability to place in the top 4 in several other events."

Here is a breakdown of the 1993 Trojans:


SPRINTS--An overwhelming strength for the Trojans in 1992, Bush sees 1 proven sprinter and then a whole lot of potential this season.

Senior Jeff Laynes, a former state juco champion in both the 100m and 200m, is Bush's proven sprinter (10.20, 20.51). The Oakland native finished fifth in the 100m at last year's NAAs and has the potential to get under 10 seconds in the 100m.


Sophomore Michael Bradley (10.78, 22.36) will back Laynes, but was untested last season, running in only 4 meets.

"The loss of Conway really hurts, said Bush. "He would have been an impact performer for us in both the sprints and relays."

Despite the loss of Watts and Hannah, Bush still feels that he has a pair of 400m runner who are among the best in the nation in

MICHAEL BRADLEY**



chose from in the sprint relay. A combination of freshman Pedro Rodrigues, James, Laynes, junior Marcus Carter and Greene will form the 4 X 400 team.

HURDLES--Portugal native Pedro Rodrigues (49.46) is USC's top intermediate hurdler as only a freshman. Bush believes that Rodrigues will be an immediate threat for the NCAA title this season.

High hurdles is a question mark for the Trojans with the graduation of Crear. Soph Eric Bell is USC's top returner (14.31), but will have to improve dramatically to reach the NAAs. McFadden (14.1 in high school), a tailback for USC's football team and a state qualifier in the intermediate and high hurdles in high school in Oklahoma, will also run for the Trojans.




**MARCUS CARTER AND

DISTANCE--The distances are not a strong area for USC, with an asterisk. The Trojans have recruited several raw talents who should be impact performers in the future. Meanwhile, 2 veterans return for their senior season.


Dave Beaudet (14:36.01), who sat out most of last year, returns to run the 5,000m while working on his graduate degree. Todd Overstreet will need to return to his sophomore form in the 800m (1:50.76) if he is going to have any impact this year.

"Beaudet should place in the Pac-10 meet and will be our leader in the distance races," said Bush.

JUMPS--Senior Jamal Elmidge (23-3 1/2 in long jump, 50-0 1/2 in triple



POLE VAULT--Junior Eric Klassen (16-6 3/4) is USC's best vaulter. He will be backed by soph Wolfgang von Aspe (14-0) and freshmen Brian Levredge (14-0) and Chris Gilberg (14-0).


THROWS--Bush feels that this will be the best unit for Troy in several years. Junior Gary Kirchhoff (58-2 in the shot), who missed last season with a back injury, has returned. A former Southern California juco shot put champion at Saddleback College, Kirchhoff is capable of reaching 62 feet. If he does that, he should place in the nationals.

Kirchoff (169-0) and sophomore Chad Danowsky (176-8) will compete in the discus.

In the hammer throw, Bush feels that he has the premier throwers in the nation in freshman Balazs Kiss (school record 249-9). Kiss, a native of Hungary, is capable of dominating the world of collegiate hammer throwing for the next 4 years. Already, he has broken the school record of 225-10. Danowsky (197-8) will also compete in this event.

jump) and sophomore transfer Del Vaughn Alexander (48-7, 6-11 in the high jump) will compete in both the long jump and triple jump for USC, but both need some improvement to reach the NCAAs.

Senior Deny Sepaher (6-10 1/4) is 1 of USC's top high jumpers, while Elmidge (6-10 1/4) and Alexander (6-11) might also compete in this event. Freshman Brandon Overstreet (6-8 in high school) will also be available for the Trojans.

In the javelin, USC doesn't have a proven athlete. Mike Thomas (143-11) and soph decathlete Alexis Sharp (180-1) are Troy's best throwers.

DECATHLON--Sophomores James Prestridge (7038) and Sharp (7010), and Klassen (7137), will compete.


"Any 1 of those 3 has the potential to score in the nationals in they can stay healthy," said Bush. "Most of the top decathletes in the nation from a year ago have graduated. If 1 of our guys could come through then that would be frosting on the cake."

career. She looks to be healthy and if she returns to peak form could be a bonus for the Trojans.

Sophomore Kerrie Pegues (12.49, 25.29, 2:24.65) is USC's most versatile runner and may again compete in both the sprints and 800m.

"We should be very strong in the relays with a number of athletes that we can use in both events," said Edmonson.

HURDLES--Junior Felice Lipscomb returns and will run both the 100 (13.62) and 400 (59.44) hurdles. She may also be used in the relays.


