The Sullivan Fire Protection District is seeking a highly motivated individual with a positive attitude to fill the position of FIREFIGHTER. This is a full-time, paid position on an Operations shift working a 48-hr onduty/96-hr off-duty schedule. The Sullivan Fire Protection District covers 174 square miles of area including Sullivan, Oak Grove Village, Village of West Sullivan, Miramiguoa Park, and Meramec State Park. The Sullivan Fire Protection District serves a total population of approximately 14,500 residents.

The Sullivan fire Protection District is a combination paid and volunteer fire protection district and employs 9 full-time professional firefighters, and has 30 active Volunteer firefighters. The Sullivan Fire Protection District maintains 5 fire stations, housing 5 engine companies, 1 ladder company, 1 rescue company, 3 tankers, 6 brush trucks, 2 rescue boats, 1 dive unit, and multiple other support vehicles.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- H. Necessary Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:
 - 1. Ability to perform work requiring good physical condition.
 - 2. Working knowledge of driver safety.
 - 3. Working knowledge of first aid.
 - 4. Ability to successfully learn the operation of the listed tools and equipment.
 - 5. Ability to learn how to apply standard firefighting, emergency aid, hazardous materials, and fire prevention techniques.
 - 6. Ability to perform strenuous physical effort during emergency, training, or station maintenance activities for prolonged periods of time under conditions of extreme heights, intense heat, cold, or smoke.
 - 7. Ability to act effectively in emergency and stressful situations.
 - 8. Ability to follow verbal and written instructions.
 - 9. Ability to communicate effectively, orally and in writing.
 - 10. Ability to establish and maintain positive effective working relationships with other employees, supervisors, and the public.

The following criteria are provided from the FIREFIGHTER position description, as examples of the expected duties and responsibilities associated with this position.

GENERAL PURPOSE

- A. Protects life, property and the environment by performing fire suppression, rescue, emergency aid, hazardous materials, and fire prevention duties.
- B. Maintains fire equipment, apparatus, and facilities.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED

A. Works under the close supervision of a fire officer.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED

A. May exercise limited supervision of team members in the absence of an officer.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. Performs duties in accordance with the Sullivan Fire Protection District Standard Operating Guidelines.
- B. Functions within the NIMS Incident Command Systems.
- C. Performs firefighting activities including deploying hose, performing fire suppression operations, and water supply tasks.
- D. Performs rescue activities including removal of victims from hazardous locations and extrication of victims from vehicles.
- E. Performs emergency aid activities including administering first aid and providing other assistance as required.
- F. Performs salvage operations such as deploying salvage covers, sweeping water, and removing debris.
- G. Responds to fire alarms and extinguishes fires, as a member of a team and under the supervision of an officer.
- H. Participates in the maintenance of incident accountability.
- I. Selects, drags, lifts, and carries hose and nozzle depending on the type of fire, and correctly applies a stream of water or chemicals on the fire.
- J. Positions and climbs ladders to gain access to upper levels of buildings or assist individuals from burning structure.
- K. Creates openings in buildings for ventilation or entrance using appropriate and available manual and power tools.
- L. Protects property from smoke and water damage using positive pressure ventilation, salvage covers, and smoke ejectors.
- M. Wears appropriate protective clothing and equipment, including self-contained breathing apparatus.
- N. Able to communicate with two-way radio communications systems.
- O. Maintains competence in Hazardous Material Operations, CPR/AED, apparatus driving and operation and other required competencies.

PERIPHERAL DUTIES

- A. Participates in fire drills, attends classes in firefighting, rescue, emergency medical, hazardous materials and related subject.
- B. Attends regular and assigned training sessions to maintain and upgrade firefighting skill.
- C. Participates in the inspection of buildings, hydrants, and other structures in fire prevention programs.
- D. Maintains fire equipment, apparatus, and facilities.
- E. Performs minor repairs to departmental equipment.
- F. Performs general maintenance work in the upkeep of fire facilities and equipment; cleans and washes walls and floors; cares for grounds around station; makes minor repairs; washes, hangs and dries hose; washes, cleans, polishes, maintains, and tests apparatus and equipment.
- G. Presents programs to the community on safety and fire prevention topics, if trained.
- H. Other duties as assigned by a fire officer.

TOOLS AND EQUIPMENT USED

A. Fire apparatus, fire pumps, hoses, and other standard firefighting equipment, ladders, first aid equipment, radio, pager, personal computer, phone, SCBA filling station, and similar equipment.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

- A. The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job.
- B. While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to sit, stand, walk, use hands to handle or operate objects, tools, or controls, and reach with hands and arms.

 The employee is occasionally required to climb or balance, stoop, kneel, crouch or crawl.
- C. The employee is required to be able to function in and wear fire department personal protective equipment that weighs approximately 40 pounds.
- D. The employee must frequently lift and/or move up to 10 pounds and occasionally lift and or move up to 100 pounds.
- E. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIRONMENT

- A. The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential function of this job.
- B. Work is performed in office, vehicle, and outdoor settings, in all weather conditions, including extreme temperatures, during day and night. Work is often performed in emergency and stressful situations. Individual is periodically exposed to loud noises, such as alarms and sirens and other hazards associated with fighting fires and rendering emergency medical assistance, including smoke, noxious odors, fumes, chemicals, solvents, and oils.

C. The employee occasionally works near moving mechanical parts and in elevated, precarious places and is occasionally exposed to wet and/or humid and slippery and icy conditions, fumes or airborne particles, toxic or caustic chemicals, risk of electrical shock and vibration.

SELECTION GUIDELINES

- A. Formal application, to include review of education, training and experience, appropriate testing and interviews, background check, reference check, operator's license check, physical agility test, drug screening, and pre-appointment medical examination are part of our standard application process. Written and agility testing will occur at Fire Station 5, 1230 N. Church St.
- B. Appointees will be subject to completion of a standard probationary period.
- C. The examples of duties are intended only as illustrations of the various types of work performed. The omission of specific statements or duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is similar, related, or a logical assignment to the position.
