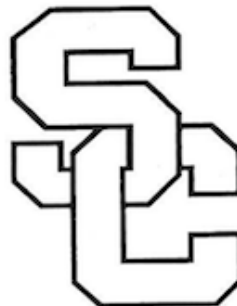

BUILDING THE

1996 USC Men's and Women's Track and Field

TRADITION

USC director of track and field Ron Aliche made quite a splash in 1995 in his first season at USC, guiding the Trojan men's team to a fourth place finish at the NCAA Championships. In doing so, the Trojans remained in a select group of universities that have consistently finished in the top five. The fourth-place standing also represented USC's second top-five finish in the NCAAs in the past four years.

With that kind of season to build on, one would think that more of the same would be in store for the Trojans this season. However, 1995's team was heavily dependent on seniors and graduation has taken its toll.

Rebuilding, however, will not take long in Troy. This past off-season saw Aliche and his coaching staff bring in one of the top recruiting classes in the nation for both the men's and women's teams.

THE 1995 SEASON IN REVIEW

The 1995 dual meet season for the USC men's team began with the Trojans defeating Cal State Northridge, 103-5, Cal State Fullerton, 97-38, and UC Irvine, 103-33. The next scoring competition was at California, where the Trojans won the championship in an invitational meet over Washington, California, Iowa, Stanford, Cal Poly SLO, UC Davis, Sacramento State and Humboldt State.

On May 6, history was made with the USC-UCLA dual meet being held for the first time on the USC campus. All previous meetings had been at UCLA, the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum or at a neutral site. In this meet, the Trojans defeated BYU, 87.5-73.5, but lost to UCLA, 90-71.

The Pacific-10 Conference Championships were held in

Tucson, Ariz. Several disqualifications hurt the Trojans, but they managed to pull out a third place finish behind UCLA and Oregon. Individual championships were won by Kenny Alade'fa (110m HH), Pedro Rodriguez (400m IH), Kyle Beck (LJ), Balazs Kiss (hammer) and the 400-meter relay team of Anthony Volsan, Edward Hervey, Udeme Ekpenyong and Bryan Krill.

The NCAA Championships were held in Knoxville, Tenn. Balazs Kiss started the Trojans off on the right foot, winning the opening event and breaking the NCAA hammer record three times. It was Kiss' third consecutive NCAA title. Other scorers included Chad Danowsky (sixth - discus), Hervey (fifth - 200m), Ekpenyong (eighth - 400m), Nils Fearnley (second - javelin), the 400-meter relay team (fourth - Ekpenyong, Hervey, Volsan, Krill) and the 1,600-meter relay team (fifth - Ekpenyong, Hervey, Rodriguez and Krill). Overall, the Trojans surprised many good teams, finishing in fourth.

USC's Women of Troy competed in the same meets and defeated UC Irvine, 99-31, and Cal State Northridge, 92-46. The Women of Troy tied BYU, 67-67, and lost to UCLA, 84-52. And at the 10-team Cal Invitational, USC finished third.

The Women of Troy finished eighth at the Pac-10s, but had individual champions with La Tima Jones (200m), Sau Ying Chan (100m hurdles) and the 400-meter relay team (Chan, Kanika Conwright, Tai-Ne Gibson and Jones).

In the NCAAs, the 400-meter relay team dropped the baton on the first exchange and La Tima Jones missed qualifying for the finals by just .03. Chan was the only scorer with a fourth-place finish in the 100m hurdles, which gave USC a 37th place overall finish in the team standings.

1996 SEASON OUTLOOK

THE TROJAN MEN

With no less than six All-Americans gone from last year's squad, USC's men's team has an entirely different look to it in 1996. "I don't think anybody in the country had to replace as many quality athletes as we had to replace," Alice says. "Outside of three guys, we had to replace everybody."

Despite being led by three-time NCAA hammer champion Balazs Kiss, the Trojans will be hard pressed to repeat 1995's fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. But don't count these Trojans out just yet. This may be a rebuilding season in Troy, but it is not without promise.

