BUILT TO LAST

1995 USC Track and Field Outlook

We have all heard the saying before: they don't build them like they used to.

From houses to cars to watches, things just don't appear to have the craftsmanship of the past. They seem thrown together without the care or pride that is crucial for durability and long-lasting quality.

Ron Allice, the new leader of the USC track and field program, wants to construct a team just like they used to — with balance, depth and speed — all trademarks of the dominant Trojan squads of the past.

Allice, who comes to USC with an impressive record of success everywhere he has coached (including Long Beach State and, most recently, Long Beach City College, where he won 11 state titles in 16 years), is looking to regain the position Troy has maintained as the most prestigious and talent-laden track and field program in collegiate history.

"(Former coach) Jim Bush did an excellent job putting USC back in the right direction," Allice said. "What we're working to do is build on the foundation he laid for us. I want USC back on top as quickly as possible and we will work tirelessly to put together a program with depth and talent at every position."

Allice won't just stop there, however. Another goal is to educate the Trojans about the rich heritage of USC track and field, and bring the men's and women's squads together to achieve success.

"The men and women will train together and support each other in their events," Allice said. "I want the athletes to go out and see each other compete. It is important for all of us to remember what a special place USC is and carry ourselves with pride when we wear the Trojan uniform. We have a lot to live up to, from athletes to coaches, because we have to do justice to the track alumni of this program who have established a legacy of excellence at USC."

THE MEN

To accomplish his goals, Allice inherits an experienced men's team that finished 10th in the NCAA Championships and second in the Pac-10 Championships (its highest finish since 1973) last season, led by Balazs Kiss, the 2-time defending NCAA hammer throw champion.

FIELD EVENTS

Kiss, a junior who has never lost a meet during his 2 years at USC, is the Trojan record-holder in the hammer throw with a mark of 250-4. Make no mistake: the team's success begins with him.

"Balazs is representative of the kind of athlete every coach would love to have," Allice said. "He's disciplined and extremely intense. He has got it done under pressure and always seems to rise to the occasion. (Assistant coach) Dan Lange has done a tremendous job with him, and deserves much of the credit for Balazs's success."

Senior Chad Danowsky, an All-American in 1994, is a 230-foot-plus hammer thrower who could have a big year. "He might be a surprise success for us," Allice said. "He is a consistent performer who could break through in 1995." Danowsky also competes in the discus, and was a national qualifier in 1994.

Nils Fearnley, a senior javelin thrower, placed 10th at the 1994 NCAA championships and looks to improve on his PR throw of 237-9 (a USC record). Senior thrower Roman Slobodnskyj will also contribute in the discus for Troy, while senior James Prestridge will compete in the decathlon as well as add depth in the hurdles, jumps and throws. Senior Kyle Beck, also an excellent hurdler, returns to the Trojans in the long jump after finishing sixth in the Pac-10 championships in 1994.

SPRINTS, HURDLES

While the throwing events figure to be USC's strength, Allice also sees promise in hurdles, where junior **Kehinde "Kenny" Alade'fa,** the defending Pac-10 champion in the 110m hurdles, will be the runner to beat. He ran a 13.93 at the Pac-10 championships, just ahead of USC teammate **Eric Bell** (14.18).

"Simply put, Kenny is the best hurdler on the African continent and he could become one of the best in the collegiate ranks as well," Allice said. "He has had a full season to improve and we are hoping for big things from him."

Bell, a senior who can run in the low 14's and has the ability to run the 100m, will complement Alade'fa and give the Trojans a 1-2 punch in the hurdling events.

Junior Pedro Rodrigues, the defending Pac-10 champion in the 400m hurdles, is another Trojan who is expected to contend for national honors. He competed for Portugal in the 1992 Barcelona Olympics. Rodrigues finished seventh at the 1994 NCAA championships and could push for one of the top spots in 1995.

"Pedro ran a 48.7 this past summer in the European Championships, which is almost 2 seconds faster than he ran at USC last year," Allice said. "If he can maintain that performance level, he could contend for the NCAA championship in the 400m hurdles."

The return of **Marcus Carter** after a year-long hiatus due to injury also bodes well for USC. Carter won the Pac-10 400m hurdles championships in 1993 with a mark of 50.55 and will pair with Rodrigues to make a formidable duo.

A major question mark for USC in the sprints is whether Allice can lure some of Troy's fleet football wide receivers to Cromwell Field. If so, the Trojans may have 1 of the speediest 100m, 200m and 4X400m teams in the conference.

