2004 USC Season Outlook

YOUTH--AND TALENT--PREVAIL FOR 2004 MEN'S SQUAD

USC has been in the news a lot of late as a result of national titles won by the football, women's volleyball and men's water polo teams this past fall.

If one weren't careful, one might forget that the the mightiest athletic legacy at Troy competes not at the Coliseum, the McDonald's swim stadium or the Lyon Center, but at Cromwell field within the confines of Katherine B. Loker Stadium.

It's the USC sport with the richest tradition and the most national championships. That sport is track and field.

Twenty-eight Trojan men's teams have brought home NCAA titles, the most of any school in the country. USC athletes have won 145 NCAA individual championships--again, more than any other school.

The tradition and excellence in achievement is not a thing of the past for USC track and field, but an ongoing affair. Each year brings more champions, more records and more successes.

Last season, the USC men's team finished third at the NCAA Outdoor Championships in Sacramento, Calif. The Trojans scored 41.5 points, their most since scoring 48 in 1977. It was also the highest team finish for USC since also finishing third in 1997. Three Trojans won individual titles, the most by a USC team at the NCAA outdoor meet since 1968 and tied for the most by any team at the 2003 meet.

In other words, USC men's track and field is alive and flourishing. Give most of the credit to the efforts of Director of Track and Field Ron Allice and his staff. They have kept alive USC's unparalleled tradition and their teams have created new standards of excellence.

This season, look for more of the same from USC. But a cautionary note: while the Trojans are talented, they are also very young. Four senior All-Americans—three of them NCAA champions—depart from last year's squad. This year's Trojans will need to mature in a hurry in order to keep pace.

"We are young," said Allice, who is in his 10th season at USC. "The guys we had last year did everything that was asked of them and more. We have people with similar potential this season, but many of them are freshmen and sophomores or new to the program.

"There are some areas that could be very strong for us and some areas where there could be some weaknesses."

This year, the Trojans' path takes them to Arizona for the Pac-10 Championships, then to Northridge for the NCAA West Regionals before heading to the NCAA Championships in Austin, Texas.

If this young USC squad has matured by then, it could be a path of glory.

Squad Breakdown

This year's Trojan squad has the makeup of many of the teams of old. There is a heavy emphasis in the sprints, an area for which USC teams are renowned. The sprint corps features five athletes who have run 100m at 10.45 or better, making it perhaps the deepest group of speedsters at USC since the late 1970s.

Leading the way is junior Wes Felix (10.33/20.79), a tough competitor who is the reigning Pac-10 champion at 200m. Felix has vastly improved during his time at USC and was an NCAA qualifier as a sophomore. He had cartilage removed from a knee and has been slowed in the off-season, but should be back in top form by the time the big meets come around. Sophomore Garry Jones is another proven talent (10.45) who has gained strength in the off-season and should shine in 2004. Junior Phillip Francis hasn't had a chance to make much of a mark at USC so far due to eligibility concerns, but he ran for the Trojans at the NCAA Regional and NCAA Championship meets last season and has the natural ability to be one of the Pac-10s best. Add Felix, Jones and Francis to incoming junior college phenom Marvin Anderson (10.24/ 20.62), you have the makings of a pretty good relay squad. Also in the mix is freshman Reggie Bush (10.42), who has already made a name for himself as a tailback on the Trojan football team. In the 400m relay, Jones, Felix, Francis and hurdler Blake Frazier ran a season-best 39.75 at the NCAA Championships last season. Look for that mark to be improved upon in 2004.

"Our sprint corps is the deepest we've had since I've been at USC," said Allice. "To start with, Wes Felix has been one of our most valuable athletes. In 2003, he carried the flag for us in the 100m and 200m through the entire season. Jones is much stronger than he was last year. He was hurt a good part of the season last year, but he has looked good in practice so far coming into this season. Francis sat out the fall, so he will peak later, but he has the potential to really help us. It's just a matter of keeping him strong. Anderson is a very talented young man who had a tremendous fall for us. His work ethic and his desire have been excellent. If he stays healthy, we feel he can really be a gem. Bush has talent and will be a part of things in the relay and he will be an important presence. In the sprint relay, we think we can be very strong.

In the 400 meters, two freshmen will carry the load: **De'Sean Cunningham** and **Michael Pratt**. Cunningham is a prep All-American out San Diego's University High with a best of 47.19 in the quarter, while Pratt is a local product from Taft High in Woodland Hills, with a best of 47.75. Both were among the most talented 400m runners in the state last year.

