# CHARITY QUILTS FEBRUARY PROGRAM -BRING A ROTARY CUTTER

It's been two years since we worked on charity quilts, so our February meeting will be dedicated to hauling out and sorting through the 17 boxes of fabric which have been donated to the guild. This announcement prompted Joy to tell the following story:
Many years ago, the Robert Kaufmann Fabric company



policy was that they would give away remnants and last year's fabric samples to any Guilds who wanted to use them for projects. When that got out of hand, the company tightened their security and appointed one person to be the liaison to all of the guilds. That person's name is Andrea Lideke, a former co-worker of my husband and later my friend. She is a quilter and makes hundreds of charity quilts for her church and for the South Bay Guild. She would call me once a year and let me know she had "boxes" of fabric for us.

The procedure was, and still is, that we would pick up

the fabric boxes. We would then be required to write a thank you note to the company, and Andrea would deliver the thank you note to Mr. Kaufmann, president of the company.

Then, it was decided by the company that they would no longer give out the fabric to Andrea for the guilds, but instead they would sell the remnant and old samples to manufacturers or scrap dealers who made the highest bid. Andrea was disappointed to learn this. As she prepared to go to South Orange County to pick up her last box, she

The response to the Friendship Block concept has been great. Ten people have handed out blocks so far. They will soon be able to show us the results of your friendship toward them with a finished quilt.

If you weren't around when this activity started, we'll give a short summary of the idea. Complete guidelines for friendship

#### Friendship Blocks, continued

You chose a pattern you would like help with. Write out detailed instructions regarding its construction. Read over your directions to see if you understand them and would be able to complete the block as instructed. Remember, be clear as to what you want your friend to do.

If there are specific fabrics you want in the block, such as background, attach the fabric to the instructions. You can provide as much or as little fabric as you want. Sometimes it helps if you have a sample for people to see when they pick up you instructions. On the instruction sheet, include your name and telephone number in case there are questions by members who chose to complete your block. Also, indicate the date that the block is due back to you. Members have three months to complete and return the blocks.

At the guild meeting, present your block and provide a sheet for members to sign on when they take your pattern. Include on the sheet your name, the name of your block, the date you handed out the pattern and the date the completed blocks are due. They should record their name and phone number in case the chairperson needs to contact them. You may hand out 16 patterns at a time. If you need additional blocks to complete your quilt, you may hand the pattern out again after you make six blocks for other people.

Anyone who visits the plant has to be escorted in and must stay with her escort. That day, as she was showing her photos, a man walked into the room and wanted to know who the visitor was. She was introduced to him, and showed him the photographs of all the wonderful quilts and some of their recipients. She told him that since this was her last visit, she thought they would want to see the photos.

The man turned out to be Mr. Kaufmann, President of the Company. He was so touched by the photos, that he changed the policy on the spot and said "give her the fabric", hence allowing her to continue provide the fabric. Andrea has since retired from this job, and the new liaison, Mary, is a friend of Lynn's, so we continue to have access to the fabric. Lynn was able to pick up 17 boxes last fall.