FIELD EVENTS

Kiss, who has never lost an event in three years at USC, is not the only reason the Trojans will be strong in the field. Bengt Johannson (hammer), Troy Stricklin (discus), Eric Stansfield (pole vault), Jemal Young (triple jump), Gordon Hovey (discus, hammer) and David Spitz (discus, hammer) give USC a formidable corps of potential point scorers. "We just don't have Balazs Kiss, we have quality and quantity," Alice says.

SPRINTS, RELAYS, HURDLES

Graduation took a huge bite out of the Trojans in this area, with the departure of All-Americans Udem Ekpenyong, Edward Hervey, Pedro Rodriguez and Bryan Krill, but there are several young sprinters gunning to prove that they can fill the void. Returners Anthony Volsan and Jason Shelton, along with newcomers Ramsey Jay, Jerome Davis and Isaac Turner and football players Chad Morton and Kenny Haslip are expected to make up the heart of USC's sprint and relay teams.

Last season, Troy's strength was over 400 meters and the hurdles. This year, it is more of the same, but with a younger crew. Quartermilers such as Hervey and Krill, who also ran the 200m and on the relays, are hard to replace. However, highly recruited freshmen Jerome Davis and Ramsey Jay could be future stars in the making.

In the hurdles, the Trojans have a headliner in Kenny

Alade'fa, the two-time defending Pac-10 champion in the 110-meter high hurdles. He could be joined by Jay or Joe Maashoff in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles.

Marques Holiwell, the No. 1 prep sprinter in the country last season, is redshirting this year, but is a tremendous talent and could be the Trojans' next great sprinter.

DISTANCES

USC will be very strong in the middle distance area with the addition of Brandon Pacheco, who was the top prep runner in his events last season. The U.S. Junior team member, along with junior college transfer Isaac Turner, gives USC a great one-two punch in the middle distances. Richard Stapp, Diego Ash and Andy Frogue will make the Trojans a force to be reckoned with in the 800m, 1,500m and 5,000m.

THE WOMEN OF TROY

The Women of Troy, fielding one of the strongest teams in the past six years, has a unique combination of seasoned All-Americans and talented freshmen. With the proper combination of training and focus, USC could surprise at the conference championships and score well at the NCAAs. According to

Alice, the Women of Troy should have a great year and a very bright future.

FIELD EVENTS

In the shot put, discus, javlin and hammer, the Women of Troy are better all because of one person . . . All-American Leslie Coons. "She's Superwoman," Alice says of the senior transfer from South Carolina. "She does it all, but she has had injury problems and we are not going to ask her to be Superwoman every week." Coons, whose specialty is the hammer, has a strong chance to be an All-American in multiple events.

With All-American heptathlete Nicole Haynes (javelin), Carrie Martin (shot, discus, hammer), Pam Simpson (long jump), Tanya Smith (high jump) and Karleen Shields (long jump, triple jump), USC field event athletes add considerable strength and balance to the entire team. The Women of Troy should be especially strong in the jumps, featuring three athletes with personal bests over 20 feet in the long jump and two women with triple jump PRs over 41 feet.

HEPTATHLON

Senior Nicole Haynes, who finished fourth in the heptathlon at last season's Pac-10 Championships (15th at the NCAAs), could establish herself as one of Troy's best-ever heptathletes. "Nicole has really been dedicated this fall," Alice says. "She is fit and (assistant coach) Dan Lange expects big things from her both in the heptathlon and javelin. And if she and Tanya Smith stay healthy, we will have a good one-two punch in the heptathlon."

SPRINTS, RELAYS, HURDLES

Without Jones and Chan, the Women of Troy have their work cut out for them in the sprints, relays and hurdles, but they are not without talented youngsters ready to step in.

A trio of freshmen — Esi Benyarki,

Torri Edwards and Pam Simpson — could all make an immediate impact in the sprints and relays, along with returners Tai-Ne Gibson and Kanika Conwright, who finished eighth in the 100m and sixth in the 200m at last year's Pac-10s.