"Michael Pratt had a great fall," said Allice. "He has a great, great work ethic. De'Sean Cunningham is very talented, but he is young. He could be a surprise if he stays focused."



The middle distances are in good shape, though again there is not a lot of experience. Sophomore Raphael Asafo-Agyei is USC's top 800m runner (1:49.27). He was the NCAA West Regional champion and also the Pac-10 runner up last season. He has the potential to have an outstanding year and, along with steady junior Anthony Heckman (1:50.79), he forms a potent punch in the 800m. In the 1500m, sophomore Tomasz Babiskiewicz is the standard bearer and one of the best in the conference. He finished second at the Pac-10s as a freshman and is already fourth on the all-time USC 1500m chart. He can also run the 5000m. In that race and the steeplechase, USC must develop runners within the program.

"We have two sophomores in the middles distances, but both are very talented and they had good freshman years," said Allice. "Asafo-Agyei is very fit. He had a great year last year in terms of improvement. He's savvy and talented and he could be an NCAA finalist this year. Heckman is further along than he's ever been in terms of being prepared. He has a different concept of what kind of runner he is and that has made a big difference. We've had Tomasz for a full year now and that should make a difference for him. He came on strong at the end of last year and I expect even better things this season."

The hurdles have been a major strength for the Trojans in recent years thanks to 2003 NCAA champion Ryan Wilson. But Wilson has graduated and there are three athletes looking to fill his shoes. Junior **Kenneth Thomas** is USC's top returning hurdler. He can run both the short and long hurdles (14.31/52.78). Redshirt sophomore **Jeff Garrison** has been hampered by injuries and will concentrate on the 400m IH this season (52.78). Also competing in the 110m HH is rangy sophomore **Blake Frazier**, who was fast enough to run third leg on USC's 400m relay last season. Sophomore **Jenson Wayne** (53.63) adds depth in the 400m IH.

"Thomas was out all fall for a military commitment after joining the Army reserve," said Allice. "So, his training has been limited. He's a good technician. Frazier came on well at the end of the year as a freshman. He is quick but isn't yet the technician he needs to be. Thomas and Frazier both have the potential to break through and they need to step up to make us viable in the short hurdles. Garrison will help us in the 400m IH and the 1600m relay. We need to keep him injury free. Wayne improved quite a bit last season."

The jumps were USC's bread and butter in 2003, as the Trojans scored 43 points in jumping events at the indoor and outdoor NCAA Championships and won three individual titles. It was definitely a season to remember for jumps coach Mike Pullins and his crew. This year, high jumper Dawid Jaworski and triple jumper Julien Kapek--both NCAA champs--have departed and the spotlight rests squarely on junior superstar Allen Simms, who last year became the first Trojan to win the indoor NCAA triple jump title and the first USC trackster since 1961 to earn All-America honors in both the long and triple jumps at the same NCAA outdoor meet. Simms is the Pac-10 record holder in the triple with a best of 56-7 1/2 and is fourth on the USC long jump list at 26-3 3/4. He is ranked 15th in the world (and 4th in the U.S) in the triple jump. Simms is joined in the triple by some non-scholarship athletes who nonetheless have a lot of potential: freshman Clark McGuire (48-3), sophomore Inman Breaux (47-7 1/4) and senior Laurence Mason (46-7 1/4). Senior Andre Serrette (24-2 1/4) gives USC a proven veteran in the long jump. As hard as it is to replace school record holder Dawid Jaworski in the high jump, the Trojans may have found the perfect candidate in North Carolina State transfer Jesse Williams, already a two-time All-American. The sophomore was second at the NCAA indoors last season and seventh outdoors. He has a best of 7-4 1/4, so don't expect much dropoff from last season.



"Last year, we had two 56-footers in the triple," said Allice. "Allen Simms and Julien Kapek were certainly the best combo ever in that event. Without a doubt, Simms is one of the greatest horizontal jumpers in USC history. We will be careful with him because it is an Olympic year and that will dictate to us how much he competes for us early. But we think he will be even better this year in the long jump and, of course, he is the school record holder in the triple. Clark McGuire could eventually be a 50-footer for us. If Andre Serrette can get more consistent on his approaches, we feel he can be a 25footer. Laurence Mason has the potential to be a 52-footer if he applies himself. He had a great fall and he may be a surprise. Jesse Williams is a competitor and a great athlete. He is fitter than he's ever been. He's very confident and when he's confident, I am confident. A guy that saw him early in his high school career was (Olympic medalist) Dwight Stones and Dwight is his biggest fan."

