TWIG has successfully mentored and supported over 132 young ladies for the last 21 years, exposing them to role models, funding over 435 series of golf lessons, hosting tournaments, and teaching etiquette.

TWIG Kidz Newsletter

Seventeen TWIG Kidz were selected for the 2023 season. They were all offered small-sized clinics and individual golf lessons at Lonnie Poole Golf Course at NC State University from March through October. The Kidz also have opportunities to practice at Lonnie Poole between lessons.

Plus, the Kidz participated in 'Operation 36' where one or two golf skills are covered each week. Each skill has an educational goal to work toward. This program is designed to guide the Kidz by giving them small successes along the way.

For example, every third week, the Kidz had match-play games. Win – you move up to the next level and get a chance to play from a point further back from the hole. Sounds like fun!