Edward Hervey will return as a 200m specialist. Hervey also thrilled Coliseum crowds in 1994 as a member of the football team (he finished the season with 22 catches for 362 yards and 1 touchdown after missing 4 games with an early-season knee injury).

"Edward is extremely talented," Allice said. "He can run in both the 4X100 and 4X400 m and excel for us in both events."

Anthony Volsan, who finished second last year at the Pac-10 championships in the 100 m (10.70), is another bright hope for USC. Just a sophomore, he is also capable of running the 200m and the 4X100m relays. He also played football for Troy.

Sophomore Jason Shelton hopes to improve upon his solid showing in 1994 with even better times in the 100m and 200m this season. Only an injury prevented him from competing in the Pac-10 Championships. Larry Parker, a freshman who also played football (he caught 14 passes for 137 yards), is another Trojan with blazing speed.

Udeme "Sammy" Ekpenyong, a junior transfer from Central Arizona College, rounds out the list of Trojan men who Allice feels will make a major impact in 1995. Ekpenyong, a member of the Nigerian team at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, is a 400m specialist who could transform into a leading runner in the conference, if not the country. He is versatile enough to run in the 100m, 200m and both relay events.

"He ran a 45.20 as a member of the Nigerian Olympic team, and if we can bring him along to consistently run in the low 45's this year towards the end of the season, he could be one of the better runners in the country," Allice said.

Senior Bryan Krill can run either the 200m or 400m. At the Pac-10 Championships in 1994, he placed third in the 200m and fifth in the 400m. Allice is hopeful that South African import Keith Bazeley can help the Trojans in the distance events.

THE WOMEN OF TROY

The Women of Troy, who have potential and may be more balanced than 1994, will be hurt by the loss of **Inger Miller**, the daughter of USC track legend and world-record holder **Lennox Miller**. During her Trojan career, Miller set USC records in the 100m and 200m events.

With the return of some talented performers, Allice and women's coach **Barbara Edmonson** hope to develop the Women of Troy into a perennial contender.

SPRINTS, HURDLES

Without a doubt, the anchor of the Women of Troy is All-American senior Sau Ying Chan, the defending Pac-10 champion in the 100m hurdles. At the NCAA championships, she placed fourth and will battle Miami,-Fla. senior Gillian Russell for the top mark this year.

"Sau Ying is our flagship, there is no question about it, " Allice said. "She is one of the best hurdlers in the country and one of the leaders of our squad."

Chan demolished most of her competition in 1994, with 1 notable exception: she finished second in the 50m to Olympian Jackie Joyner-Kersee in the Sunkist Invitational (an indoor event), which is certainly nothing to be ashamed of. She responded during the season by tying a USC record in the 100m hurdles at the Mt. SAC Relays (13.14), and won 8 of 9 finals in the event, losing in the NCAA championships. The versatile Hong Kong native is also an accomplished sprinter in the 100m, with a number of 1994 first-place finishes under her belt.

Freshman **Tai-Ne Gibson**, a local product from Morningside High School, enters USC with no shortage of prep accolades. Gibson competed in the 100m, 200m, 4X100m and 4X400m relay team and will compete for a spot on the Trojan 4X400 team. Junior **Kanika Conwright** will also be relied on in the sprints. She ran well in 1994 and will need to step up for USC this season.

Allice and Edmonson are also hoping senior La Tima Jones can return to form in the 400m after being sidelined by injury in 1994. With freshman Brandy Stephens and sophomore Asha Jayasinghe, the Women of Troy have the beginnings of what could be a dangerous 4X400m relay team.

DISTANCE

Sophomore Christine Lewis, the top runner on the Women of Troy cross-country team, leads the team in the distance events, and will be complemented by fellow sophomore and cross-country teammate Treasure Schultz.

"Christine, who is our best cross-country runner, will probably compete in the 800m, 1500m and 3000m for us," Allice said. "We feel she could do some good things for us in those events."

Kerrie Pegues, a senior middle distance runner, will compete in the 400m and 800m for USC.

FIELD EVENTS

Junior high jumper **Chrissy Mills**, who did not compete in 1994 due to injury, has impressed Allice this fall.

"Chrissy has looked very good and could be an NCAA qualifier," Allice said. "I feel confident she can excel at a national level if she continues to progress, and under the tutelage of coach Charlie Di Marco, I am sure she will do very well in 1995."

Another jumper with the ability to make an immediate impact is J.C. transfer Glory Dolphin, a junior from Santa Monica College who placed third at the 1994 J.C. state meet in the triple jump. She also ran in hurdles and relay events.

