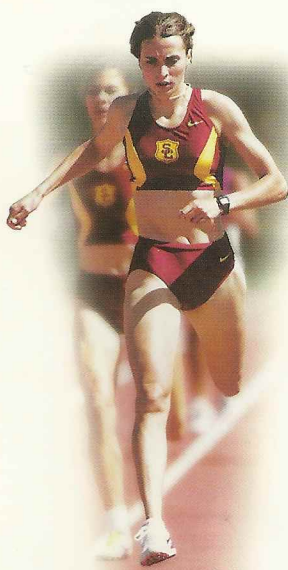

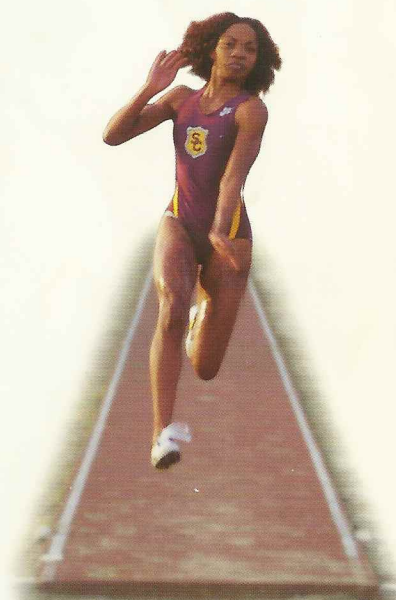

USC has a storied history in conjunction with the Olympics and has sent 300 Trojan athletes (more than any other university) to the Games since 1904.

University athletes have won 94 gold medals, 50 silver and 48 bronze and have taken home at least one gold medal in every Summer Olympics since 1912.



Balazs Kiss, who won four consecutive NCAA titles while at USC, won the gold medal in the hammer at the Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.

USC sent 14 former, current and incoming track and field athletes to the Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta, winning three medals, two gold and one silver.



Former Trojan standout Mark Crear (1990, 1992) won the silver medal in the 110-meter high hurdles at the 1996 Summer Games in Atlanta.

USC TRACK & FIELD HISTORICAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

WORLD RECORDS:

Sixty-one USC athletes have equalled or bettered world records since 1912.

OLYMPIC GAMES:

USC athletes have won 25 individual Olympic titles and have shared in nine relay victories. Seventy-four Trojan men and 13 Women of Troy have won a total of 117 places on national Olympic teams.

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS:

USC has won 26 out of the 74 NCAA Outdoor meets since its beginning in 1921. On 10 occasions Troy has finished second. The Trojans once won nine in a row (1935-1943) and seven straight (1949-1955). They have also won two NCAA Indoor crowns since its beginning in 1965. A total of 103 individual outdoor championships highlights the record.

NATIONAL USA CHAMPIONSHIPS:

USC trackmen have won 86 individual senior USA (formerly AAU and TAC) outdoor championships.

1998 USC Season Outlook

Men's and Women's Track & Field

Following in the footsteps of USC's legendary track and field coaches is no easy task.

Names like Dean Cromwell, Jess Mortensen and Vern Wolfe are household ones in the world of track and field. And along with them come memories of championships by the truckload.

Ron Alice, who was hired as Troy's director of track and field in June of 1994, knows this all too well.

"My office is like the collegiate track and field Hall of Fame," says Alice, sitting among piles of trophies in his Heritage Hall office. "I always say that I have an obligation, a responsibility and a mandate to develop a total program at USC. That means balanced programs with depth on both the track and field."

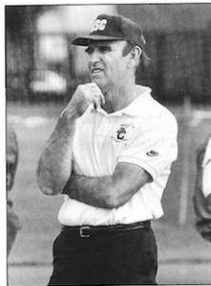
Nowhere else in the country is the measure of success higher than in Troy. Consider USC's past successes in track and field: 28 NCAA men's championships (including two indoor titles), 61 world records, 87 Olympic team members, 34 Olympic gold medals and 14 inductees in the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame.

"It is our goal and aspiration to maintain the tradition that was established before us," Alice says. "There is such great history and tradition here at USC in track and field and we are always trying to live up to the goals that are expected of us."

