PAC-10 CHAMPIONS

USC TRACK & FIELD HISTORICAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

WORLD RECORDS:

Sixty-one USC athletes have equalled or bettered world records since 1912.

OLYMPIC GAMES:

USC athletes have won 25 individual Olympic titles and have shared in nine relay victories. Seventy-four Trojan men and 13 Women of Troy have won a total of 117 places on national Olympic teams.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS:

USC has won 26 out of the 73 NCAA Outdoor meets since its beginning in 1921. On 10 occasions Troy has finished second. The Trojans won nine in a row (1935-1943), and seven straight (1949-1955). They have also won two NCAA Indoor Championships since its beginning in 1965. A total of 102 individual outdoor championships highlight the record.

NATIONAL USA CHAMPIONSHIPS:

USC trackmen have won 86 individual senior USA (formerly AAU and TAC) outdoor championships.

SC director of track and field Ron Allice made quite a splash in his first two seasons at USC, guiding the Trojan men's team to a fourth place finish at the 1995 NCAA Championships and a 10th-place showing last year. On the women's side, his effect was clear in 1996 as the Women of Troy celebrated their first-ever Pacific-10 Conference Championship and wound up seventh at the NCAAs.

In doing so, USC remained in a select group of universities that have consistently finished among collegiate track and field's elite, where Top 10 finishes are commonplace if not expected.

With those kinds of seasons to build on, one would think that more of the same would be in store for the Trojans in 1997. Especially, considering the men's and

women's recruiting classes that Allice and his staff have signed in preparation for this season. According to Track & Field News, both classes were rated among the nation's best, with the men's haul ranked at No. 2.

It promises to be another interesting year in Troy, where Allice's goal is to remain a consistent inhabitant of the Top 10, all the while keeping an eye on the prize.

"We're still building because we are still a young team," Allice says. "I hope that this year would be a stepping stone toward the ultimate goal.

"It is our goal and aspiration to maintain the tradition that was established before us. There is such great history and tradition here at USC in track and field and we are always trying to live up to the goals that are expected of us."


THE 1996 SEASON IN REVIEW

For the USC men's team, the 1996 dual meet season began with the Trojans defeating UC Irvine, 92-43, Cal State Northridge, 84-68, Cal State Fullerton, 105-32, Cal State Bakersfield, 107-31, and Long Beach State, 86-64. Then, USC dropped two of its next three duals, falling to Louisiana State (71-48) and UCLA (109-52) and downing BYU (83-67).

The Pacific-10 Conference Championships were held in Westwood at UCLA, where the Trojans managed to

pull out a fourth-place finish behind UCLA, Oregon and Washington. Individual championships were won by Jerome Davis (400-meters), Kenny Alade'fa (110-meter high hurdles and 400-meter intermediate hurdles), Balazs Kiss (hammer) and the 1,600-meter relay team of Isaac Turner, Alade'fa, David Holmes and Davis.

The NCAA Championships were held in Eugene, Ore., at Oregon's Hayward Field. Balazs Kiss won his fourth consecutive NCAA title and closed out an undefeated four-year collegiate career. Troy's other scorers were All-Americans Bengt Johannson (second — hammer) and Alade'fa (eighth — 400-meter intermediate hurdles).



The 1996 Women of Troy competed in the same first five meets as the men's team and were similarly victorious, defeating UC Irvine, 101-38, Cal State Northridge, 96-48, Cal State Fullerton, 115-27, Cal State Bakersfield, 92-22, and Long Beach State, 99-31. At the end of the season, the Women of Troy pounded San Diego State, 102-43, lost nail-biters to defending NCAA champion Louisiana State (73-68) and UCLA (74-70) and blasted BYU, 110-35.

The Women of Troy won their first ever Pac-10 championship on May 19 with a dramatic victory over Oregon and UCLA. Troy's individual champions were Torri Edwards (100- and 200-meters), Grazyna Penc (1,500-meters), Emebet Shiferaw (3,000- and 5,000-meters), Nicole Haynes (heptathlon) and the 400-meter relay team of Tai-Ne Gibson, Kanika Conwright, Esi Benyarku and Edwards.