DISTANCE--As is the case with the men's program, the Women of Troy distance program is in its early building stages. Freshmen Maurita DelaTorre will be USC's top runners this season and will only get better with experience.

JUMPS--Sophomores Crissy Mills (6-1 1/2) and Tanya Smith (career-best 5-11) and freshman Janea Oliveira (5-7) give USC a solid group of high jumpers, each capable of being in the

6-foot range. Freshman Nicole Haynes is USC's lone long jumper. She was the 1992 CIF 2-A Division champion and has a personal-best of 19-7 1/2. She finished third in the state the past 2 years.

"Whereas we only had sprinters last year," said Edmonson, "I'm now very confident in our jumpers and throwers."


THROWS--Allison Franke will compete in the javelin (164-4), shot put (38-8 1/4) and discus (166-5). The senior placed seventh at last year's NCAAs in both the javelin and discus to earn All-American honors. Soph Celeste McVey (149-2 in the discus, 128-3 in the javelin) has made strides in the off-season and hopes to improve on her 1992 finishes at the Pac-10 in the discus and javelin (seventh and 11th, respectively). USC does not have a shot putter this season.

Jim Bush USC Men's Head Track Coach



It's one of the most unusual pairings in the history of college athletics, but logically it's a natural fit. Long-time UCLA coach Jim Bush is a Trojan, serving his third year as head coach of USC's men's track and field program (he also served as women's coach for parts of 2 seasons).

Last season, the Trojans finished third in the NCAAs, their highest finish since 1984 and Quincy Watts, the 1992 Olympic champion in the 400m and Mark Crear earned individual NCAA championships.

Bush, 66, a 1987 inductee in the National Track and Field Hall of Fame as one of the collegiate ranks' most successful coaches ever, is now the head coach of the winningest collegiate track and field program, and in the process becomes the first person ever to coach both the UCLA and USC track programs.

"I never planned on this happening," said Bush. "You save the very best for last. This is definitely my last coaching assignment, but I think it's the best."

Bush, who served 2 years (1989-90) as a volunteer assistant coach at USC, spent 20 years (1965-84) as the head coach at UCLA, guiding the Bruins to 5 NCAA titles (1966-71-72-73-78) and 3 second place finishes (1974-75-80). All told, 15 of his 20 UCLA teams finished among the NCAA's top 5. His teams won 87.9% of their dual meets (152-21), 7 national dual meet championships awarded by *Track & Field News*, and 7 conference championships. In addition, UCLA posted 10 undefeated seasons under Bush, putting together winning streaks of 17, 20, 34 and 42.

The 1971 and 1973 U.S. Track Coaches Association National Coach of the Year (the first 2-time recipient), Bush has coached 35 NCAA outdoor individual champions (including USC's Watts, Crear and Robert Reading, winner of the 1989 high hurdles and USC's first NCAA champ since 1982) and 20 Olympians, including Watts, the Gold Medalist in the 400m and 1600 relay, and former Bruins Wayne Collett, John Smith, Willie Banks, Greg Foster and Andre Phillips.

Prior to Bush's arrival on the Westwood campus, UCLA had never beaten USC in 32 tries. However, under Bush, the Bruins not only defeated USC, they collected 13 wins in 19 dual meets with the Trojans.

In 1984, Bush retired from UCLA at the age of 58 and spent the following 5 years as the conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers, the Los Angeles Raiders and the Los Angeles Clippers. While still at UCLA in the early 1970s, Bush served 3 years as the conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Lakers and Los Angeles Kings. He returned to track in 1989 when longtime friend Ernie Bullard invited Bush to take part in the USC track program as a volunteer assistant for the men's hurdles.

A noted author, lecturer and clinician, Bush has served as a consultant to the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports and the U.S. National Fitness Foundation. He was president of the U.S. Track Coaches Association (1972-73), chairman of the Western United States Olympic Development Committee, on the NCAA Track Coaches Association executive committee for 10 years, and on the Athletic Congress executive board for

7 years. He was head coach of the U.S. team at the 1979 Pan American Games. He also acted as technical director for the track scenes in NBC's movie "The Golden Moment."

He served as a writer for UPI at the 1968 and 1972 Olympics.

Bush, a 1951 graduate of California, began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for Golden Bear football coach Pappy Waldorf. He served as an assistant track coach at Berkeley (Calif.) High in the 1952 season and then move to Southern California, spending 7 seasons (1953-59) at Fullerton (Calif.) High. After 2 seasons (1960-61) at Fullerton College and 3 years (1962-64) at Occidental College, Bush succeeded the late Ducky Drake as UCLA's head coach in 1965.

