coach at Troy, is in his 13th year as Director of Intercollegiate Athletics at the University of Southern California.

Jess Hill, former track and football

Born Jesse Terrill Hill in Yates, Missouri, on January 20, 1907, Jess came west with his family ten years later and became one of the top athletes in Southern California while at Corona High School. From the fall of 1923 to the spring of 1925, he was awarded ten letters in five sports—football, basketball, baseball, track

and tennis.

Following his graduation from Corona in 1925, Hill attended Riverside Junior College for one year, earning letters in football, basketball, baseball and track as Riverside fielded championship teams in all four sports.

Jess entered USC in February, 1927 and continued to exhibit his all-around athletic prowess, playing football and baseball and compilingan o utstanding track and field record. He became the first Trojan in history to surpass 25 feet in the broad jump, leaping 25' 7_6 " to win the 1929 IC4A title.

Also outstanding his his studies, Jess graduated cum laude following the 1930 collegiate basetall season.

Hill signed immediately to play professional baseball with the old Hollywood Stars. In his first plate appearance, he hit one out of the park at Wrigley Field to start a ten-year career in Triple-A and Major League baseball.

In the off-season during his professional baseball years, Jess launched his coaching career at Corona High. Just as is his playing days, he moved from Corona to Riverside JC. His next position was at Long Beach JC where he was on the physical education and coaching staff when World War II came.

Hill enlisted in the Navy in March of 1942 and served until February of 1946 when he was separated from active duty with the rank of Lieutenant Commander.

Jess returned to USC in the fall of 1946 to begin a period of ten years of advancement within the athletic department. In 1948 he was selected as assistant track coach, being groomed to succeed Dean Cromwell as head track coach after the latter's retirement at the end of the '48 season.

Hill had two undefeated years, 1949 and 1950, as head track coach at USC, continuing the great Trojan track heritage and winning two National Championships. He also held that post in 1962 following the sudden death of his close friend, Jess Mortensen.

Early in 1951 he was named head football coach, following the resignation of Jeff Crayath.

Hill's six-year record as head football coach at USC was 45 wins, 17 losses, and 1 tie for a .722 winning percentage.

Jess is married to the former Elizabeth Helen Glass. They have two children, Mrs. Mary Bett Carter, a USC graduate, and Jess Jr., also a USC graduate.

VERN WOLFE

Head Track Coach



Now entering his eighth year as head track and field coach at the University of Southern California, Vern Wolfe has already established himself as one of the nation's premier track and field mentors.

Wolfe's teams have won five NCAA track and field championships and three Pacifica Conference titles. In his seven seasons at Troy the personable

coach has won 49 meets against just four losses.

Friendly and buoyant in nature, the 47-year old coach has been coaching track since 1950. He arrived at USC in the summer of 1962, taking over the coaching reins from Jess Hill. Hill had served as interim coach that season following the sudden death of Jess Mortensen just as the season was beginning.

In seven years at Troy, 13 Trojan tracksters have tied or broken 20 indoor and outdoor world records. In winning five NCAA team championships the Trojans have been individual winners fifteen times. All individual track and field event records have been broken by Wolfe-coached athletes.

Since arriving at USC Wolfe's teams have captured three conference titles, but even more significant is thet fact that Trojan teams have had four undefeated seasons, and have lost to cross-town rival UCLA only twice in that span.

Eleven athletes who were coached by Wolfe have competed in the Olympic Games, with three winning gold medals. Rex Cawley captured a gold medal in the 1964 games in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles; Dallas Long won the shot put in the 1964 games and Bob Seagren took the pole vault in Mexico City in 1968.

Wolfe lives in Rolling Hills with his wife, Marilyn and two

boys, Corey 16 and Dean 14.

KEN MATSUDA Athletic Advisor Assistant Track Coach



Ken Matsuda is now in his fourth year as assistant track coach at USC. He came here in the summer of 1966 following a successful coaching job at Foothill College.

Matsuda had worked with Wolfe for one season (1961)

at San Jose State when the Trojan headman trained the Spartan freshmen. Besides his coaching duties, the 33-year-

old coach serves as Athletic Advisor for academic affairs in the athletic department.

The Trojan track assistant had an outstanding athletic career of his own, lettering four years in football, track and baseball at Westchester High. From Westchester Matsuda went to Santa Monica City College for a year and a half making the All-Metropolitan Conference team in football. He then transferred to San Jose State where he earned two letters as a Spartan halfback and competed in track as a sprinter and long jumper.

