Greetings!

We are in the deep of summer and actively planning and organizing our fall, 2021, ministries. We successfully relaunched in-person, in the Sanctuary worship, in June, while remaining committed to sharing worship and many of our other meetings and activities online. My prayer is that you are feeling comfortable with your decision as to how to re-engage in your faith journey here at OCCUMC. I also ask that we keep in mind that not everyone is comfortable being in-person at church at this time. Let us offer grace and compassion to each other as we find our own strides as we reenter our faith-journey again.

I want to assure you that mission and ministry has continued throughout this past year and a half during the health pandemic shut-down. We were able to adapt many of our outreach activities. We were also able to stay connected to, and with each other, through the creation of our 12 Circles of Care. We added a lot to the life of our congregation through the use of social media and regular old phone calls. We also needed to let go of some things like our Food Pantry and, for now, our monthly senior lunch gatherings to name two things.

Starting new ministries and letting go of other outdated and/or ineffective ministries, is the focus of the book that some of us read and discussed in May. Start This Stop That: Do the Things That Grow Your Church, by Jim Cowart and Jennifer Cowart, was a breath of fresh air, with permission giving recommendations as to how to move forward in new directions in the life of a church. The authors state that, "Many churches are stuck in cycles that worked for past generations but are not proving effective now." The book was an appropriate one for our book group to read as we are coming out of the health pandemic. Everything is new, and therefore all of our ministries need evaluation for their effectiveness and a possible makeover. It is time to assess what we have been doing in the past and either adapt those ministries to fit a new world following the pandemic, or we need to let them go and move on.

The Leadership here at OCCUMC is asking great questions like the following: How are we truly going to reach out into our communities and, not only tell them about God's love, but also show them God's compassion, hope, and healing? How can we effectively engage and partner with area businesses, civic groups, schools, and other area churches to help bring justice, equity, and care? These questions, and more, are about evangelism (telling about God's love and inviting folks into the journey of faith here at OCCUMC), mission (being God's hands, feet, voice, eyes, and heart in our communities and in our world), and bringing about change in our societies (naming and claiming the gospel message of life for all of God's Beloved children and creation).

I want to personally thank each of you for your prayers and work on behalf of God everyday. We are making a difference together. We are hearing God's call to help make all things new through the grace and love of Jesus Christ. Keep up the good work.

Sunday School (New Start Time 10:15 am)

The Christian Education Committee has begun formulating a plan for this fall's Sunday School Program. This year's Sunday School will kick off on Rally Day, September 12, 2021. Sunday School will now start at 10:15 am. Third Graders will receive their Bibles also on September 12, 2021, at the 9 a.m. service.





Because we value having three or four teachers per class, there is the need for 15 to 20 teachers. So far we have recruited about half the spots. Also, we will be evaluating the Sunday School curriculum this summer to find the best one that consid-NEEDED ers our faith family children's spiritual, educational and social needs.

Sunday School teacher training will be on September 1st, 6:30 p.m. at the church. Teachers will be able to spend time to set up their rooms that night if they wish.

Versiti Needs Blood Donors

There is an <u>urgent need</u> right here in our community for all blood types!

Unfortunately, due to staffing challenges, the blood drives that OCCUMC sponsors will not take place. However, there are six area donor centers. The closest center is the Versiti Blood Center on 76th and Edgerton Avenue, near Southridge Mall.



When you donate blood, you will save LOCAL lives. Every blood donation helps up to three patients with red blood cells, platelets and/or plasma. <u>Versiti Blood Center of Wisconsin is the only provider for the local hospitals in SE Wisconsin</u>. It takes less than an hour to donate. Whole blood donors are eligible every 56 days and dual red donors 112 days.

Donors should sign up online for an appointment. When donors make their appointment by visiting https://donate.wisconsin.versiti.org/donor/schedules/zip or by calling Versiti Blood Center of WI at 877-232-4376, they should add "OCCUMC" to the notes section so Versiti can celebrate their gift of life along with your willingness to help.






