### What is TWIG KIDz?

TWIG KIDz is a youth program sponsored by Triangle Women in Golf (TWIG) that introduces young girls to the game of golf and aims to inspire a lifelong passion for the game. Each year, TWIG welcomes up to 20 girls between the ages of 8 and 18 to participate in the TWIG KIDz Program.

Girls receive many benefits from playing golf, including but not limited to, learning responsibility, building character, gaining confidence, developing a strong work ethic, discipline and perseverance, cultivating rewarding friendships in a safe and supportive environment, and becoming engaged in a sport that can provide social and professional networking possibilities well after childhood, and that can truly be played for a lifetime.

Also, and importantly, there are opportunities for girls who play golf to earn college scholarships. The National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) estimates that roughly 200 college golf scholarships for women go unclaimed each year because there are too few girls competing in the sport to qualify for these scholarships. One of the primary goals of TWIG is to help girls in the TWIG KIDz program learn the game of golf and develop the golf skills needed to be able to compete for golf scholarship opportunities, which could make all the difference to their education, their income and their future. The program strives to accomplish this by providing the

girls in the program with golf lessons, golf equipment, and assistance in attending golf camps and clinics.

TWIG partnered with Dona Lerner Golf Academy, which is sited at Brier Creek Country Club, for TWIG KIDz clinics. Clinics were held roughly two to three times per month from May to October.

Level 1 works on:

- Golf Basics, Mechanics, Core Values
- ➢ Grip and Set-Up
- Stroke Mechanics



Level 2 works on:

- Level 1 skills
- Thinking Competitively



Level 5 is a group requiring personal invitation by Dona Lerner. In addition to refining the core golf mechanics and competitive mindset taught to beginner and intermediate players, Level 5 players also develop in the process of: Fairway and Green Strategy



### **TWIG KIDz on Tour!**

In addition to attending TWIG KIDz clinics from May to October, a number of TWIG KIDz athletes are on course developing their game and engaging in highly competitive golf.

#### **Golf Camp**

Level 5 athlete and 10<sup>th</sup> grader Tyla McAffity attended the Dianne Dailey Junior Girls Golf Camp at Wake Forest University in June. She won the longest drive contest on the first day of camp, carrying one of her drives 250 yards. Tyla was also in the group that won the 9-hole competition during the camp session. She received one-on-one instruction from Dianne Dailey, who retired in May 2018 after 30 years at the helm of the WFU Women's Golf Program, and tips on fitness, nutrition, and the college application process.

Zariel made a great showing, coming in  $2^{nd}$  in the Drive competition and 4th overall, which made her an alternate for the Subregional competition in the Girls 10-11 Age Division.


