

Events over 1 lap are officially recorded in tenths and no auto timing factors are therefore presented. 100 yard, 100 meter, 200 meter, 220 yard hand times are converted to automatic "equivalents" by adding a factor of 0.24; 400 meter flat and hurdles, add 0.14; 400 relay, add 0.14 hand-timed yards to automatic metric equivalent; 440 yards flat and hurdles, subtract 0.16; 440 relay, subtract 0.06; hand-timed decathlons are worth about an extra 75 points compared to an automatically timed 10-eventer.

All athletes who meet the more stringent qualifying mark will automatically compete at the NCAA meet. The remaining spots in the championships field will be filled by those athletes who meet the provisional requirements, but in descending order so that the best performances fill the field first.

# 1994 Men's Outlook

He may not be making predictions, but there's no disguising that head coach Jim Bush is excited about the 1994 USC men's track team. And it's certainly no wonder, considering the outstanding group of athletes that he has put together.

With USC's present collection of hurdlers and throwers, the Trojans will undoubtedly have a legitimate impact at June's NCAA Championships in Boise, Idaho.

"We're expecting great things this year," said Bush. "I'm very excited, but I'm not going to be making any predictions like I did last year."

The Trojans finished a disappointing 18th at last season's national championships, highlighted by Balazs Kiss' first place finish in the hammer throw. But Bush lost just 1 regularly-scoring senior in sprinter Jeff Laynes (who ran at the NCAAs in both the 100m and 200m), and he has brought in more than a dozen new athletes this season.

"It's the best recruiting class I've ever had, without a doubt, said Bush, who is starting his fourth year as USC's men's head coach. Bush a 43-year coaching veteran, also coached 5 national championships teams while at UCLA.


The 1994 squad breaks down this way:

**SPRINTS--**Bush certainly won't have a problem selecting relay teams from this year's talented group of sprinters.

Freshman Jason Shelton (10.34, 21.3), a native of Jamaica, looks to be the Trojans top fast man in the 100m and 200m. Anthony Volson (10.50, 21.3), a freshman who is a wide receiver for the USC football team, will back Shelton. Volsan placed third in the state in the 100m for the last 2 years and Dennis Earls, a walk-on from Georgia, could be a surprise

Australian sophomore Paul Greene (20.58, 45.61) returns as USC's the top 400m man. He will be joined by former 2-time Big West 400m champion Dustin James (21.22, 46.02), and football wide receiver Edward Hervey (46.02, 20.65), a junior college transfer. Bush also likes what he sees in J.C. transfer Bryan Krill.

"This is the one of best group of sprinters ever put together here in terms of depth," said Bush. "This is an awesome group and we'll be able to put together outstanding relay teams."

**HURDLES--**There is little doubt that the hurdles will be USC's strongest event.

Sophomore Pedro Rodrigues (14.13, 49.46), who had an Achilles injury for much of last season, returns as the Trojans' top hurdler. Rodrigues set Portugal's 400m national record in the 1992 Olympics, and Bush is convinced that he is a national championship threat.

Rodrigues will be pushed by junior Jean-Paul Bruwier (14.38, 49.83), Belgium's top intermediate hurdler. Senior Marcus Carter (50.55), also injured last year, won the 1993 Pac-10 championship in the 400m and placed seventh at NCAAs. Carter expects to be in the 49s, as should sophomore Kehinde Alade'fa (13.73, 50.55), a 6-4 hurdler from Nigeria.

"We could make NCAA history if all these young men stay healthy," said Bush. "We could have 4 athletes in the 49s in the 400m. No school has ever had more than 2."

THROWS--Expect to see a lot of points scored by Trojans throwers, who have improved tremendously under throwing coach Dan Lange.

"They are one of the best groups in the country, if not the best," said Bush.

Hungarian sophomore Balazs Kiss is undeniably the premier hammer thrower in college track and field. USC's 100th individual national champion, Kiss shattered the school record numerous times in 1993, finishing the season with a 253-2 at a meet in his hometown of Vezprem, Hungary. Bush is confident that Kiss will shatter the NCAA record of 257-0 (by Oregon's Ken Flax) sometime in his career at USC.

Senior Gary Kirchhoff (194-7) has greatly improved and could be on track to break the nearly 27-year-old school record of 206-0 (by Gary Carlsen, set in 1967). Kirchhoff will also compete in the shot put, and Bush expects him to be able to add as much as 4 feet to his 60-3 3/4 best.