Born Sept. 15, 1926, in Cleveland, Ohio, Bush moved with his family to California when he was 3 years old. He prepped at Bakersfield (Calif.) High and lettered in both track and football. His athletic accomplishments merited him as an inductee into the Kern County Hall of Fame. Upon graduation in 1944, Bush joined the Naval Air Corps.

Jim has 2 children, Jean and Don. He and his wife, Francoise, live in Culver City.

Barbara Edmonson USC's Women of Troy Track Coach



One of the finest women sprinters of all-time, Barbara Edmonson is in her first full year as USC's women's head coach. She took over in April of last season and led the Trojans to a third place finish in the Pac-10.


Edmondson came to USC in 1991 and in the process become one of the few, if any, coaches to handle both the men's and women's sprinters at a Division I program. Edmonson is a former world record holder in the 50m, 100m and 200m and, competing under her maiden name of Ferrell, was a member of the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic teams. In fact, she was a member of the gold medal-winning 100m relay team and also won the 200m silver at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. She was recognized for several years as the United States' top performer in her specialties. And like men's head coach Jim Bush, Edmonson is a member of the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame (1988 inductee). She is 1 of 12 track and field Hall of Fame members to be associated with USC.

Edmonson was an elementary teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District for 8 years (1968-76) and continued to compete on an international level for much of her teaching career. In 1976, she moved on to become the United Teachers of Los Angeles union representative. At the same time, she returned to track as a coach for the Beyond Athletics Track Club. In 1980, she stepped up to the college ranks, coaching the sprinters at West Los Angeles Junior College. Edmonson became the head boy's and girl's coach at St. Bernard High in Playa Del Rey, Calif., in 1988 and led both teams to the league title.

She is the wife of past UCLA sprint great Warren Edmonson, the 1972 NCAA 100m champion.

In his seventh season at USC, Mike Bailey has been instrumental in USC's recent success in the throws and multi-events. Bailey was the head coach of the USC women's program for 2 seasons (1989-90) before it was consolidated under one umbrella with the men's program in 1991. As a result, Bailey returned his focus to his first love -- the field events, where he has already


coached 3 of USC's 4 all-time NCAA women champions. Bailey guided Wendy Brown (heptathlon), Yvette Bates (triple jump) and Ashley Selman (javelin) to their respective NCAA crowns. Indeed, he's made quite an impact on USC track and field in a short span.

In his 2 years as women's head coach, Bailey led USC to 5 wins in 7 dual meets. He coached 18 All-Americans and 7 USC record holders. Bailey, who spent 2 prior seasons (1987-88) as Fred LaPlante's assistant at USC, guided the Women of Troy to a ninth place finish at the 1989 NCAAAs, his first season as USC's head coach.

The 36-year-old Bailey came to USC in 1987 after spending 2 years (1985-86) as the head women's coach at Idaho State. For 4 previous years (1981-84), he was the head coach at Judge Memorial High in Salt Lake City, Utah.

A strong technician in the multi-events, Bailey draws upon his own experience as a decathlete, though he never competed in college track and field. He was a celebrated high school decathlete and was the 1974 and 1975 Western U.S. decathlon champion. He gave up the decathlon in college and starred for 4 years as a middle linebacker at Utah. He continued playing football for 2 years in the Canadian Football League with Calgary and Saskatchewan. Upon his departure from football, Bailey resumed training in the decathlon in 1982. He logged a personal best of 7,621 points in the 10-eventer. A ruptured Achilles tendon in 1987 ended his competition and signaled the start of his coaching career.

Mike and his wife, Cindy, have a 16-year old son, Michael.





Dan Lange is in his third year working with USC's throwers. The 27-year-old Lange came to USC from the Advantage Athletics club for which he continues to coach during the summers.

Lange was a 4-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and was a 3-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier in the hammer. He won All-American

1 track team in the discus throw. The 27-year-old Lange, who studied exercise physiology at CSUN, is single and still resides in Valencia.








DEL VAUGHN ALEXANDER 6-2, 175, Jumps, Junior

Heritage

CHAMPIONS AND RECORD HOLDERS

WORLD RECORDS: 61 USC trackmen have equalled or bettered world records since 1912.

OLYMPIC GAMES: USC trackmen have won 24 individual Olympic titles and have shared in 8 relay victories. Fifty-eight men have won a total of 87 places on United States Olympic teams.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC has won 26 out of the 72 NCAA Outdoor meets since its beginning in 1921. On 10 occasions they have finished second. The Trojans won 9 in a row (1935-1943), and 7 straight (1949-1955). They have also won 2 NCAA Indoor Championships since its beginning in 1965. A total of 99 individual outdoor championships highlight the record.





