Entering “Quilt Alley,” potential bidders were given ballots and voted on their favorite quilts in five different categories. At the end of the day, Ma-

terial Girls won Viewers’ Choice and Most Wrightwood; the CutUps won Chairman’s Choice and Most Patriotic; Joyce Gwinner earned Best Use of Color; and Alice Smith won Best Children’s. Congratulations to all!



“It’s Not Our Fault” by the Material Girls earned the highest bid and two ribbons.

People warmed up to the bidding quickly and
