#### Just...pray

Our family always seems to get a running start into the New Year. Just when we think there might be a lull in the chaos of life and time to relax and enjoy the good things, something else comes along and puts us right back on our toes.

Is your family like this? Do you feel that often, just as you get your grip on life, something else comes along? It's like playing a continual game of Donkey Kong. . . You just keep jumping one barrel after another, after another, trying to get to the next ladder, and you finally get a moment to just stand in stillness...and then comes another barrel. (Yes, I'm aware that I dated myself by using a Donkey Kong reference.)

I had a moment last week when I had just about all I could handle for the day, and I became overrun with fear. Fear of uncertainty, fear of change, fear of chaos, fear of loss, fear of the future, fear of the present. I know that I'm not alone, we all face fears in life. Nothing is for certain in this world, and we begin to just stand ready to face what's going to come up next. Fear had taken control of me. And in this moment, I panicked and I began working out my fear, reasoning with logic, working things out. But it didn't help. The fear continued and even became worse as I attempted to alleviate the problems. And as my brain raced through 536 thoughts at once, one word came into focus. One word that became louder and more obvious than anything else...PRAY!

Do you ever forget to pray? Am I the only one who often needs God to tap me on the shoulder and say "Hey! I'm still here. You can't do this on your own. Talk to me."

God is with us! Through the fears and the struggles and the joys and the sorrows of life, God is right here! We do not need to take the cares and worries of our lives on by ourselves because we have a God who has strength to overcome anything pulling us down. A God who can carry us through the times when we are too weak to stand. A God whose light can pierce the depths of darkness and overcome. Our God IS an awesome God!

I picked up my prayer beads and began to pray. One bead at a time. In the moment, I couldn't recall exactly what I was "supposed" to pray with each bead, so I made it up. One bead at a time. Through 34 beads. One bead at a time. And I came to the end of my prayer with strength in knowing that God had everything in His control. I surrendered myself and my fears to the love of God.

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksqiving, present your requests to God." —Philippians 4:6

As we continue our walk through the first months of 2023 and look toward our journey through Lent, let us not forget to talk to God. The world would have us turn within and bear every burden alone, but God calls us to "Cast your burden on the LORD, and he will sustain you; he will never permit the righteous to be moved." Psalm 55:22

# Youth Mission Trip—Summer 2023

Youth Mission Trip

We are excited to announce we are preparing a youth mission trip for Summer 2023! Our primary option is Louisville, Kentucky through the organization Youthworks. This location is open to students who have completed 6<sup>th</sup> grade in the spring of 2023 through seniors who have graduated in the spring of 2023.

Youthworks offers a wide variety of assignments, but all are focused on relational work. At Louisville we may help with youth programming such as VBS, work at food pantries and soup kitchens, sort items at clothing distribution centers, or work on simple home repair projects.

The cost per participant for this trip is expected to be about \$380. However, youth will be participating in fundraising efforts through the year, and there are also scholarships which may be available to help limit cost as a barrier for participation.

Available weeks for this location are 6/11-6/16, 6/18-6/23, 6/25-6/30. Since we have selected a site close enough to reach within one day of driving, we do not need to overnight along the way.

# **Helping Those In Need**















United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) responds to disasters in the United States and around the world by working with communities and local partners. When a disaster overwhelms a community's ability to recover on its own, UMCOR provides essential relief supplies and supports long-term rebuilding efforts.

While UMCOR is <u>not a first-response organization</u>, it stands ready to accompany communities in need over the long haul of their recovery until a "new normal" is established after a crisis. "**Early in and last out**" is a guiding principle of **UMCOR**. When disasters happen, it is local churches that provide the first response to their communities. This basic understanding – that disaster response is local – forms the foundation for UMCOR's U.S. disaster training and response efforts.

Please be there for survivors by including your donation with your <u>regular offering</u>, noting in the memo line of your check the amount you want donated to <u>UMCOR</u>; or by giving online @ <u>occumc.org</u>, pick Miscellaneous, and enter <u>UMCOR</u> (you may choose Where Most Needed, or a specific disaster like Tornado Relief, Wildfire Relief, Ukraine etc.). Remember, 100% of your donation goes to the relief efforts.



The walk to Emmaus is a spiritual renewal program intended to strengthen the local church through the development of Christian disciples and leaders. The Walk to Emmaus begins with a 72-hour short course in Christianity, comprised of 15 talks by lay and clergy volunteers on the themes of God's grace, disciplines of Christian discipleship and what it means to be the church.

It is an opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in a new way as God's grace and love is revealed to you through other believers.

The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with the prayerful discernment and invitation from a sponsor. After one accepts this invitation, they complete an application. The Emmaus leaders prayerfully consider each applicant and in God's time, the person is invited to attend a three-day experience of New Testament Christianity as a lifestyle.