USC has a great throws tradition but, as in many areas of the Trojan squad, this year's group is young and still maturing. In the hammer, Troy has NCAA qualifiers **Michael Murray** (204-5) and **Adam Midles** (205-8), though Midles will redshirt this season after an outstanding true freshman season. Murray has improved tremendously and is now one of the best in the Pac-10. Sophomore **Noah Bryant** (56-10 3/4) and redshirt freshman **William Denbo** (64-0 1/4 junior shot) are the two main competitors in the shot. Look for both to build upon solid first years at USC. They finished 2-3 at the U.S. junior championships last summer. Sophomore javelin thrower **Dennis Rice** has a lot of talent and showed his stuff last year by winning the javelin against UCLA in the dual meet. He has the potential to be among the leaders in the conference. Bryant also throws the discus (148-6) and hammer (177-11).

"Michael Murray has probably improved more than anyone in any event in this program," said Allice. "If he can put it together at the right time, he can be a big factor for us again this year. In the throws it takes time to develop, so we have chosen to take this year to let Midles do just that. It will help him mature and it will give us an even stronger throws program in the coming years. But there is no doubt that he is a special talent. Bryant and Denbo are very young. But they are pretty good. They stole the show at the U.S. junior championships,

so they are among the better young throwers around. They will make big contributions this year. Rice pulled it out for us at the dual meet last year. We feel if he gets in that 220-foot range, he can be as good as anyone in the conference. But the key factor in this event is to stay healthy, so we will use him accordingly."



Looking at his team overall, Allice sees a lot of promise, but also a lot of holes.

"We've got some sprint power and a good jumps corps," said Allice. "We also have good young talent in the middle distances and throws. But there are areas that are not as strong as I'd like them to be. I strive to achieve balance so we can compete successfully in dual meets and conference meets, and still do well at the NCAAs. This is a young team that will get better as the year goes along and will be even more formidable in the coming years."

He also was the Arcadia champion, L.A. Indoor champion and CIF champion in the 800m as a junior ... As a sophomore, he was part of Don Lugo's national champion 4 x 800m relay squad ... Had PRs of 1:50.70 in the 800m and 48.21 in the 400m. PERSONAL: Raphael was born on Oct. 20, 1983 in Aura, Ghana ... He is an undeclared major at USC.



CONFERENCE RECAP


USC captured the men's title at the Pacific-10 Conference Track and Field Championships, which concluded a two-day run Sunday, May 18th. It was the first time ever that the meet was held on USC's campus.

Trojan senior Ryan Wilson won his third Pac-10 title in the 110-meter high hurdles in a wind-aided 13.42 seconds, then returned about 90 minutes later to win his first conference title in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles in 49.33 seconds.

The 20 points Wilson accumulated was crucial in helping USC win the team title.

USC ended Stanford's two-year reign as men's champion with 139 points to 128 for the Cardinal. USC men won five individual events and the USC women won four.

RON ALLICE

USC Director of Track & Field • 10th Season

Like a phoenix rising from the ashes, USC track and field has reemerged as a force on the collegiate scene thanks to the work of Director of Track and Field Ron

Allice and his coaching staff.

Under the guidance of Allice and company, the Trojan men went on a run of seven consective top 10 finishes--a feat last accomplished during the late 1960s and early 1970s under Verne Wolfe--from 1994-2000 and have won three Pac-10 titles in the last seven years. The hallmark of an Allice team is balance--after all, the sport he coaches is called track and field--and his tenure has been marked by squads that have been able to compete for championships at the national, conference and dual meet level. Last season, his men's team won the Pac-10 championship (though it was later forced to relinquish the title due to an ineligible athlete) and placed third at the NCAA meet. The year before, his young men's team finished third in the Pac-10 and tied for 11th at the NCAAs. The previous season--2001--the Trojans were 12th at the NCAA meet and 2nd in the conference, while snapping crosstown rival UCLA's dual-meet win streak at 22. The seven seasons prior to 2001, Troy finished no lower than seventh at the NCAAs (including three top-5 finishes) and won three Pac-10 titles. During his tenure, Trojan men have won six NCAA individual titles, garnered All-American acclaim 67 times and set six school records--not an easy task considering the glorious track and field history at USC.

