Paramedics create an official medical document called a Patient Care Report (PCR). Your ID links this report securely to you. The PCR acts as legal proof of your condition on the scene and details every lifesaving service rendered. If you need specialized treatment, this report serves as the baseline narrative of your emergency.

3. Validating Your Insurance and Billing

Ambulance bills can be complex but having your insurance information collected immediately jumpstarts the verification process. The thorough notes taken by paramedics validate the medical necessity of your trip to your insurance provider.
