Station 1 Covid supplies have been stored in the upstairs storage room.

Two new ice suits arrived for 8816 to replace the OOS ones.

The Chiefs have a 25-year plan to update the vehicle fleet, and hopefully that will allow for routine updating and replacing as needed.

Grace City Church has completed their addition. They have installed a Knox box to the right of the east glass entry doors. This will be the main entrance. Currently, there is an electronic swipe card for the doors and a fire alarm panel key in the box. More to be added soon. The annunciator panel is in the foyer to the right of the front door. The key must be in it to use it. The main panel and sprinkler room is in the northwest corner of the building. The FDC is also in the same northwest corner, which is the rear of the building. To gain access to this you will have to enter off Landon Rd. and go to the far rear corner. There is also a hydrant in that area too.

Muddy Banks is also complete. There is a Knox box to the right of the front door. There is a downstairs area in the rear of the building only. This is where they brew the beer. Minimal hazards in this building. No alarm or sprinkler as they are under the required square feet. Hydrant is 250 feet out on Acid Mine Rd.

The new Juergens warehouse is on Shamrock Lane. It is a complete and has a simple floor plan. No hazards.