In the hurdles, Alice will look to for several athletes to chip in. Gibson, Haynes, Smith, Glory Dolphin, Andrea Wasden and Martise Moore could all see some action throughout the season in the 100-meter high hurdles. In the 400-meter intermediate hurdles, USC returns Nekeidra Shegog, who will be complimented by Brandy Stephens and possibly Wasden.

DISTANCES

The Women of Troy will field the best distance group the university has had since the mid-1980s, with the addition of Emebet Shiferaw (World Junior finalist), Kristie Johnston (high school All-American) and Grazyna Penc (European Cup finalist). The addition of these athletes gave USC the strongest recruiting class of distance runners in the country. The Women of Troy can expect to score a great deal of points from 800 meters to 5,000 meters. Christine Lewis and Asha Jayasinghe could surprise in this area.

Johnston and Penc could rewrite USC's freshmen record book early in the season. Shiferaw's personal bests are far superior to the USC school records. She could possibly put her name into the record books every time she sets foot on the track.

"We've had some great middle distance runners, but Emebet is probably as good as anybody USC has ever had in that 3,000-5,000 area," Alice says. "Emebet's value will really come into play at the Pac-10s and the NCAAs."

RON ALLICE

Director of Track and Field

Ron Alice, who follows in the footsteps of USC's legendary track coaches, is eminently qualified to lead Troy back to the future and has already made an immediate impact. In his first year at USC last season, Alice led the men's team to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

USC's past successes in track and field are well known: 28 NCAA men's championships (including two indoor titles), 66 Olympic team members and 11 inductees in the National Track and Field Hall of Fame.

The future of Trojan track and field lies in the hands of Alice and his staff, and they are ready to restore the luster to USC's most successful athletic program.

Alice, a prep standout at Long Beach (Calif.) Poly High, is well known for his ability to win. His overall dual meet coaching mark is 126-20 in 28 years at five schools, including 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach City College, his previous stop before landing at Troy. Alice's programs have produced more than 200 All-Americans, plus 13 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He has coached at his high school, junior college and college alma maters on the way to compiling his outstanding coaching statistics.

Clearly, Alice has enhanced the performance of athletes at each stop along his coaching career, a fact not lost on Trojan athletic director Mike Garrett.

"This is one of the most exciting appointments I've made since I've been here at USC," Garrett said upon hiring Alice in June of 1994. "I look for great things from our track and field program in the years to come."

Last season, Alice inherited a program that has set a standard for excellence in the track and field world, plus a women's team with a tremendous amount of potential. The Trojan men have won an unprecedented 26 NCAA titles (including nine straight, 1935-43), along with 38 unbeaten and untied seasons, including 16 in a row (1946-61). The Women of Troy have had four Top 10 finishes in their brief history.

"I'm extremely happy to be here because the tradition at USC is second to none," Alice said after joining the Trojan Family. "When I was growing up, to be a part of the Trojan family was the pinnacle of the profession."

Alice has certainly reached the top echelon of his career, although he has not forgotten the beginnings of his coaching days. In his first coaching job, he guided the Long Beach Comets, a girls' and women's AAU program, for four years (1964-68), expanding the squad from just five girls to more than 150 competitors. During that time, he was also a graduate assistant at Long Beach State in 1964, an assistant at Compton (Calif.) High in 1966 (the team was second at the CIF championships) and the head coach for track and cross country for two years (1967-68) at Wilson High in Long Beach.

The next three seasons (1969-71), he was the track and cross country coach at Poly High in Long Beach. His track teams went 23-4 and captured the Moore League title each year. His 1971 squad was ranked as California's top dual meet team and was fifth at the state meet.

Alice was then Cal Poly Pomona's track and cross country head coach for two years (1972-73). Again, the success he had enjoyed at previous coaching stops followed him -- the Broncos lost only one dual meet, won two CCAA titles (a first in school history) and finished fifth in 1972 and sixth in 1973 at the NCAA College Division championships.

