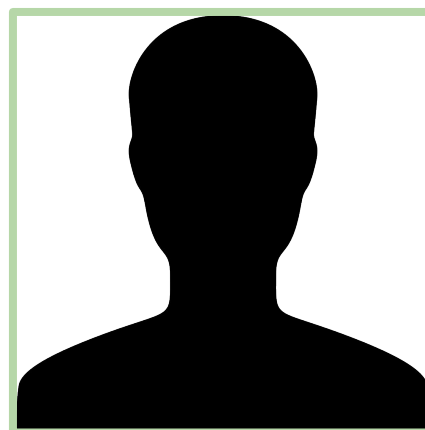

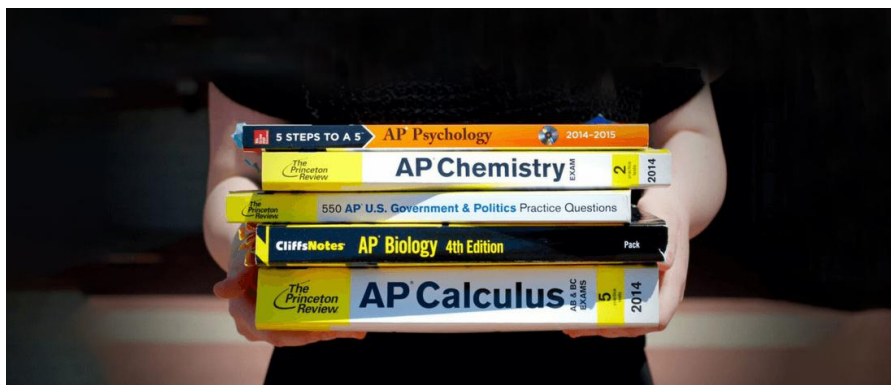
What do you have to say after such an exhilarating run?