Following the three-day experience, participants are joined in small groups to support each other in their ongoing walk with Christ. Through the formational process of accountable discipleship in small groups and participation in the Emmaus community, each participant's individual gifts and servant-leadership skills are developed for use in the local church and its mission. Participants are encouraged to find ways to live out their individual call to discipleship in their home, church, and community.

The objective of Emmaus is to inspire, challenge, and equip the local church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, communities and places of work. Emmaus lifts up a way for our grace-filled lives to be lived and shared with others.

# **SENIOR DINING / MEALS ON WHEELS**



#### What is Senior Dining?

Once known as the Elderly Nutrition Program or the Senior Meal Program. Senior Dining has been a part of Milwaukee County since 1973. This program has been serving meals to adults 60+ years old in various community settings. The program MILWAUKEE COUNTY receives funding from the State of Wisconsin's Bureau on Aging, Title 111-C of the Department on Aging Federal Older Americans Act, and contributions from seniors in our community.

#### What is the Cost?

There is a suggested contribution of \$3 for diners 60 and over and a cost of \$8 for their guests under 60. If this contribution amount is a hardship for you, please give whatever you can.

#### What is on the Menu?

The menus must meet Federal guidelines for nutritional and calorie content. A wide variety of foods that equal 1/3 of the recommended daily allowance of Vitamins A & C and Calcium are offered. Menus are posted at the meal sites and take home copies are available.

#### How do I Sign Up?



Each diner must sign up by completing a Registration Card (application forms are available in the Friendship Room literature rack), which requires a Driver's License or a Senior Citizen ID card. You will then receive a Diner's Card with a Diner Number that you may use to dine at any of the Milwaukee County Senior Dining Meal locations. All diners must place a reservation at least one day in advance for the date they wish to dine. All meals ordered for the following day are based on the number of meals recorded on the reservation list.

Franklin City Hall Community Room 9229 W. Loomis Rd., Franklin. Still serving pick up only Monday-Friday, between 10:30 am and 12 pm; use the Senior Dining entrance for pickup. Reservations may be placed in person or by phone (414-427-7696) from 9:30 am to 11:30 am weekdays.

Grobschmidt Senior Center 2424 15<sup>th</sup> Ave., South Milwaukee. Serving Monday-Friday, Although the Senior Center is open for all programming, the Senior Dining Program will continue to be distributed outside in a drive through type fashion. Meals are dispersed in the back parking lot from 11:00-11:30 am. Reservations must be made by 11:30 am the previous day by calling 414-768-5722. Monday reservations need to be made by Friday.

Warnimont- Kelly Center, 6100 S. Lake Dr., Cudahy. Serving Monday-Friday, in person now 11:00 am - 12:00 pm. Reservations must be made between 9:30 - 11:00 am the day prior to dining by calling (414) 483-3532.

Milwaukee County Meals on Wheels, Aging Resource Center, Call (414) 289-6874 to register.

Special Diets Available. To be eligible for Meals on Wheels, you must be:

- 60 or older
- A Milwaukee County resident
- Homebound
- Unable physically or mentally to prepare your own meals
- Home at the time of delivery

# **Food Pantry**



Because we no longer operate a food pantry here at OCCUMC, we encourage you to drop off non-perishable food items at the Salvation Army. Or, you can visit their website to make an online donation at https://centralusa.salvationarmy.org/oakcreek/

The Oak Creek Centennial Corps Food Pantry on Howell and Centennial Drive, provides a 2-3-day supply of emergency food to neighborhood individuals and families who are hungry. The food is given on the day it is requested, and represents breakfast, lunch, and dinner for all members of the household. Those receiving food are also informed about how they can participate in supplemental food programs so they can move beyond visiting charity food pantries.

#### Items Needed Year-round:

Fruits: fruits canned in own juice, or 100% fruit juice

Grains: whole-grain foods like brown rice, oatmeal, cereal (no sugar added), multigrain pasta

**Dairy:** boxed skim & 1% milk, or milk alternatives like almond & soy milk **Condiments:** healthy and salt-free flavors of salsa, oil, mustard, seasonings

Vegetables: low sodium, canned vegetables, pasta sauces

Protein: lean sources of animal and plant-based protein - canned chicken, tuna, peanut butter,

dried or canned beans

Snacks: healthy, low in fat foods for on-the-go, like granola, nuts and seeds, breakfast bars,

graham crackers

#### Senior Stock Box Distribution

Hunger Task Force is distributing a box of free, healthy food for seniors at different spots around Milwaukee County. All Stockboxes include cereal, milk, canned veggies and fruits, pasta or rice, protein, fruit juice, canned meats and 2 pounds of fresh Wisconsin cheese. Please share this information.

- 60 years or older (Bring an ID showing your age)
- Monthly household income of less than \$1,473 (1 person) or \$1,984(2 persons) (NEW)
- Be a resident of Wisconsin

- ⇒ 3rd Thursday of the month from 12:00-1:30 pm at the Kelly Senior Center, 6100 South Lake Drive, Cudahy;