1993 Women of Troy Outlook

If a team is an extension of its coach, then the 1992 USC women's track team will have sprinter's speed.


Under the tutelage of Barbara Edmonson, a member of the United States' gold medal-winning 4 X 100 relay team in the 1968 Olympics, the Women of Troy are deep in the sprint events this season.

"With basically 6 people, we placed third in the Pac-10 meet last year," said Edmonson, who took over as head coach in April of last season. "And if it were not for injury problems, we probably would have placed better at the NAAs (USC finished 43rd). This year we are a lot deeper, so we'll have the flexibility to adjust."

With the exception of Michelle DeCoux in the 400 intermediate hurdles and distance runner Margarita Fernandez, USC returns its top 1992 performer in every event. And in the case of the sprint events, its top 3.

"The bottom line is that we have a lot more depth than last year," said Edmonson. "You'll see a more mature team, with a winning attitude."



INGER MILLER

SPRINTS--Leading the very deep corps of sprinters for USC is junior Inger Miller (11.16 in the 100m, 23.04 in 200m). The early favorite to win the Pac-10, Edmonson has higher expectations for her.

"She should be the No. 1 sprinter in the country," said Edmonson. "With her strength and maturity, she should run away with it. Last year, she set 2 school records and should easily wipe those from the books this season."



MELANNA GRAY

Juniors Melanna Gray (11.58/23.94) and LaTima Jones (11.78/23.72/53.65 in the 400m) return and could elevate to the NCAA level this season. Gray, who missed the final month of last season with a knee injury, is fully recovered.

A pair of newcomers add to USC's depth. freshman Kanika Conwright, last year's L.A. City champion in the 100 and 200, and senior UC Irvine transfer Desiree Bracey, the 1991 Big West Conference 100 and 200 champion, give Edmonson a long list to choose from for the relays.

Angela Rolfe (53.55), a former 3-time California state champion in the 400m, has been fighting injury problems her entire USC

Barbara Edmonson *USC's Women of Troy Track Coach*



One of the finest women sprinters of all-time, Barbara Edmonson is in her first full year as USC's women's head coach. She took over in April of last season and led the Trojans to a third place finish in the Pac-10.


Edmondson came to USC in 1991 and in the process become one of the few, if any, coaches to handle both the men's and women's sprinters at a Division I program. Edmonson is a former world record holder in the 50m, 100m and 200m and, competing under her maiden name of Ferrell, was a member of the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic teams. In fact, she was a member of the gold medal-winning 100m relay team and also won the 200m silver at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. She was recognized for several years as the United States' top performer in her specialties. And like men's head coach Jim Bush, Edmonson is a member of the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame (1988 inductee). She is 1 of 12 track and field Hall of Fame members to be associated with USC.

Edmonson was an elementary teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District for 8 years (1968-76) and continued to compete on an international level for much of her teaching career. In 1976, she moved on to become the United Teachers of Los Angeles union representative. At the same time, she returned to track as a coach for the Beyond Athletics Track Club. In 1980, she stepped up to the college ranks, coaching the sprinters at West Los Angeles Junior College. Edmonson became the head boy's and girl's coach at St. Bernard High in Playa Del Rey, Calif., in 1988 and led both teams to the league title.

She is the wife of past UCLA sprint great Warren Edmonson, the 1972 NCAA 100m champion.

MIKE BAILEY

Assistant Coach

In his seventh season at USC, Mike Bailey has been instrumental in USC's recent success in the throws and multi-events. Bailey was the head coach of the USC women's program for 2 seasons (1989-90) before it was consolidated under one umbrella with the men's program in 1991. As a result, Bailey returned his focus to his first love -- the field events, where he has already


coached 3 of USC's 4 all-time NCAA women champions. Bailey guided Wendy Brown (heptathlon), Yvette Bates (triple jump) and Ashley Selman (javelin) to their respective NCAA crowns. Indeed, he's made quite an impact on USC track and field in a short span.

In his 2 years as women's head coach, Bailey led USC to 5 wins in 7 dual meets. He coached 18 All-Americans and 7 USC record holders. Bailey, who spent 2 prior seasons (1987-88) as Fred LaPlante's assistant at USC, guided the Women of Troy to a ninth place finish at the 1989 NCAAAs, his first season as USC's head coach.