Allice also runs perhaps the top women's program in the country. Before last year's 13th-place finish at the NCAA meet, the Women of Troy were the only team in the country to finish in the NCAA top three each of the previous four years while winning at least one NCAA team title. In 2002, his squad finished third at the NCAAs. It was led by the most celebrated sprinter in collegiate history, Angela Williams, who won an unprecedented fourth NCAA 100m title and later was awarded the Honda/Broderick Cup given to the nation's top female collegiate athlete. In 2001, the Women of Troy put on a nearperfect meet to win their first NCAA team title. In 2000, USC took second--at the time, their best-ever showing at the NCAAs. In 1999, USC was the only program that finished in the top five in both men's and women's track and field, as the women were third and the men fifth. In 1998, the women's team finished in fifth place. In 1997 they placed 14th, but that came on the heels of their first-ever Pac-10 title and a seventh-place NCAA finish in 1996. Allice's women's teams are feature powerhouse athletes who go on to shine on the national and world stages, including such stars as Williams, Natasha Danvers, Brigita Langerholc and Torri Edwards.

USC's past successes in track and field are well known: 29 NCAA championships (including two indoor titles), 61 world records, 87 Olympic team members, 40 Olympic gold medals and 16 inductees in the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame - all encapsuled in 104 years of a rich and storied tradition.

And now, with the second century of Trojan track and field already well underway, Ron Allice and his staff continue to work hard to maintain the luster of USC's most successful athletic program.

Allice, a prep standout at Long Beach (Calif.) Poly High, is well known for his ability to win. His overall dual meet coaching mark is 211-42-1 in 35 years at five schools, including 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach City College, his previous stop before landing at Troy. Allice's programs have produced more than 245 All-Americans, plus 16 Olympians,

four world record holders and seven American record holders. He has coached at his high school, junior college and college alma maters on the way to compiling his outstanding coaching statistics.

Allice has certainly reached the top echelon of his career, although he has not forgotten the beginnings of his coaching days. In his first coaching job, he guided the Long Beach Comets, a girls' and women's AAU program, for four years (1964-68), expanding the squad from just five girls to more than 150 competitors. During that time, he was also a graduate assistant at Long Beach State in 1964, an assistant at Compton (Calif.) High in 1966 (the team was second at the CIF championships) and the head coach for track and cross country for two years (1967-68) at Wilson High in Long Beach.

The next three seasons (1969-71), he was the track and cross country coach at Poly High in Long Beach. His track teams went 23-4 and captured the Moore League title each year. His 1971 squad was ranked as California's top dual meet team and was fifth at the state meet.

Allice was then Cal Poly Pomona's track and cross country head coach for two years (1972-73). Again, the success he had enjoyed at previous stops followed him—the Broncos lost only one dual meet, won two CCAA titles (a first in school history) and finished fifth in 1972 and sixth in 1973 at the NCAA College Division championships.


He spent the next five seasons (1974-78) as the track and cross country head coach at Long Beach State. Despite being a new Division I program and having just three scholarships, four of his squads placed among the nation's Top 15 dual meet teams. He won one Pacific Coast Athletic Association title and his teams finished second twice. Two of his cross country teams won the PCAA crown (two others were runners-up).

In 1979, Allice went to Long Beach City College. During his tenure (1979-94), his men's teams won the conference championship all 16 years and lost only one dual meet (78-1) in that time. Besides the 11 state crowns (including five in a row), his Vikings had five state runner-up finishes and won 14 Southern California championships (with two second-place finishes). In 1980, his team was selected by Track & Field News as the best junior college team in history. He was named the 1992 Coach of the Year by both the California Community College Coaches Association and the California Coaches Association (CCA). He also coached LBCC's cross country teams, including the 1990 state titlist and the 1991 state runner-up. He was the 1992 CCA Cross Country Coach of the Year.


Allice's achievements have not only been limited to the coaching ranks. He prepped at Long Beach Poly High (where he was a CIF finalist in the 440-yard dash), then went to Long Beach City College before attending Long Beach State, where he set the school record in the 440-yard dash. He was inducted into Long Beach State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993.

Allice received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1962 and his master's in physical education in 1970, both from Long Beach State.

He and his wife, Sharlene, have three children: Lance (36, who is a sports and marketing agent who recently passed the California state bar exam), Melinda (34, a USC graduate who is a worker in the field of geriartric and special patient care in the Bay Area and is also due to deliver her first child in August of 2004) and Sean (28, a graduate of the USC School of Cinema who works in film production and is currently working on his teaching credential).

JOHN HENRY JOHNSON, Jr.

Sprints/Decathlon/Recruiting Coordinator

John Henry Johnson enters his 10th year as one of the top assistant coaches in the nation. He works specifically with USC's sprinters and decathletes, and is the team's strength coach, but it is his prowess on the recruiting trail that has been the most instrumental in putting Troy back on the map.