Alice has done very well for himself so far, pointing the Trojan men's and women's programs toward future glory that will remind many of ones in the past.

In his first three seasons in Troy, Alice has breathed considerable life back into USC's most successful athletic program.

Last season, he led the Trojan men's team to its first Pacific-10 Conference title since 1977 (and 30th

overall) before finishing third at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. In his second season in 1996, Alice guided the USC women's team to its first-ever Pac-10 championship and directed the men's squad to a 10th-place finish at the NCAAs. And in his first year at USC in 1995, he led the men's team to a fourth-place finish at the NCAAs.

"We have been going in the right direction and are demonstrating growth," Alice says. "However, you are only as good as the people around you. So I like to surround myself with quality coaches and we've done that here, putting together an outstanding staff to work with our athletes."

Alice, a prep standout at Long Beach (Calif.) Poly High, is well known for his ability to win. His overall dual meet coaching mark is 156-26-1 in 30 years at five schools, including 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach City College, his previous stop before landing at Troy. Alice's programs have produced more than 200 All-Americans, plus 16 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He has coached at his high school, junior college and college alma maters on the way to compiling his outstanding coaching statistics.

This year, Trojan fans can expect more of the same and maybe even a strong run at USC's first track and field national championship — on either the men's or women's side — in more than 20 years.

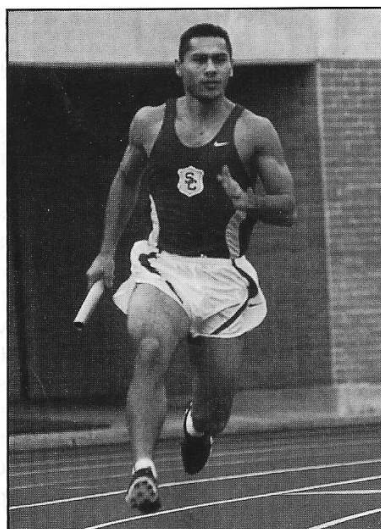
The Trojan men's team is led by a solid corps of sprinters and defending NCAA hammer champion Bengt Johansson, who stretched USC's streak of national champion hammer throwers to five (1996 Olympic gold medalist Balazs Kiss won the first four).

Leading the charge on the track is All-American Jerome Davis, the two-time defending Pac-10 400m

champion who is also a premier 200m and relay runner. Along with Marques Holiwell (100m), William Erese (defending Pac-10 110m HH champion), Edgardo Serpas (100m and 200m), DeJon Joyner (400m IH), and junior college transfers Charles Lee (100m and 200m) and Felix Sanchez (400m IH), Troy will be well represented in the sprints, hurdles and relays.

"Over the years at USC, the sprint corps has been the main focus and that will always be our mainstay here," Alice says. "However, I have a mandate to develop balance in this program. It says track *and* field, and that's what it will be."

The Trojans are also strong in the field. In addition to Johansson, Kedjeloba Mambo is back after winning the Pac-10 triple jump title (52-11) last season as a true freshman and will be joined on the team by his younger brother, Djeke Mambo, who excels in both the long and triple jumps and will also team with Erese in a powerful one-two punch in the 110m HH.

Troy's efforts in the field will also will be boosted by the addition of pole vaulter Dennis Kholev of Israel (17-6) and freshman decathlete Daniel Haag (7,468), who could score crucial points for USC in several individual events as well. On the other hand, the Trojans are hurt by a shoulder injury that could keep Henrik Kjaereng, who established himself as one of USC's best-ever javelin throwers last season as a freshman, out for the year.

"In my first year, I was left with a talented all-senior men's team, which finished fourth at the NCAAs," Alice says. "Last year, we had a young team that had everything go right and we finished third. This year's team is prob-

ably a better balanced one than either of those squads."

The Women of Troy, fielding perhaps the school's strongest team ever, have their sights set on getting back the Pac-10 title they won in 1996 and then contending for the big prize at season's end. One would be foolish to count out the Women of Troy, who

are now bolstered by the nation's No. 1 recruiting class, according to Track and Field News.

USC has a mix of seasoned veterans and talented newcomers who fully cover the sprints, hurdles and intermediate distances impressively.

