Another successful TWIG Invitational is on the record books! The sound of rain at 4:30 a.m. probably made some participants wonder whether we would have to postpone the tournament. But, as in years past, we were blessed to start on time and finish without inclement weather.

This year's tournament was held on September 21 at Reedy Creek Golf Course in Four Oaks, NC, which was also the site of the 2011 tournament. The field included men competing in three flights and women competing in two flights. Many of our supporters over the years were back again this year and we had some first-time participants. The TWIG tournament committee, TWIG Kidz and parents did an excellent job in getting everyone registered and started on time. They also served the delicious lunch and helped with the raffle and the awards ceremony following the competition.

By the time of the shotgun start at 9:00, the temperature was comfortable and most of the players had on their game faces. Reedy Creek is 6426 yards from the blue tees and 4632 from the red tees. There's a little of everything in the mix: water, sand, elevated tee boxes, and trees guarding the fairway. From the ladies' perspective on the front 9, two par 3s that play over water from an elevated tee box to a sloping green make you wonder how much more challenging the back 9 will be. Then you get to the back 9 and find there are more challenging holes. If you like a course without houses along the fairways and enjoy the sights and sounds of nature, Reedy Creek offers a pleasant round regardless of how well you are playing.

As always, the proceeds of the tournament go entirely to the TWIG Kidz program. Get ready for an even stronger 2014 TWIG Kidz program, thanks to the generosity of the participants, sponsors, and those who made donations. 
TWIG Foursome Places Second at Preston Pars Member Guest Tournament by Renee Allain-Stockton


