Quilted

Due: October 8

Incoming President Kim Ogilvie has thrown down the gauntlet and challenges guild members to make a quilt that represents a song of your own choosing. The quilt can be no bigger than 22" x 22" (although it can be smaller) and must be quilted. Any medium and

method is permitted: paint, buttons, rick rack; it can be pieced, appliqued, whatever. The objective is to have fun and be creative.

Finished quilts are due at the October general meeting. A prize will be awarded to the quilt judged the best represen-

tation of the chosen song. In addition, the guild member who correctly guesses the most song titles will win another prize.

Kim wants everyone to have a good time with this challenge and hopes that many members participate.

Jami Lynum-Young's Bread Pudding

Jami Lynum-Young shares the recipe for her popular dessert.

Preheat/Bake at 350 degrees

- 1 Loaf French Bread
- 1 ¼ C Heavy Cream
- 1 ¼ C Whole Milk
- 1 ½ C Butter (unsalted)
- 6 Eggs – Beaten
- ½ C Spiced Rum (Captain Morgan is best)
- 2 ¼ C White Sugar
- ½ t Nutmeg
- ½ t Cinnamon
- 2 t Vanilla
- 1 C Raisins*** (Optional)

Use a LARGE bowl.

READ ALL DIRECTIONS BEFORE STARTING

24 hours before making pudding, tear French bread into bite sized pieces and let dry overnight.

- >In large sauce pan* add heavy cream, milk and butter. Scald.
- >In separate bowl beat eggs

until foamy. Add rum, sugar, nutmeg, cinnamon and vanilla combined well.

- >When milk and butter are ready, temper** the egg mixture (READ TIP BELOW).
- >Pour mixture over dried bread submerging with hands or wooden spoon gently to not break down the bread pieces. Be sure to thoroughly soak the bread.
- >Transfer to a buttered 9 x 13 pan. Pour mixture gently so bread does not break down.
- >Bake until inserted knife comes out clean, approx. 40-45 minutes.
- >Allow to cool for 20 minutes, dust with cinnamon before serving.

TIPS:

*Rinse pan with water, DO NOT dry pan, then add the milk, cream and butter (This prevents burning milk

on bottom of pan).

**Temper - take a ½ C of the scalded milk and mix into egg mixture ¼ C at a time, do this until eggs are very warm then add all the egg mixture into milk (this keeps eggs from cooking in the milk mixture otherwise you will have Creamy Birds Nest Soup).

***Before adding raisins, soak raisins in boiling water for 20-30 minutes to rehydrate and plump.

RUM SAUCE

- 1 C Butter (unsalted)
- ½ Pound of Powder Sugar (approx)
- Spiced Rum to taste (I use approx ½ Cup)

Melt butter over low heat. Add powder sugar a little at a time, thicken to suit. Add warm rum to taste.