Led by Torri Edwards (the 1996 Pac-10 champion in the 100m and 200m), Esi Benyarku (the defending Pac-10 100m champ), Tai-Ne Gibson (100m and 200m), Asha Jayasinghe (400m) and true freshmen Kinshasa Davis, Malika Edmonson, Candace Young and Carla Estes, USC could be as formidable in the sprints and relays as anyone in the country.

Over the longer distances, the Women of Troy are in good hands with juniors Grazyna Penc (a two-time All-American and the defending Pac-10 800m and 1,500m champion) and Kristie Johnston, and true freshmen Anna Lopaciuch of Poland and Brigita Langerholc of Slovenia.

"We are extremely strong at 800m, having four women who have run 2:06 or better," Alice says. "They also have the versatility to swing down to the 400m and help us in the 4x400m relay or swing up to the 1,500m and possibly the 3,000m."

In the hurdle events, Myriam

Tschomba-Fariala (No. 3 all-time at USC in the 100m H) and Natasha Danvers (No. 4 all-time at USC in the 400m H) are back after impressive showings as true freshmen last season.

In the field, the Women of Troy are also no slouches. Junior Pam Simpson is an All-American and the defending Pac-10 champion in the long jump (20-11 1/4). Carrie Martin, who is well represented on three of USC's all-time charts, is back for her senior season, her second as Troy's top performer in the throws. And freshman Cynthia Ademiluyi was the California state champion in the shot put last season.

However, Emelie Fardigh, who established herself as the best high jumper in Women of Troy history early last season as a true freshman with a leap of 6-2, will not compete this season due to a family obligation in her native Sweden.

"This is potentially one of the best women's teams USC has ever had," Alice says. "Our depth is extremely good all the way from 100 to 1,500 meters. We certainly hope the women's team is able to break into the Top 5 at the NCAAs and that the men's team maintains its position."

RON ALLICE

USC Director of Track & Field

Following in the footsteps of USC's legendary track coaches, Ron Allice made quite an impression during his first three seasons in Troy as the Director of Track and Field. Last season, he led the Trojan men's team to its first Pacific-10 Conference title since 1977 (and 30th overall) before finishing third at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. In his second season in 1996, Allice guided the USC women's team to its first-ever Pac-10 championship and directed the men's squad to a 100th-place finish at the NAAs. And in his first year at USC in 1995, he led the men's team to a fourth-place finish at the NAAs.

USC's past successes in track and field are well known: 28 NCAA men's championships (including two indoor titles), 61 world records, 87 Olympic team members, 34 Olympic gold medals and 14 inductees in the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame.

And now, the future of Trojan track and field lies in the good hands of Allice and his staff, and they are ready to restore deep luster to USC's most successful athletic program.

Allice, a prep standout at Long Beach (Calif.) Poly High, is well known for his ability to win. His overall dual meet coaching mark is 156-26-1 in 30 years at five schools, including 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach City College, his previous stop before landing at Troy. Allice's programs have produced more than 200 All-Americans, plus 16 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He has coached at his high school, junior college and college alma maters on the way to compiling his outstanding coaching statistics.

Clearly, Allice has enhanced the performance of athletes at each stop along his coaching career, a fact not lost on Trojan Athletic Director Mike Garrett.

"This is one of the most exciting appointments I've made since I've been here at USC," Garrett said upon hiring Allice in June of 1994. "I look for great things from our track and field program in the years to come."

Allice was equally excited. "I'm extremely happy to be here because the tradition at USC is second to none," Allice said after joining the Trojan Family. "When I was growing up, to be a part of the Trojan Family was the pinnacle of the profession."

Allice has certainly reached the top echelon of his career, although he has not forgotten the beginnings of his coaching days. In his first coaching job, he guided the Long Beach Comets, a girls' and women's AAU program, for four years (1964-68), expanding the squad from just five girls to more than 150 competitors. During that time, he was also a graduate assistant at Long Beach State in 1964, an assistant at Compton (Calif.) High in 1966 (the team was second at the CIF championships) and the head coach for track and cross country for two years (1967-68) at Wilson High in Long Beach.

