Pastor's Note

"Hebrew Worship" Selected Texts

Someone once asked Winston Churchill what he thought about wartime Russia. Churchill never quite understood Russia or how to predict what it might do next. After thinking a moment he said, "It is a riddle, wrapped in a mystery, inside an enigma."

A riddle, wrapped in a mystery, inside an enigma might well describe how some Christians today describe the New Testament book of Hebrews. Dr. Robert Ross, a scholar who has spent much of his life studying Hebrews comments, "The student of this epistle must understand its uniqueness. It is like no other NT epistle, and it poses problems that are peculiar to itself. In form of construction, in style, in argument, and in relation to other books of the Bible, Hebrews stand apart." A challenging summary from someone who knows Hebrews well.

No one is even sure who actually penned the letter. The third-century scholar Origin said it best: "But who it was that really wrote the epistle, God only knows." Not knowing *who* wrote it means we're also not sure *when* it was penned or *where* the author was living at the time.

But when it comes to *why* it was written, we have an answer. Near the end of the book the author says, "But I urge you, brethren, bear with this word of exhortation, for I have written to you briefly."

Notice two things:

First, the letter is referred to as being brief. This is an interesting word about a book of thirteen chapters and over three hundred verses! But I think "briefly" implies there was more to say. You know how it goes, you're talking about something important and it's time to go with more left unsaid. The time flew by.

Second, notice the letter is called a "word of exhortation." Isn't that refreshing? What better message does the church need than a word of encouragement? Whenever you read Hebrews, begin with this purpose of the book. Realize you are reading a brief word of exhortation.

As we continue our series on public and private worship, I want to have us consider what this brief word of exhortation says about the subject.



Hebrews is, in some ways, a New Testament commentary on the Old Testament economy. This makes it one of the best books to refer to when thinking about worship in both Testaments. The author, whoever it was, was well-versed in the OT way of life, but Christ had transformed him. And this change resulted in his being able to see the Old Testament through New Testament eyes.

For our purposes, I want to limit our thoughts to just a few passages in Hebrews 9. We will consider two passages this month and touch on our final observation in the next issue.

By way of review, for the last few issues of the *Bell Tower* we have been reflecting on one of the keywords used in the New Testament for worship, the Greek word, *latreuein*. A word used in the New Testament about 21 times. And as one might guess, it comes up often in Hebrews (8:5; 9:9, 14; 10:2; 12:28; 13:10). Let's notice a couple of these verses beginning with 9:8-10.

The word translated as "worshipper" in verse 9 is *latreunonta*. The author's point is that all the sacrifices of the OT were ineffective in addressing the conscience.

You see, the OT ritual was all outward, everything is limited to the physical. It consisted of animals you could see and hear, priests you could talk to, and a temple you could walk into. Everything existed in the physical realm. And because it was all outward it couldn't address the inward condition; because it was physical it couldn't address the spiritual. It was meant to symbolize the spiritual, but many people missed that point and thought that going through the motions was all God ever wanted. Many people make the same mistake today. They conclude that as long as they go through the motions of going to church, giving some money, etc. they have worshipped God. But those practices alone are not worship.

But what the Old Testament sacrifices couldn't do, Christ's sacrifice did. And this brings us to our second passage, Hebrews 9:14. Here "serve" is the same word translated as "worshiper" in 9:9.

When Christ enters your life, you are to begin living a life of worship by having your entire life become a life of service. Christ works to cleanse your conscience, to make you "right with God." This is something only He can do. But from that point on you are to serve Him. This further confirms what we've been saying throughout this series, that worship means to serve; to serve God and to serve others.

Next month we will review what we said here and we will look at one more passage in Hebrews that ties all this together. For now, let me leave you with this word of encouragement from Philippians 3:15-16, "Let us therefore, as many as are perfect, have this attitude; and if in anything you have a different attitude, God will reveal that also to you; however, let us keep living by that same standard to which we have attained."


AUTUMN


