Training Division



From the desk of the Training Officer:

Training is the backbone of a fire department. It produces a well-prepared force that through repetition increases the speed of an operation and enhances proper execution while reducing injuries.

A firefighter who arrives at an emergency unprepared can be faced with life and death situations and will find himself or herself under extreme stress to perform his or her duties.

Training permits mistakes to be made and corrected in a non-emergency setting. The fire officer can take the time to stop a training exercise and point out the correct procedures. He or she can explain what problems can arise by failing to use the correct method, including problems that can occur if shortcuts are taken.

The whole department is a beneficiary since training allows for constantly improved operations. The efficiency of the fire department is recognized by the citizens they protect and can be directly linked to good public relations, permitting the passage of bills which benefit the fire department.

All fire department members need training. New members need to learn basic skills. Senior members need the training as a refresher and to keep their skills sharp. The company officer monitoring the training should provide positive reinforcement when required and adjust or correct improper actions should they occur.

Training also fosters teamwork and cooperation. This increases the likelihood that the firefighters will come to work in a pleasant environment and will look forward to participating in various departmental functions.

Training can be accomplished formally through drills and practical evolutions or informally by explaining policies and procedures. Members should set goals and discuss their individual progress with their commanding officers.

Worth Repeating:

A reminder to everyone about the first phase of truck number changes that were implemented on January 1st, 2022. Phase one essentially eliminated all three-digit numbers with a "zero" in the middle. Chief officers, the duty officer, and the flatbed Ford were affected. The transition happened as follows:

Chief moved from 800 to 8800

Deputy Chief moved from 801 to 8801
Deputy Chief/fire marshal moved from 805 to 8805

Flatbed Ford moved from 808 to 8802 or 819 depending on use. If this truck is being used for utility it is 819, if it's being used for duty officer, then 8802.

The remainder of the fleet will change later in 2022.

Fire Marshal Update Corey Rice SFPD

I completed the first inspection of Menards today. For the most part, it was clean, and they had minimal issues. This building would present many hazards to firefighters if it was on fire.

PLEASE NOTE:

- There are large spaces with pits and many moving parts. There are sprinkler systems throughout the entire building.
- There are three different FDC connections for first or main building and one serving the truss building.
- There is also a special system for the trash compactor in the main building.
- Most of the exterior main doors are marked.
- The procedure is to go through the entrance at guard shack and they will direct you to emergency location.
- There are two alarm panels. One in each building. I am adding those to map in active 911.
- They have cleaned out around all the hydrants. There are several and all should be in active 911.
- One thing for future is I would like them to mark risers and what area they cover. This will help you guys if you need to only shut one part of the system down.

That is all for now look at the map in active 911 and hydrant locations for up-to-date information.

Hope Ranch Visit

On Wednesday, January 5th, Crew A visited Hope Ranch in Stanton to provide fire extinguisher training to their staff. Currently, the staff and volunteers remain busy as they prepare for the opening and occupancy of this community for at risk youth who are in the foster care system. Training went well and we were also given a tour of the main facility by Gary Vogel. Another day in January was also provided by the ranch and served as one of the January Tuesday training events for the district. Trainees were able to do a walk thru and gather important information for any future calls that may come in.