The next three seasons (1969-71), he was the track and cross country coach at Poly High in Long Beach. His track teams went 23-4 and captured the Moore League title each year. His 1971 squad was ranked as California's top dual meet team and was fifth at the state meet.

Allice was then Cal Poly Pomona's track and cross country head coach for two years (1972-73). Again, the success he had enjoyed at previous coaching stops followed him — the Broncos lost only one dual meet, won two CCAA titles (a first in school

history) and finished fifth in 1972 and sixth in 1973 at the NCAA College Division championships.

He spent the next five seasons (1974-78) as the track and cross country head coach at Long Beach State. Despite being a new Division I program and having just three scholarships, four of his squads placed among the nation's Top 15 dual meet teams. He won one Pacific Coast Athletic Association title and his teams finished second twice. Two of his cross country teams won the PCAA crown (two others were runners-up).

In 1979, Allice went to Long Beach City College. During his tenure (1979-94), his men's teams won the conference championship all 16 years and lost only one dual meet (78-1) in that time. Besides the 11 state crowns (including five in a row), his Vikings had five state runner-up finishes and won 14 Southern California championships (with two second-place finishes). In 1980, his team was selected by Track & Field News as the best junior college team in history. He was named the 1992 Coach of the Year by both the California Community College Coaches Association and the California Coaches Association (CCA). He also coached LBCC's cross country teams, including the 1990 state titlist and the 1991 state runner-up. He was the 1992 CCA Cross Country Coach of the Year.

Allice's achievements have not only been limited to the coaching ranks. He prepped at Long Beach Poly High (where he was a CIF finalist in the 440-yard dash), then attended Long Beach City College before attending Long Beach State, where he set the school record in the 440-yard dash. He was inducted into Long Beach State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993.

Allice received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1962 and his master's in physical education in 1970, both from Long Beach State.

He and his wife, Sharlene, have three children: Lance (30, who graduated from law school), Melinda (28, who has a master's degree from USC) and Sean (22, who works for the Long Beach Stingrays of the ABL).

BARBARA EDMONSON
Women's Coach/Sprints



One of the finest women sprinters of all time, Barbara Edmonson is in her seventh season at USC. She is currently the women's head coach and works with all of USC's sprinters.

In 1996, Edmonson helped direct the Women of Troy to their first-ever Pacific-10 Conference Championship, outlasting UCLA in a dramatic competition at Drake Stadium in Westwood. And last season, the Women of Troy finished second at the Pac-10 Championships and beat 10-time defending NCAA champion LSU in a dual meet on their way to a 14th-place showing at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Edmonson took control of the women's team in April of 1992 and led the Trojans to a third-place finish in the Pac-10. In 1993, the Women of Troy were fifth in the Pac-10 and finished in a tie for 49th at the NCAAs. In 1994, the Women of Troy, racked by injuries to key personnel, finished fourth in the Pac-10 and 27th at the NCAAs.

Edmonson came to USC in 1991 and in the process became one of the few, if any, female coaches to handle both the men's and women's sprinters at a Division I program.

Edmonson is a former world record holder in the 50m, 100m and 200m and, competing under her maiden name of Ferrill, was a member of the 1968 and 1972 United States Olympic teams. In fact, she was a member of the gold medal-winning 4x100m relay team and also won the 200m silver at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. She was recognized for several years as the United States' top performer in her specialties. In addition, Edmonson is a member of the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame (1988 inductee). She is one of 14 Track and Field Hall of Fame members to be associated with USC.

Edmonson, a member of the California Black Sports Hall of Fame, was an elementary teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District for eight years (1968-76) and continued to compete on an international level for much of her teaching career. In 1976, she moved on to become the United Teachers of Los Angeles union representative. At the same time, she returned to track as a coach for the Beyond Athletics Track Club. In 1980, she stepped up to the college ranks, coaching the sprinters at West Los Angeles Junior College. Edmonson became the head boys' and girls' coach at St. Bernard High in Playa Del Rey, Calif., in 1988 and led both teams to the league title.

She is the wife of past UCLA sprint great Warren Edmonson, the 1972 NCAA 100m champion. Her daughter Malika, one of the top prep sprinters in the nation last season, is currently a freshman on the Women of Troy squad.