Born Feb. 11, 1935 in Fresno, Ken and his wife, Janet, have a girl, Jo Ann, 9, and a boy, Michael, 7. They live in

Torrance.

INDIVIDUAL BIOGRAPHIES

(Note: Those sketches are limited to those performers who figure to see most action. They are listed in alphabetical order.)

JOE ANTUNOVICH - 6-31/2, 235, Jr. (Discus)

Strongest performer in discus...threw 182 in New Zealand this year...Wolfe: "Joe should be consistently in the 180's this season and could go into the 190's."

HOWARD BECKER — 5-9, 155, Sr. (880)

Only returning half-miler from last year's squad...best time last season of 1:48.8...came to USC from Pierce College where he was one of state's top JC 440 men...will be important element of mile-relay team...must come through in 880...

JOHN BUEHLER - 6-0, 250, Jr. (Shot Put)

One of three Trojan weight men...tops last season was 59-6...should be consistently over 60-feet this year... former CIF Southern Section shot champion while at Whittier High...brother of pro footballer and former Stanford star George Buehler...

RICH CARR — 6-0, 160, So. (Mile, 880)

Younger brother of former Trojan half-miler Dennis Carr ... attended Santa Monica City College for one year before transferring to Troy . . Wolfe: "Rich must come through for us in the mile, as we know he can." Best time in mile of 4:03.6, but must hit this mark consistently . . .

JIM COCHRAN - 5-11, 150, So. (Pole Vault)

One of two Trojan pole vaulters... competed for freshmen last season...will definitely be counted on to score points in dual meet action...hard-worker and a dilligent performer...

TOM COLICH — 6-3, 260, Sr. (Shot Put One of three Trojan weight men, forms strong one-two punch with Dave Murphy...last year threw 60-7...has worked hard since last year and is expected to be in 62-foot to 64-foot range this year...

STEVE CRANE - 5-10, 160, So. (Mile, 880)

JC track star while at Long Beach City College...best time in JC was 4:07...must come through in mile to give team depth in that event...Wolfe: "Steve has the potential to become a premium miler"... Will probably see some action in 880 as well as mile...

TYRONE DUTTON - 5-11, 147, Sr. (Hurdles)

Along with Herman Franklin, Dutton gives USC the best one-two combination in the conference in both hurdles events ... Could surprise people this season with 120 HH times ... will be running both hurdles events and possibly will see relay action ... attended LACC before coming to USC ...

RICH DYER-6-1, 155, Jr. (Distances)

Attended Lakewood High, former CIF 2-mile champion... switched to steeplechase last year...will alternate between steeple and mile this season...should give much needed depth in both events...

HERMAN FRANKLIN - 5-11, 175, Sr. (Hurdles)

Most valuable track athlete of last season, as voted by Los Angeles track writers...high point man on last season's team with 112½ points...consistently puts our 100% effort...hard work has turned him into one of nation's top hurdlers this year...has already done 13.7 and 7.1 indoors...will lead off Troy 440-relay team...Wolfe: "Herman will be a world class performer in the 120 hurdles this year, and will also be outstanding in the intermediates." Herman will be a busy man for Troy this season...

EDESEL GARRISON — 6-2, 185, So. (Sprints, 440)

Must come through in sprints to give Troy needed points to fill void left by loss of Lennox Miller and Fred Kuller... will run 440 and will anchor mile relay...definitely a world class performer following 45.5 440 clocking last year...Wolfe: "Edesel was great last season and will be even better this year."

WILLIE HALL — 6-4, 235, Jr. (Javelin)

Pleasant addition to track team...could be a bright prospect...former national high school champion in javelin, attended Arizona Western JC for two seasons...with experience could blossom into top flight javelin man...has already thrown 230-feet...earned All-America football honors at defensive end...

RICH HARDING — 5-9, 185, Jr. (Javelin)

This fine performer should form core of Troy's finest group of javelin men in recent years...national JC champion at Treasure Valley JC in Oregon...should be throwing well into 230's...will definitely help in this traditionally weak USC event...

CURTIS JONES — 6-1, 153, Jr. (Steeplechase)

Mr. Dependable . . . very consistent, solid performer switched from mile to unfamiliar steeplechase last season . . . came through with flying colors . . . with experience should develop into fine steeplechase performer . . .