Sophomore Carrie Martin and senior Celeste McVey will shoulder the throwing burden for the Women of Troy. Martin will compete in the shot put and discus, while McVey will handle discus, shot put and javelin chores.

Junior Nicole Haynes is a tough competitor who finished third at the 1994 Pac-10 championships in the heptathlon. This season, she has her sights set on the top spot in the conference in the heptathlon, and she is especially proficient in the javelin.

"Nicole is a good heptathlete who will only get better," Allice said. "She's also an accomplished javelin thrower, jumper and shot putter, and her ability to do a lot of things is a big plus for our team."

SUMMARY

With the contributions of some talented newcomers and the experience of the team's seasoned leaders, both USC men's and women's track and field teams could improve on last year's record (the men finished 10th at the NCAA's), but Allice won't make any bold predictions.

"Make no mistake, this is a learning process for us all," Allice said. "We're doing some things differently and everyone is having to adjust their way of thinking, myself included.

"I think the men's team needs to get faster, and I've been speaking to some of our football players to see if they can come help in our sprints," Allice said.

Regardless of the question marks surrounding the depth and overall balance of both squads, Allice does have at least 1 or 2 guarantees.

"USC will not roll over to anyone. Our opponents will know that when they are facing a Trojan athlete, they will have a tough competition in store.

"We will create a winning environment here at USC that will enable every athlete to reach his or her ultimate potential. With the help of a good staff, I have been successful everywhere I have been, and I am confident that we will carry on in USC's winning tradition."

RON ALLICE

Director of Track and Field

Ron Allice, who follows in the footsteps of USC's legendary track coaches, is eminently qualified to lead Troy back to the future.

USC's past successes in track and field are well known: 28 NCAA men's championships (including 2 indoor titles), 66 Olympic team members and 11 inductees in the National Track and Field Hall of Fame

The future of Trojan track lies in the hands of Allice and his staff, and they are ready to restore the luster to USC's most successful athletic program.

Allice, a prep standout at Long Beach (Calif.) Wilson High, is well known for his ability to win. His overall dual meet coaching mark is 122-19 in 27 years at 5 schools, including 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach City College, his previous stop before landing at Troy. Allice's programs have produced more than 200 All-Americans, plus 13 Olympians, 4 world record holders and 7 American record holders. He has coached at his high school, junior college and college alma maters on the way to compiling his outstanding coaching statisitics.

Clearly, Allice has enhanced the performance of athletes at each stop along his coaching career, a fact not lost on Trojan athletic director Mike Garrett.

"This is one of the most exciting appointments I've made since I've been here at USC," Garrett said upon hiring Allice in June of 1994. "I look for great things from our track and field program in the years to come."

Allice inherits a program that has set a standard for excellence in the track and field world, plus a women's team with a tremendous amount of potential. The Trojan men have won an unprecedented 26 NCAA titles (including 9 straight, 1935-43), along with 38 unbeaten and untied seasons, including 16 in a row (1946-61). The Women of Troy have had 4 Top 10 finishes in their brief history.

"I'm extremely happy to be here because the tradition at USC is second to none," Allice said. "When I was growing up, to be a part of the Trojan family was the pinnacle of the profession."

Allice has certainly reached the top echelon of his career, although he has not forgotten the beginnings of his coaching days. In his first coaching job, he guided the Long Beach Comets, a girls' and women's AAU program, for 4 years (1964-68), expanding the squad from just 5 girls to more than 150 competitors. During that time, he was also a graduate assistant at Long Beach State in 1964, an assistant at Compton (Calif). High in 1966 (the team was second at the CIF championships) and the head coach for track and cross country for 2 years (1967-68) at Wilson High in Long Beach.

The next 3 seasons (1969-71), he was the track and cross country coach at Poly High in Long Beach. His track teams went 23-4 and captured the Moore League title each year. His 1971 squad was ranked as California's top dual meet team and was fifth at the state meet.

Allice was then Cal Poly Pomona's track and cross country head coach for 2 years (1972-73). Again, the success he had enjoyed at previous coaching stops followed him-- the Broncos lost only 1 dual meet, won 2 CCAA titles (a first in school history) and finished fifth in 1972 and sixth in 1973 at the NCAA College Division championships.

He spent the next 5 seasons (1974-78) as the track and cross country head coach at Long Beach State. Despite being a new Division I program and having just 3 scholarships, 4 of his squads were named among the nation's Top 15 dual meet teams. He won 1

Pacific Coast Athletic Association title and his teams finished second twice. Two of his cross country teams won the PCAA crown (the other 2 were runnersup).