He spent the next five seasons (1974-78) as the track and cross

country head coach at Long Beach State. Despite being a new Division I program and having just three scholarships, four of his squads were named among the nation's Top 15 dual meet teams. He won one Pacific Coast Athletic Association title and his teams finished second twice. Two of his cross country teams won the PCAA crown (the other two were runnersup).

In 1979, Alice went to Long Beach City College. During his tenure (1979-94), his men's teams won the conference championship all 16 years and lost only one dual meet (78-1) in that time. Besides the 11 state crowns (including five in a row), his Vikings had five state runnerup finishes and won 14 Southern California championships (with two second place finishes). In 1980, his team was selected by Track and Field News as the best junior college team in history. He was named the 1992 Coach of the Year by both the California Community College Coaches Association and the California Coaches Association (CCA). He also coached LBCC's cross country teams, including the 1990 state titlist and the 1991 state runnerup. He was the 1992 CCA cross country Coach of the Year.

Alice's achievements have not only been limited to the coaching ranks. He prepped at Long Beach Poly High (where he was a CIF finalist in the 440-yard dash), then attended Long Beach City College before attending Long Beach State, where he set the school record in the 440-yard dash. He was inducted into Long Beach State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993.

Alice received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1962 and his masters in physical education in 1970, both from Long Beach State.

He and his wife, Sharlene, have three children: Lance, 28, Melinda, 26 (who has a master's degree from USC) and Sean, 20, a sophomore at USC.

BARBARA EDMONSON

Women's Head Coach



One of the finest women sprinters of all-time, Barbara Edmonson is in her fifth season at USC. She took control of the women's team in April of 1992 and led the Trojans to a third place finish in the Pac-10. She coaches USC's sprinters. In 1994, the Women of Troy, racked by injuries to key personnel, finished fourth in the Pac-10 and 27th at the NCAAs. In 1993, the Women of Troy were fifth in the Pac-10 and finished in a tie for 49th at the NCAAs. Edmonson came to USC in 1991 and in the process became one of the few, if any, female coaches to

handle both the men's and women's sprinters at a Division I program. Edmonson is a former world record holder in the 50m, 100m and 200m and, competing under her maiden name of Ferrell, was a member of the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic teams. In fact, she was a member of the gold medal-winning 4x100m relay team and also won the 200m silver at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. She was recognized for several years as the United States' top performer in her specialties. In addition, Edmonson is a member of the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame (1988 inductee). She is one of 12 track and field Hall of Fame members to be associated with USC. Edmonson, a member of the California Black Sports Hall of Fame, was an elementary teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District for eight years (1968-76) and continued to compete on an international level for much of her teaching career. In 1976, she moved on to become the United Teachers of Los Angeles union representative. At the same time, she returned to track as a coach for the Beyond Athletics Track Club. In 1980, she stepped up to the college ranks, coaching the sprinters at West Los Angeles Junior College. Edmonson became the head boys' and girls' coach at St. Bernard High in Playa Del Rey, Calif., in 1988 and led both teams to the league title. She is the wife of past UCLA sprint great Warren Edmonson, the 1972 NCAA 100m champion.

DAN LANGE

Assistant Coach



In his sixth year at USC, Dan Lange is one of the nation's most respected teachers. In addition to his duties as coach of the Trojan throwers, he will also coach decathletes and pole vaulters. The 31-year-old Lange has guided Balazs Kiss to three consecutive NCAA hammer throw championships and aided USC throwers across the boards with his vast knowledge in the sport. Lange led Troy's throwers to an extremely successful year in 1994. USC was one of three teams to qualify an athlete for the NCAAs in all four throwing events. In addition,

Lange guided Balazs Kiss and Nils Fearnley to All-American honors in 1994 and 1995. A four-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and three-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier, Lange also earned All-American honors in the hammer. Lange, who studied exercise physiology at Cal State Northridge and also works as a sports fitness consultant, is single.