Junior Chad Danowsky (184-9, 200-0) will add depth in the discus and hammer, and Nils Fernley (218-11), a junior transfer from UC Santa Barbara, will fill a void at javelin.

JUMPS--The jumps are a source of concern for Bush. Junior Kyle Beck (24-9) is USC's top long jumper. He will be joined by LaVale Woods, who redshirted this past season as a tailback for the Trojan football team, will compte in the long jump (23-9). DelVaughn Alexander (6-11, 48-7), who spent this past fall as a wide receiver on the Trojan football team, is the Trojans' best high jumper and triple jumper. Sophomore Brandon Overstreet (6-8) will back up Alexander in the high jump, while sophomore Josh Elson and freshman twins Kehinde and Taiwo Madison will fill in at triple jump.

**POLE VAULT--**Former decathlete Eric Klassen (16-7) will concentrate on the pole vault this season, and Bush hopes the focus will allow him to reach the 18s. Junior college transfer Jesse Hafen (14-6) will also compete.

**DISTANCE--**A question mark for the Trojans will be in the distance races. Junior Shinsuke Nishihara (15:58.96) will lead USC in the 5,000m, while several underclassmen will round out the 800m, 1,500m and steeplechase events.

"I don't know what to expect in terms of scoring from our distance runners," said Bush. "I look forward to the younger athletes making a lot of improvement and that experience may help us out as the season progresses. I believe that there is a lot of talent in this group and I'm challenging them to make an impact."

# Jim Bush USC Men's Head Track Coach



It's one of the most unusual pairings in the history of college athletics, but logically it's a natural fit. Longtime UCLA coach Jim Bush is a Trojan, serving his fourth year as head coach of USC's men's track and field program (he also served as women's coach for parts of 2 seasons).

Last season, USC finished in a tie for 18th at the NCAAs and produced its 100th NCAA individual champion in hammer thrower Balazs Kiss.

In 1992, the Trojans finished third in the NCAAs, their highest finish since 1984 and Quincy Watts, the 1992 Olympic champion in the 400m and Mark Crear earned individual NCAA championships.

Bush, 67, a 1987 inductee in the National Track and Field Hall of Fame as one of the collegiate ranks' most successful coaches ever, is now the head coach of the winningest collegiate track and field program, and in the process becomes the first person ever to coach both the UCLA and USC track programs.

Bush, who served 2 years (1989-90) as a volunteer assistant coach at USC, spent 20 years (1965-84) as the head coach at UCLA, guiding the Bruins to 5 NCAA titles (1966-71-72-73-78) and 3 second place finishes (1974-75-80). All told, 15 of his 20 UCLA teams finished among the NCAA's top 5. His teams won 87.9% of their dual meets (152-21), 7 national dual meet championships awarded by *Track & Field News*, and 7 conference championships. In addition, UCLA posted 10 undefeated seasons under Bush, including winning streaks of 17, 20, 34 and 42.

The 1971 and 1973 U.S. Track Coaches Association National Coach of the Year (the first 2-time recipient), Bush has coached 35 NCAA outdoor individual champions (including USC's Watts, Crear and Robert Reading, winner of the 1989 high hurdles and USC's first NCAA champ since 1982) and 20 Olympians, including Watts, the Gold Medalist in the 400m and 1600 relay, and former Bruins Wayne Collett, John Smith, Willie Banks, Greg Foster, Andre Phillips Warren Edmonson and Mike Tully.

Prior to Bush's arrival on the Westwood campus, UCLA had never beaten USC in 32 tries. However, under Bush, the Bruins not only defeated USC, they collected 13 wins in 19 dual meets with the Trojans.

In 1984, Bush retired from UCLA at the age of 58 and spent the following 5 years as the conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers, the Los Angeles Raiders and the Los Angeles Clippers. While still at UCLA in the early 1970s, Bush served 3 years as the conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Lakers and Los Angeles Kings. He returned to track in 1989 when longtime friend Ernie Bullard invited Bush to take part in the USC track program as a volunteer assistant for the men's hurdles.

A noted author, lecturer and clinician, Bush has served as a consultant to the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports and the U.S. National Fitness Foundation. He was president of the U.S. Track Coaches Association (1972-73), chairman of the Western

United States Olympic Development Committee, on the NCAA Track Coaches Association executive committee for 10 years, and on the Athletic Congress executive board for 7 years. He was head coach of the U.S. team at the 1979 Pan American Games. He also acted as technical director for the track scenes in NBC's movie "The Golden Moment."