The 36-year-old Bailey came to USC in 1987 after spending 2 years (1985-86) as the head women's coach at Idaho State. For 4 previous years (1981-84), he was the head coach at Judge Memorial High in Salt Lake City, Utah.

A strong technician in the multi-events, Bailey draws upon his own experience as a decathlete, though he never competed in college track and field. He was a celebrated high school decathlete and was the 1974 and 1975 Western U.S. decathlon champion. He gave up the decathlon in college and starred for 4 years as a middle linebacker at Utah. He continued playing football for 2 years in the Canadian Football League with Calgary and Saskatchewan. Upon his departure from football, Bailey resumed training in the decathlon in 1982. He logged a personal best of 7,621 points in the 10-eventer. A ruptured Achilles tendon in 1987 ended his competition and signaled the start of his coaching career.

Mike and his wife, Cindy, have a 16-year old son, Michael.




DAN LANGE

Assistant Coach



Over the years, Lang has coached 3 State, 1 CIF and 5 L.A. City high jump champions. He also tutored 1980 Olympian Greg Caldwell and 1980 national champion Freeman Miller in the triple jump.

Prior to enrolling at UCLA, Lang attended East Los Angeles Community College and was the state community college high jump champion in 1969 with a leap of 6-11.

JOE ARRAZOLA

Assistant Coach

With a wealth of coaching experience dating back to 1962, Joe Arrazola begins his first year as an assistant coach at USC. He also serves as the head coach for Troy's men's and women's cross country program.

The 1963 national junior AAU champion in the 15k run, Arrazola is active in both The Athletic Congress

(TAC) and the AAU. Prior to coming to USC last summer, he had served as a private coach since 1990.

The 57-year-old Arrazola was head track and field coach at Metro State (1971-74) in Colorado. In addition, other coaching stops included assistant positions at Denver University (1962-66) and Arapahoe H.S. in Littleton, Colo. (1978-87).

Arrazola served as distance coach for the United States' Pan American team in 1987 and was the U.S. coach at the 1989 Men's World Cross Country Championships.

An avid photographer, Arrazola has shot assignments for *Track & Field News*.

(Note: The following biographies are limited to those performers expected to see the most action this season.)



DESIREE BRACEY 5-6, Senior, Sprints

THIS YEAR: The addition of former Big West Conference 100 and 200m champion Desiree Bracey of UC Irvine will add to USC's depth of quality sprinters. (In addition to Bracey, Dustin James joined the USC men's team from the Ant-eater program.) She has 1 year of eligibility.

UC IRVINE -- 1992: Finished second in the 100m (11.85) and third in the 200m (24.15) at the Big West meet...anchored UCI's conference champion 4X100 meter relay...**1991:** Won Big West Conference 100m (11.73) and 200 (24.14) as a sophomore, setting school records in the process...competed at the NCAA Championships, but did not advance past prelims...**1990:** Finished third in the 100m and fourth in the 200m as a freshman.

HIGH SCHOOL: Competed in track, basketball and volleyball at Pius X High in Downey....Earned All-CIF honors in volleyball.

PERSONAL: Bracey was born Oct. 7, 1971 in Los Angeles....stepfather, Daniel Frawley, is a former swimmer at USC who lettered in 1969-70.

CAREER BESTS: 100m-11.73; 200m-24.14; 400m- 56.53



ALLISON FRANKE 5-10, Senior, Throws

THIS YEAR: Perhaps USC's most versatile athlete, senior Allison Franke teams with Celeste McVey to give USC a strong 1-2 combination in the discus and javelin. She will also compete in the heptathlon.

COLLEGE -- 1992: Enjoyed a fine junior season in the discus, the javelin and the heptathlon...she finished seventh in both the javelin (157-7) and discus (163-7) at the NCAA championships...finished sixth in the Pac-10 heptathlon with 4,795 points, but posted her season-best 4,865 at the California Invitational Heptathlon where she finished fifth...took a pair of second place finishes at the Pac-10 meet in both the discus (160-4) and the javelin (164-4, third best performer in USC history), recording then season-bests in both events...three days later topped her season-best in the discus (166-5, fourth best performer in USC history) and qualified for the NCAAs in a last chance meet at Mt. SAC...recorded 8 victories in the javelin during the season, losing only at the Pac-10 meet in Eugene, Ore...also won 3 discus competitions, including the Santa Barbara Easter Relays, where she swept the javelin (155-3) and discus (157-8) competition...also performed admirably in the triple jump, posting a lifetime best jump of 38-7 3/4...**1991:** It took Franke little time to put her name in USC's track & field annals...tossed the javelin a season-best 156-8 (then fourth best thrower in Trojan history) in only her third meet at USC ...finished second in the javelin in 5 different meets (4 of which teammate Ashley Selman won)...finished fourth in the Pac-10 Championships in Tempe, Ariz., with a throw of 151-11...tossed the disc a season-best 160-0 to finish in seventh at the Pac-10s...competed in 11 meets as a