Each of USC's past eight men's and women's recruiting classes have ranked among the best in the nation, and his 2004 women's class promises to be a blockbuster. Johnson has brought into the Trojan fold such superstars as Jerome Davis, Felix Sanchez, Denis Kholev, Charles Lee, Ryan Wilson and Julien Kapek on the men's side, and Angela Williams, Natasha Danvers, Brigita Langerholc, Grezyna Penc and Inga Stasiulionyte on the women's side. His extensive knowledge of the world amateur track scene--bouyed by a degree in international relationshas proved invaluable to USC and has established Johnson as perhaps the preeminent recruiter of foreign track and field athletes in the last quarter century.

Johnson has coached USC's last three sprint All-Americans. In the 100m, Sultan McCullough captured such honors in 2000 and Jason Shelton

did so in 1996. In the 200m, Charles Lee was an All-American in 1998 and 1999. Johnson also leads one of the top decathlon programs in the country, with five of his athletes scoring over 7,000 in the past three years.

Johnson, who was a state champion in the decathlon for Ron Allice at Long Beach City College (1987), also earned All-Pacific-10 Conference honors while competing at UCLA. After surpassing the 7,000-point mark in the decathlon for the Bruins, he graduated with a degree in international relations in 1990.

A track and football star at West Technical High in Cleveland, Ohio, Johnson--who is the son of former NFL-great John Henry Johnson--became an assistant coach at Long Beach State from 1990-92, where he worked with sprinters and throwers. He also served as a strength coach for the 49ers.

In 1993, Johnson studied abroad, spending time in Mexico and Spain, as well as the Center for Intensive Language Studies in Costa Rica. His hobbies include writing, playing and recording music.

DAN LANGE Throws

After 14 years of coaching the Trojan throwers, Dan Lange is one of the nation's most respected teachers, having coached his athletes to All-American honors 32 times.

The 38-year-old Lange guided former Trojan and 1996 Olympic gold medalist

Balazs Kiss to four consecutive NCAA hammer throw championships (and a collegiate record) and aided USC throwers across the board with his vast knowledge in the sport. In 1997, despite the departure of Kiss, Lange made it five in a row, coaching Bengt Johansson to the 1997 NCAA hammer title. Johansson was runner up in the hammer in 1998, as was Norbert Horvath in 1999 (Horvath also finished fifth in 2000 and third in 2001). At the 2000 Pac-10 Championships, USC continued its men's hammer domination, sweeping the top four spots to key the Trojans' title run. In 2001, Horvath captured his third straight Pac-10 hammer title and third straight All-American honor. In 2002, Lange guided walk ons Michael Murray and Harrison Lee into the Pac-10 finals.

On the women's side, he has coached 2001 NCAA javelin champ and Pac-10 record-holder Inga Stasiulionyte, 2003 NCAA runner-up and Pac-10 hammer record-holder Julianna Tudja, 2002 hammer All-American L'Orangerie Crawford, 2001 shot put All-American and school discus record holder Cynthia Ademiluyi, two-time hammer All-American Jennifer Vail, 1996 Pac-10 heptathlon champion and NCAA runner-up Nicole

Haynes and Leslie Coons (a former American record holder in the hammer).

Outside of USC, Lange is currently coaching hammer thrower Lisa Misipeka, who holds the American Samoa record in that event, plus Tudja. He was at one time the coach for two-time U.S. Olympian discus thrower Adam Setliff.

A four-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and three-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier, Lange also earned All-American honors in the hammer. Lange studied exercise physiology at Cal State Northridge and also works as a sports fitness consultant.

He and his wife Darcy (Arreola), who was one of America's finest middle distance runners and a former NCAA champion, reside in Valencia, Calif., with their son, Dylan, age three.

TOM WALSH

Distances/Women's Cross Country

Tom Walsh enters his 10th year as middle and long distance coach at USC. He also serves as the head women's cross country coach.

During his tenure, the Women of Troy middle and long distance program has

consistently been one of the best in the country. In fact, no other middledistance program in the country in the last decade--except for USC's under Tom Walsh--has had a four-time All-American in both the 800m and the 1500m at the NCAA Championships.