Webinar Opportunity

In-Person Worship Guidelines

The COVID-19 pandemic is still continually changing. The City of Oak Creek defers to the CDC. The UMC WI Annual Conference guidelines:

Please worship at home if you are not feeling well, if anyone in your household is awaiting test results, or if anyone has been exposed to a sick person. We seek to Do No Harm and ask for your prayers and patience.

In-Person Worship Guidelines:

- Entry from the **North** parking lot only.
- Only the Sanctuary, Narthex, hallway restrooms, will be open.
- Drinking fountains are not to be used, and will be covered.
- Masks are required at all times while in the building. Masks will be available.
- Hand sanitizer will be readily available.
- There is no childcare/nursery.
- Social distance 6-ft. from others not in your household, avoid gatherings.
- Ushers will guide you in and out of worship.
- The sanctuary will be filled from front to back, and emptied from back to front.
- Bulletins will be placed in the pews the Thursday prior to Sunday, and can be taken home.
- Congregant singing will be permitted with a mask on, except for Shelly S. in Doyle Hall.
- Pass the peace to others worshippers with a nod or bow, but no contact.
- Offering can be placed in a basket as you enter or depart from the church.
- Communion cups w/wafers will continue to be used, receptacles will be placed for disposal.
- Online worship will be recorded live during in-person worship.
- No beverages or food will be served, but you may bring your own if you would like to do so (not to be shared).
- Our church will be sanitized after the service.



2021 WI Annual Conference Laity Report

The Wisconsin 2021 Annual Conference was held virtually during the week of June 14 - 19, with the Clergy session held Monday June 14, the Laity session on June 15, and the main conference held June 18 &19th.

The Clergy session addressed retirements, and new members of the clergy. While we wish the retiring elders and clergy well, it is disturbing that we had 20 retirements and only 11 new clergy at various levels, with one being a transfer from the Korean Methodist Church.

The majority of the Main Session was worship sessions, a Bible study presented over the two days titled "Building Beloved Community: Creating Healthy Eco-Systems of Radical Inclusion and Racial Justice", and administrative matters including the approval of the budget.

Report on the Laity Session of June 15th by Allan Lindsay

Bishop Hee-Soo Jung presented the opening. His theme focused on Ezra 1:1-7; the Israelites return from exile, which he believed offered us three lessons as we return

- 1) Return is a time for celebration. Let go of the past. Do not forget it, but do not let it limit your future
- 2) Things can/will not return to the way they were, but will move to a new reality.
- 3) The exile lead to new diversity, the incorporation of new ideas, new peoples and new ways of doing things. We cannot drop them. The idea of God's messengers coming on wings was inherited from the Babylonians. What new beliefs will come about from our exile? With Zoom, Facebook and other communications, the world has shrunk. Our fellow worshiper can be a thousand miles away. Will we give this up and return to our old narrow beliefs?

While the Clergy will provide much needed leadership in moving forward, the Laity is needed to make the return work, both as leaders and as enthusiastic workers. The church is the Laity and the Laity are the church. Lay leadership must contribute and combine their knowledge, gifts, talents, resources and expertise to sustain a rebirth of the church. The Wisconsin conference is one of the most diverse in both laity and the clergy, including Caucasians, Native Americans, Hispanics, Hmong, African-Americans, Asians and Pacific Islanders and many other groups. We must make use of the knowledge and traditions of all these groups to forge a strong future for the church. The Rev. Dr. Jaview Vieira, the new president of Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary declared that very few churches will reopen, as only a few churches that he knew of closed during the pandemic, and while they might now be opening their physical buildings, it would only be an addition to the work they have been doing during the pandemic.

Deanna Schinkio, Conference Lay Leader, informed the Laity of one of the special offerings for this year, a drive to purchase Yamaha motorcycles for the Bolivar Evangelical Methodist Church allowing the ministers to travel over the poor or non-existing roads to reach their flock.

A video presentation of the basic history and works of the United Methodist Women was presented

The Global Board of Discipleship presentation was on the many aids they provide to the Laity and Clergy, especially the new Generosity Audit; a guide and opportunity to analyze the habits of our church's overall giving climate to see what is currently working, as well as where opportunities for a culture of generosity to increase might exist.