At the NCAAs, the Women of Troy posted a surprising seventhplace finish, the best showing by the USC women in nine years. Shiferaw finished second in the 3,000-meters, Haynes was the runner-up in the heptathlon, Penc brought home a third-place medal in the 1,500-

meters, Leslie Coons finished third in the hammer and the 400-meter relay team of Gibson, Conwright, Benyarku and Edwards took sixth.

"The women's team came together after the dual meet loss to UCLA and then the win at the Pac10s was the spark that carried them through the NCAAs," Allice says.

"So we were kind of the surprise team of the Pac-10s and the NCAAs in 1996."

1997 SEASON OUTLOOK

THE TROJAN MEN

The Trojans, who were ranked at No. 10 in the preseason poll, are expected to be in contention for the Pac-10 title. As is the case with most of USC's recent track and field teams, its strength is in the sprints. However, despite the loss of Olympic gold medalist and four-time NCAA hammer champion Balazs Kiss, the Trojans should remain formidable in the field.

"If we can get the kind of consistent point production from the field that we've gotten for the past few years, our depth in the 100, 200 and 400 will be the key if we are

This year's squad could possibly end up being similar to the 1995 team that finished fourth at the NCAAs.

FIELD EVENTS

Kiss, who never lost an event in four years at USC, is gone but junior Bengt Johannson is back after finishing second to Kiss at the Pac-10s and NCAAs. Three other hammer throwers — David Spitz, Szabolcs Maroti and Dagan Massey — are expected to be Pac-10 qualifiers.

Others who are expected to be vital to USC's success in the field are Henrik Kjaereng (javelin), Kedjeloba Mambo (horizontal jumps) and Joshua Vollertsen (shot put).


Kjaereng could end up being USC's NCAA qualifier in the javelin throw and Mambo has had a good performance record while winning triple jump championships in Belgium.

SPRINTS, RELAYS, HURDLES

With a solid corps of returners, which includes Jason Shelton (the conference's top returning sprinter) and Jerome Davis, to go along with newcomers Marques Holiwell, William Erese and Tony Serpas, USC will be tough to beat

over the short distances.

Last season, Shelton was the Pac-10 runner-up in the 100-meters and Davis won the conference title in the 400meters as a freshman.

Holiwell, the No. 1 prep sprinter in the country two seasons ago, redshirted in 1996 and is expected to immediately compete for the conference title in the 100- and 200-meters.

In the hurdles, the Trojans have been hurt by the loss of Kenny Alade'fa, the 1996 Pac-10 champion in the 110-meter high hurdles and the 400-meter intermediate hurdles, but his departure will be offset by the addition of Erese, who is from Nigeria and owns the African record in the 110-meter high hurdles.

DISTANCES

USC will be strong in the middle distance area with the return of Brandon Pacheco, Isaac Turner and Diego Ash.

Pacheco, who was the top prep runner in 1995, has the potential to place his name high up on the USC all-time charts. He finished fifth in the 800-meters at the Pac-10s. Turner is expected to be a force in the 800-meters, but also remains as a key member of the 1,600-meter relay squad. Pacheco and Turner give the Trojans an excellent one-two punch in the 800m.

Ash was one of USC's most pleasant

surprises last season and is expected to continue with his improvement, adding good depth to the Trojan effort in this area.

THE WOMEN OF TROY

The Women of Troy, fielding one of the school's strongest teams in the 1990s, are out to defend the first women's Pac-10 crown in USC history. The team, which features a unique combination of seasoned All-Americans and talented freshmen, is an extremely balanced unit. Several women throughout the roster have benefited from international experience at the junior level.

The 1997 lineup also includes five returning Pac-10 individual champions and three of the four runners from the conference's top sprint relay squad. However, the Women of Troy do not expect to be as competitive as they were last year in the field.

"We'd have to do as well this season as we did in 1996 in terms of point distribution to have a shot at defending out title," Allice says.

FIELD EVENTS

In the field, the Women of Troy are in a rebuilding mode due to the graduation of thrower Leslie Coons and hepthathlete Nicole Havnes.

