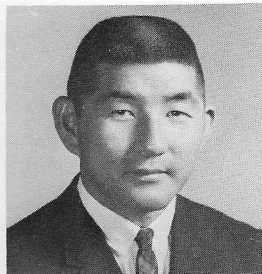

KEN MATSUDA**Assistant Track Coach**

Vern Wolfe's right-hand man, and a respected coach in his own right, is Ken Matsuda, assistant track coach at USC.



The popular assistant also serves as the department's athletic advisor for academic affairs.

Matsuda is now in his fifth season as assistant coach at USC. He came in the summer of 1966, following a successful coaching tenure at Foothill College in Northern California.

A graduate of San Jose State, Matsuda was one of Los Angeles' most sought-after prep athletes when he graduated from Westchester High School. At Westchester, Ken earned varsity letters in football, track and baseball, each of the four years he was in school.

After a brief stay at Santa Monica City College Matsuda transferred to San Jose State where he earned two letters as a Spartan halfback, also competing as a sprinter and long jumper on the track team.

Matsuda and Wolfe first worked together in 1961 when the Trojan head coach was on the staff at San Jose State.

The 34-year-old Matsuda and his wife Janet live in Torrance with their two children, Jo Ann, 9, and Michael, 8.

RON TEBBS**Assistant Track Coach**

Ron Tebbs is now in his third season assisting Vern Wolfe with the Trojan tracksters.

Born in Whittier, a graduate of Whittier High and Whittier College, Tebbs is now in his ninth season as head track coach at his alma mater, Whittier High School.

Tebbs was born in Whittier in 1937, graduating from Whittier College in 1959. At Whittier he played football and ran track. As a guard on the football team he played under Don Coryell and George Allen.

After gaining a Master's Degree in Biology and Marine Biology from Whittier and Humboldt State College, Tebbs turned to teaching, ending up at Whittier High in 1962.

Ron and his wife Carol live in Hacienda Heights with their two children, Kim (13) and Ron (11).

INDIVIDUAL BIOGRAPHIES

(Note: The following biographies are limited to those performers expected to see the most action this season. For each performer, the first mark is his 1970 best, the second is his lifetime best in the event indicated.)

JOE ANTUNOVICH — Sr., Discus (192-7, 192-7)

Joe is a senior performer who is expected to have a great year . . . he will be a threat to capture the NCAA title, and also has a shot at Gary Carlsen's USC discus mark . . . he should be consistently in the 190's . . . Architecture major.

LANCE BABB — Jr., Hurdles (14.0, 13.7)

Fine hurdle prospect from Los Angeles City College . . . had fine indoor season, running well with nation's top hurdlers . . . former City low hurdles champion at Dorsey High . . . holds state JC 440 IH record of 52.5.

LEON BROWN—Jr., Sprints (9.5, 9.5; 21.3, 21.3)

Another transfer from LACC, this versatile athlete will give Vern Wolfe depth in the sprints, 440 and relays . . . lifetime best of 47.5 in 440, Brown turned in a 46.9 relay leg last season . . . should see plenty of action.

JOHN BUEHLER—Sr., Shot Put (59-8¼, 59-11¼)

An experienced senior and a good competitor, Buehler should be in the sixties this season . . . will score points for Troy in both shot and discus.

NATE BURKS — Fr., 880, (1:52.2, 1:52.2)

Freshman half-miler out of Oakland, blossomed at end of last season, coming on to finish second in the 880 in the California State Prep meet . . . can also run 440 . . . Vern Wolfe: "Nathan has the strength and the speed to be a great one."

RICH CARR — Jr., Mile (4:07.3, 4:03.6)

Junior miler and 880 man . . . must improve over last season to give team strength in these two critical events . . . brother of former USC standout Dennis Carr . . . has lifetime best in 880 of 1:52.8, clocked last season.

JIM COCHRAN — Jr., Pole Vault (16-0, 16-0)

Hard working pole vaulter . . . scored points in several dual meets last year . . . finally cleared 16-feet at end of season . . . will be hard-pressed to score this year with abundance of fine vaulters in conference.

JOHN COLICH — Sr., Shot Put (57-5, 57-5)

Veteran shot putter . . . No. 3 man on Trojan weight squad . . . has already improved over last season's best mark . . . will be flirting with sixty-feet all season.

BOB COFFMAN — Fr., Hurdles (13.8, 13.8)

Prized freshman hurdler from Houston, Texas (Lamar High) . . . had time of 13.8 over high school 120's . . . ran 37.2 to lead nation's preps in 300 IH's . . . Vern Wolfe: "At 6-3, this young man has all the tools, definitely one to watch."