GREG HARPER

Volunteer Assistant

Greg Harper, who was a four-year letterman (1986-89) as a triple jumper at USC, is in his first year as a volunteer assistant on Ron Alice's staff. He will be working with Troy's horizontal jumpers. Harper's career-best triple jump of 52-8 in 1988 ranks him at No. 6 on Troy's all-time chart. Harper, 29, graduated from USC in 1990 with a degree in business. He is still a nationally ranked triple jumper and has qualified for this spring's U.S. Olympic Trials.

JOHN HENRY JOHNSON

Assistant Coach & Recruiting Coordinator



John Henry Johnson enters his second year as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. He works specifically with USC's sprinters and is the team's strength coach. Troy's 1995 men's and women's recruiting classes rank among the best in the nation and bodes well for the future of USC track. Johnson, who was a state champion in the decathlon for Ron Alice at Long Beach City College (1987), also earned All-Pac-10 honors from UCLA. After surpassing the 7,000-point mark in the decathlon for the Bruins, he graduated with a

degree in international relations in 1990. A track and football star at West Technical High in Cleveland, Ohio, Johnson became an assistant coach at Long Beach State from 1990-92, where he worked with sprinters and throwers. He also served as a strength coach for the 49ers. In 1993, John studied abroad, spending time in Mexico and Spain, as well as the Center for Intensive Language Studies in Costa Rica. He is single and is currently working on his master's degree at USC in international relations.

TOM WALSH

Assistant Coach



Tom Walsh returned to Troy in 1995 after serving as a graduate assistant from 1987-88 for Fred La Plante's successful Women of Troy teams. He coaches the Trojan distance runners. Walsh, who served as a track and field consultant for ABC and NBC during the 1988 and 1992 Olympic Trials, will coach middle and long distances for USC. He also serves as head coach of the Women of Troy cross country team, which completed its best ever season in 1995, and he was assisted by Andy Shapiro. Walsh starred as a prep in both cross country

and track and ran one year at Cal State Northridge before transferring to USC. In 1990, Walsh started the Westwood Track Club. Walsh, 32, is single and resides in Westwood.

TONIE CAMPBELL

Assistant Coach



Tonie Campbell, one of Troy's most outstanding all-time track performers, returned to USC as a coach in 1995. He coaches the hurdlers. Campbell, a 110m high hurdler, was named to three U.S. Olympic teams, competing at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles and the 1988 Games in Seoul. He won the bronze medal at the 1988 Games. He was also named to the 1980 team which boycotted the Moscow Olympics. Only one other U.S. high hurdler, Wille Davenport, has qualified for more Olympic teams (four times). Campbell, who served as USC's team captain in 1981, earned 12 straight world rankings (1980-91) in the high hurdles, making him one of the only high hurdlers in history to accomplish the feat. His PR of 13.17 at the Weltkassen meet in Zurich, Switzerland, in 1988 was the 10th fastest high hurdles time ever.

TYRUS DEMINTER

Volunteer Coach

Tyrus Deminter is in his first year as a volunteer coach at USC and he is the head of the Men of Troy Distance Running Club. Deminter is a former J.C. All-American and got his degree from Cal State Long Beach in speech communication. His best time in the marathon is 2:19, and he qualified twice for the U.S. Olympic Trials (1988, 1992).

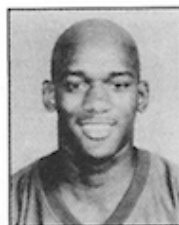

SAC Twilight meet...Went undefeated for the collegiate season, winning the NCAA (246-10) and Pac-10 titles (239-11)...In nine of 10 meets, Kiss' winning throw surpassed the previous school mark of 225-10...Set USC-UCLA meet record with 245-10 at UCLA's Drake Stadium. 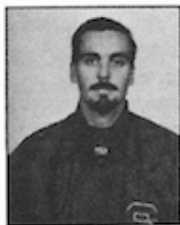