sophomore...**1990:** As a freshman in 1990, Franke competed at Southern Methodist, where she won the Southwest Conference titles in both the javelin (137-4) and discus (169-4, an SMU school record)...finished fifth in the heptathlon (4,304 points) at the SWC meet and accounted for 24 of SMU's 38 points...was the high point performer of the meet and as a result was named the meet's most valuable female athlete ...threw the discus 150-3 in the prelims of the NCAA Championships in Durham, N.C. but did not advance.

HIGH SCHOOL: One of the finest female athletes ever to come out of Canyon High in Anaheim, Calif., Allison was a 3-time CIF 4-A champ in the discus, 2-time champ in the triple jump and collected another title in the long jump (6 CIF crowns in 3 seasons)...as a senior in 1989, she had the nation's sixth best prep mark in the discus (160-6)...was selected Los Angeles Times Female Athlete of the Year both her junior and senior year...won the CIF Master's discus title with a toss of 153-11...finished fourth in the long jump (17-8 3/4) at the same meet.

PERSONAL: Franke (pronounced frank-ee) was born Aug. 4, 1971 in Fullerton, Calif...majoring in communications.

CAREER BESTS: Discus - 169-4, Javelin - 164-4, Long Jump - 18-5, Triple Jump - 38-7 3/4, Heptathlon - 4897



MELANNA GRAY 5-4, Junior, Sprints

THIS YEAR: Melanna Gray, a junior, is recovering from tendinitis problem in her knee that forced her to miss the second half of last season.

COLLEGE-1992: Finished no worse than third in either the 100m or 200m all season before experiencing knee problems in April...won the 100 at

both the Santa Barbara Easter Relay (career-best 11.58) and triangular at Cal...**1991:** As just a freshman, Gray enjoyed an outstanding season...qualified for the Pac-10 Championships in Tempe, Ariz., where she ran an 11.99 100m and a 24.75 in the 200m in the prelims...was unable to compete in the finals because of a strained hamstring suffered in running a leg in USC's 4x100m relay later in the meet...won the 200m at the Mt. SAC Relays with a PR 23.82 (sixth fastest ever at USC)...twice ran an 11.82 (seventh fastest at USC) to finish second at the USC Homecoming and fourth at the Modesto Relays...also clocked an 11.85 to finish fourth in the 100m at the UCLA/Houston/TCU/USC meet.

HIGH SCHOOL: A prep All-American at North Kansas City High in Kansas City, Mo., Gray finished second at the Golden West Invitational with 11.80 in the 100m, Track & Field News' fourth fastest time by a U.S. prep in 1990...undefeated in both the 100m and 200m during her 1989 junior and 1990 senior seasons...was a 2-time state champ in the 100m and 200m, clocking her prep bests of 11.77 and 24.20 her senior year while leading North Kansas City to the state title...as a junior in 1989 won the Kansas University Relays 100m (11.85)...anchored her high school's 4x100m to the state title...was also a 2-time recipient of the Wayne Campbell Award recognizing her as the best female athlete in Kansas City...lettered 2 years in basketball as well.

PERSONAL: Melanna was born July 16, 1972 in Kansas City, Mo...majoring in drama at USC...her father, Mel Gray, was an All-Pro receiver for the NFL's St. Louis Cardinals for 11 years...paints portraits and has had her work shown in exhibits.

CAREER BESTS: 100m - 11.58, 200m - 23.82



LA TIMA JONES 5-8, Junior, Sprints

THIS YEAR: La Tima Jones is expected elevate her performance as a junior and possibly qualify for the NCAA Championships this season.

COLLEGE -- 1992: Began year as Troy's only half-miler but switched back to her original events,

the 200m and 400m early in the season...finished second in the 400m (53.86) at the Pac-10 Championships in Eugene, Ore., and took a fifth in the 200m (23.72) at the same meet...in fact, ran 4 sprints (200m, 400m 4x100m and 4x400m) in less than 2 hours at the Pac-10 Championships...posted a career-best 23.72 in the 200m in a triangular at California and clocked a career-best 53.65 to win the 400m in the university division at the Mt. SAC Relays...won 5 of 7 400m races...Ran career-best 11.78 in the 100m at Santa Barbara Easter Relays...**1991:** One of USC's 3 freshmen sprinters in 1991, Jones proved to be a pleasant addition to the team...qualified for the Pac-10 Championships in both the 200m and 400m, finishing seventh in the 400m (57.91) and fourth in the 200m (season-best 24.25)...ran 14 races, winning 3...placed first in the 400m (57.36) at USC's Homecoming meet and swept the 200m (24.26w) and 400m (season-best 56.20) college titles at the Mt. SAC Relays...continually ran the third leg on USC's 4x100m and 4x400m relays.