KEN JONES — 5-11, 160, So. (Sprints)

Another must in sprints to fill void left by Miller and Kuller...fine prep performer at South Bakersfield High School ...will probably see action on sprint relay team...

PARK KENNEDY - 6-3, 190, Sr. (High Jump

Consistent, clutch performer... dependable point getter in high jump...has shown consistent improvement and should be over 7-0 this season... will be up against stiff competition from other conference performers...

VINCE LIBBON — 6-3, 200, Sr. (Javelin)

A pleasant surprise who will round out Troy's javelin squad...no previous track experience...walked onto the field last August and threw the javelin 170-feet...first time he had ever thrown...now throwing better than 230-feet ...former prep star in Santa Maria...pharmacy-biology major with high scholastic average...

JOE MACKEY - 6-6, 200, So. (High Jump)

This basketball playing high jumper should be over 7-0 this year after flirting with 7-feet last season... Mackey will be with the Trojan basketball team through the first week in March...then will concentrate on track...former prep standout at Coronado High in Scottsdale, Ariz.

JEFF MARSEE — 5-10, 140, Jr. (Distances)

This USC record holder is coming off an injury, but is still expected to give Troy depth in the distances...he had an outstanding cross-country season...was named winner of the Warren Woodruff Award, presented to top Cross-country performer...popular member of team could blossom into top-caliber distance man...

DAVE MURPHY - 6-4, 265, Sr. (Shot Put)

This fine shotputter has shown vast improvement over last season...has already thrown 64-4 indoors...should be consistently in middle sixties...is finally realizing high school potential...should be one of top three shot putters in the nation...has finally recovered from mononucleosis which sapped his strength last year...

RICK MUTH — 6-0, 175, Jr. (Distances)

JC transfer expected to give depth in mile and two-mile ...if he develops, should give Troy needed points in 8-lap event ...

MIKE NEWTON - 5-11, 165, Jr. (440, 880)

Former state high school 440 champion while at Whittier High...rapidly gaining former strength...counted on to give strength in quarter and mile relay...outstanding potential could be realized if he matures...experience will help...

OLE OLESON — 5-9, 150, Sr. (Distances)

NCAA indoor and outdoor champion in 2-mile and 3-mile, now recovering from knee surgery...should regain former strength...one of all-time great USC distance men...has competed two years and already holds school records in 2-mile (indoor and outdoor) and 5000 meters...competed one year at Santa Monica City College before choosing USC...tremendous performer who is consistent in both big and small meets...will concentrate on two and three-mile races this season...

RON PHARRIS - 6-0, 185, Jr. (Sprints)

Returnee from last year's 39.6 sprint relay team . . . if he regains early form, should help team in sprints and relay . . . had best frosh times of 9.6 and 21.2 two years ago . . .

HOWARD PRATT — 6-1, 175, Sr. (Triple Jump)

Troy's strongest triple-jump performer...made it to NCAA finals last year...should be jumping 51-feet or better this season...could blossom into NCAA and conference points getter...will give depth in long jump, one of USC's weaker events this season...

FRED RITCHERSON — 5-11, 150, Fr. (Distances)

Fine long distance prospect, will concentrate on two-mile and three-mile events this season...voted SPAAU athlete of year...Wolfe: "Fred should score well for us all year long in the distances." Has the potential to be an NCAA point getter...ran 8:55 two-mile at Salesian High...

BILL SIMS — 5-11, 170, Fr. (440)

Incoming freshman...second in state in 440 last year with fine 47.1 clocking...also turned in 21.4 220 and 46.1 relay time while at Whittier High...will be used in both quarter and in mile relay...

STEVE SMITH — 6-1, 175, Fr. (Pole Vault)


Fine competitor in pole vault...expected to fill void left by the great Bob Seagren...will be over 17-feet this season ...one of nation's finest prep pole vaulters with best mark of 16-83/4...high school marks better than Seagren and Paul Wilson at same stage.

KEVIN TODD - 5-10, 170, Fr. (Triple Jump)

New Zealander who will give depth in both jumping events ... should be a consistent point getter in both the triple jump and the long jump. Has been over 49-feet in the triple jump with a best long jump mark of 24-0 ...

MONTGOMERY TURNER-5-10, 167, Jr. (Sprints,

Should help in both sprints and 440, as well as in both relays...if he regains Junior college form, Turner could be point-getter in any one of three events...will run on at least one relay team...