However, junior Carrie Martin is expected to score significant points in the hammer and discus. And with three-time Swedish high jump champion Emelie Fardigh

added to a mix that includes Pamela Simpson (long jump), Reischea Canidate (high jump), Melissa Brule' (triple jump) and Jennifer Oliveira (long jump), USC is capable of harvesting several points from jumpers.

This group has the potential to add considerable strength and balance to the entire team. Troy's results in this area will go a long way in deciding if back-to-back Pac-10 crowns are in the cards.

SPRINTS, RELAYS, HURDLES

Led by sophomore Torri Edwards, the defending Pac-10 champion in the 100- and 200meters, the Women of Troy sprint

corps is young and talented. Fellow sophomore Esi Benyarku and junior Tai-Ne Gibson, represent two more legs of last season's Pac-10 championship sprint relay team, which is a strong contender to repeat.

Freshmen Myriam Tschomba-Fariala and Natasha Danvers lead the Women of Troy hurdlers and are possible Pac-10 scorers, and Gibson will also compete in the 100-meter

Senior Nekeidra Shegog, who was a surprise Pac-10 scorer last season, adds some solid depth in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles.

DISTANCES

With two returning All-Americans, Emebet Shiferaw and Grazvna Penc.

and sophomore Kristie Johnston the Women of Troy have one of the most potent distance units in the country. This past fall, all three were key members of USC's best cross country team in history and hopefully that momentum will carry over.

Both Shiferaw and Penc are both looking to defend Pac-10 individual titles - Shiferaw in the 3,000-meters and the 5,000-meters and Penc in the 1,500-meters - and take a shot at national prizes. Johnston showed great improvement during this past cross country season and could be set for breakout campaign on the track.

Without doubt, this trio represents the Women of Troy's best group of distance runners the university has had since the mid-1980s and they made a solid contribution to the championship season and will again be a key to

USC's future.

"We've had some great middle distance runners, but Emebet is probably as good as anybody USC has ever had in the long distances," Allice says. "Her value will really came into play at the Pac-10s and the NCAAs.

RON ALLICE

USC Director of Track & Field

Following in the footsteps of USC's legendary track coaches, Ron Allice made quite an impression during his first two seasons in Troy as the Director of Track and Field. Last season, he guided the USC women's team to its first-ever Pacific-10 Conference championship and directed the men's squad to a 10th-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. And in his first year at USC in 1995, Allice led the men's team to a fourth-place finish at the NCAAs.

USC's past successes in track and field are well known: 28 NCAA men's championships (including two indoor titles), 61 world records, 87 Olympic team members, 34 Olympic gold medals and 14 inductees in the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame.

And now, the future of Trojan track and field lies in the good hands of Allice and his staff, and they are ready to restore deep luster to USC's most successful athletic program.

Allice, a prep standout at Long Beach (Calif.) Poly High, is well known for his ability to win. His overall dual meet coaching mark is 139-23-1 in 29 years at five schools, including 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach City College, his previous stop before landing at Troy. Allice's programs have produced more than 200 All-Americans, plus 16 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He has coached at his high school, junior college and college alma maters on the way to compiling his outstanding coaching statisitics.

Clearly, Allice has enhanced the performance of athletes at each stop along his coaching career, a fact not lost on Trojan Athletic Director Mike Garrett.

"This is one of the most exciting appointments I've made since I've been here at USC," Garrett said upon hiring Allice in June of 1994. "I look for great things from our track and field program in the years to come."

Allice was equally excited.

"I'm extremely happy to be here because the tradition at USC is second to none," Allice said after joining the Trojan Family. "When I was growing up, to be a part of the Trojan family was the pinnacle of the profession."

Allice has certainly reached the top echelon of his career, although he has not forgotten the beginnings of his coaching days. In his first coaching job, he guided the Long Beach Comets, a girls' and women's AAU program, for four years (1964-68), expanding the squad from just five girls to more than 150 competitors. During that time, he was also a graduate assistant at Long Beach State in 1964, an assistant at Compton (Calif). High in 1966 (the team was second at the CIF championships) and the head coach for track and cross country for two years (1967-68) at Wilson High in Long Reach

The next three seasons (1969-71), he was the track and cross country coach at Poly High in Long Beach. His track teams went 23-4 and captured the Moore League title each year. His 1971 squad was ranked as California's top dual meet team and was fifth at the state meet.

