3/4 yd. Background material

1 yd. Border

1 yd. Backing and sleeve

1/4 yard binding

1/2 yd. Light weight interfacing for Mouse: med, different than squirrel interlay

30 " square of batting

Perle cotton #12, various greens, rust, gold and brown

Rayon DMC floss, different greens, browns

Metallic silver thread

Moth: printed fabric moth,  $3/4" \times 6$ strip beige fabric

Tree log—wood grain print fabric

Acorns: beige and brown

Maple or oak leaves: variety of value

Squirrel: Light, med, dark fur-like

or KIT available from Cathy at www. cathyvb.com which includes pattern, fabric for top, borders, binding and floss for embellishments.

## SEWING SUPPLIES

Basic sewing supplies Fine pins Needles, straw#10, embroid.#10 Mechanical pencil Paper & small sewing scissors Freezer paper Threads to match appliques 1 yd. SewLite (light weight sew-in interfacing) Optional lightbox