In 1979, Allice went to Long Beach City College. During his tenure (1979-94), his men's teams won the conference championship all 16 years and lost only 1 dual meet (78-1) in that time. Besides the 11 state crowns (including 5 in a row), his Vikings had 5 state runnerup finishes and won 14 Southern California championships (with 2 second place finishes). In 1980, his team was selected by Track and Field News as the best junior college team in history. He was named the 1992 Coach of the Year by both the California Community College Coaches Association and the California Coaches Association (CCA). He also coached LBCC's cross country teams, including the 1990 state titlist and the 1991 state runnerup. He was the 1992 CCA cross country Coach of the Year.

Allice's achievements have not only been limited to the coaching ranks. He prepped at Long Beach Poly High (where he was a CIF finalist in the 440-yard dash), then attended Long Beach City College before attending Long Beach State, where he set the school record in the 440-yard dash. He was inducted into Long Beach State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993.

Allice received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1962 and his masters in physical education in 1970, both from Long Beach State.

He and his wife, Sharlene, have three children: Lance, 27, Melinda, 25 (who has a master's degree from USC) and Sean, 19.

BARBARA EDMONSON

Women's Head Coach

One of the finest women sprinters of all-time, Barbara Edmonson is in her fourth season at USC. She took control of the women's team in April of 1992 and led the Trojans to a third place finish in the Pac-10. She will coach USC's sprinters.

In 1994, the Women of Troy, racked by injuries to key personnel, finished fourth in the Pac-10 and 27th at the NCAA's. In 1993, the Women of Troy were fifth in the Pac-10 and finished in a tie for 49th at the NCAA's.

Edmonson came to USC in 1991 and in the process become one of the few, if any, female coaches to handle both the men's and women's sprinters at a Division I program.

Edmonson is a former world record holder in the 50m, 100m and 200m and, competing under her maiden name of Ferrell, was a member of the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic teams. In fact, she was a member of the gold medal-winning 100m relay team and also won the 200m silver at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. She was recognized for several years as the United States' top performer in her specialties. In addition, Edmonson is a member of the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame (1988 inductee). She is 1 of 12 track and field Hall of Fame members to be associated with USC.

Edmonson, a member of the California Black Sports Hall of Fame, was an elementary teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District for 8 years (1968-76) and continued to compete on an international level for much of her teaching career. In 1976, she moved on to become the United Teachers of Los Angeles union representative. At the same time, she returned to track as a coach for the Beyond Athletics Track Club. In 1980, she stepped up to the college ranks, coaching the sprinters at West Los Angeles Junior College. Edmonson became the head boys' and girls' coach at St. Bernard High in Playa Del Rey, Calif., in 1988 and led both teams to the league title.

She is the wife of past UCLA sprint great Warren Edmonson, the 1972 NCAA 100m champion.



JOHN HENRY JOHNSON Administrative Assistant


John Henry Johnson enters his first year as an assistant in the USC track and field program.

Johnson, who was a state champion in the decathlon for Ron Allice at Long Beach City College (1987), also earned All-Pac-10 honors from UCLA. After sur-

passing the 7,000-point mark in the decathlon for the Bruins, he graduated with a degree in international relations in 1990.

A track and football star at West Technical High in Cleveland (Oh.), Johnson became an assistant coach at Long Beach State from 1990-92, where he worked with sprinters and throwers. He also served as a strength coach for the 49ers.

In 1993, John studied abroad, spending time in Mexico and Spain, as well as the Center for Intensive Language Studies in Costa Rica. He is single and is currently working on his master's degree at USC in international relations.



DAN LANGE
Assistant Coach

In his fifth year at USC, Dan Lange is one of the nation's most respected teachers. In addition to his duties as coach of the Trojan throwers, he will also coach decathletes and pole vaulters.

The 29-year-old Lange has guided Balazs Kiss to 2 consecutive NCAA ham-

mer throw championships and aided USC throwers across the boards with his vast knowledge in the sport.

Lange led Troy's throwers to an extremely successful year in 1994. USC was one of 3 teams to qualify an athlete for the NCAA's in all 4 throwing events (hammer, discus, javelin and shot put). In addition, Lange guided Balasz Kiss, Chad Danowsky and Nils Fearnley to All-American honors last season.

"Dan is one of the bright young coaches in the country," said coach Ron Allice. "His athletes have performed exceptionally well at the national level, which is a testament to his coaching ability."