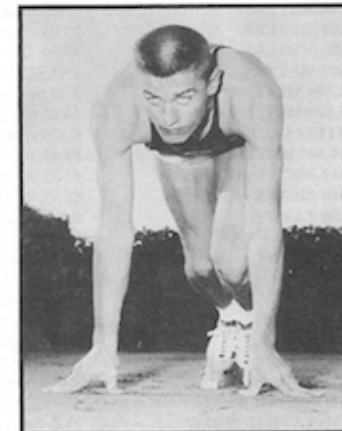

OLYMPIC CHAMPIONS AND RECORD HOLDERS

WORLD RECORDS: Sixty-one USC trackmen have equalled or bettered world records since 1912.

OLYMPIC GAMES: USC trackmen have won 24 individual Olympic titles and have shared in eight relay victories. Sixty-six men have won a total of 96 places on national Olympic teams.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC has won 26 out of the 74 NCAA Outdoor meets since its beginning in 1921. On 10 occasions they have finished second. The Trojans won nine in a row (1935-1943), and seven straight (1949-1955). They have also won two NCAA Indoor Championships since its beginning in 1965. A total of 101 individual outdoor championships highlight the record.

NATIONAL USA CHAMPIONSHIPS: USC trackmen have won 86 individual senior USA (formerly AAU and TAC) outdoor championships.

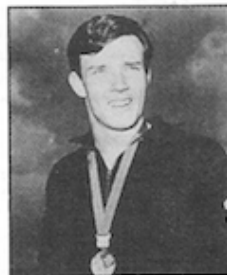

Paths of Glory

The Story of USC Track and Field

USC is well known as the most successful athletic program in the history of the NCAA, with 81 men's and women's national championships, far more than any other university. However, the most dominant force in USC's slate of athletic teams is not the baseball team (11 championships) or the football team (eight championships) but the men's track and field program, with an unprecedented 28 NCAA titles (including nine straight, 1935-43).

Trojan athletes have dominated the track and field scene for decades. From the exploits of sprinter Charlie Paddock and thrower Clarence "Bud" Howser in the 1920's and 1930's, sprinter Mel Patton in the 1940's, thrower Parry O'Brien in the 1950's, sprinter Lennox Miller and pole vaulter Bob Seagren in the 1960's, sprinter Quincy Watts in the 1980's and continuing on to current three-time NCAA champion hammer thrower Balazs Kiss, USC is synonymous with track and field excellence.

THE CROMWELL YEARS: 1909-1948

The roots of Troy's preeminence date back to 1926, when coach Dean Cromwell brought the first NCAA track and field championship to USC. Cromwell, who led the Trojans from 1909-48, also served as head coach of the football team for five seasons. However, the foundation he laid was not on the gridiron but the cinderpaths. Cromwell's track squads won 12 NCAA championships, including 34 NCAA individual champions. In

addition, Cromwell was unanimously selected as head coach of the victorious 1948 U.S. Olympic team, a group which featured five Trojans (Mel Patton, Bob Chambers, Roland Sink, Wilbur Thompson and Cliff Bourland). In fact, Patton, Thompson and Bourland brought home gold medals in their respective events from London, the Olympic site.

From 1935-43, USC experienced a streak of unequalled track and field success. No other university has come close to matching Troy's string of nine consecutive NCAA championships, all under Cromwell's watchful eye. Nicknamed the "Maker of Champions," he fashioned Trojan athletes into a powerhouse. At the 1936 Olympics in Berlin, USC trackmen scored enough points (37 1/2) to have finished among the top five in the world. Cromwell's influence extended far beyond the USC campus to the corners

of the world. He personally tutored champions in every Olympic Games from 1912 to 1948, and upon his retirement in 1949, "The Dean" remained involved as a regular figure in various Southland sporting events until his death in 1962.

TWO JESSES, NINE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS: 1949-1961

Jess Hill and Jess Mortensen, both integral parts of USC's proud athletic heritage, carried the track and field torch after Cromwell's retirement. Both men are still considered among the finest all-around athletes in USC history, and their accomplishments did not end after their playing days were over.

