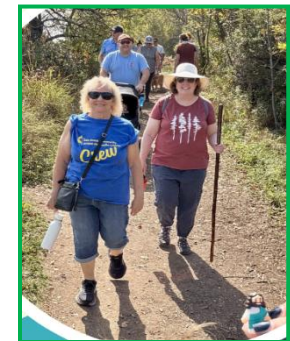

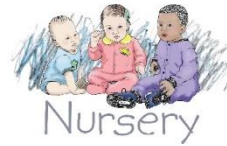

We've gathered together to pack rice meals, count onesies, weave sleeping mats, make student bags and assemble student kits. We have all prayed for those who receive the help - the babies, mamas & papas who receive layettes; the students who have a desk to sit in that we've built & a handmade bag to hold their supplies; the person who can get to work or school because we donated an old bike; the person who can support their family because we gave a sewing machine we no longer use. Last August many of the Home Care buckets were sent to Milwaukee after the flooding.
