TOWING BABIES TO VENICE KEEPS EYES LOW, INSPIRED BY FLOORS

Nora McMeeking of Santa Barbara, back for her second visit to Pine Needles Quilt Guild, tells of her decade-long quest to learn how to make quilts from the Cosmati designs she delighted in on her first visit to Italy. These mosaic tile floors were filled with familiar patterns: Flying Geese, Diamonds in the Square, Double Wedding Ring, set in stone as long ago as the 13th century.

Thanks to Al Gore's invention of the internet, Nora was able to research the floors, and eventually taught her adult education classes in Santa Barbara how to assemble these intriguing patterns into quilts.

In 2005, Nora's professional career as a graphic designer for books and magazines came into play

as she designed her own book, Bella Bella Quilts. This is one of the more beautifully styled quilting books, with lovely side bars accenting the pages, and features the works of many of her students. It includes 7 patterns, one of which she taught in the workshop on April 9th. The ladies learned some of her many tricks and got a good start on a Renaissance Italian designed quilt. We can't wait to see the finished products in weeks to come.


