ICE RESCUE TRAINING

City Lake 1/28/2025

This is just one of the technical disciplines that firefighters must be prepared for. A dozen firefighters participated in the blistering cold temperatures and wind. This made the drill more realistic. We hope to never have to use this training on a real emergency but continue to train for worst case scenarios. As Missouri weather changes from day to day, so do the ice conditions. Warm days thaw and weaken the ice, and colder nights re-freeze the ice. This makes the ice look solid, but it's just the opposite. Freezing and thawing makes the ice weak and more susceptible to breakthroughs or falling into the water. We always remind our community to stay off the ice. - Deputy Chief Fire Marshal, Corey Rice
