Home Tour is Coming Up Fast!

The November meeting is the famous “Quilt Grab” meeting. This is the meeting where we select the quilts for the houses. They will be returned to you at the December meeting.

Included in the newsletter are the labels for your quilts and the Personal Inventory sheet. The labels need to be attached to your quilts before you bring them to the meeting. The inventory sheet is for you to note which house your quilt will be at. You will fill this out during the meeting. Before you leave, we will make a copy of this sheet for our records.

House Descriptions

Magana House - 5865 Elm. This cabin was built in 1916. The style is “bachelor”, so we will be looking for any type of quilts to fill this house. There is one bedroom downstairs and two small bedrooms upstairs. Our featured quilter, Charlotte Ketcheside, will be in the large family room with her quilts.

Campbell House - 1405 Laura. This house is a lovely three-bedroom home with an open plan kitchen/dining room/living room and separate den/office. Outside is a large wraparound deck with a homeowner-built cascading stream running alongside. The home is decorated primarily in neutrals so we can be flexible with the color palette, however, because the owners have Mickey

Stayton House - 997 Oriole Rd. This old cabin was built in the 20s, but has recently been remodeled (after a disastrous flood). The wood floors were replaced with slate, giving it a very elegant look. The main part of the cabin is a cottage look – reminiscent of the “Craftsman” style. The main living area is open containing the kitchen, dining area, and the living room. Both the downstairs bedrooms have lovely pitched ceilings, giving them a very open feel. An addition to the cabin was done in logs. In this portion of the house, there is a downstairs room that is a workout room and upstairs is a lovely bedroom with a large picture window looking out into the trees. The colors throughout the house are light yellow, seafoam green, and brick red.

Ludwig - 1279 Oriole. The first floor is comprised of a great room and an office, both of which have views of the country club. The office features pecan wood floors. The upstairs has a grandchildren's room and a master suite. Both rooms have beamed ceilings that will be great for hanging quilts. All of the interior walls are wood. The property also has a guest cabin with a small kitchen. Style of quilts is mountain or country.