STEVE CRANE — Jr., Mile (—, 4:07.6)

This junior miler missed most of last season with leg injury . . . but is ready to have big season . . . team needs his talents badly . . .

SCOTT CRYDER — Jr., Pole Vault (16-6, 16-6)

Transfer from Mesa J.C. in Arizona . . . Scott is a consistent 16-6 pole vaulter who should be over seventeen shortly . . . has been over 16 for the past two seasons . . . Wolfe: "Scott gives us excellent depth in this event."

SAM CUNNINGHAM — Jr., Decathlon

Junior decathlon performer who has potential to become one of the best ever if he can take the time away from football . . . starter at fullback on John McKay's Trojan varsity. CIF and state shot put champion while at Santa Barbara High.

WILLIE DECKARD-Jr., Sprints (9.4, 9.4; 20.7, 20.7)

Transfer from LACC . . . has unlimited sprint potential . . . will run relay and both sprints . . . must come through . . . will carry lion's share of sprint responsibilities . . . state JC 220 champion.

RICH DYER — Sr., Mile (4:06.3, 4:06.3)

Senior distance man will run mile or steeple chase . . . he has the experience, but must become more consistent.

EDESEL GARRISON — Jr., 440 (46.0, 45.5)

Junior quarter-miler with great talent, will be a contender for the NCAA 440 title . . . forced to run sprints last season because of lack of team depth, Edesel will return to his favorite event this season . . . will probably see action on both relay teams . . . has recorded fastest 440 in history of school.

ANDY HERRITY — Sr., 2-mile (9:03.2, 8:58.2)

Senior distance man from England . . . has not matched early expectations . . . has plenty of hustle . . . should score points in two and three mile races.

WILLIE HALL — Jr., Javelin (221-8, 221-8)

Could be one of team's big surprises . . . with work he could develop into a conference contender . . . may help in the NCAA's . . . former Golden West Meet javelin champion.

HENRY HINES — Sr., Long jump (26-2, 26-5w)

Extremely versatile performer who will see action in many events besides long jump . . . could develop into world class triple jump prospect . . . also runs hurdles (14.3), intermediates (53.0), 440 (47.0) and if needed, either relay. Member of U.S. team which competed in Europe two summers ago . . . national JC long jump record holder while at Sacramento City College.

LARRY HOLLINS — Jr., High jump (7-0, 7-0)

Transfer from Mira Costa JC, gives Wolfe legitimate seven-foot high jumper . . . opened indoor season with a seven foot jump in Idaho . . . late blossomer, Larry's high school best was only 6-2 $\frac{3}{4}$. . . he should continue to improve.

HENRY JACKSON — Jr., Triple jump (51-7, 51-7)

Another extremely versatile performer . . . Henry's best event now is the triple jump, where he is a consistent 50-footer, but he can do almost anything . . . this includes long jump (24-6), high jump (6-8), intermediates (52.2) . . . he has also turned in a 9.7 hundred and a 47.5 quarter . . . could be one of nation's top decathlon prospects . . . born in Jamaica.

MIKE JACKSON — Sr., Sprints, Relay (9.8, 9.8)

Jackson had a good rookie year last season, ended as Troy's lead-off man in the 440-yard relay team which finished second in last year's NCAA meet.

EDDIE JOHNSON — Jr., Sprints (9.6, 9.6; 21.5, 21.5)

Transfer from Mira Costa JC . . . will be good utility man, can also run hurdles, has best 120HH time of 14.3 . . . will go out for football team as a safety.

CURTIS JONES — Sr., Steeplechase (9:01, 9:01)

School record holder in steeplechase, a very hard worker who can run mile and half mile in addition to the steeplechase . . . Jones came into his own last year and should improve on his records this season.

KEN JONES — Jr., (9.7, 9.5)

Steady runner who was bothered by injuries last year . . . came on to help 440-yard relay team . . . may move up to quarter this season.

DOUG LANE — Jr., Shot Put (64'-0 $\frac{1}{2}$ " , 64'-0 $\frac{1}{2}$ ")

Transfer with unlimited potential in shot put . . . Lane has the size (6'-4", 290) and the strength to become a world class performer . . . consistently near 64 feet last season, should improve greatly this year.

VINCE LIBBON — Sr., Javelin (235'-0", 235'-0")

Senior javelin thrower who walked out to practice last year and threw 200-feet the first time he picked up a javelin . . . Libbon should improve this season . . . he was bothered by back problems toward the end of last year . . . gives Wolfe a good 1-2-3 punch in this traditionally weak Trojan event.