JOHN HENRY JOHNSON
Sprints/Recruiting Coordinator



John Henry Johnson enters his fourth year as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. He works specifically with USC's sprinters and is the team's strength coach. Troy's past three men's and women's recruiting classes rank among the best in the nation and bodes well for the future of USC track and field.

Johnson, who was a state champion in the decathlon for Ron Alice at Long Beach City College (1987), also earned All-Pacific-10 Conference honors while competing at UCLA. After surpassing the 7,000-point mark in the decathlon for the Bruins, he graduated with a degree in international relations in 1990.

A track and football star at West Technical High in Cleveland, Ohio, Johnson became an assistant coach at Long Beach State from 1990-92, where he worked with sprinters and throwers. He also served as a strength coach for the 49ers. In 1993, John studied abroad, spending time in Mexico and Spain, as well as the Center for Intensive Language Studies in Costa Rica.

He is single and is currently working on his master's degree at USC in international relations.

DAN LANGE
Throws



In his eighth year of coaching the Trojan throwers, Dan Lange is one of the nation's most respected teachers. In addition to his duties as throws coach, he also handles the multi-event athletes and pole vaulters.

The 33-year-old Lange guided former Trojan and 1996 Olympic gold medalist Balazs Kiss to four consecutive NCAA hammer throw championships and aided USC

throwers across the board with his vast knowledge in the sport. Last season, despite the departure of Kliss, Lange made it five in a row, coaching Bengt Johansson to the 1997 NCAA hammer title.

Lange, who has coached athletes to All-American honors 16 times, led Troy's throwers to extremely successful campaigns for the past five seasons. He also guided Nils Fearnley to All-American javelin honors in 1994 and 1995. On the women's side, he has coached Nicole Haynes (the 1996 Pac-10 heptathlon champion and NCAA runner-up) and Leslie Coons (a former American record holder in the hammer).

Lange is also currently coaching U.S. Olympians Todd Reich (javelin) and Kevin McMahon (hammer).

A four-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and three-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier, Lange also earned All-American honors in the hammer.

Lange, who studied exercise physiology at Cal State Northridge, also works as a sports fitness consultant.

TOM WALSH
**Women's Cross Country/
 Distance Running**



Tom Walsh is in his fourth year as the distance coach and head women's cross country coach at USC.

In a short period of time, Walsh has helped rebuild the middle and long distance program at USC into one of the finest squads in the nation. In 1996 and 1997, Women of Troy distance runners Grazyna Penc and Emebet Shileraw earned All-American honors in track and field. Shileraw was the NCAA runner-up in the 3,000m final in 1996 and finished fourth last year. Penc placed third in the NCAA 1,500m final in 1996 and was fourth last year.

Walsh graduated from USC in 1988, and served as a graduate assistant at USC for three years in the late 1980s. He also served as a track and field consultant for ABC and NBC during the 1988 and 1992 Olympic Trials.

ALLAN HANCKEL
Jumps



Allan Hanckel is in his second year at USC. His main responsibility is coaching the jumps. Hanckel recently spent two seasons (1993-94) as a women's track and field assistant coach at UCLA.

From 1985 to 1993, he was a volunteer and part-time member of UCLA's conditioning staff. Hanckel also served as the conditioning coach for the Los Angeles Raiders of the NFL in 1990. In addition, he has coached Jackie Joyner-Kersey in the shot put, javelin and high jump. Hanckel also was the decathlon coach for UCLA's Jim Connolly, who won the 1987 NCAA decathlon championship.

In 1987, he also began coaching post-collegiate athletes, including Olympians Doug Nordquist and Trish King-Porter, and 1992 Olympic decathlete Dave Johnson.

Hanckel himself was a football (running back/flanker) and lacrosse player at Syracuse, before becoming a national and international decathlon competitor. He is looking forward to building on last season's success with defending Pac-10 champions Kedjeloba Mambo (men's triple jump) and Pamela Simpson (women's long jump) and the rest of a very deep and talented jump squad.

EDDIE PERALES
Team Manager

Eddie Perales is in his second year working with the USC track and field program. Perales, who received his master's degree from USC in 1979, was the head track and field coach at Montebello (Calif.) High from 1993 to 1996.