During the last eight years, USC middle and long distance runners have captured All-American honors 17 times, including an NCAA 800m championship by four-time All-American Brigita Langerholc in 2001. Langerholc also finished a suprising fourth in the 800m at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney in a school-record time of 1:58.51. Another Walsh

product was Grazyna Penc, a four-time All-American in the 1,500m. Penc finished third in 1996 and 1998, fourth in 1997 and was runner up in 1999. Emebet Shiferaw was a two-time All-American in the 3,000m in 1996-97. Her best NCAA finish was second place. Anna Lopaciuch twice earned All-American honors in the 1500m, finishing fifth in 1998 and third in 2000. In 2002, Alekandra Deren placed seventh in the 800m at the NCAAs. This past cross country season, Iryna Vascshuk placed 35th at the NCAA Cross Country Championships. She was the third Trojan in as many years to qualify for the finals, joining Brooke Thomas and Sarah Ellis as three of only five Trojans ever to qualify for the NCAA Cross Country Championships.

Walsh graduated from USC in 1988, and served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater for three years in the late 1980s. He also served as a track and field consultant for ABC and NBC during the U.S. Olympic Trials.

MIKE PULLINS

Jumps

Mike Pullins is in his sixth year as jumps coach at USC. Coach "Mike," as he likes to be called, is responsible for coaching both the women and men's jumpers.

Under his tutelage, the USC jumpers have been mainstays on the honors

podium at the NCAA Championships, with 2003 being an especially bountiful year.

At last year's NCAA Outdoor Championships, Pullins guided Julien Kapek to the triple jump title--USC's first outdoors since 1961--while Allen Simms placed third. Simms, who also finished seventh in the long jump outdoors, won the triple jump at the NCAA Indoor Championships earlier in the year with a Pac-10-record jump of 56-7 1/2. To cap off a remarkable season for USC jumps, Dawid Jaworski won the NCAA high jump title--Troy's first since 1963--with a school-record jump of 7-5 3/4. All totaled, Pullins' athletes scored a remarkable 43 points at the indoor and outdoor NCAA meets.

In 2002, Julien Kapek set a school triple jump record with a jump of 55-8 1/2 and then went on to place third at the NCAAs. The year prior, Djeke Mambo became the first Trojan to win both the long jump and triple jump at the Pac-10s since Luther Hayes in1961.

On the wome's side, he guided Tatyana Obukhova to her third-straight Pac-10 triple jump championship and a fourth-place finish at the NCAAs in 2002. The year before, Obukhova was third at the NCAAs. In his first year, he coached Pam Simpson to a third-place finish at the 1999 NCAAs. He also helped Disia Page and Stephanie Jones land on the USC top 10 charts in the long jump. In fact, four of the 10 women on USC's long jump chart were coached by Pullins.

A 1987 graduate of USC, his name is still among the top ten triple jumpers on the all-time Trojan charts. As a high school senior Mike qualified for the CIF Championships in four individual events and went on to win the triple jump, in which he placed fifth in the 1982 state meet. Mike starred at Cal State Northridge and Pasadena City College before coming to Troy. A three-time USA Track & Field outdoor qualifier (he qualified for the 1992 Olympic trials), he was forced to set track aside due to injuries and four ankle surgeries in 1994.

Mike is single and currently working on his master's degree in education.

JOE LANNING

Hurdles/Heptathlon

Joe Lanning is in his sixth year at USC after coming out of retirement. His main responsibility is coaching the hurdlers on both the men's and women's squads as well as the women's heptathlon.

The year 2003 was an excellent one for Lanning and his hurdlers as senior Ryan

Wilson won the 110m HH at the NCAA Championships and freshman Virginia Powell finished sixth in the 100m HH and set a school record in the process. In 2002, Wilson placed sixth in the 110m HH at the NCAAs, following a third-place finish in 2001. Natasha Neal also placed sixth last year in the 100m HH. But 2000 might have been the biggest season to remember for Lanning, as two of his proteges came away with NCAA glory. Natasha Danvers and Felix Sanchez each won the NCAA 400m hurdles title in school-record times. Danvers went on to the finals of the 400m hurdles at the Sydney Olympics, while Sanchez reached the semifinals before going on to win the 400m IH at the World Championships in 2001 (he is currently ranked No. 1 in the world). Lanning also guided then-freshmen Wilson and Marcell Allmond to a 1-2 finish in

the 110m HH at the 2000 Pac-10 Championships.

Lanning, the former head coach at Long Beach City College, was Ron Allice's mentor in his undergraduate days and later assisted Allice there for 16 years. During his time as the head coach at Long Beach City College, Lanning won 15 state championships and 22 Southern California titles. In addition, 41 of his athletes won individual state titles and 60 Southern California championships, including hurdler Earl McCullouch, who later became a Trojan and world record holder.

He is a member of the California Community College Track & Field Hall of Fame, and the Long Beach Century Club Hall of Fame.





