

CONVENTION RULES

Rule 1	The meeting of the Coalition of Black Trade Unionists shall be called to order as outlined in the agenda.
Rule 2	All cell phones are to be turned OFF during all sessions of this convention. The Sergeant-at-Arms will collect \$50.00 from you if your phone goes off during any session.
Rule 3	Before a delegate is granted the floor, they shall proceed to the nearest microphone and, before expressing their views, shall make known their name and/or chapter/city they represent.
Rule 4	No question shall be subject to debate until it has been made, seconded and stated from the chair.
Rule 5	If a delegate is called to order while speaking, they shall, at the request of the chair, take their seat until the question of order is decided.
Rule 6	Should 2 or more delegates rise to speak at the same time, the chair shall decide which delegate is entitled to the floor. This decision is not subject to appeal.
Rule 7	No delegate shall interrupt another delegate in their remarks, except to raise a point of privilege. The chair shall determine with the advice of the parliamentarian whether the point raised is a question of privilege. An appeal from the decision of the chair shall not be entertained unless it has support of 25% of the present voting delegates.
Rule 8	Speeches on matters of business shall be limited to 5 minutes, however time may be extended by majority vote of the dele- gates present and voting.
Rule 9	A delegate may not speak a second time upon the same ques- tion until all delegates wishing to speak have had an opportuni- ty to do so.
Rule 10	The chair with the approval of the Executive Council shall ap- point the following committees: Constitution, Credentials, Resolutions, Rules, and Sergeant-at-Arms
Rule 11	Robert's Rules of Order, revised, shall be the guide in all cases in which they are applicable.

In U.S. politics, the practice of drawing the boundaries of electoral districts in a way that gives one political party an unfair advantage over its rivals (political or partisan gerrymandering) or that dilutes the voting power of members of ethnic or linguistic minority groups (racial gerrymandering).

Why it matters. Gerrymandering can disenfranchise voters, skew election results and determine which party controls Congress.

Gerrymandering has become a major concern for Americans, especially in states like Ohio. In a recently released report card, watchdog group Common Cause gave Ohio and six other states an "F" for using redistricting practices that negatively impact minorities.





Home Mortgage



The Black homeownership rate has seen the largest percentage point increase of any racial or ethnic group since the end of 2019, moving from 42.7% to 45.2% in the third quarter of 2022¹.
