Rotary Cutter (with Sharp blade) cutting mat at least 24"

Rulers— 6 1/2" square

12 1/2" square (I have these rulers for sale)

24" ruler

*Optional: If you have June Taylor Shape Cut for cutting strips, bring it!

WHITE FLEECE or flannel for design surface attached to foam core board large enough for your design (AT LEAST 32" X 40"

I'll have copies of my book "9 Patch Pizzazz" available!

FABRIC:

1 1/2 yard large scale print (landscape/floral, etc.)

1/2 yard EACH of 3 or 3 coordinating fabrics — not solids

Bring 1 fabric to highlight one of the colors in the large scale print.

Optional:

I have lots of kits available in various themes for \$32 + tax, including 2 1/2 yards of fabric.


