Greetings!

The word that keeps coming to my mind and my heart in prayer these past 18 months is <u>resiliency</u>. With everything that we have been through in the COVID-19 health pandemic and the resulting economic disparities and racial inequities that have been brought further to light, I believe that God is calling us to resiliency as we come through the other side of the effects of this virus and public health emergency.

Resiliency, Lawrence Peers writes in his article, *Resilience and the Practice of Pivoting*, found in the Congregational Consulting Group monthly newsletter, dated March 15, 2021, that "Resilience is often understood as the capacity to "bounce back," but (he) prefers to think of it as the ability to return again and again to what matters. In other words, to cultivate resilience, we must practice pivoting." Dr. Lawrence goes on to recognize that how we pivot needs to happen psychologically, emotionally sociologically/relationally, spiritually, and organizationally, in wholistic ways. In the face of coming through the COVID-19 health pandemic, I believe that we are tasked with the need to be resilient.

Friends, we have spent this past summer and early fall regrouping after being apart for safety reasons. We have grieved the loss of life, health, and relationships, not to mention economic stability. We have acknowledged how our worries, anxiety, and, yes, even our anger about the virus and its effects, has blocked even our connection with God.

Now is the time for resiliency and a time to return again as we have in the past, to what matters to God and our faith journey together in community. We have opened up the church to welcome folks back into the Sanctuary, Sunday School classes, meetings, and regular administration of the church. We still have more to do as the virus, especially the Delta variant rages in our world. We pray that the virus will, hopefully in the near future, not have as strong a grip on our lives. We have much to do to care for others and share the Good News of Jesus Christ.



Mission Programs

We would like to share a little background on the organizations that benefit from the Layette Program. In this Newsletter we are sharing our relationship with the Sixteenth Street Clinic and La Causa.

Sixteenth Street Clinics

<u>Sixteenth Street Clinics</u> has proudly cared for the south side of Milwaukee and Waukesha for over 50 years. Through full-service bilingual clinics, a behavioral health clinic, a satellite geriatric clinic, and six in-school clinics, Sixteenth Street cares for nearly 43,000 primarily low-income,

United Methodist Women's group and expressed the need for our layettes. They used the layettes in the past as an incentive during their group prenatal care but they are not doing group care any longer. For the past five years Case Managers have given the layettes to women during the post-birth visits that all of their patients receive.

During COVID-19, they suspended home visits for a period of time, but still hand out layettes during clinic visits. Sixteenth

Street has told us, "the layettes are wonderful and their patients are always appreciative when they receive one". The United Methodist Women also make a monetary donation at Christmas time.

LaCausa Crisis Nursery & Respite Center

La Causa – Crisis Nursery & Respite Center division is the only state licensed center care of its kind in SE Wisconsin, for more than 29 years. La Causa is open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year to provide support to children from birth to 12 years old when family emergencies arise, such as homelessness, domestic violence, medical needs or more. They care for up to twelve children, up to 72 hours by providing children's basic needs; clothing, food and shelter, at no cost to the family.



Electronic Giving to OCCUMC

Thank you to our members and friends who have been supporting our ministries through the five different ways of giving: offering plate during worship, dropped off at the church office, mailed in, EFT, and online through our website. The first three are pretty clear, but you may want to know more about **EFT** and **online** giving.

Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) is set up by the Financial Secretary. You can request a form from the church office or finance@occumc.org. Contributions through EFT are made from your bank account the 1st or 15th of each month, or both, as you so choose. EFT giving can be changed or cancelled at any time by contacting the Financial Secretary, or submitting a new form.



Online Giving is managed by you from your bank account (ACH) or credit card (CC) by going to our website at occumc.org. Click Online Giving on the upper right, then Donate Now. Create a Profile if you like, or give as a guest. Creating a profile keeps a history of your giving for you to see, which means you don't need to enter your information each time you give and your envelope number will be assigned to your profile. Enter a \$ amount in General, Apportionment, UMCOR, or Miscellaneous. If you pick Miscellaneous you must tell us what you want to contribute to. This can be done as a one

time or recurring donation. You may change or cancel recurring donations whenever you like.

Our EFT and online giving is done through Vanco Payment Solutions. There is a cost for us to use this service. We're happy to provide EFT, ACH and CC giving, as it makes it convenient for you to contribute. For those of you who have asked, the additional costs for each type of transaction are: Bank account cost: is \$0.45 plus 1%; MC or VISA cost: 2.75% plus \$0.45; American Express cost: 3.50 % plus \$0.45. You have the option to cover the costs of these transactions. There is a box you can check when you finalize your gift.
