TRIANGLE WOMEN IN GOLF FOUNDATION ESTABLISHED

As part of our growth and after twenty years in the community, TWIG voted to organize a separate nonprofit organization to raise funds for our TWIG Kidz program. The Triangle Women in Golf Foundation, Incorporated was established through the Office of the NC Secretary of State and received its tax-exempt 501(c)(3) status effective August 2017. One of the primary benefits of being tax-exempt under IRC Section 501(c)(3) is the ability to accept contributions that are tax deductible to the donor.

Many individuals contributed to this effort including the Executive Board of TWIG and the TWIG Foundation Committee (Peketa Long, Renee Allain-Stockton, Rose Foster, Valerie Willis, Rhumel Anderson, Carlos Lewis and Carlene Morgan). We were also assisted by The NC Center for Nonprofits, Attorney Rob Bergdolt, and Angie Banask, CPA. Pro-bono assistance from the NC Center for Nonprofits was vital in our assurance that we were established appropriately.



Per our newly adopted Foundation bylaws, all members of TWIG are also members of the Foundation. The President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer of TWIG are stipulated in the Foundation bylaws as the same respective officers of the TWIG Foundation and members of the Board of Trustees. In addition, we will seek to add members from the community to the Board of Trustees who are interested in the Foundation's mission to inspire and empower women and girls of all ages by introducing them to the game of golf.

By attaining this status, TWIG will be able to engage in enhanced fundraising efforts to support activities related to our TWIG Kids program. Information on changes to our operations will be provided as we embark on our 2018 calendar year in TWIG. We will provide a detailed look at the bylaws and responsibilities of maintaining compliance.

Thank you to all that made this endeavor possible and we look forward to successful growth and a positive impact on TWIG and TWIG Kidz.

This year the TWIG Kidz were invited to return to Dona Lerner's Golf Academy, (DLGA), at Brier Creek Country Golf Course, in Raleigh, NC. Dona Lerner introduced us to their new coach, Nick Zurowski, who welcomed and taught each TWIG Kid with encouragement and strong leadership.

Dona Lerner was named as the LPGA Teaching & Club Professionals National Junior Leader for 2017. Our TWIG Kidz have been taking lessons at the Dona Lerner Golf Academy for the past few years. She was the 2014, 2016 & 2017 LPGA Southeast section recipient of this award. Now Dona is the National recipient.

2017 was truly exciting for the TWIG Kidz, because outside of the three blocks of golf sessions at DLGA from March to August, the young ladies were competing in golf tournaments, meeting and working out with personal trainer, Wade Harris at Raleigh Personal Training and receiving various recognitions throughout the golf community. 2017 TWIG INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT

The weather was perfect for the 76 golfers who arrived bright and early at The Crossings Golf Course in Durham on Saturday, September 16th to compete in the 14th Annual TWIG Invitational Tournament to benefit our TWIG Kidz program. The golfers were greeted in the parking lot by Boy Scouts from Troop 411 who volunteered to provide a "golf bag valet" service to transport golf bags to the players' assigned carts. The vast majority of golfers pre-registered for the tournament, so the registration process ran fairly smoothly, with most players purchasing the maximum of four mulligans to remain competitive with the field.

Lots of raffle tickets were also purchased in anticipation of having a chance to win one of over 30 great raffle prizes that were donated by various sponsors with a total value in excess of \$2,500. Registration bags filled with healthy snacks were donated once again by G. Alan, Inc.

After completing the registration process, the golfers enjoyed croissant breakfast sandwiches, continental breakfast, orange juice and coffee provided by four of our sponsors (William's Gourmet Kitchen, Ar-Razzaz Islamic Center, Chick-fil-A, and Starbucks).

There were 11 two-person women's teams and 27 two-person men's or mixed teams registered to play, including four of our TWIG Kidz: Nyialah Anderson, Tyla McAffity, Gabrielle Pace and Tyler Spriggs. Based on the feedback provided from our Survey Monkey, we are considering adding a separate mixed team flight to our tournament next year.

Golfers were set to head off to their respective holes shortly after 9:00 am for a shot-gun start after hearing the Rules of Play for the tournament. All the TWIG Kidz playing in the tournament were introduced by our TWIG Kidz Chairperson, Valerie Willis. Players were greeted this year on both the white and red tee boxes by a record number of 36-hole sponsor signs!

We introduced two new hole contests this year. The \$10,000 Hole-in-One Contest was sponsored by Richardson Private Wealth Advisors and the Pot of Gold Contest was sponsored by the Dona Lerner Golf Academy where our TWIG Kidz take their lessons. Although no one made a hole-in-one on the designated contest hole, two players landed within the Pot of Gold circle and split half of the entry fees collected with the remaining proceeds benefiting our TWIG Kidz program.

Pepsi-Cola (Garner) donated Gatorade, soft drinks and water once again this year which was provided to golfers by our TWIG member volunteers who were driving beverage carts around during the tournament.

The pace of play was good for a tournament with a full field of players with everyone completing their round in approximately five hours. All golfers and volunteers enjoyed a delicious lunch catered by Doug Boyd Foundation with fried fish, barbeque and grilled chicken with banana pudding for dessert while the raffle prizes donated by our sponsors were presented.

We have already started planning for the 2018 TWIG Invitational Tournament by holding a wrap-up meeting to discuss the results from Survey Monkey.

TWIG JOINS CAROLINAS GOLF ASSOCIATION

In 2018, the USGA will make changes to the Handicap System to promote consistency across clubs in following guidelines and to enable a worldwide Handicap System. Those changes will cause TWIG's USGA Type 3 club license to expire on December 31, 2017. TWIG has held a Type 3 club authorization to issue Handicap Indexes to our members since 2012. To prepare for the 2018 changes, TWIG had to determine which of four options to pursue.

At the TWIG business meeting held on October 28th, the membership voted to apply for club membership with Carolinas Golf Association (CGA). The application was submitted on November 20 and has been approved.



The annual fee for CGA club membership is \$50 (paid by TWIG). CGA clubs use the USGA GHIN (Golf Handicap Information Network) to record scores and calculate Handicap Indexes. The annual cost for individual members to access GHIN will be \$16 per year per member. That annual fee will be need to be paid individually by the TWIG member in order to maintain her USGA handicap. Currently, TWIG members who also belong to Type 1 clubs (such as Hasentree, Prestonwood, Wakefield and Wildwood) will continue to use GHIN through their club memberships.

On December 14th, the GHIN staff for the CGA sent the TWIG access information and other details for using the system. For each TWIG member who has score cards entered in GolfSoftware.com, I will export those scores to a Microsoft Excel file so that they can be used in GHIN for 2018. I expect to complete the exports before December 31 and will send each person a copy of the exported file. In January 2018, I'll send details on paying the \$16 fee for accessing GHIN and how to import the scores from GolfSoftware.com into GHIN. If you have questions about the upcoming changes, do not hesitate to contact me.
