Identifying Crawford Electric Poles/Meters

From the Desk of Deputy Chief-Fire Marshal Rice,

We had the opportunity to learn about electrical safety during our onsite training at Crawford Electric. They can remotely disconnect the meter at the scene of an incident but will only disconnect the meter when requested by us or dispatch.

The best method to identify a Crawford pole and meter is the **oval tag**. It will say Crawford Electric and have a number. If a meter is connected to the pole there will be large numbers nailed to the pole. If you can safely reach the meter, the bottom 9-digit number will give the best identifier to the correct meter to shut off. If they remotely disconnect the power at one of our incidents, they still will send a crew out to verify the hazard is safe. That is their policy. Most of their meters are on poles and not the house.

Remember that the City of Sullivan is in our district too. The Sullivan City poles have round tags. During busy times, I would recommend calling the power company directly if Franklin County is busy and you have ample time. It might prompt a quicker response.