He served as a writer for UPI at the 1968 and 1972 Olympics.

Bush, a 1951 graduate of California, began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for Golden Bear football coach Pappy Waldorf. He served as an assistant track coach at Berkeley (Calif.) High in the 1952 season and then move to Southern California, spending 7 seasons (1953-59) at Fullerton (Calif.) High. After 2 seasons (1960-61) at Fullerton College and 3 years (1962-64) at Occidental College, Bush succeeded the late Ducky Drake as UCLA's head coach in 1965.

Born Sept. 15, 1926, in Cleveland, Ohio, Bush moved with his family to California when he was 3 years old. He prepped at Bakersfield (Calif.) High and lettered in both track and football. His athletic accomplishments merited him as an inductee into the Kern County Hall of Fame. Upon graduation in 1944, Bush joined the Naval Air Corps.

Jim has 2 children, Jean and Don. He and his wife, Francoise, live

in Culver City.

### DAN LANGE Assistant Coach

In his fourth year at USC, Dan Lange is one of the nation's most respected teachers. In addition to his duties as USC's throws coach, he will now coach the Trojans' decathletes and pole vaulters.

The 28-year-old Lange tutored Balazs Kiss last year to an improvement of more than 20 feet in the

hammer and an NCAA championship. The improvement in the Trojan throwers was not confined to Kiss. Chad Danowsky improved 24-4 in the hammer and 8-1 in the discus, Gary Kirchhoff improved 25-7 in the discus, and Michael Thomas 34-10 in the javelin.

"Dan not only knows the biomechanics of each event, but more important, how to relate to the athletes," said USC coach Jim Bush. "When given a new event, he seeks advice and information until he becomes an expert. I'm proud to have him on my staff."

Lange was a 4-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and was a 3time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier and an All-American in the hammer.

Lange, who studied exercise physiology at CSUN, is single.



### PAT CONNELLY Assistant Coach

In his first year at USC, Pat Connelly brings an enormously rich background of 38 years of running experience to the job of USC distance coach. He is also the head cross country coach.

The assistant cross country and track distance coach at UCLA for the past 2 seasons (1992-93),

Connelly has been the official coach for the Los Angeles Marathon for the past 3 years (his 1,500 students posted a 97% finish rate in the 1993 race).

A 23-year veteran of the Los Angeles Police Department, Connelly is assigned to the Drug Abuse Resistance Education Division (D.A.R.E). He started the program in 1983.

His running career began in 1954 at Birmingham High in Van Nuys (Calif.), where in 1956 he became the school's first All-City cross country and track star. After a tour in the Navy, he set a school 10,000m record (32.33), leading Pierce College to conference titles in 1959 and 1960. He later was a member of the 5-time national champion Southern California Striders. He was nationally-ranked in the 3- and 6-mile events and competed in more than 20 marathons.

As a coach at Birmingham, Reseda, Granada Hills, Kennedy and Alemany Highs, Connelly led those teams to a combined 16 city titles.

Connelly earned a degree in criminal justice from UCLA in 1972. He and his wife, Joan, have 2 adult children.



### STEVE LANG Assistant Coach

The head track coach at Fremont High in Los Angeles (1981-84) and himself a former high jumper for Jim Bush at UCLA in the early 1970s, Steve Lang is in his second season as a USC assistant coach coaching jumpers.

Lang, who spent the last 8 seasons as an assistant for the Bruins (1985-

92), led Fremont -- his alma mater -- to L.A. City championships in 1981 and 1984. Prior to that, he served as an assistant at the school (1973-80).

Over the years, Lang has coached 3 State, 1 CIF and 5 L.A. City high jump champions. He also tutored 1980 Olympian Greg Caldwell and 1980 national champion Freeman Miller in the triple jump.

Prior to enrolling at UCLA, Lang attended East Los Angeles Community College and was the state community college high jump champion in 1969 with a leap of 6-11.

He is single.

HEAD COACH: Jim Bush



# 1994 Women of Troy Outlook

If you think that last season's results will be any office of the USC women's track team should do in 1994, the numbers, say head coach Barbara Edmonson, don't tell the story.

"The women just seemed to be plagued with injuries less perespecially at the end of the season," said Edmonson. "If everyone had been healthy, the results would have been much different. Instead of scoring 2 points at NCAAs, you're looking at 30. And instead of tied for 49th, you're looking at placing a lot higher than we did."

