Scottsdale police announced that the boys would face charges for aggravated criminal damage and trespass, with the intent to file these charges with the Maricopa County Attorney's Office.

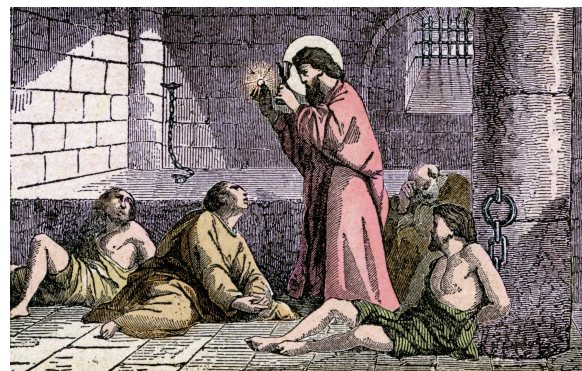

Disney's a Dime a Dozen

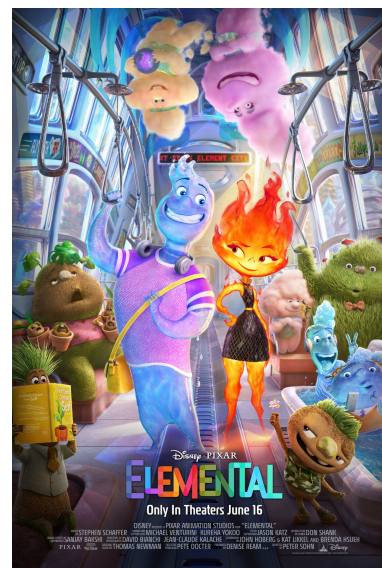