JEFF MARSEE — Sr., 3-Mile (14:01, 13:40.2)

After two seasons with leg injuries, Jeff appears to be ready to return to the form he showed as a freshman. Wolfe: "Jeff is a tough competitor who always comes ready to run."

ROD McNEILL — So., Hurdles (14.3, 14.3)

Should give depth to Trojan hurdle squad . . . will be excused from spring football to concentrate on track . . . consistent low fourteens last year, will improve this season . . . has shot at No. 1 tailback on USC varsity football squad.

RICK MUTH — Jr., 880 (—, —)

Junior middle distance and distance man plagued with injuries last year, will help distance crew if he can overcome injuries which have plagued him the past two years . . . will also run mile and two mile.

DEAN OWENS — Fr., High Jump (6'-9", 6'-9")

High jumper from El Cajon, went 6'-9" as a prep . . . good size at 6'-3", Wolfe feels should be over 7'-0" this season . . . also starting forward on Trobabe basketball team . . . high jumps with one shoe on, one shoe off.

RON PHARRIS — Sr., Sprints (9.7, 9.7; 21.3, 21.3)

Veteran senior sprinter, injured much of last season . . . will be counted on to score points in dashes . . . should hold down No. 3 spot on Trojan 440-yard relay team.

ROBERT PULLARD — Fr., Pole Vault (16'-7", 16'-7")

Top-flight pole vaulter from Los Angeles High School . . . vaulted 16'-7" as a prep sensation . . . good size . . . has all the physical tools . . . great potential . . . will give Troy point-scoring potential in both dual and conference meets . . . also will run intermediate hurdles . . . fast enough to try for spot on mile relay team.

FRED RITCHERSON — So., Distances (13:45.5, 13:45.5)

Sophomore distance man who finished fourth in NCAA six-mile last season . . . has unlimited potential . . . hard-worker . . . always gives his best shot . . . has run 8:52.8 two mile . . . best six mile is 28:36.8 . . . prep star from Salesian High.

LYNN SWANN — Fr., Long Jump (24'-10", 24'-10")

State prep long-jump champion from Northern California . . . with coaching expected to be well over 25-feet . . . may surprise as triple jumper . . . has good shot at starting spot on Trojan varsity football squad as wide receiver . . . one of most sought-after prep athletes ever to come out of Northern California.

KEVIN TODD — So., Long Jump (23'-5", 23'-5")

Sophomore jumper with one year of seasoning after coming over from New Zealand . . . should make his presence felt in triple jump or long jump . . . has been near 50-feet in triple jump.

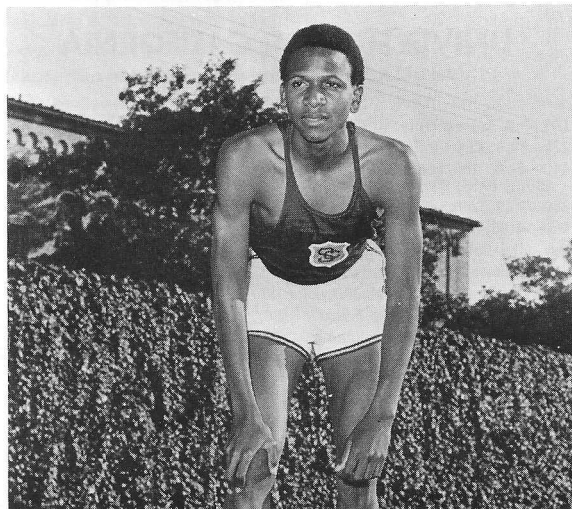

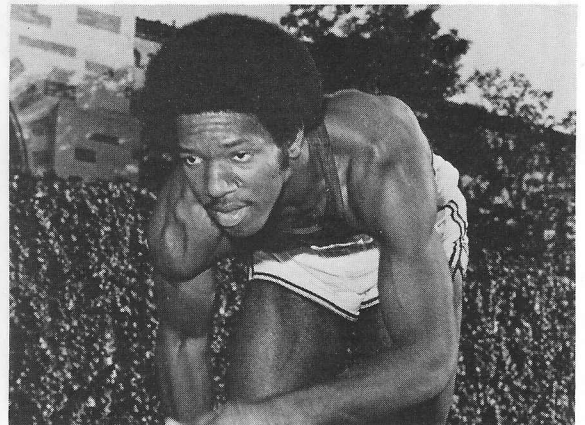
