Context of Northern Mozambique: 3 provinces and 56 districts with over 30% of the nation's population and 50% of its land mass



Context of Northern Mozambique: A region with enormous potential and need for development investment

Introduction to the MSP: The platform is subdivided into 4 thematic Working Groups

Planning groups

District Planning of Palma

Consolidation of existing plans and initiatives for the territorial development of the district that encompasses the megaprojects activities of the Afungi peninsula. This analysis will inform coordinated efforts to reduce the vulnerability of local communities, economy, infrastructure and land resources of the district

The Pemba-Lichinga Corridor

Project launched by the African Development Bank for the development of value chains and markets along the Pemba-Lichinga corridor, which aims to promote competitive and inclusive agricultural business in certain geographies by increasing agricultural production and productivity

Local content groups

SME Financing

Initiatives and financial inclusion programs that facilitate the creation of an enabling ecosystem to attract private capital that unlocks funding for SMEs in northern Mozambique. The group aims to explore innovative solutions in the financing ecosystem to support SMEs

Local Content and Capacity Building

Projects and programs designed to improve processes and skills of SMEs in order to service the LNG sector. Examples of interventions are the sponsorship of training centers or Technical Assistance programs, as well as sectoral coordination of professional certification standards

What it is

- A platform to promote collaboration and the exchange of ideas
- A stakeholder led initiative
- The result of collaboration with over 80 representative organizations from the Private and Publics Sectors, Civil Society and NGOs
- A narrowly launched platform with a thematic and geographic focus with the inspiration to grow
- A tool for stakeholders to leverage to incubate and drive initiatives forward



What it is not

- A mechanism for any official policymaking or replacement for any government led initiative
- An all-encompassing donor-coordination platform for Cabo Delgado
- An umbrella mechanism that aims to absorb all ongoing development activities in the region
- An effort representing the interests of a selective group of parties
- A presentation of a set of concrete projects that have or require funding



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What the MSP produces: An overview

Information sharing

- *Webinars:* Regularly scheduled platform wide sessions to present new programs, studies, or topics of interest
- *Newsletters:* Monthly updates that include member and platform produced content



• Forum attendance: Representation and speaking engagements at thematically overlapping forums and conferences

Thought leadership

- White Papers and Concept Notes: Publications driven by working groups on working group topics of interest
- **Case studies and mappings:** Smaller scale secretariat-led insights
- **Data snapshots:** Regularly published thematic data visualizations and insights of the on-the-ground reality of thematic areas

- **Consultative sessions:** Stakeholder presentations to receive member feedback on ideas and projects
- **Strategic TA:** Assistance to members and local government institutions with overlapping thematic work

 designing potential new programs and
 ideas based on stakeholder input
- Incubation sessions: Smaller, technical working groups to co-design projects, programs, and thought leadership





Current state of infrastructure in Cabo Delgado



Additional factors impacting infrastructure development

- ~300,000 internally displaced peoples adding increased pressure on infrastructure for service delivery
- Heavy rainy season is expected, likely causing additional damage to critical infrastructure
- Economic impact of COVID has hit state budgets and local private sector investment
- Increased urgency to develop critical supply routes for linkages to local producers and service providers and increasingly for humanitarian response
- Influx of private and development capital to be leveraged to sustainably develop the North

A more holistic approach to infrastructure development is required in this resource constrained environment

Capacitation workshop and debates sponsored by the platform

MSP partnered with Cabo-Delgado based CSO, Djumula to hold a **two-day capacitation and debate workshop** focused on:

- Promoting women's rights in the context of COVID-19
- Challenges of internally displaced women in areas of conflict in Cabo Delgado
- Role of civil society and human rights institutions in the development process

Feedback from these debates was disseminated to the larger platform network through the MSP monthly newsletter.



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



Case studies of local stakeholders...



...highlight difficulties in the current environment

- Access to tenders: Local companies often struggle with the online procurement systems due to technological complexity of procurement portals, the documentation requirements, as well as language barrier
- Lack of contractor support: Registering feedback or resolving operational issues with IOCs is complicated for subcontractors without a singular portal for support
- **Onerous payment timelines:** SME cashflows often cannot withstand payment terms longer than 30 days
- **Difficulty attracting a consumption base**: Workers for the megaprojects in the North often do not live in the region meaning there are limited consumption spending benefits for the local communities



Value of Projects by Sector





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
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How the MSP works: Governance structure