Hill, who lettered in three sports at USC (football, baseball and track), served as head coach of Troy's track and field program in 1949 and 1950, leading the Trojans to consecutive undefeated seasons and national championships both years. From 1951-56, Hill coached the Trojan football team, and in 1957, he began his tenure as USC athletic director, a position he held until 1972.

Mortensen's reign at USC also began as an undergraduate. The talented athlete lettered in track, basketball and football, winning the NCAA javelin title as a junior. After a 14-year coaching stint at Riverside Junior College, he returned to become coach of the Trojan track and field team in 1951, leading Troy to seven NCAA championships in his 11-year tenure. Mortensen's Trojan teams never lost a dual meet, going 79-0 between 1951 and 1961. He developed some of Troy's best-known trackmen, including Parry O'Brien and Max Truex. Sadly, "Mort" died suddenly at the age of 54 from complications caused by a blood clot. Hill, his longtime friend and teammate, stepped in as interim head coach for the 1962 season, and a new chapter in Trojan track and field history was about to begin.

THE WOLFE YEARS: 1963-1984

The prospect of succeeding three consecutive coaching legends would be a difficult task for anyone, but Vern Wolfe answered the challenge.

During his 21 years at the helm of the Trojan track and field program, USC captured five outdoor NCAA championships, including back-to-back titles in 1967 and 1968. A former pole vaulter for Cromwell's Trojan teams, Wolfe also won indoor titles in 1967 and 1972. At the time of his retirement in 1984, he was the third-winningest coach in U.S. track history, all despite reductions in scholarships and the lack of a top-flight on-campus facility.

Wolfe, who competed in senior events as a pole vaulter, attacked all problems with a straight-ahead approach. He continued to win throughout his career and oversaw the modernization of Cromwell Field, USC's track facility which served as a training site for the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. And so, after 21 years on the job, Wolfe retired and gave way to Ernie Bullard.

BULLARD AND BUSH: 1985-94

Another in the line of former Trojan athletes to become head coaches at USC, Ernie Bullard came to Troy from San Jose State, where he helped build the Spartans into a national contender. It didn't take long for Bullard to continue Troy's winning ways, recruiting athletes like sprinter Quincy Watts, a two-time gold medalist at the 1992 Barcelona Olympic Games.

Jim Bush was the man picked to replace longtime friend Bullard in 1991. After all, who better to rebuild the USC program than the man who guided UCLA to five national championships?

Bush helped stabilize the program and recruited some of Troy's current stars, like Balazs Kiss of Hungary, the 1993, 1994 and 1995 NCAA champion in the hammer throw.

Consequently, he helped lay the foundation for the latest in the distinguished line of Trojan head track coaches: Ron Alice.

RON ALLICE, THE NEW ERA: 1995 --

Ron Alice, who prior to the 1995 season was named head coach for USC's combined men's and women's program, is no stranger to success. He has distinguished himself at every level of competition, all in the Southland, and is well-known not only as a master builder, but a man who can keep a program at the highest level year after year.

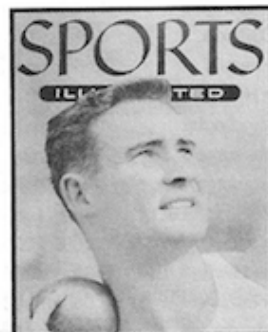
Alice came to Troy with impeccable credentials: 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach (Calif.) City College (including conference championships all 16 years), and quickly went to work, guiding the USC men's team to a fourth-place finish at the 1995 NCAA Championships. Alice has a dual meet career record of 126-20 at five schools, and

he has coached more than 200 All-Americans, 13 Olympians, four world record holders and seven USA record holders. His 1980 Long Beach City College squad was called "the best junior college team in history" by Track and Field News, and during his tenure at LBCC, his teams lost just one dual meet.

Alice takes the storied history of USC track and field very seriously.