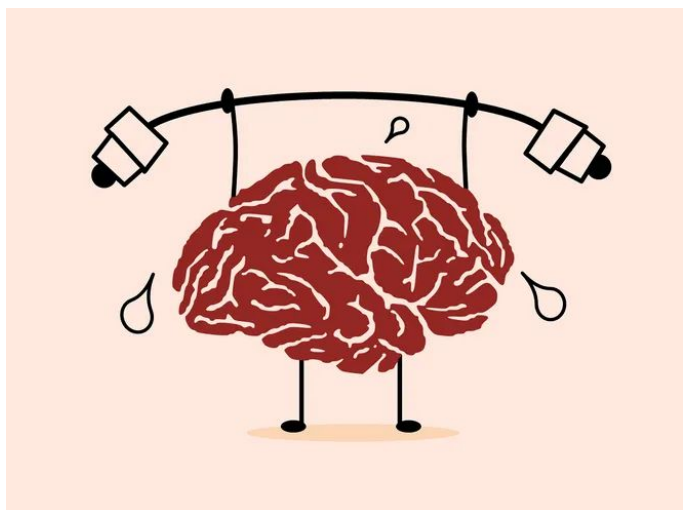

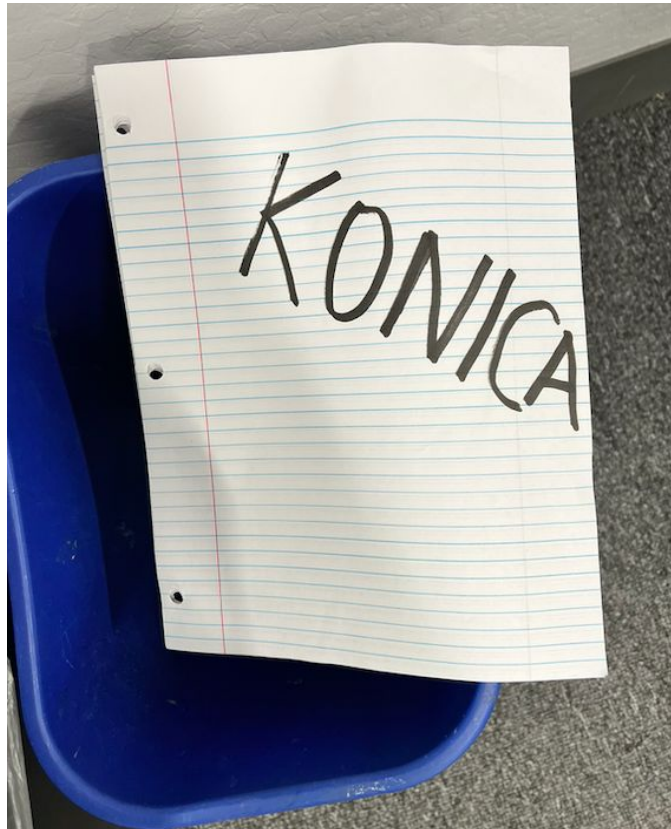

Of course, it is a great idea for states facing growing case counts with the highly misunderstood Omicron variant to delay reporting to the end of the week! It'd be much easier to just ignore the overwhelming number of case counts rather than create an efficient method of accessing *public* health data! We should always go for the path of least resistance; after all, we are never told to look at the long-term. We all know that it's so much better to be shortsighted.

So what if this decision prevents Americans from understanding ever-changing health trends in their state? Why not encourage state governments to prioritize their own public image rather than help public health?

It couldn't be hospitals were struggling to maintain ICUs. And allowing case counts to occur every week prevents efficient allocation of resources. 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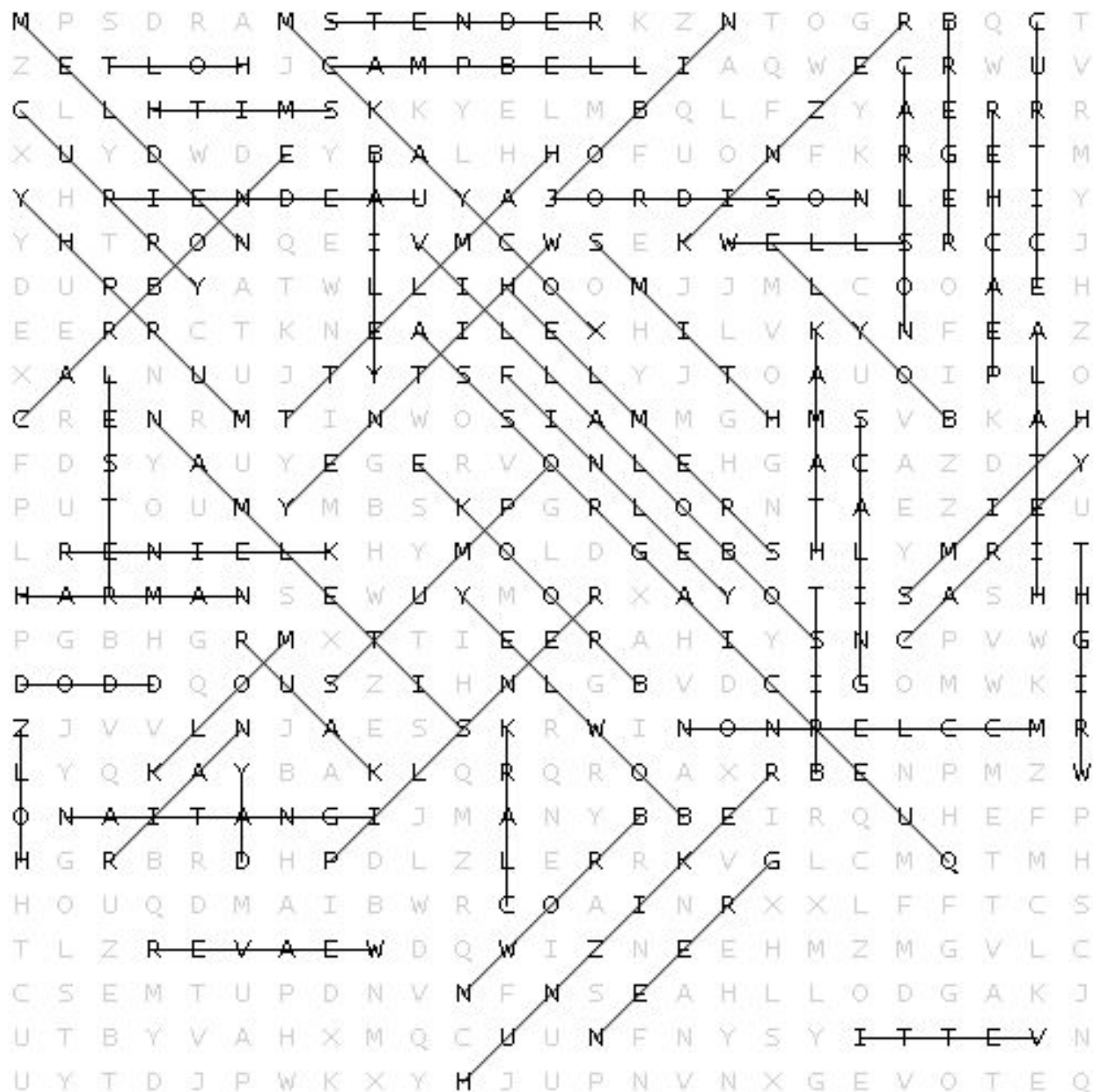

