Youth Mission Trip - Summer 2023

We are preparing for our youth mission trip for Summer 2023! Our travels will take us to Indianapolis from June 18th - 23rd through the organization Youthworks. Students who have completed 6th grade in the spring of 2023 through seniors who have graduated in the spring of 2023 are eligible to participate.

Youthworks offers a wide variety of assignments, but all are focused on relational work. We may help with youth programming such as VBS, work at food pantries and soup kitchens, sort items at clothing distribution centers, or work on simple home repair projects.

There are two spots open. The cost per participant for this trip is expected to be about \$200. However, participants will be fundraising to help cover the cost, and there are also scholarships which may be available to help with the cost.


Garden Ministry

Apportionment



We Support the Apportionment because....Apportionment Funds support the Northcott Neighborhood House. Since 1961, the center has offered a lifeline to the people living in the Sherman Park neighborhood. For example, the food pantry gives out stock boxes to over 1,000 senior citizens each month. Day care and after school care is a haven for young children and teens. Through Milwaukee Build, former felons receive job training and career opportunities. The men in this training have refurbished over 600 formerly derelict homes, providing housing for others as well as upgrading the

neighborhood and getting a second chance at a promising future in construction. These are only a few of the reasons for why we give.


WISCONSIN CONFERENCE NEWS


Personal Dignity Kit




- 1 Washcloth no dishcloths

Food Pantry

The Oak Creek Centennial Corps Food Pantry on Howell and Centennial Drive, provides a 2-3-day supply of emergency food to neighborhood individuals and families who are hungry. The food is given on the day it is requested, and represents breakfast, lunch, and dinner for all members of the household. Those receiving food are also informed about how they can participate in supplemental food programs so they can move beyond visiting charity food pantries.

Items Needed Year-round:

Fruits: fruits canned in own juice, or 100% fruit juice

Grains: whole-grain foods like brown rice, oatmeal, cereal (no sugar added), multigrain pasta

Dairy: boxed skim & 1% milk, or milk alternatives like almond & soy milk **Condiments:** healthy and salt-free flavors of salsa, oil, mustard, seasonings

Vegetables: low sodium, canned vegetables, pasta sauces

Protein: lean sources of animal and plant-based protein - canned chicken, tuna, peanut butter,

dried or canned beans

Snacks: healthy, low in fat foods for on-the-go, like granola, nuts and seeds, breakfast bars,

graham crackers