"I have a mandate to bring this program to its rightful place," he said. "This university is a special place to us all, and we are ready to add another chapter to USC's illustrious history."

Now ready to return to the heights of athletic achievement, USC track and field, as has been the case for nearly half a century is in good hands.

Trojan long jumper Randy Williams won the Gold Medal at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich with a jump of 27-4 1/4, which is still a USC freshman record.

Early in the spring of 1966, USC assistant track coach Willie Wilson was found to have terminal cancer. USC's two-mile relay team of John Link, Dennis Carr, Bruce Bess and Dave Buck vowed to give him something special to remember and ran 7:17.4 to set a new world record at the Coliseum on May 13, 1966.

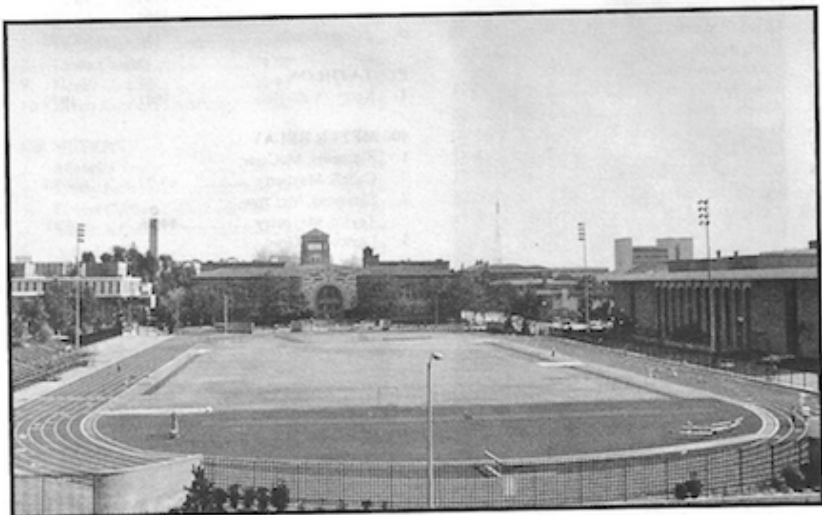

CROMWELL TRACK AND FIELD STADIUM

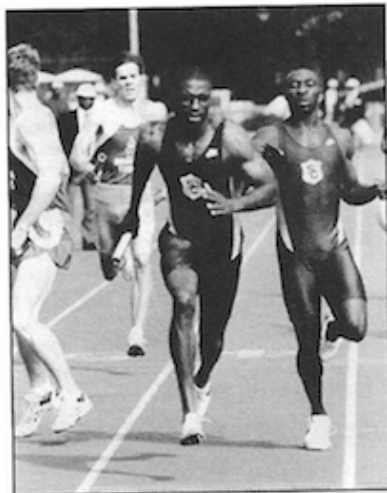
Used as a training and warm-up facility during the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles, Cromwell Track and Field underwent a complete refurbishing in fall of 1983. Not only was the track resurfaced, but a new drainage system was also added. In the summer of the 1991, the track was resurfaced again.

A new Rekortan surface, the same one installed for the Olympic track competition in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, has eight, 42-inch lanes. The high jump area is larger than before and there are two new sand pits for the horizontal jumps.

Cromwell Field had been renovated in 1979, but all that remains from the first facelift is the equipment storeroom and weightroom on the track's southwest perimeter.



USC-UCLA DUAL MEET AT CROMWELL FIELD

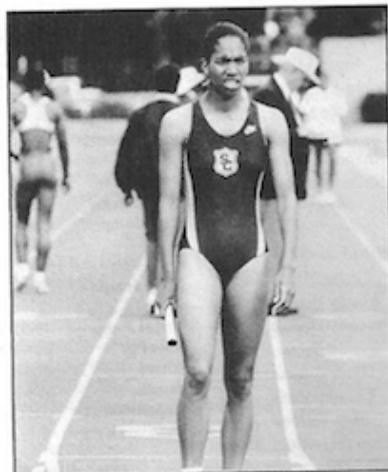