Allice was then Cal Poly Pomona's track and cross country head coach for two years (1972-73). Again, the success he had enjoyed at previous coaching stops followed him — the Broncos lost only one dual meet, won two CCAA titles (a first in school history) and finished fifth in 1972 and sixth in 1973 at the NCAA College Division championships.

He spent the next five seasons (1974-78) as the track and

cross country head coach at Long Beach State. Despite being a new Division I program and having just three scholarships, four of his squads were placed among the nation's Top 15 dual meet teams. He won one Pacific Coast Athletic Association title and his teams finished second twice. Two of his cross country teams won the PCAA crown (the other two were runner-ups).

In 1979, Allice went to Long Beach City College. During his tenure (1979-94), his men's teams won the conference championship all 16 years and lost only one dual meet (78-1) in that time. Besides the 11 state crowns (including five in a row), his Vikings had five state runner-up finishes and won 14 Southern California championships (with two second-place finishes). In 1980, his team was selected by Track and Field News as the best junior college team in history. He was named the 1992 Coach of the Year by both the California Community College Coaches Association and the California Coaches Association (CCA). He also coached LBCC's cross country teams, including the 1990 state titlist and the 1991 state runner-up. He was the 1992 CCA Cross Country Coach of the Year.

Allice's achievements have not only been limited to the coaching ranks. He prepped at Long Beach Poly High (where he was a CIF finalist in the 440-yard dash), then attended Long Beach City College before attending Long Beach State, where he set the school record in the 440-yard dash. He was inducted into Long Beach State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993.

Allice received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1962 and his master's in physical education in 1970, both from Long Beach State.

He and his wife, Sharlene, have three children: Lance (29, who recently graduated from law school), Melinda (27, who has a master's degree from USC) and Sean (21, a junior at USC's School of Cinema).

BARBARA EDMONSON Women's Coach/Sprints



One of the finest women sprinters of all time, Barbara Edmonson is in her sixth season at USC. She is currently the women's head coach and works with all of USC's sprinters. Last year, Edmonson helped direct the 1996 Women of Troy to their first-ever Pacific-10 Conference Championship, outlasting UCLA in a dramatic competition at Drake Stadium in

Westwood. She took control of the women's team in April of 1992 and led the Trojans to a third-place finish in the Pac-10. In 1993, the Women of Troy were fifth in the Pac-10 and finished in a tie for 49th at the NCAA Championships. In 1994, the Women of Troy, racked by injuries to key personnel, finished fourth in the Pac-10 and 27th at the NCAAs. Edmonson came to USC in 1991 and in the process became one of the few, if any, female coaches to handle both the men's and women's sprinters at a Division I program. Edmonson is a former world record holder in the 50m, 100m and 200m and, competing under her maiden name of Ferrell, was a member of the 1968 and 1972 United States Olympic teams. In fact, she was a member of the gold medal-winning 4x100m relay team and also won the 200m silver at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. She was recognized for several years as the United States' top performer in her specialties. In addition, Edmonson is a member of the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame (1988 inductee). She is one of 14 Track and Field Hall of Fame members to be associated with USC. Edmonson, a member of the California Black Sports Hall of Fame, was an elementary teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District for eight years (1968-76) and continued to compete on an international level for much of her teaching career. In 1976, she moved on to become the United Teachers of Los Angeles union representative. At the same time, she returned to track as a coach for the Beyond Athletics Track Club. In 1980, she stepped up to the college ranks, coaching the sprinters at West Los Angeles Junior College. Edmonson became the head boys' and girls' coach at St. Bernard High in Playa Del Rey, Calif., in 1988 and led both teams to the league title. She is the wife of past UCLA sprint great Warren Edmonson, the 1972 NCAA 100m champion. Her daughter Malika, one of the top prep sprinters in the nation (23.47 in the 200m), recently signed a letter of intent to attend USC next fall.