TONIE CAMPBELL
Hurdles



Tonie Campbell, one of Troy's most outstanding all-time track performers, returned to USC as a coach in 1995. He coaches the hurdlers.

Campbell, a 110-meter high hurdler, qualified for three U.S. Olympic teams, competing at the 1984 Summer Games in Los Angeles and the 1988 Olympics in Seoul, where he won the bronze medal. He was also named to the 1980 U.S. team that boycotted the Moscow Olympics. Only one other U.S. high hurdler, Willie Davenport, has qualified for more Olympic teams (four times). Campbell, who served as USC's team captain in 1981, earned 12 straight world rankings (1980-91) in the high hurdles, making him one of the only high hurdlers in history to accomplish the feat. His PR of 13.17 at the Weltkassen meet in Zurich, Switzerland, in 1988 was the 10th-fastest high hurdles time ever.

TYRUS DEMINTER
Distance Running



Tyrus Deminter is in his third year as a volunteer coach at USC and is the head of the Men of Troy Distance Running Club. Deminter is a former Junior College All-American and got his degree from Long Beach State in speech communication. His best time in the marathon is 2:19, and he qualified twice for the U.S. Olympic Trials (1988, 1992).

BILL TISDALE
Statistics and Newsletter

Bill Tisdale, the meet director for all of USC's home meets for the past three years, works on the Trojan Force web site (www.es2.net/trojanforce) and publishes the Trojan Force Newsletter four times a year.

Tisdale ran for Long Beach City College in 1954 and returned the next year as a student assistant to Mel Patton. He then followed Patton to the University of Wichita as an assistant coach in 1956. In 1957, he returned to California to assist Jack Rose at Long Beach State. Following two years in the U.S. Army, Tisdale again served as Rose's assistant in 1960.

From 1961 to 1974, Tisdale left the coaching ranks to work in private business. In 1974, he rejoined Rose to help him at the National Track and Field Hall of Fame. At that time, Rose introduced him Ron Alice, and Tisdale has been with him ever since, working as a volunteer assistant.

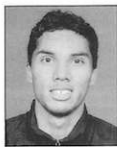

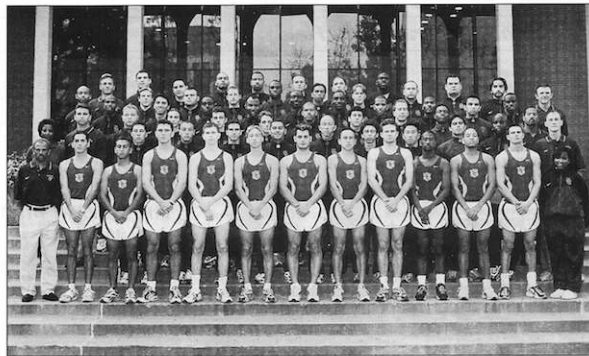

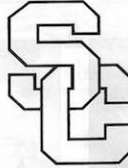

DEAN CROMWELL TRACK & FIELD STADIUM



Used as a training and warm-up facility during the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles, Cromwell Track & Field Stadium underwent a complete refurbishing in fall of 1983. Not only was the track resurfaced, but a new drainage system was also added. In the summer of 1991, the track was resurfaced again. A new Rekortan surface, the same one

that was installed for the Olympic track and field competition at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, has eight, 42-inch lanes. The high jump area is larger than before and there are two new sand pits for the horizontal jumps.

Cromwell Track & Field Stadium, which is named after legendary Trojan coach Dean Cromwell, who led USC track

teams to 12 NCAA Championships, had been renovated in 1979, but all that remains from the first facelift is the equipment storeroom and weightroom on the track's southwest perimeter.

Cromwell Track & Field Stadium was the site of the first USC-UCLA Dual Meet held on the USC campus in 1995 and hosted the meet again last season.

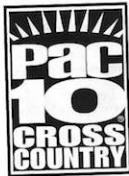
Sophomore Kristie Johnston gave USC a big lift this past season as she had a pair of third-place finishes (Biola and UC San Diego).