Cromwell Field at KATHERINE B. LOKER STADIUM



Katherine B. Loker Stadium was made possible by a generous donation from Katherine B. Loker.

The 3,000-seat stadium opened in the 2001 season and was dedicated on May 5 during the USC-UCLA dual meet.

The facility includes track offices, locker rooms, an athlete lounge and meeting rooms. The track and field portion of the venue is still named after legendary USC coach Dean Cromwell, winner of 12 NCAA titles.


Cromwell Track & Field was used as a training and warm-up facility during the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. It underwent a complete refurbishing in fall of 1983. Not only was the track resurfaced, but the high jump area was expanded, two new sand pits for the horizontal jumps were installed and a new drainage system was also added.

The track's Rekortan surface, the same one that was installed for the Olympic competition at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, has eight, 42-inch lanes.

Cromwell Track & Field Stadium was the site of the first USC-UCLA Dual Meet held on the USC campus in 1995.

Katherine B. Loker stadium was the site of the 2003 Pac-10 Championships, the first conference meet hosted by USC since 1986 and the first ever held on the university campus.

New in 2004: The Louis Zamperini Plaza, an entrance way that will greet visitors to Loker Stadium with a tribute to USC track and field greatness.

Jack Davis--All-Time USC NCAA Scoring Leader



Paths of Glory

The Story of USC's Unmatched Track & Field History

USC is well known as one of the most successful athletic programs in the history of the NCAA, with 100 men's and women's national championships. The Trojans have won far more NCAA team and individual titles combined than any other university. However, the most dominant force in USC's slate of athletic programs is not the baseball team (12 College World Series titles) or the football squad (nine national championships) but the men's track and field program, with an unprecedented 28 NCAA titles (including nine straight, 1935-43).

Trojan athletes have dominated the track and field scene for decades. From the exploits of sprinter Charlie Paddock and thrower Clarence "Bud" Houser in the 1920s and 1930s, sprinter Mel Patton in the 1940s, thrower Parry O'Brien in the 1950s, sprinter Lennox Miller and pole vaulter Bob Seagren in the 1960s, sprinter Quincy Watts in the 1980s, to four-time NCAA hammer champion Balazs Kiss (only the fifth collegian to win four in a row) in the 1990s and World Champion hurdler Felix Sanchez in the 2000s, USC is synonymous with track and field excellence.

THE CROMWELL YEARS: 1909-1948

The roots of Troy's preeminence date back to 1926, when coach Dean Cromwell brought the first NCAA track and field championship to USC. Cromwell, who led the Trojans from 1909-48, also served as head coach of the football team for five seasons.

However, the foundation he laid was not on the gridiron but the cinderpaths. Cromwell's track squads won 12 NCAA championships and featured 34 NCAA individual champions. In addition, Cromwell was unanimously selected as headcoach of the victorious 1948 U.S. Olympic team, a group which featured five Trojans (Mel atton, Bob Chambers, Roland Sink, Wilbur Thopson and Cliff Bourland). In fact, Patton, Thomson and Bourland brought home gold medalsin their respective events from London, the Olympic site.

From 1935-43, USC experienced a streak of unequalled track and field success. No other university has come close to matching Troy's string of nine consecutive NCAA championships, all under Cromwell's watchful eye. Nicknamed the "Maker of Champions," he fashioned Trojan athletes into a powerhouse. At the 1936 Olympics in Berlin, USC trackmen scored enough points (37 1/2) to have finished among the top five in the world. Cromwell's influence extended

far beyond the USC campus to the corners of the world. He personally tutored champions in every Olympic Games from 1912 to 1948, and upon his retirement in 1949, "The Dean" remained involved as a regular figure in various Southland sporting events until his death in 1962.

TWO JESSES, NINE NATIONAL TITLES: 1949-1961

Jess Hill and Jess Mortensen, both integral parts of USC's proud athletic heritage, carried the track and field torch after Cromwell's retirement. Both men are still considered among the finest all-around athletes in USC history, and their accomplishments did not end after their playing days were over.

Hill, who lettered in three sports at USC (football, baseball and track), served as head coach of Troy's track and field program in 1949 and 1950, leading the Trojans to an undefeated season and national championship in both seasons. From 1951-56, Hill coached the football team, and in 1957, he began his tenure as USC athletic director, a position he held until 1972.