JOHN HENRY JOHNSON Sprints/ Recruiting Coordinator



John Henry Johnson enters his third year as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. He works specifically with USC's sprinters and is the team's strength coach. Troy's past two men's and women's recruiting classes rank among the best in the nation and bodes well for the future of USC track and field. Johnson, who was a state champion in the decathlon

for Ron Allice at Long Beach City College (1987), also earned All-Pac-10 honors while competing at UCLA. After surpassing the 7,000-point mark in the decathlon for the Bruins, he graduated with a degree in international relations in 1990. A track and football star at West Technical High in Cleveland, Ohio, Johnson became an assistant coach at Long Beach State from 1990-92, where he worked with sprinters and throwers. He also served as a strength coach for the 49ers. In 1993, John studied abroad, spending time in Mexico and Spain, as well as the Center for Intensive Language Studies in Costa Rica. He is single and is currently working on his master's degree at USC in international relations.


DAN LANGE Throws



In his seventh year of coaching the Trojan throwers, Dan Lange is one of the nation's most respected teachers. In addition to his duties as throws coach, he also handles the decathletes and pole vaulters. The 32-year-old Lange guided former Trojan and 1996 Olympic gold medalist Balazs Kiss to four consecutive NCAA hammer throw championships and aided USC

throwers across the boards with his vast knowledge in the sport. Lange led Troy's throwers to extremely successful campaigns for the past three seasons. USC was one of three teams to qualify an athlete for the NCAAs in all four throwing events in 1994. In addition, Lange guided Nils Fearnley to All-American honors in 1994 and 1995. A four-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and three-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier, Lange also earned All-American honors in the hammer. Lange, who studied exercise physiology at Cal State Northridge and also works as a sports fitness consultant, is single.

TOM WALSH Women's Cross Country/ Distance Running



Tom Walsh returned to Troy in 1995 after serving as a graduate assistant from 1987-88 for Fred La Plante's successful Women of Troy teams. He coaches the Trojan distance runners. Walsh, who served as a track and field consultant for ABC and NBC during the 1988 and 1992 Olympic Trials, will coach middle and long distances for USC. He also serves as head coach of

the Women of Troy cross country team, which completed its best-ever season in 1996, and is assisted by Andy Shapiro. Walsh, 33, starred as a prep in both cross country and track and ran one year at Cal State Northridge before transferring to USC. In 1990, Walsh started the Westwood Track Club. He is single and resides in Westwood.

ALLAN HANCKEL Jumps

Allan Hanckel, who recently spent two seasons (1993-94) as a women's track and field assistant coach at UCLA, is in his first year at USC. His main responsibility will be to coach the jumps. From 1985 to 1993, he was a volunteer and part-time member of UCLA's conditioning staff. Hanckel also served as the conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Raiders of the NFL in 1990. In addition, he has coached Jackie Joyner-Kersee in the shot put, javelin and high jump. Hanckel also was the decathlon coach for UCLA's Jim Connolly, who won the 1987 NCAA decathlon championship. Hanckel himself was a football (running back/flanker) and lacrosse player at Syracuse, before becoming a national and international decathlon competitor.

KERRY WALTERS EDDIE PERALES Team Managers

TONIE CAMPBELL Hurdles



Tonie Campbell, one of Troy's most outstanding all-time track performers, returned to USC as a coach in 1995. He coaches the hurdlers. Campbell, a 110m high hurdler, qualified for three United States Olympic teams, competing at the 1984 Summer Games in Los Angeles and the 1988 Olympiad in Seoul, where he won the bronze medal. He was also named to the

1980 U.S. team that boycotted the Moscow Olympics. Only one other U.S. high hurdler, Wille Davenport, has qualified for more Olympic teams (four times). Campbell, who served as USC's team captain in 1981, earned 12 straight world rankings (1980-91) in the high hurdles, making him one of the only high hurdlers in history to accomplish the feat. His PR of 13.17 at the Weltkasse meet in Zurich, Switzerland, in 1988 was the 10th-fastest high hurdles time ever.

TYRUS DEMINTER Distance Running



Tyrus Deminter is in his second year as a volunteer coach at USC and he is the head of the Men of Troy Distance Running Club. Deminter is a former Junior College All-American and got his degree from Long Beach State in speech communication. His best time in the marathon is 2:19, and he qualified twice for the United States Olympic Trials (1988, 1992).