The Trojans lost a number of potential points when top sprinter Inger Miller injured her hamstring, initially at the Pac-10 Championships and then again at the NCAAs. A number of her other teammates failed to even make it to that point of the season before being stricken.

"Because of injuries, we didn't do what we wanted to do," said Edmonson, in her second full season as USC coach. "And that's a big inspiration for us this year."

And with the addition of several top athletes, the Women of Troy certainly have the potential to move up. Only 2 top performers -- sprinter Desiree Bracey and thrower Allison Franke -- were lost to graduation from last year's team. And while only 3 women qualified for last year's NCAAs, Edmonson feels that at least 9 or 10 athletes are capable of reaching Boise, Idaho, site of the 1994 NCAA Championships.

"This is the most balanced team we've had in 6 years," said Edmonson, who was just inducted into the California Black Sports Hall of Fame. "We should do well in almost all of the events. And if we're healthy, we'll score a lot of points at nationals."

Here is a look at the 1994 Women of Troy:

SPRINTS--Senior Inger Miller (11.11, 22.33) -- who had the seventh best time in the world last year in both the 100m and 200m -- returns to lead USC's sprinting corps. Miller set school records in both events last season, but injured her hamstring while winning the prelim of the Pac-10 100m and never fully recovered.

"She's such a natural that 11.11 seems like a stride for her," said Edmonson. "There's nobody in the NCAA who should come close to her."

Sophomore Kanika Conwright (11.50, 24.75) will join Miller in the 100m and 200m. Conwright, who shed 25 pounds since last season, is ready to return to the form that made her one of the nation's top high school sprinters.

Senior LaTima Jones (53.65), and freshman Asha Jayasinghe, a former state 400m champion, will give USC a strong 400m pair.

"We will be really competitive with the talent we've got in there," said Edmonson

**DISTANCE--**A weak spot for the Trojans in the past, the distance events now look to be a lot stronger with the addition of several freshmen.

"We haven't had any distance runners who have made significant contributions since 1987," said Edmonson. "Those were points that we just gave away. Now we have 5 or 6 women who have possibilities."

Junior Kerrie Pegues (2:15.07), a former CIF Southern Section champion in the 200m and 400m, will run the 800m for Troy and may run on the relay teams.

Freshmen Christine Lewis and Treasure Shultz ran for the Trojan cross country team this past fall, and will run the 1,500m, 3,000m, and the 5,000m. Freshman Shayvonne Goldsby could also run the long events.

Freshmen Nekeidra Shegog and Tosha Clements will run the 800m. A sprinter in high school, Shegog has made the transition to the middle distances, according to Edmonson.

"We haven't seen what these cross country athletes can do on a track," said Edmonson, "but I'm confident that they will be a dramatic improvement."

**HURDLES--**The Women of Troy look to be much improved in the hurdles with the addition of junior college transfer Sau Ying Chan (13.27). The Hong Kong native specializes in the 100m hurdles, but could also run the sprints in the 100m (11.78) and 200m (24.19).

Senior Felice Lipscomb (13.56, 59.44) and junior Tanya Smith (13.94) will join her in the 100m hurdles, and Edmonson expects that all 3 will consistently run in the 13s.

Sophomore Nicole Haynes (1:05.79), a heptathlete, will join Lipscomb and Smith in the 400m hurdles.

**JUMPS--**The long and triple jumps have been a weak spot for the Trojans, but junior college transfer Karleen Shields looks to change that. Shields, a guard for the Women of Troy basketball team, is a former state champion in the triple jump (40-10 3/4). She could also compete in the long jump (19-5 1/2).

Junior Crissy Mills (6-1 1/2), who placed seventh at last year's

NCAAs, returns as the Trojans' top high jumper. Mills will be backed by Smith (5-11 1/2), freshman Reischea Canidate (5-8) and sophomore Janae Oliviera (5-7).

**THROWS--**The loss of Allison Franke will have a great impact on the Trojans, but sophomore Haynes and junior Celeste McVey will try to fill her void.

Haynes (152-11) will lead USC's javelin throwers, while McVey will throw both the javelin (146-10) and the discus (161-10). The Trojans do not have a regular shot putter and will rely instead on their heptathletes to throw in dual meets.