HIGH SCHOOL: A 2-sport star at St. Anthony High in Long Beach, Calif., La Tima finished fourth at the state championships in the 200m (24.45) and fifth in the 400m (55.64)...was the CIF 2-A champion in the 200m (24.79) and 400m (55.19, division record)...was 3-time All-City...named to the 1990 Long Beach Press-Telegram Dream Team in both track and basketball...as a junior in 1989, she recorded season-best in 100m (12.22) while winning the CIF title...an outstanding forward on the St. Anthony girl's basketball team as well, winning CIF 2-A honors for her play during her 1990 senior season...named Camino Real League MVP after averaging 21.3 points and 21.8 rebounds...named L.A. Times All-South Coast in basketball...collected 28 points and 20 rebounds in a victory over league champion St. Bernard...was senior class president...member of the national honor society and the California Scholarship Federation.

PERSONAL: La Tima was born June 22, 1972 in Harbor City, Calif...majoring in psychology.

CAREER BESTS: 100m - 11.78, 200m - 23.72, 400m - 53.65



FELICE LIPSCOMB 5-4, Junior, Hurdles

THIS YEAR: Felice Lipscomb is USC's top returning hurdler as a junior and will be asked to fill the void caused by the graduation of Michelle DeCoux.

COLLEGE -- 1992: After a slow start, Lipscomb

finished strong in her sophomore campaign...clocked a PR 13.62 to win the 100m high hurdles in the UCLA dual and later that same meet recorded a PR 59.44 in the intermediate hurdles...was fifth in the high hurdles (13.66) at the Pac-10 Championships in Eugene, Ore., and fourth in the intermediates (61.01)...ran the opening legs on the majority of USC's 4x100m and 4x400m

relay races... **1991:** Lipscomb burst onto the college scene in grand fashion, winning the first 3 competitions of her freshman season...won the 100m high hurdles at the Long Beach Relays (14.35), a quadrangular at Cal State Northridge (14.07) and a 5-way meet at UC Irvine (14.16)...though she finished second in her fourth meet, the USC Homecoming, she still recorded a then-PR 13.96...had a hand-timed 13.8 in Westwood at the UCLA/BYU/USC Triangular...advanced to the Pac-10s, where she posted a 14.19 to come in fourth in the prelims, and then matched her PR 13.96 in the finals to finish in sixth place.

HIGH SCHOOL: A prep All-American at Santa Monica (Calif.) High, Felice was a double winner as a senior at the 1990 state championships, capturing the 100m high (13.58) and 300m intermediate (41.69) titles...finished second at the Golden West Invitational in the 100m highs (14.38)...a week later, she won both the 100m highs (13.92) and the 300m intermediates (42.47) at the International Prep Invitational in Elmhurst, Ill...owned the nation's best high school mark in both the 100m highs (13.92) and the 300m intermediates (41.69), her first year running the intermediates...was named USA Today All-USA...as a junior in 1989, Lipscomb won the state 100m highs (13.65) and recorded the nation's top prep mark in the 30-inch high hurdles (13.69)...as a sophomore in 1988, Felice clocked a 14.00 in the 30-inch 100m hurdles, the fourth best U.S. prep mark...finished third in the 100m highs at the state meet (DeCoux won the event)...was the 4-time Ocean League MVP while winning the league title in the 100m hurdles all 4 years...led the team to the league title both her sophomore and senior seasons.

PERSONAL: Felice was born March 20, 1972, in Santa Monica, Calif...majoring in communications.

CAREER BESTS: 100m hurdles - 13.62, 400m hurdles - 59.44



CELESTE McVEY 5-9, Sophomore, Throws

THIS YEAR: A multi-purpose thrower, junior Celeste McVey will team with Allison Franke to give USC a strong 1-2 combination in the javelin and discus.

COLLEGE -- 1992: Finished seventh in the discus with season-best 149-7 (eighth best in USC history) and 11th in the javelin (122-9) at Pac-10 Championships as a freshman...Threw career-best 146-7 in the javelin at USD Invitational.

