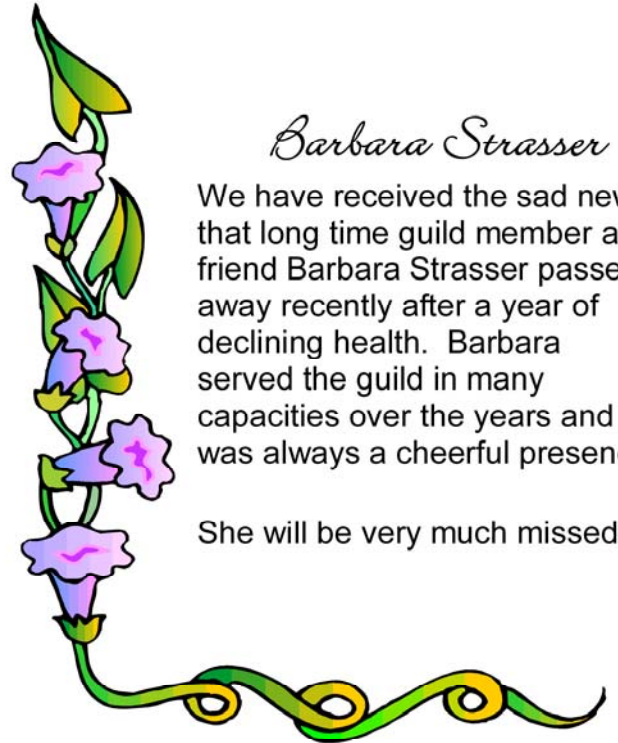

I promised several people at guild that I would send this to you for the Nov. newsletter. It is called:

Pumpkin Cake Preheat oven to 350

1 Can (16 oz.) Solid Pack Pumpkin (or Libby Pumpkin Pie Mix)
1 Can (12oz.) Evaporated Milk
3 Eggs 1/2 tsp. Salt
1 1/2 Cup Sugar 4 tsp. Pumpkin Pie Spice (w/Pumpkin Pie Mix Pumpkin, only use 1 & 1/2 tsp.)
1 Box Duncan Hines moist Deluxe Yellow Cake Mix or Deluxe Butter Recipe Golden Cake Mix
1 Cup Butter (or Margarine) melted
1/2 Cup Chopped Pecans

Combine pumpkin, evaporated milk, eggs, sugar, spice & salt. Grease bottom of pan **only** with butter and pour into 13" X 9" cake pan. Sprinkle dry cake mix evenly over top of pumpkin mixture. Then sprinkle chopped nuts overall. Bake at 350 for 50-55 min. or until golden brown - when knife comes out clean, it's done! Top with whipped cream or ice cream or just eat it plain with a good cup of coffee! **ENJOY!**