CHAD MORTON

He was USC's top performer in the 800m. 1.500m and mile and has the potential to break into the school's all-time charts. 1996: Brandon finished fifth in the 800m (1:50.78) at the Pac-10 Championships...He won the first five collegiate events he was entered in (three in the 800m and two in the 1,500m)...Brandon clocked a PR in the 1,500m (3:47.81) at the Mt. SAC Relays...He finished second in a rare mile event (4:07.96) at the Golden Bear Challenge...Brandon also ran 1:49.95, a provisional qualifying mark in the 800m, twice. HIGH SCHOOL: At Brethren Christian High in Long Beach, Calif., Brandon won three events (800m, 1,600m and 3,200m) at the 1995 CIF Southern Section Championships...He was an All-American in the 800m, 1,500m and 1,600m, and set Olympic League records in the 400m, 800m, 1,600m, 3,200m and 5.000m...Brandon has also been a member of the 1995 U.S. Junior National Team. PERSONAL: Brandon was born on October 20, 1977...He says that his most thrilling moment in sports was joining the USC track and field team, which has always been a dream of his since he started running...Brandon attended Long Beach City College as a part-time student in the fall of 1995...He is majoring in business at USC. JASON SHELTON

5-10, 165, Senior

100m, 4x100m Relay Kingston, Jamaica Pac-10 Runnerup NCAA Semi Finalist Olympian

THIS YEAR: The fastest man in Troy last year, Jason Shelton returns for his senior season as the leader of the USC sprint corps. This past summer, Jason represented his native Jamaica at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta (he qualified for the team despite a strained hamstring). 1996: Jason finished second in the 100m at the Pac-10 Championships with a career-best time of 10.25, to qualify for the NCAAs where he was a finalist...He won four 100m races (Nike Cal Poly Invitational, LSU Invitational, Golden Bear Challenge and Mt. SAC Relays [Inv. 2]) as a junior...Jason also ran a wind-aided time of 10.21 at the Nike Cal Poly Invitational and a hand-timed 10.1 in a qualifying heat at the Pac-10s. 1995: As a sophomore, Jason won the 100m at the USC Dual with a time of 10.63...He clocked a season-best time of 10.62 at the Pac-10s. 1994: Jason posted the best 100m time among all Trojans in 1994 with a 10.49...He ran a wind-aided time of 10.45w at the Quincy Watts Invitational...But, Jason was unable to compete in the Pac-10s due to tendinitis in his right knee. HIGH SCHOOL: Jason was the No. 1-ranked Under-20 sprinter in Jamaica in 1992 and 1993...He won a silver medal at the 1993 Carifta Games in Martinique in the 100m after winning gold in the same event in 1992...Jason competed at the 1993 Mutual Games where he set a PR in the 100m (10.39)...He qualified for the Junior Pan Am Games with a PR 21.20 at the Jamaican national trials, finished fourth in the 100m and 200m at the Junior Pan Ams and ran on Jamaica's 4x100m relay team that won a silver medal at the Senior Caribbean and Central America Games...Jason attended Priory High in Kingston. PERSONAL: Jason was born on March 19, 1974, in Kingston... He is majoring in business/finance at USC. CAREER BESTS: 100m - 10.25, 10.21w, 10.1h; 200m - 21.20.





DEAN CROMWELL TRACK & FIELD STADIUM



Tsed as a training and warm-up facility during the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles, Cromwell Track & Field Stadium underwent a complete refurbishing in fall of 1983. Not only was the track resurfaced, but a new drainage system was also added. In the summer of the 1991, the track was resurfaced again.

A new Rekortan surface, the same one

that was installed for the Olympic track and field competition at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, has eight, 42-inch lanes. The high jump area is larger than before and there are two new sand pits for the horizontal jumps.

Cromwell Track & Field Stadium, which is named after legendary Trojan coach Dean Cromwell, who led USC track teams to 12 NCAA Championships, had been renovated in 1979, but all that remains from the first facelift is the equipment storeroom and weightroom on the track's southwest perimeter.

Cromwell Track & Field Stadium was the site of the first USC-UCLA Dual Meet held on the USC campus in 1995 and hosts the meet again this season.