HIGH SCHOOL: McVey was the top discus selection for Track & Field News All-American honors in 1991...as a senior at Redlands (Calif.) High, McVey tossed the discus a career-best 160-11 to win the state prep title...was a 2-time (1990 and 1991) CIF Masters and 4-A champ in the discus...was named field events MVP at the 1991 Mt. SAC Relays and Claremont Invitational...was a 3-time Citrus Belt League titlist in the discus and added the shot put crown in 1991...won the 1991 Golden West Invitational discus (156-8) and finished second (her only loss of the season) at the Keebler Invitational (148-0)...has also thrown the javelin, finishing third at the 1990 Junior TACs in Fresno.

PERSONAL: Celeste was born Aug. 6, 1973, in West Covina, Calif...in 1985, she set the TAC national record in the discus (99-2) for her age group...majoring in communications.

CAREER BESTS: Discus - 160-11, Javelin - 146-7



INGER MILLER 5-4, Junior, Sprints

THIS YEAR: The centerpiece of USC's sprint corps, junior Inger Miller is an NCAA title contender in both the 100m and 200m. She has already set a new school record in the 200m (22.92) and tied her USC record and set Cromwell Field mark in the 100m (11.16) at the USC-Fresno State meet.

COLLEGE - 1992: An NCAA qualifier as a sophomore, Inger advanced to the final in both the 100m and 200m, but did not run due to a strained hamstring...won the Pac-10 200m title in Eugene, Ore., with a meet record 22.43w and finished second in the 100m with a season-best 11.09w...won both the 100m (career-best and USC record 11.14) and 200m (23.19) at the S&W Modesto Relays...also swept the 100m (11.38) and 200m (22.8) in the UCLA dual...matched or surpassed USC's 100m record 5 times, first tying Gail Douglas' mark of 11.34 in the first meet of the year (Long Beach Relays), then breaking it 2 weeks later with an 11.32 in a triangular at USC, breaking it again at the Sun Angel Classic with the 11.19 and then again with an 11.16 at the Mt. SAC Relays and finally with an 11.14 at the Modesto Relays...qualified for the Olympic Trials...ran a then career best 23.43 in her first 200m race of the season (a quadrangular at USC)...anchored USC's 4x100m relay that posted a 44.07 (third fastest time in USC history) to qualify for the NCAAs...won both the 100m (11.43) and 200m (22.8) at the UCLA dual meet...**1991:** Despite various ailments which sidelined her for portions of her 1991 freshman season, Miller still put together an outstanding year that made her one of the Pac-10's top underclass sprinters...won 4 of the 7 races she ran and finished second in 2 others and third in the other...won the 100m in her first 2 collegiate meets, a 5-way at UCI (11.90) and the USC Homecoming meet (11.77)...suffered a slight pulled groin muscle that kept her out for a month, but upon her return she lowered her season-best to 11.64 after finishing third in a triangular at UCLA...recorded her season-best and wind-aided 11.52 in winning the Mt. SAC Relays...qualified for the Pac-10s and ran a 24.01 in the 200m to advance to the finals but DQ'd in the 100m prelims...after anchoring USC to a second place finish in the 4x100m with a 44.61 (third fastest time in USC history), Miller was forced out of the meet with a recurring foot injury she originally suffered in high school.

HIGH SCHOOL: Miller was a prep All-American as a 1990 senior at John Muir High in Pasadena, Calif...posted 1990 U.S. prep bests in the 100m (11.48) and the 200m (23.57)...incurred severe tendinitis in her left foot that cut short her season in April...attempted to compete at the state meet but the tendinitis forced her out after the prelims...prior to the injury, she captured the 100m (11.71) and 200m (23.57) titles at the Arcadia Invitational...anchored Muir's 1990 U.S. best 4x100m relay (46.07)...led Muir to the state championship as a junior in 1989...finished second at the state meet to Angela Burnham (now of UCLA) in both the 100m (11.46) and 200m (23.86)...had second best prep marks in the nation in both 100m (11.53) and 200m (23.62)...won the Arcadia Invitational 100m (11.64), beating Burnham (11.89), but finished second in the 200m (23.91) to Burnham (23.63)...relatively new to the sport; first started competing in track during her 1988 sophomore season at Muir...finished second at the 1988 state championship meet in the 100m and third in the 200m...had the nation's fourth best prep mark in both the 100m (11.64) and the 200m (23.59)...won the CIF and Pacific League 100m and 200m titles all 3 years at Muir.