A 4-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and 3-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier, Lange also earned All-American honors in the hammer.

Lange, who studied exercise physiology at Cal State Northridge and also works as a sports fitness consultant, is single.



TOM WALSH
Assistant Coach

Tom Walsh returns to Troy in 1995 after serving as a graduate assistant from 1987-88 for Fred La Plante's successful Women of Troy teams. He will coach the Trojan distance runners.

Walsh, who served as a track and field consultant for ABC and NBC during

the 1988 and 1992 Olympic Trials, will coach middle and long distances for USC. He also serves as head coach of the Women of Troy cross-country team.

Walsh starred as a prep in both cross-country and track and ran 1 year at Cal State Northridge before transferring to USC.

In 1990, Walsh started the Westwood Track Club in 1990. Vicki Burnett, one of his athletes, earned a place on the 1992 U.S. Olympic Team as an alternate in the high jump.

Walsh, 31, is single and resides in Westwood.



MARK ROBBINS
Volunteer Assistant

Mark Robbins is in his first year as an assistant coach at USC. He will coach the long and triple jumpers.

Robbins comes to USC from Long Beach City College, where as an assistant coach he helped the Vikings earn back-toback Mission Conference football championships (1993, 1994).

For 6 years, he also served as an assistant track coach at Long Beach Poly High School, where the team earned state championships in 1992 and 1993 and CIF championships in 1992, 1993 and 1994.

Robbins is no stranger to Troy, playing wide receiver for USC from 1981-83. He graduated from USC with a degree in public administration.



TONIE CAMPBELL

Assistant Coach

Tonie Campbell, one of Troy's most outstanding all-time track performers, returns to USC as a coach in 1995. He will coach the hurdlers.

Campbell, a 110m high hurdler, was named to 3 U.S. Olympic teams, competing at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles and the 1988 Games in Seoul. He won the

bronze medal at the 1988 Games. He was also named to the 1980 team which boycotted the Moscow Olympics. Only one other U.S. high hurdler, Wille Davenport, has qualified for more Olympic teams (4 times).

Campbell, who served as USC's team captain in 1981, earned 12 straight world rankings (1980-91) in the high hurdles, making him one of the only high hurdlers in history to accomplish the feat. His PR of 13.17 at the Weltkasse meet in Zurich, Switzerland, in 1988 was the 10th-fastest high hurdles time ever.

CHARLIE DIMARCO

Assistant Coach

Charlie DiMarco enters his fourth year on the Trojan coaching staff. He will continue to coach Trojan high jumpers.

DiMarco has helped develop the rapidly-improving All-American high jumper Crissy Mills and has earned experience at a number of levels as a top-flight coach.

After competing at L.A. Valley College and Cal State L.A. in the pole vault, DiMarco began coaching at L.A. Valley, producing 3 state champions in the field events. He then coached at Cal State Northridge, where 4 Matadors earned All-American honors and 1 earned an NCAA national champioship in the high jump.

Meanwhile, while serving simultaneously as director of the Advantage Athletics track club, he also helped develop national leaders in the javelin, high jump and heptathlon.

KEHINDE ALADE'FA 6-4, 195, Hurdles, Junior

THIS YEAR: Junior Kehinde Alade'fa (pronounced Ken-ny-dee Ala-day-fa), the defending Pac-10 champion in the 110m hurdles, is expected to continue his progress towards becoming one of the best hurdlers in the country, 1994: At the NCAA Championships in Boise, (Ida.),

ERIC BELL 6-2, 195, Senior, Hurdles

WOMEN OF TROY TRACK AND FIELD BIOS



SAU YING CHAN 5-7, Senior, Sprints and Hurdles

THIS YEAR: Senior Sau Ying Chan, who established herself as 1 of the top hurdlers in the nation as a 1994 junior, is poised to battle for the NCAA championship in the 100m hurdles... She enters the 1995 season as the second-rated

