
Opportunity Quilt



"Go Fetch!" by Karen Brow

A Workshop Special Project incorporating delightful techniques for playful animals

Known for her animal quilts with personality, Karen offers tips and techniques for creating the humor, detail and playfulness of animals and incorporating them in your own quilts. Participants will create her "Go Fetch" wall quilt—a pet- inspired project which students customize with dogs, and/or a cat and birds.

Workshop Instruction Includes:

-- creating dimension with only two or three fabrics



"Go Fetch!" Workshop Requirements Instructor Karen Brow

The Aminals: I recommend, hand-dyes, tone-on tones or batiks for the animals for richness and texture. Solid colors with no variation can look too "flat." Large florals & prints with areas of whites are also more difficult to work with here *BRING SEVERAL CHOICES IF YOU HAVE THEM!

NOTE: The yardages below will accommodate all borders, backgrounds and main applique pieces. Additional very small pieces for ears, collars etc. may be required.

OPTION #1-- DOG QUILT

Labrador: 1/4 yard main body color 1/8 yard lighter color for front legs

1/8 yard deeper gold/brown for back legs and ear

Chihuahuas: 12"x14" piece white/off-white 7" X 10" piece gold/brown

Dachshund: fat eighth dark brown 7" x 10" medium brown

OPTION #2-- DOG, CAT & BIRDS QUILT

Labrador: (See above)

Birds: 7" x 10" piece red/pink for breasts 7" X 10" deep blue for bodies

Cat: fat eighth white/off white 7" x 10" medium brown

Background & Borders: A combination of florals, prints, batiks and tone-on-tones can work here. (Again, avoid prints or florals with a lot of white.)

Quilt center: 1/2 yard light/medium blue or green (This may be a subtle print or texture)

First border: 1/8 yard multi-color print

Pieced border: 1/8 yard deeper blue (& leftover quilt center fabric above)

Wide border: 1/4 yard medium gold or brown First corner: 9" x 12" subtle print or batik

Outer corner: 1/8 yard multi-color print or solid (& leftover white from animals)

Leash (optional): fat eighth

Ball: 4" x 6" piece red/ burgundy & 4" x 6" piece for contrasting seams

----- Students should also bring the following to class: ----

- -- pencil (mechanical is best) and eraser
- -- scissors for both fabric and paper
- -- applique' threads to match fabrics (40-80 weight threads give nice results.)
- -- good-quality hand-applique' needles (I like Bohin.)
- -- Roxanne's Glue-Baste-It (I much prefer this brand to others.)
- -- fabric glue stick -- your own iron to use at your seat (smaller is better) and a small FIRM ironing surface

Instructor will supply: • freezer paper & starch • brushes and containers