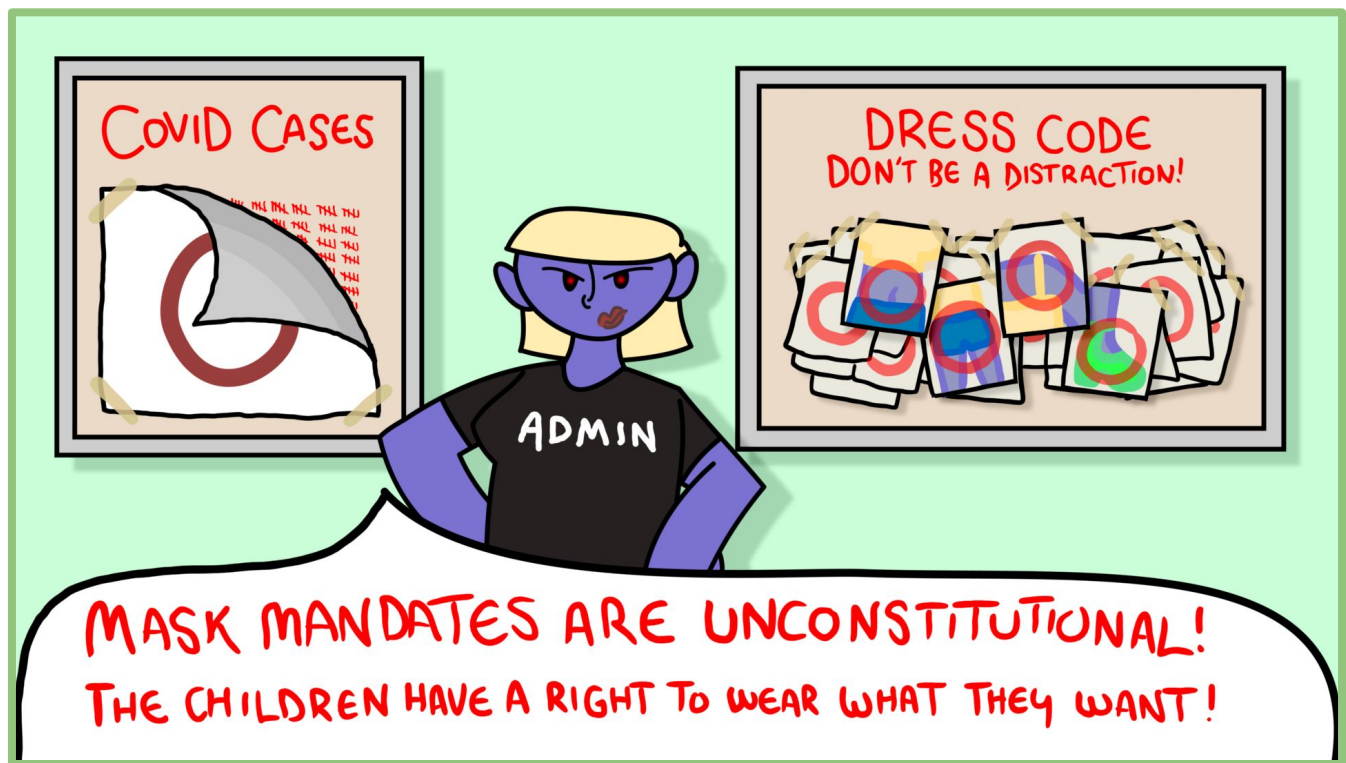
