## June Program

This month Helen Young Frost will be visiting us from Tucson, AZ. Helen has been in the quilting world for many years. You may recognize her mother’s name, Blanche Young. They wrote many books on quilting starting in the 1980s! Helen’s lecture will be the “The Quilter’s Magic Show: Lots of Tricks for Better Quilts”. Is perfect patchwork an illusion? Add these techniques for precise cutting, easier matching, and efficient pressing to your bag of tricks! Learn the secret behind ripple- free borders and great bindings. Get terrific ideas for improving your quilt and enjoy some magic tricks too!

Her workshop on Wednesday, June 12 is “Beautiful Bindings”. It will be held at the Community Building from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. We will open the building at 9:00 am for set-up and will start promptly at 10:00. There is still space available in the workshop. Cost is \$30 plus the \$15 kit fee. Achieve smooth bindings with perfect corners and learn a great method for joining the ends. You’ll also get great tips on preparing your quilt for binding. You’ll make a sample of traditional binding then practice angled and scalloped edges. Try new “gourmet” bindings such as two-color and faux piping. All quilted fabric and bindings are included in the kit. (\$15 kit fee per student).

## Scissor Sharpening Service

Richard Raponi will be bringing his truck and tools to the June guild meeting to sharpen scissors and knives. The price for scissors vary by length but the standard 8” is \$10. Knives are \$1 per inch. Serrated knives are \$1.50 per inch. We will be dropping them off to him outside before the meeting starts so he can work on them while we are having our meeting. Also, please plan on paying him as you deliver the scissors/knives to him so we don’t disrupt the meeting/lecture. He accepts cash, checks, or charge cards. **BE SURE TO PUT YOUR NAME ON EACH PAIR OF SCISSORS/KNIVES!**