**HEPTATHLON--**Smith (5,345) and Haynes (5,128) are USC's heptathletes.

### Barbara Edmonson USC's Women of Troy Track Coach



One of the finest women sprinters of all-time, Barbara Edmonson is in her third season as USC's women's head coach. She took over in April of 1992 and led the Trojans to a third place finish in the Pac-10.

This past season, the Women of Troy, racked by injuries to key personnel finished fifth in the Pac-10 and in a tie for 49th at the NCAA.

Edmondson came to USC in 1991 and in the process become one of the few, if any, coaches to handle both

the men's and women's sprinters at a Division I program. Edmonson is a former world record holder in the 50m, 100m and 200m and, competing under her maiden name of Ferrell, was a member of the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic teams. In fact, she was a member of the gold medal-winning 100m relay team and also won the 200m silver at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. She was recognized for several years as the United States' top performer in her specialties. And like men's head coach Jim Bush, Edmonson is a member of the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame (1988 inductee). She is 1 of 12 track and field Hall of Fame members to be associated with USC.

Edmonson, who was just inducted into the California Black Sports Hall of Fame, was an elementary teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District for 8 years (1968-76) and continued to compete on an international level for much of her teaching career. In 1976, she moved on to become the United Teachers of Los Angeles union representative. At the same time, she returned to track as a coach for the Beyond Athletics Track Club. In 1980, she stepped up to the college ranks, coaching the sprinters at West Los Angeles Junior College. Edmonson became the head boy's and girl's coach at St. Bernard High in Playa Del Rey, Calif., in 1988 and led both teams to the league title.

She is the wife of past UCLA sprint great Warren Edmonson, the 1972 NCAA 100m champion.

MIKEBAILEY Assistant Coach

In his eighth season at USC, Mike Bailey has been instrumental in USC's recent success in the throws and multi-events. Bailey was the head coach of the USC women's program for 2 seasons (1989-90) before it was consolidated under one umbrella with the men's program in 1991. As a result, Bailey returned his focus to his first love — the field events, where

he has already coached 3 of USC's 4 all-time NCAA women champions. Bailey guided Wendy Brown (heptathlon), Yvette Bates (triple jump) and Ashley Selman (javelin) to their respective NCAA crowns. Indeed, he's made quite an impact on USC track and field in a short span.

In his 2 years as women's head coach, Bailey led USC to 5 wins in 7 dual meets. He coached 18 All-Americans and 7 USC record holders. Bailey, who spent 2 prior seasons (1987-88) as Fred LaPlante's assistant at USC, guided the Women of Troy to a ninth place finish at the 1989 NCAAs, his first season as USC's head coach.

The 37-year-old Bailey came to USC in 1987 after spending 2 years (1985-86) as the women's coach at Idaho State. For 4 previous years (1981-84), he was the head coach at Judge Memorial High in Salt Lake City, Utah.

A strong technician in the multi-events, Bailey draws upon his own experience as a decathlete, though he never competed in college track and field. He was a celebrated high school decathlete and was the 1974 and 1975 Western U.S. decathlon champion. He gave up the decathlon in college and starred for 4 years as a middle linebacker at Utah. He continued playing football for 2 years in the Canadian Football League with Calgary and Saskatchewan. Upon his departure from football. Bailey resumed training in the decathlon in 1982. He logged a personal best of 7,621 points in the 10-eventer. A ruptured Achilles tendon in 1987 ended his competition and signaled the start of his coaching career.

Mike and his wife, Cindy, have a 16-year old son, Michael.



# PAT CONNELLY Assistant Coach

In his first year at USC, Pat Connelly brings an enormously rich background of 38 years of running experience to the job of USC distance coach. He is also the head cross country coach.

The assistant cross country and track distance coach at UCLA for the past 2 seasons (1992-93), Connelly has been the official coach

for the Los Angeles Marathon forthe past 3 years (his 1,500 students posted a 97% finish rate in the 1993 race).

A 23-year veteran of the Los Angeles Police Department, Connelly is assigned to the Drug Abuse Resistance Education Division (D.A.R.E.). He started the program in 1983.

His running career began in 1954 at Birmingham High in Van Nass

(Calif.), where in 1956 he became the school's first All-City cross country and track star. After a tour in the Navy, he set a school 10,000m record (32.33), leading Pierce College to conference titles in 1959 and 1960. He later was a member of the 5-time national champion Southern California Striders. He was nationally-ranked in the 3- and 6-mile events and competed in more than 20 marathons.