Mortensen's reign at USC also began as an undergraduate. The talented athlete lettered in track, basketball and football, winning the NCAA javelin title as a junior. After a 14-year coaching stint at Riverside Junior College, he returned to become coach of the Trojan track and field team in 1951, leading Troy to seven NCAA championships in his 11-year tenure. Mortensen's Trojan teams never lost a dual meet, going 79-0 between 1951 and 1961. He developed some of Troy's best-known trackmen, including Parry O'Brien and Max Truex. Sadly, "Mort" died suddenly at the age of 54 from complications caused by a blood clot. Hill, his longtime friend and teammate, stepped in as interim head coach for the 1962 season, and a new chapter in Trojan track and field history was about to begin.

THE WOLFE YEARS: 1963-1984

The prospect of succeeding three consecutive coaching legends would be a difficult task for anyone, but Vern Wolfe answered the challenge.

During his 22 years at the helm of the Trojan track and field program, USC captured five outdoor NCAA championships, including back-to-back titles in 1967 and 1968. A pole vaulter for Cromwell's Trojan teams, Wolfe also won indoor titles in 1967 and 1972. At the time of his retirement in 1984, he was the third-winningest coach in U.S. track history, all despite reductions in scholarships and the lack of a top-flight on-campus facility.

Wolfe, who competed in senior events as a pole vaulter, attacked all problems with a straight-ahead approach. He continued to win throughout his career and towards the end oversaw the modernization of Cromwell Field, USC's track facility which served as a training site for the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. And so, after 21 years on the job, Wolfe retired and gave way to Ernie Bullard.

BULLARD AND BUSH: 1985-94

Another in the line of former Trojan athletes to become head coaches at USC, Ernie Bullard came to Troy from San Jose State, where he helped build the Spartans into a national contender. It didn't take long for Bullard to continue Troy's winning ways, recruiting athletes like sprinter Quincy Watts, a two-time gold medalist at the 1992 Olympic Games.

Jim Bush was the man picked to replace longtime friend Bullard in 1991. After all, who better to rebuild the USC program than the man who guided UCLA to five national championships?

Bush helped stabilize the program and recruited some of Troy's stars, like Balazs

Kiss of Hungary, the 1993, 1994, 1995 and 1996 NCAA champion in the hammer throw. Consequently, he helped lay the foundation for the latest in the distinguished line of Trojan head track coaches: Ron Allice.

RON ALLICE, THE NEW ERA: 1995 —

Ron Allice, who prior to the 1995 season was named the Director of Track and Field for USC's combined men's and women's program, is no stranger to success. He has distinguished himself at every level of competition, all in the Southland, and is well-known not only as a master builder, but a man who can keep a program at the highest level year after year.

Allice came to Troy with impeccable credentials: 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach (Calif.) City College, where his 1980 squad was called "the best junior



college team in history" by Track & Field News. During his tenure at Long Beach C.C., his teams lost just one dual meet.

He quickly went to work, guiding the USC men's team to a fourth-place finish at the 1995 NCAA Outdoor Championships. In 1996, his Women of Troy won their firstever Pac-10 title. In 1997, he led the Trojan men's team to its first Pac-10 title since 1977 and a third-place showing at the 1997 NCAAs, At the 1998 NCAAs, he led the USC men's team to seventh-place and the Women of Troy to fifth. In 1999, the men won their second Pac-10 title in three years. At the NCAAs, the women finished third and the men fifth (as a combined men's and women's program, this was the best finish in school history). In 2000, the men finshed seventh--their seventh consecutive top 10 finish--while the women placed second-their highest finish ever. In 2001, Allice guided the Women of Troy to their first-ever NCAA team championship while the men tied for 12th. In 2002, the women were third and the men tied for 11th at the NCAAs, then last season, the men finished third (as three Trojans won NCAA titles) and the women tied for 13th.

Allice has a career dual meet record of 211-42-1 at five schools, and he has coached more than 250 All-Americans, 20 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He takes the storied history of USC track and field very seriously.


"I have a mandate to bring this program to its rightful place," Allice said. "This university is a special place to us all, and we are ready to add another chapter to USC's illustrious history."

Now ready to return to the heights of athletic achievement, USC track and field, as has been the case for 104 glorious years, is in good hands.

Trojan long jumper Randy Williams won the Gold Medal at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich with a jump of 27-4 1/4, which is still a USC freshman record.

Early in the spring of 1966, USC assistant track coach Willie Wilson was found to have terminal cancer. USC's two-mile relay of John Link, Dennis Carr, Bruce Bess and Dave Buck vowed to give him something special to remember and ran 7:14.4 to set a world record at the Los Angeles Coliseum on May 13, 1966.
