Baptism FAQs

When does the baptism take place?

First Saturday of the month at 10am in English and 2pm in Spanish.

When are the pre-baptismal classes?

Spanish- Last Wednesday of the month at 7pm in the annex. English- By appointment. NO RESCHEDULING

What is a letter of good standing?

A letter from your home parish stating you are an active member of their community.

How do I pay my fees?

At St. Rita's parish office and with a check or exact cash (we do not keep change).

Do parents and sponsors have to be registered at a catholic church?

Yes AND they MUST BE ACTIVE MEMBERS OF THEIR PARISH.

How long do I have to be registered at St. Rita before being an active member?

You MUST be active at least 6 consecutive and most recent months to your date of application for baptism.

What do we need to take the pre-baptismal class?

You need to have registered and paid for class in advance of at least 24 hours of the scheduled class and please check your name on your baptismal certificate and make sure the name given for your Prebaptismal class certificate matches.

If the parents of child to be baptized are not married, can they still baptize child? YES

Can the prospective sponsors be living together as a couple but not married in a catholic church be sponsors?

NO, sponsors must be in good standing with the Catholic Church (Receiving Holy Eucharist)

Can the prospective sponsors be sponsors if they do NOT have the catholic sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation?

Must the children wear white for the baptism?

Yes, preferably but may wear off white.