As a coach at Birmingham, Reseda, Granada Hills, Kennedy and Alemany Highs, Connelly led those teams to a combined 16 city titles.

Connelly earned a degree in criminal justice from UCLA in 1972. He and his wife, Joan, have 2 adult children.

100m (11.11) and 200m (22.33) at the Mt. SAC Relays (both marks were 1993 world-bests at the time), earning Pac-10 Women Track Athlete of the Week recognition...Named Track & Field Writers Female Track Athlete of the Month for April...Set a Cromwell Field record with a 23.23 in the 200m at the USC 4-way, only to better mark 2 weeks later with a 22.92 at the Fresno State dual...Set a Cromwell record and matched her then-school record with a 11.16 in the 100m at the Fresno State dual... Won the 100m in a meet record 11.18 at the UCLA tri-meet...Anchored both of USC's relay teams and led the 400m relay team to 8 straight victories...Favored to win both the 100m and 200m at the Pac-10 Championships, Miller strained her right hamstring in winning the 100m prelim in a time of 11.30...She had to pull out of the rest of the meet...Concentrating on the 200m at the NCAAs, Miller won her prelim with a time of 23.09, but pulled up in the semis after aggravating her injury. 1992: An NCAA qualifier as a sophomore, Inger advanced to the final in both the 100m and 200m, but did not run due to a strained hamstring...Won the Pac-10 200m title in Eugene, Ore., with a meet record 22.43w and finished second in the 100m with a season-best 11.09w...Won both the 100m (with then-career-best and USC record 11.14) and 200m (then-career-best 23.19) at the S&W Modesto Relays...Also swept the 100m (11.38) and 200m (22.8) in the UCLA dual...Matched or surpassed USC's 100m record 5 times, first tying Gail Douglas' mark of 11.34 in the first meet of the year (Long Beach Relays), then breaking it 2 weeks later with an 11.32 in a triangular at USC, breaking it again at the Sun Angel Classic with an 11.19 and then again with an 11.16 at the Mt. SAC Relays and finally

with an 11.14 at the Modesto Relays... Qualified for the Olympic Trials...Ran a then-career best 23.43 in her first 200m race of the season (a quadrangular at USC)...Anchored USC's 400m relay that posted a 44.07 (third fastest time in USC history) to qualify for the NCAAs...Won both the 100m (11.43) and 200m (22.8) at the UCLA dual meet...1991: Despite various ailments which sidelined her for portions of her 1991 freshman season, Miller still put together an outstanding year that made her one of the Pac-10's top underclass sprinters...Won 4 of the 7 races she ran and finished second in 2 others and third in the other...Won the 100m in her first 2 collegiate meets. a 5-way at UCI (11.90) and the USC Homecoming meet (11.77)...Suffered a slight pulled groin muscle that kept her out for a month, but upon her return she lowered her season-best to 11.64 after finishing third in a triangular at UCLA...Recorded her season-best 11.52w in winning the Mt. SAC Relays...Qualified for the Pac-10s and ran a 24.01 in the 200m to advance to the finals but DQ'd in the 100m prelims...After anchoring USC to a second place finish in the 400m with a 44.61 (then third fastest time in USC history), Miller was forced out of the meet with a recurring foot injury she originally suffered in high school.

HIGH SCHOOL: Miller was a prep All-American as a 1990 senior at John Muir High in Pasadena, Calif...Posted 1990 U.S. prep bests in the 100m (11.48) and the 200m (23.57)...Incurred severe tendinitis in her left foot that cut short her season in April...Attempted to compete at the state meet but the tendinitis forced her out after the prelims...Prior to the injury, she captured the 100m (11.71) and 200m (23.57) titles at the Arcadia Invitational...Anchored Muir's 1990 U.S. best 400m relay (46.07)...Led Muir to the state championship as a junior in 1989...Finished second at the state meet in both the 100m and 200m...Had second best prep marks in the nation in both 100m (11.53) and 200m (23.62)...Won the Arcadia Invitational 100m (11.64), but finished second in the 200m (23.91)...Relatively new to the sport; first started competing in track during her 1988 sophomore season at Muir...Finished second at the 1988 state

championship meet in the 100m and third in the 200m...Had the nation's fourth best prep mark in both the 100m (11.64) and the 200m (23.59)...Won the CIF and Pacific League 100m and 200m titles all 3 years at Muir.