college returner (behind Miami-Fla.'s Gillian Russell) in the 100m hurdles...The versatile Hong Kong native also has the abiltiy to run the 100m sprints. 1994: Sau Ying won the Pac-10 championship in the 100m hurdles with a time of 13.54 as a 1994 junior...A month earlier, she tied a USC record with a PR mark of 13.14...She also set the third-best mark in school history in the 100m hurdles (13.51)...Chan made her mark in the 100m sprints, recording the eighth- best time in USC history (11.73) while taking first at the USC 4-Way at Cromwell Field...She competed just once in the 50m hurdles, finishing second at the Sunkist Invitational...The woman who defeated her was no slouch: Olympian Jackie Joyner-Kersee. AT MT. SAC: Sau Ying was the Southern Coast Conference's top female athlete each of her 2 years at Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut, Calif...Won the 1993 conference titles in the 100m hurdles (school-record 13.34, 100m, 200m PR 24.19) and was a member of the 400m relay champion team...Won state junior college championship in heptathlon (her second heptathlon ever) and mile relay...In the summer of 1993, she competed in the World Track Championship at Stuggart, Germany; World Indoor Championships at Toronto and World University Games at Buffalo, N.Y (placing ninth in the 100m hurdles)...Ran in 1993's Japan National Championships in Tokyo, setting a then-PR in 100m hurdles (13.27)...Ran at the 1993 Asian Games in China...Competed for Hong Kong in the 1992 Olympics, running the 100m hurdles...Won the 1992 conference titles at Mt. SAC in the 100m, 100m hurdles, 200m, long jump, high jump and 400m hurdles. HIGH SCHOOL: Sau Ying attended Delia Memorial High in Hong Kong... Initially went to the school as a gymnast, but switched to track for her senior year...Won 100m, 100m hurdles and long jump titles at Hong Kong's Division I Championships...Finished third in 100m hurdles at Junior Asian Games in 1988....Ran at 1987 World Junior Championships in Canada, reaching the semifinals in 100m hurdles. PERSONAL: "Wanet" was born Aug. 30, 1970 in Hong Kong... She is majoring in communications...Her family still resides in Hong Kong...All her personal bests are Hong Kong records. CAREER BESTS: 100m Hurdles - 13.14; 100m - 11.73; 200m - 24.19



KANIKA CONWRIGHT 5-7, Junior, Sprints

THIS YEAR: Junior Kanika Conwright has made improvements in the offseason which should allow her to make tremendous strides for the Women of Troy...After 2 years of seasoning, she expects to return to the form which made her a top prep sprinter. 1994: Competed

in the 100m and 200m as a 1994 sophomore, finishing second in the 100m, at the USC 4-Way at Cromwell Field...Ran a wind-aided

11.88 in the 100m at the UNLV Invitational...Had a season-best 25.36 at the Cal-Nevada Championships (she also ran a windaided 25.05 at the UNLV Invitational), 1993: As a 1993 freshman, Kanika competed in 4 meets, running both the 100m and 200m. HIGH SCHOOL: A 3-time prep All-American (1989-91), Kanika led Dorsey High of Los Angeles to the 1992 L.A. City championship, winning the 100m and 200m, as well as running a leg on the winning 400m and 1,600m relay teams.. THIS YEAR: Junior Nicole Haynes will not only provide the Women of Troy with a strong heptathlete, but she is also one of the squad's leading javelin talents. 1994: Nicole was the sole heptathlete for USC as a 1994 sophomore...In her 2

heptathlon efforts, Haynes recorded marks of third and sixth...The versatile athlete recorded victories at Northern Arizona (long jump), USC tri-meet (javelin & long jump) and the Quincy Watts Invitational (triple jump)...In her 6 javelin events, she was in the top 3 on 4 occasions and recorded a PR javelin mark of 158-10 in the Pac-10





CROMWELL TRACK AND FIELD STADIUM

Used as a training and warm-up facility during the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles, Cromwell Track and Field underwent a complete refurbishing in fall of 1983. Not only was the track resurfaced, but a new drainage system was also added. In the summer of the 1991, the track was resurfaced again.

A new Rekortan surface, the same one installed for the Olympic track competition in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, has eight, 42-inch lanes. The high jump area is larger than before and there are two new sand pits for the horizontal jumps.

Cromwell Field had been renovated in 1979, but all that remains from the first facelift is the equipment storeroom and weightroom on the track's southwest perimeter.



USC: NO. 1 IN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

USC has long dominated the world of intercollegiate athletics.

Trojan Men's teams are tops in the nation in NCAA championships with 68 -- far more than any other university. In addition, the Trojan football team has been voted national champions 8 times.

USC has won the National Collegiate All-Sports Championship — an annual ranking of the country's top men's athletic programs — 6 times (1971-72-74-75-77-80) since its inception in 1971. USC's women are also a force, with 13 national team titles, all since 1976.

MEN (76)

From 1959-60 to 1984-85, USC put together an amazing streak. In each of those 26 years, at least one Trojan team won a national championship (including five crowns in both 1962-63 and 1976-77). The Trojans have also had at least one Gold Medalist in each Summer Olympics since 1904.
