

KAREN COMBS' QUILT ILLUSIONS



Karen Combs became so frustrated in trying to find fabrics in gradations that she designed her own line of fabric. The key to her optical illusions is the value shift from dark to light, so her border to border gradations make it possible. She had many color gradations for sale, with her interesting patterns, two pictured below. Her quilts were show and tell to the fourth power, since they looked different each time they were rotated. The squares rotated in and out visually as the mind's eye tried to compute, is that square going in or coming out, or both?

Karen likes to offset a cool-leaning quilt with warmer tones for the border, and vice versa. The complements give the quilt more color snap. On the back of her quilts, Karen sometimes repeats the design on the front enlarged on the back. And sometimes she forces herself to use "those fabrics you don't even like to share with yourself".

The November meeting is our annual quilt grab where the house leaders will choose quilts for the individual homes and cookie house. We need your quilts for the November meeting. What type of quilts do you bring? Bring the quilts that you would like to have shown at the home tour. Can you bring repeats? Yes, try to bring quilts that have not been shown for a few years. All quilts will be used, either at the homes or at the cookie house.

In the newsletter are two forms that you must complete prior to the November meeting. These forms are used to identify your quilts. We take pride in keeping a complete inventory of every quilt that is turned in at the November Meeting. The first form is a label which needs to be completed prior to the meeting and attached to each quilt you bring. The second form is the inventory of all the quilts you bring, and should be completed prior to the meeting. At the meeting you will note on this inventory sheet which location it was selected for. Before you go home a copy of the inventory sheet will be made for the records we keep, and you will keep your original. The quilts will be returned at the December Pot Luck. If you need to get the quilt back prior to the December meeting, you can arrange to get it from the House Leader of the home your quilt is shown. If you cannot make the December meeting, ask a friend to pick-up your quilts. We will distribute tickets for you to make available to your friends and neighbors for sale, hopefully by the October Meeting. If you are signed up to work the at Home Tour, you will receive a letter in Mid-November with instructions, a map, and your preview ticket.

DEATH BY CHOCOLATE (management waives all responsibility)

Bake 1 regular box chocolate cake mix
When done, poke full of holes with a fork

For example, Rose Burcher would be RB1, RB2, RB3, etc. This is important – we want to get the right quilts back to their rightful owners. **Attach one label to each quilt you are loaning to us for the home tour.
