### ETHNIC FABRICS SET THE TONE

Sylvia Davis describes herself as a full-time fabric collector and a part-time sewer. As she exhibited various ethnic fabrics from Africa, Asia, Indonesia, Australia, and even Hawaii, it was evident that she loved the flavor these boldly patterned fabrics bring to her work. All her friends know when Sylvia is giving a trunk show, because she comes by for her favorite pieces from their work, as well as her own, such as the mud cloth coat, *lower right*. She described the 4 inch mud cloth woven by men, sewn together, painted with resist by women, and soaked in mud, rinsed and dyed again.

When using ethnic fabrics, you have to decide if you're going for flavor or focus. Focus means that the fabric is the first thing you notice. If you think that African fabrics clash, you don't have enough of it in!
