## Tumblers

<u>Tumblers</u>: tall cylindrical drinking vessels without a stem or handle.

- Things to consider when making tumblers:
  - The vessel should be <u>ergonomic</u> (relating to or designed for efficiency and comfort).
  - Think about the width and if the vessel fits comfortably in a hand.
  - The foot can be flat. Make sure to make the foot slightly concave so the vessel sits flat.
  - The foot can also be trimmed with a sunken foot.
  - Some vessels potters will work in ergonomic ridges or finger indentations.













## Yunomis

<u>Yunomis</u>: the most common japanese form of a tea cup/tea bowl made for daily (or informal) tea drinking. The form usually has a small, well defined trimmed sunken foot rim.

Why do Japenese tea cups never have handles? Because it forces you to hold the vessel. Hence: If it's too hot to hold, it's too hot to drink.
