Activities mainly focused in the posto of Mocimboa da Praia Sede

ICRC:

MdP Sede: Construction of 3 new small SAA + 3 new Manual water pumps. Main SAA: rehab of water intake of Buji and the two distribution towers. Work in progress for the long-term Master Plan of the town.

Posto sede, Ntotowe e Manilha: new SAA (planning)

UNDP:

MdP Sede: Main SAA: rehab of water treatment system, distribution line (with extension to Ntende).

Diaca: new SAA (2024)

UNOPS:

Diaca: rehabilitation of the existing SAA (2024) Mbau: rehabilitation of the existing SAA (2024)






